





and insulated quictor's storage pits, you can make outdoor storage, pits, yourself for keeping Irish potatoes, carroits, beets, untips, saisity, parsnips and cabbase. The temperature in above the ground insulated pits will range from about 32 to 50 degrees F. Layers of straw (or leaves) and dirt keep the food cold and moist, similar to conditions in an unheated basement tions in an unheated basement or root cellar. Pits should be put on well-drained soil.

Making a storage pit

1. Spread a layer of straw or
leaves 2 or 3 inches thick on the
ground. Or, dig a hole 6 to 8
inches deep. Then spread the
layer of straw or leaves in it.

2. Place layers of vegetables
in a cone-shaped pile, putting
straw or leaves between layers
of different vegetables.

3. Cover finished pile with
about 3 inches of straw; then
cover with 4 to 6 inches of dir.
Pat dirt firm with back of a
shovel, leaving an upright "tun
el" of straw to the top so that
air can get in.

4. Place a board or sheet of
metal on top and anchor it with
a rock.

5. Dig a shallow ditch around the pit for water drain-

Plan to store about a half bushel or so of mixed vegetables in each pit. Once you open up the pit, it's, easiest to take out all the vegetables, if you can use them up within a week or two. Keep them in the coldest part of your house, under the sink or in

CATTLE GRUB CONTROL

Cattle grub systemic in-icides should be applied to

Cattle grub systemic insecticides should be applied to cattle any time from now until the end of October. Cattle grubs are fly larvae that develop in the bodies of cattle. The eggs are laid in the spring by the adult flies and the maggot-like larvae wander throughout the animal's body for eight to ten months.

Eventually, usually in late winter, the larvae end up under the skin of the back where they do most of their growing. They create large bump-like warbles that are filled with pus.

FOREST FIRE SEASON WILL SOON BE HERE

FOREST FIRE SEASON WILL SOON BE HERE

The fall forest fire season will soon be here and the dangers of using fire will be vastly increased. According to Rock-castle County Forest Ranger Steven Bullen, the period from October I through December 18' is known as the Official Fire Season. During this period, it is dilegal for any person to burn any material within 180 feet of any woodland before 4:30 p.m. After 4:30 p.m., a person may legally burn materials on his pwn property if all reasonable precautions are taken to prevent escape of the fire. One major cause of forest fires during the fall fire season is hunting. While most hunters are sportsmen, a few will try to get their game any way they can. Ranger Bullen cautions. "Using fire or smoke to capture or destroy animals is not only unsportsman-like, it is also dangerous and illegal." A wildfire notionally damaged trees, but life habitat and food resulting in a reduction of game populations and also creates danger to other property or even danger

to life Considering all this, using fire or smoke in hunting is, just not worth the risk.

The old saying, "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of eure" is certainly true in regard to forest fires. The effort and cost to prevent a wildfire is very small compared to the effort and cost to control it. For information on fire weather or effort and cost to control it. Treatment consists of applying or feeding a systemic insecticide to beet herds, and in dairy herds, to dry cows and young stock not being milked. Lactating dairy cows cannot be treated.






