

What To Do With Zucchini

If your garden has been like ours, you are over-run with zucchini squash. For some rea-son, this has been a good year for zucchini, a new favorite of

as well.

When harvesting zucchini, pick those 8-12 inches long, and no more than 1½ to 2 inches in diameter. Large squash are seedy and tough. Check your vines daily, since these vegetables daily, since these vegetables seem to grow overnight. If you miss one and it looks ilke a small watermelon, be sure to pick it. The vines will fruit better if the squash are picked. The plant will put its energies into forming new squash, instead of producing seeds in too large squash.

Now for an answer to the question - what to do with all of it. You can can it, freeze it, fry it, use it in casseroles, cakes, bread, pancakes and even pickle

Canned Zuechini

Wash squash, do not pare.
Cut into small pieces, steam or


