

Mullins travels to Russia for culture-language summer study

The homecoming was a sight for American eyes. After two months of studying Russian in the Soviet Union, Dyche Mullins pulled into his driveway with his family to be greeted by six friends and an array of signs strung in front of their house in Mt. Vernon.

"Welcome Home, Yuri" and "The KGB Wants You!" shouted the banners. The Mullins' horse even sported an announcement which proclaimed "Russian Race Horse."

With a sense of the drama of the occasion, Mullins stepped out of the car, bent down, and gratefully kissed the ground. He was home.

The 20-year-old Russian student had just completed a trip that falls in the "once-in-a-lifetime" category. But the "once" may not hold true for Mullins. His first visit to the Soviet Union went so well that he would like to return again sometime, maybe for a whole semester.

Right now, however, it's enough to recount the first trip.

Mullins began taking several Russian classes when he was a freshman at the University of Kentucky for "something fun and challenging to do." After four Russian language courses and a couple of classes in the culture and history of the country, he decided that his hobby might become another major to add to the one he has in electrical engineering.

It was also during his freshman year that he decided he wanted to go to Russia before he graduated from college. "The Soviet Union has always been considered the antithesis of the United States,"

he said, "and I thought it would be fascinating to see how the people really live. All of my professors have been and they said to get any kind of proficiency in the language, you need to study there."

The chance to actually take such a trip came last spring, during his sophomore year, when he applied for the Council on International Educational Exchange. The Council has a summer Russian language program for 125 students from the United States who have had at least two years of Russian and have passed qualifying exams.

There are five core schools participating in the program with each school taking about 25 students and a leader. A director and assistant director help oversee the trip. The students must pay their own way and, in return, they get around eight credit hours from their university when they return to the states.

Mullins found out in early May he had qualified for the trip, making him the first student from U.K. to go for the two-month summer term in several years. He was gone from June 15 until Aug. 18.

His parents had mixed emotions about their son taking a trip of this nature. Roland Mullins is the mayor of Mt. Vernon and the executive director of the Cumberland River District mental health/retardation board. He was "very, very uneasy. I felt more because it was Russia. But Dyche got a first hand view of the dictatorial society there and how they control what people think, say, and write. And he saw an economic system that limits the standard of living for people and a system that attempts to keep down religious freedom."

His mother, Nancy Mullins, is an English teacher

other children, tire more easily, and be frequently out of breath. They have persistent coughs, but the illness is not contagious.

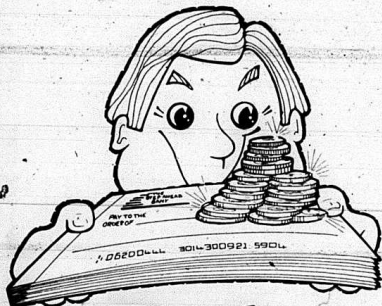

Every year of research added more than one year to the average life expectancy of a Cystic Fibrosis child during the past ten years. Funds from this event will help to insure continued research.

The mission of the Cystic

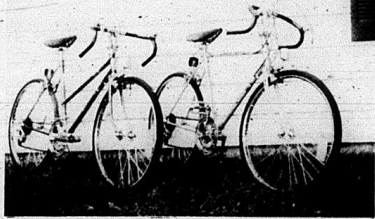

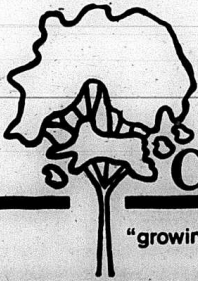
