

### Local authorities confiscate 'weed'

It has become a thriving business in Rockcastle County, said Sheriff William Taylor. The subject is marijuana, and Taylor says there might be some growing on your farm and you don't even

on your narm and you don't even know it.

Taylor and Kentucky State Troopers Nick Hensley, Shane Mahane and William Stewart did something Tuesday morning to-curtail the growth of at least three crops in the county.

One crop was growing in the county of the county of

The big haul on Tuesday was at Sand Hill where the sheriff reported finding two different patches with a total of 800 plants growing. "Someone had been taking very good care of those patches," Taylor said. He went on to say that the 800 plants were valued at over \$650,000 and that whoever was raising the crog, which is located about 3½ miles from Livingston, had the fields booby-trapped.

We located the patches

we located the parches when we noticed several dog walks leading off Sand Hill Road just past the church," he said. All 800 plants were cut off and destroyed. Taylor and State Police De-

tective Ernie Boggs also located and destroyed seven plants in the Sand Springs area just off Pine Branch Road about six miles from Mt. Vernon last week

According to the sheriff, marijuana can be found almost every day that he attempts to find some.

This was the single most

valuable crop destroyed so far this season. Taylor and Deputy Sheriff Jim Durham located 746 plants on Hi-Dri Road in May, but Taylor said his office was just scratching the surface.

"We are going to kee looking, but without the aid of a heliconter, it is almost unwestible.

helicopter, it is almost impossible to find the wild weed growing in the many wooded areas in the county," he said.

Any way you figure it, your taxes are going up, and up, and likely, up again.

An immediate look ahead to the 1985 tax bill shows a definite increase is in the works to help pay for Gov. Martha Lane Collins' education improvement peckage.

And, it's virtually assured that before very long there will be a federal tox increase to help bring the federal budget defirit under control.

And, if all programs man-dated by the state are carried through, then the county will eventually need more money. Some folks gloomly predict quite a bit of it.

But first things first. There's that 10 cent increase in the property tax rate, from the current 15 cents per 5100 property valua-tion to 25 cents a hundred for the education package.

It's not difficult to figure your bill. If your property is valued at \$35,000, it means a \$35 increase in

your tax bill from \$52.50 to \$87.50. What that will mean for Rockcastle County schools is a substantial amount. In 1984, Rock-castle County collected \$191,070 in common school taxes. The new increase will give schools \$221.436 or an increase of \$130.366 over 1984. Motor vehicle property tax is not included in the total. A gun collector in Monroe County who wants to buy an antique pistol in Tennesce must first have the gun transferred to a Kentucky gun dealer to buy it. A Kentucky homeowner who has a firearm for his protection capt is with him if his family vacations at a lake in Wes. Right now, any Kentuckian who buys a firearm must file a long form giving his personal history and gun dealers often face harrassing inspections and prosecutions for minor record keeping mistakes. Kentucky gun owners cannot carrytheir guns across state lines or buy firearms in other states and bring them home to Kentucky. In some states, a buyer has to wait weeks before receiving the gun! This law is just unfair. Kentucky, sportsmen, gun collectors and just ordinary lawabding citizens should be able to buy firearms without fighting unnecessary restrictions and regulations.

I have been working to change these regulations so that lawabiding Americans can buy, sell or collect firearms in

or out of our state.

Last week, the Senate voted on a bill which would ease some of the most burdensome and unreasonable regulations

some of the most burdensome and unreasonable regulations on the sale of firearms by legitimate cealers and would make it easier for Kentuckians to buy firearms in appropriate circumstances. This bill revises a 1968 law which first placed these heavy restrictions on firearms. The old law went far. beyond the federal government's right to regulate the use of firearms and was enforced by overzealous federal agents more interested in reporting large numbers of convictions than in stopping criminal conduct.

"Law enforcement needs to be directed at criminals, not determine the state of the processing of the control of the state of the stat

Lawen froeremen reeds to be directed at criminals, not at dealers who make an honest mistake in bookkeeping or average Americans who want to buy firearms without going through a maze of regulations and restrictions.

Under the new bill, citizens will be able to purchase guns in other states and transport them across state lines so long as the sale compiles with the law of both states. And gun owners will be allowed to carry their firearms to other states so long as the gun is unloaded and inaccessible, such as in the trunk of a car.

There are over 60 million handguns in the United States, and 99.4 percent are used for legal purposes. Kentuckians and all Americans have a constitutional right to keep and bear arms. This new bill makes it easier for them to do just that.

requires school districts to raise their tax rates to 25 cents per \$100 assessment in order to receive additional funding. Presently, 43 districts out of the state's 180 are below the 25 cent level, including Rockcastle.

Rockcastle.

The 15 cent rate is the minimum set by the state for school districts to be eligible for funding under the equalization program, which distributes funds from richer school districts to the poorer school districts.

poorer school districts. State Rep. Danny Ford, along with other Republicans in the General Assembly, did not like an amendment that changed the wording in the education tax bill from ''may'' by 25 cents per hundred to ''shall'' be 25 cents per

If the word had remained then the tax increase would have been subject to recall and would have allowed vote vote for or against the tax increase. It was not to be. The 'shall" votes prevailed.

"shall" votes prevailed Ackcastle Property Valuation Administrator Einner Hale said the new tax rate would "hur!" most taxpayers with big property assessments. The more property hey have, the more they pay. "Some businesses in the county could see as much as \$800 more on their tax bill." Hale stated. "It could be a hardship for alot of people. However, the older homeowners will not be hurt as much because of their homestead exemption."

market the year round, but they are at their best from early summer through December. The attr. crisp apple is a perfect snack or dessert, and when it is eaten raw, it makes a pleasing, low-calorie morsel.

A medium-sized apple, about two and one-half inches in diameter, has only about 75 calories. In addition, apples provide bulk in the dieft for the proper function of the body's digestive and regulatory systems. The apple is low in sodium and fairly high in potasium, making it an excellent natural snack.

When you buy apples, look for firm, crisp; well-clouder fruit. Avoid those with shrivield skins, bruises, worm holes and decayed systs. Handle them gen't a select-because rough handling select-because rough handling defects.

To store apples, keep the erfert ones for later use. Itse

defects.
To store apples, kep the perfect ones for later use. Use those with bruises or skin breaks soon as possible to avoid decayed spots. Apples that are slightly under-ripe should be stored in a cool place at 60 to 70 degrees to ripen.

Once ripe, apples will keep best stored in the home refrigerator for a week or longer.

Apples need some moisture and can be stored in the fruit or vegetable drawer or in ventilated plastic begs.

More than 2.500 apple varieties are found in the U.S. but Lodi, Red Dellicious, Roime, Winesap, McIntosh, Johnsthan, Cort. Lodi, Red Dellicious are the verieties most easily available and popular in Kentucky. The Lodi and Red Dellicious are found in early and mid-summer while the season for the other varieties is in late summer and fall.


