



Roberts family will go to Mexico as Baptist Missionaries

The message on the windows of the Trading Post on Main Stree in Mt. Vernon reads: "Mexico nd-Going Out of Business

Sale."

Kenneth Roberts opened the Trading Post in April, 1983 as a means to support his family while he was between pastorates. The business has served its purpose, but the Robertses are ready to start the new year with a new beginning.

start the new year with a new beginning.

The first week of January, they'll begin a year's travel that will take them all over the United States to raise the support needed to finance the missionary work they plan to do in Mexico.

Their ultimate destination is Campeche, Mexico, which is about 300 miles north of El Salvador and 90 miles southwest of Havana. Cuba.

90 miles southwest of Havana, Cuba.
"In October of 1983, I surrendered in a Sunday morning
service to go to the mission field,"
said Roberts. He and his family
attend the Bible Capitst Church in attend the Bible Capitat Church in Mt. Vernon where Don Stayton is

Mt. Vernon where Don Stayton is the pastor.

The church thought it would be wise to send Roberts to the mission field to visit before they officially began raising support. In April, he and his wife, Jealetta, and their son, Kevin, traveled to Tabasco, a state of Mexico, and to Campache, a state and a capital city.

They were gone for 30 days

They were gone for 30 days and stayed with two missionaries already established there. After returning to Rockeastle County, the Robertses began making plans to raise support so that they could return to Mexico and live. In the upcoming year they will visit approximately 150 independent Baptist churches in all areas of the United States to gain support for

In the first month alone they will travel to such cities as Little Rock, Ark., Denver, Col., and Dallas, Houston and Amarillo in Texas. The men of the Bible Baptist Church remodeled a van ort the Roberts family so they will be able to travel without a great deal of expense.

During their trip to Mexico in April. the Robertses got an idea of the conditions they would eventually live under. Roberts said that Mexico has high unemployment and that the economy there makes it difflicult for the poor people. Most of the population makes their living by hard labor, with many working in oil fields and farming. Others earn money as vend-

Others earn money as vend-ors of fruit and vegetables. There are also people who sell crafts they've made, such as pottery, baskets, leather items and jewel-ry. Roberts said while there they

they've made, such as pottery, baskets, leather items and jewelry. Roberts said while there they save children as young as nine years old who worked every day. The area around Campeche is swampy and tropical, with the temperatures-ranging from 70 to 115 degrees year round. There is indial from six to seven months out of the year. Roberts said his family was treated well by the Mexican people. They we had correspondence from several people they met there who want to know when they'll be back. They have also shorts isn't sure how long his family will live in Campeche as missionaries: "Right now as far as "I'm concerned." I'll be there until I die." he said. After the Robertses spend a year raising support, they will live in Tabasco for another year to take language training in Spanish. They will be taught by a mission-ary who can teach both Hebrew and Greek in Spanish. Kevin will also learn Spanish and Jealetta will refresh the three years of will refresh the three years of Spanish she's already had.

After they complete language school, the family will move to a rented house in Campeche.

school, the family will move to a reinted house in Campeche. During their work there, they will establish independent churches which will be financially self-supporting as well as self-governing. "My purpose is to allow the Mexicans we convert to be able to carry on the work after I Leave." said Roberts. They will not supply money to help the Mexicans build churches because the government could come in at any time and take them over.

could come in at any time and take them over.

Since the family will start missions under the authority of the Bible Baptist Church in Mt. Vernon, all their funding will be delegated to them through a family in that church. Roberts is confident his family will raise the money they need to finance their mission work in Mexico. Because they aren't allowed to accept money from the Mexican people, the money they raise will be used for living expenses. Any other support given will go toward ministry expenses, such as the maintenace of their vehicle, their transportation and the publishing of a monthly newsletter.

Besides building new churches in Mexico. Roberts said he has es in Mexic and burden which is to Temple Baptist College in Cincin

encourage churches in the United States to reach out to the Hispanics living in this country. He said that the United States has seen a great increase in its Hispanic population and that as far as he's concerned, there has been no real effort to get the gospel to these people. Roberts added that there are 27,000 Hispanics in Kentucky alone. Why did Roberts decide to go to the mission field? "I was in between pastorates," he said, "and a missionary (from Mexico) came to Bible Baptist and presentied the work he was involved with. ed the work he was involved with. The Holy Spirit dealt with my heart about it." Roberts, 38, has had previous

experience as pastor of the Crab Orchard Immanuel Baptist Church where he ministered 4½ years after beginning the church. He started the church under the

started the church under the authority of the Immanuel Baptist Clurch in Cincimati. Ohio. The also served as yout minister at the Twin Brook Hills Baptist Church in Hamilton, Ohio, and at the Temple Baptist Church in Cincinnati. Homestead Exemption increased to \$16,100

Revenue Secretary Gary Gillis today announced that the Homestead Exemption on real estate owned by qualified persons who are over 65 years of age or are totally disabled has been increased to \$16,100 for tax periods 1985 and 1986. This represents the maximum amount of value exempted from property tax on real property owned and resided in by qualified persons.

The amount of the Homestead Exemption is adjusted every two Revenue Secretary Gary Gillis

Exemption is adjusted every two years to account for changes in the purchasing power of the dollar. It has increased from \$6,500 in 1972 has increased from \$6,500 in 1972 to the current \$16,100 as a result of changes in the consumer price index. The exemption was \$15,000 in 1983 and 1984.

Taxpayers who are qualified for this exemption because of age

must file an application with the Property Valuation. Administrator in their county of residence on forms prescribed by the Revenue Cabinet. Taxpayers who qualify for the total and permanent disability exemption under a pro-gram authorized or administrator permanent or by the Ralicad Retirement System must file annually by December 31 and report changes in the disability classifi-cation authorized by the exempt-ion to the PVA.

Only one exemption will be allowed per residence. Therefore, regardless of the number of qualified owners of a home, totally lisabled or over 65 years of age, \$16.100 is the maximum value which can be exempted from property tax.

THE HISTORICAL APPLE

The common apple, which appeared under countless Kentucky Christmas trees and filled many Christmas stockings, is one of the most written about foods in history.

To the Greeks and Romans it means love and beauty, some say it caused the Trojan War. And of course the oldest apple story of all is the forbidden apple in the Garden of Eden.

The apple has probably been written about so much because it can be grown in almost all parts of the world. In the U. S. apples are grown in 37 states, including Kentucky, in commercial quantities

While apples are not high in any one nutrient, they provide small amounts of many vitamins and minerals. And because they are low in calories and provide important dietary fiber, they are especially important to those wanting to lose weight.

Several varieties that are especially suitable for eating raw, general cooking and baking include McIntosh, Cortland, Golden clude McIntosh, Cortland, Golden Delicious, Jonathan and Winesap. Firm apples keep best at 60 to 70 degrees and slightly soft apples should be refrigerated in the humidity compartment or in moisture proof containers.

Either way it is best to store fresh apples only a few weeks. For longer periods, they can be canned.

To can apples:

1. Pare and core, then cut in

Pare and core, then cut in pieces.
 To prevent darkening, place pieces into water containing two tablespoons of salt and two tablespoons vinegar per gallon.
 To prain, then boil five minutes in water or thin syrup.
 Pack hot fruit into Jars, leaving ½ inch headspace.
 Cover with hot water or syrup, leaving ½ inch headspace.
 Tophen jar lids.
 Process in boiling water both for 15 minutes for pint jars and 20 minutes for quarts.






