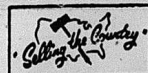

### 4-H FASHION REVIEW

Recently 33 4-H'ers went to a "Garden Party." This was the 4-H Fashion Review where they were able to show off their garments they have worked so hard on.

The review was held at Rockcastle County High School on

Sunday afternoon, April 20.

For the past six weeks, these 4-H'ers have been hard at work on their projects. Sometimes it seemed that the major thing that everyone learned was to use a seam ripper. Eventually, though, all garments were completed and turned in to be judged on construction.

In the first unit, the girls

made simple gathered skirts and the boys shorts. They learned how to make a casing and finish seams. The overall champion in Unit I was Callie Mullins.

The second year sewers advanced to making a top with facings. They developed some of the sewing techniques they had learned in their first unit. The Unit II champion was Jerry Makin. Four other boys also completed their sewing projects, although they did not model them.

Unit III is the year that the 4-H'ers learn to sew on knit materials. Sweat suits are a popular garment for this unit. The Unit III champion was Christy Callahan.

In Unit IV, the 4-H'ers learned how to put in sleeves, buttonholes, and collar. Larissa Hayes was the Unit IV champion.

### There'll be changes made

## Agriculture agencies moving

In a move that has been expected for several weeks, federal and state agencies in the Rockcastle Courthouse will move to a new location.

Harold Ballinger of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS), reported Tuesday a lease has been signed to move his office, the Farmers Home Administration office (FmHA) and the Soil Conservation Service (SCS) to the vacant

Western Auto store on Richmond Street.

Also to move are the Extension Service office (Tom Mills), Home Economics (Cheryl Witt), and 4-H (Martha Wesley).

The move will be made between June 20 and July 1, Ballinger reported.

He also reported other office space possibly could be taken by Veterinarian Joe Korn, who is completing his university work. Korn is the son-in-law of Bob Fields.

Another space is being considered by Home Health, which has offices in the Rockcastle County Health Department building.

The Western Auto building, owned by Estill Hodges of Mt. Vernon, will be remodeled according to a floor plan devised by the new occupants.

The building is being leased to the federal offices for \$824.67 a month. The extension office will pay \$310 a month.

Ballinger said the decision to move from the courthouse was prompted by the asbestos ceilings in his offices. Asbestos is considered a health hazard. There is no handicap access to the second floor extension office, and the poor state of repair of the building's walls and ceilings, particularly in his office areas also were reasons for moving. He called the asbestos the "dangerous kind."

The asbestos problem is prevalent in many public and

## Fiscal court gets no bids

Faced with no bids and the necessity to make changes to the courthouse building to accommodate the handicapped, the Rockcastle Fiscal Court voted at its Tuesday meeting to advertise for bids, again.

Bids for the project that is mandated by the state, will be opened at 10:15 a.m. May 20 at a called meeting of the court. Persons who wish to submit bids should contact County Judge Executive Hubert Thacker or the magistrates and submit bids by 4 p.m. May 19.

The project calls for a ramp leading to the second floor at the rear of the building, changes in restrooms, and changes at the rear parking lot.

Previous bids received by the court last month were turned down because of clarity. Bidders may not have been bidding on the same specifications.

It was a relatively light agenda for the court that in recent months have struggled with garbage problems, money and insurance.

The court voted to approve Byron Baker as commissioner for the Northern Rockcastle Water District.

Lois Philbeck resigned her position in the commodity program and the court appointed

Edna Cameron to replace her.

Danny Joe McKinney was hired by the court to county road work, both as a truck driver and heavy equipment operator. Mrs. Emmitt Foster asked the court to void a lease on her property that had been leased by the county for a sanitary landfill.

## Brodhead OK's fire station

After several stops and starts over the past year, the Brodhead City Council accepted a low bid for a new fire station at its meeting Monday night.

A low bid of \$38,327 from Bill Wheel of Brodhead (Lawson Wheel) was accepted by the council. It was nearly \$10,000 less than the only other bid of \$48,184 from Carter Johnson and Johnny Lunsford of Brodhead.

The new station will be on a lot adjoining the present fire station/city hall building, but will not be connected.

It will be two-story with 2,000 square feet on each floor. The

upstairs will not be finished under the present contract that begins June 1 and runs through Oct. 6.

The city will furnish most of the money for the project. However, the Brodhead Fire Department will also help with the cost. Fire Chief Brian Bussell told the council. Bussell said the department already has \$8,000 contributed by local people and he expects to have another \$2,000 by July that can be applied to the cost. Contributions are continuing to be received. Anyone wishing to contribute may give money to firemen.

## Shepherd not guilty; Civil suit in question

A Rockcastle District Court jury took 20 minutes to find Gary Shepherd not guilty on a drunk-in-public charge in court action Tuesday.

Shepherd, 37, who lives on Brindle Ridge, was arrested on the Brodhead Fairgrounds Aug. 10, 1985 and failed along with his companion David Deborde.

The drunk-in-public charge against Deborde was dismissed in District Court several weeks ago on grounds of lack of evidence and upon payment of \$47.50 court costs by Deborde.

Soon after his arrest, Shepherd filed suit in Rockcastle Circuit Court against the City of Brodhead and Policeman Bill Lawrence claiming he was arrested "wrongfully, unlawfully and without probable cause." He asked for "in excess of \$2,500."

That suit was dismissed later by Circuit Judge Dan Vinters on the grounds it was filed prematurely or before a court decision of the drunk-in-public charge was resolved.

Whether the suit will be refilled is yet known. The suit had not been refilled by Shepherd's attorney Roger M. Oliver of Berea by noon Wednesday.

On the witness stand, Shepherd claimed he was suffering from injuries received in a motorcycle accident which caused him to stagger just before he was arrested. Lawrence maintained he had observed the two men for considerable time before he arrested them for being drunk.

In his suit against the city and Lawrence, Shepherd claimed at the time of his arrest he was acting in a "quiet, peaceful and law abiding manner" and that his arrest was "without just cause or excuse and/or with gross negligence and recklessness and with wanton disregard for the rights of the plaintiff."

Brodhead Councilman Ronnie Cash said following the trial that the council would discuss the matter, probably during a previously called meeting of the council scheduled for Monday night.

## Murder charge is filed in shooting of brother-in-law

A Calloway man is dead and his brother-in-law is charged with murder following a shooting about 8 p.m. Monday.

William Ray "Billy" Hellard, 31, of Fairground Hill, Mt. Vernon, was shot once in the chest with a .22 caliber pistol. He died in the Rockcastle County Hospital about an hour later.

Charged with murder is James Lee "Jimmy" Sandusky, 19, of Calloway. Sandusky is married to Hellard's sister. Sandusky is being held in the Rockcastle County Jail in lieu of a \$75,000 cash bond.

The shooting reportedly stemmed from a family argument in front of the Sandusky house in Calloway Hollow.

He was born in Madison County on August 7, 1954, the son of Leon and Imogene Greer Hellard. Besides his parents, he is

survived by his wife, Molly Bullock Hellard, a son, William Paul Hellard of Brush Creek, two daughters, Gina Lee Hellard of Brush Creek and Samantha Jean Hellard of Mt. Vernon; a step-son, Ronnie Monk; three step-daughters, Regina, Michelle and Gail Monk; all of Mt. Vernon; two brothers, Donald Lee Hellard and James Albert Hellard, both of Calloway; two sisters, Loreta Mink of Sand Hill and Beverly Lee Sandusky of Calloway and his maternal grandfather, Stearns Greer of Mt. Vernon.

Services will be conducted at 2 p.m. Thursday (today) at the Sand Hill Baptist Church with Br. Elzie Doan officiating. Burial will follow in the Sand Hill Cemetery. Friends may call at the church until time for services. Arrangements are by the Dowell & Martin Funeral Home.

## Local school board must fill swamp area near school

In order for the Rockcastle County Board of Education to have enough property for the construction of a new school where Mt. Vernon Elementary is located, agreement must be done about the 6 1/2 acres of "swamp" land on the

property. The local board took the first step to do just that during their regular monthly meeting Tuesday night.

At the request of local district conservator David Stipes, the board voted to enter into an agreement with the federal government to clean up the swamp acreage so that it will be suitable for playground use. At the present time the land is not suitable for any outdoor activity.

## Arson suspected in home fire

Arson is suspected as the cause of an early morning fire Monday that destroyed a house rented to a state trooper, state police at London said.

Longtime trooper Stanley Hale, assigned to patrol Laurel County, was not home when the fire destroyed his house on Ky. 830 five miles south of London. The home was owned by Bill Abrams of London; said Gilbert Acicardo, Sr., a state police arson investigator.

Arson is also suspected in a fire at the house early last Saturday. That fire did "minimal" damage to the house but destroyed an adjacent garage, as well as a van, a car and two tractors in the garage.

The federal government would contribute \$11,000 of the total cost. The local board would be responsible for the remaining \$6,000.

The board agreed to allow Stipes to submit a measure plan agreement to the proper people so that he could begin trying to get the project and money approved. The local conservator told the board that it would most likely be 1987 before any work could be done on the project because federal monies had already been earmarked for this year.

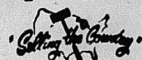

Louisville. When customers seek information of various kinds, the operator will be in Louisville.

He said the company would try to find jobs in the company for the operators, but noted that most operators are not qualified for the technical experience necessary.

The company executive also told the group the company is in the process of completing a \$3,484,925 program to upgrade service in the five Contel counties in Southeastern Kentucky, including Rockcastle.

He explained that the most advanced equipment is being installed, and by Dec. 1, the company will begin the process of making one-party service available countywide, and the eventual elimination of the mileage charge that in some cases "is very high."

There will be no general increase in rates to offset the construction costs, he added.

The Rockcastle work should be completed in about six months, he continued. He reported there are 1,700 four-party subscribers in Rockcastle, with 519 paying a \$5 a mile charge. The one-party base rate will be \$3.63 more than the

four-party base rate. The company has about 4,500 subscribers in the county.

Included in the new facilities are three "remote" stations, one each at Ottawa, Roundstone and Livingston, which will replace large transmission lines.

Calling the Community Action Team "an important factor in community relations," Thomason said the team's objective will be to assist the various communities in any way possible, and to keep the public advised of the company's responsibilities as a good corporate citizen in the community.

**Light ballot in May primary**

It will be a "light" ballot in the forthcoming May 27 primary election.

Of most interest in Rockcastle County will be the candidacy of one attorney from the county, Joseph E. Lambert of Mt. Vernon, who is seeking a seat on the Kentucky Supreme Court, District 3.

Other candidates in addition to Lambert are Charles R. Luker, Morris Butler and Norma Adams. Voters will choose one. The justice seat is non-partisan. The two candidates receiving the largest number of votes will face each other in the Nov. 4 general election.

On the ballot for U.S. Senator on the Republican ticket are Jackson M. Andrews, Carl Wayne Brown, Thurman Jerome Hamlin and Tommy Klein.

Senator Ford is not on the primary ballot since he has no Democratic opposition, but will face the Republican nominee in November.

County Clerk Norma Houk reminded voters that an application for an absentee ballot must be obtained from the clerk by May 20 in order to vote. The ballot may be returned any time before polls close on election day.

**Organization meeting set for Lambert**

An organization meeting will be held for Joe Lambert, candidate for the Kentucky Supreme Court on Tuesday, May 13, at 7:30 p.m. at the Red Top Restaurant, located just north of Mt. Vernon on U.S. 25.

"I want as many Rockcastle County people as possible to attend this meeting. We have an opportunity to elect one of our own to Kentucky's highest court," said Lambert. "This is a non-partisan race and everyone is invited. I need the strong support of my friends here at home."

**Rockcastle lawyers endorse Lambert**

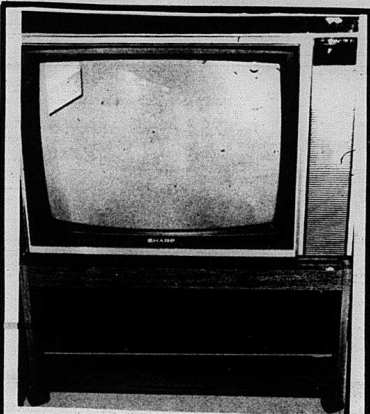

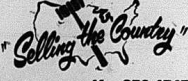

## Ag dept. cuts burley quota; places restrictions on crop

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has cut burley tobacco quotas by 6 percent for the 1986 crop, and at this time, is standing firm on reducing loans 4.3 percent that would be paid to producers under the price support program for tobacco going to cooperatives.

The national basic quota this year is 493.5 million pounds. The effective quota, or actual sale quota after surpluses sold in 1985 have been subtracted, is 463 million pounds.

Quotas for Kentucky and other individual states will not be available until about May 10, according to burley officials. Kentucky's basic quota, however, is expected to drop from 351 million pounds in 1985 to about 330 million this year. The state's effective quota is expected to be slightly less than 310 million pounds.

Individual farm quotas are expected to be mailed to producers about May 16.

It is the fourth consecutive year quotas have been reduced. They also were cut 5 percent in 1983, 10 percent in 1984 and 10 percent in 1985, for a total of 31 percent during the four-year period. The 463 million pound effective quota is 45 percent lower than the record 841.9 million pounds set in 1981, and is the lowest effective in the modern history of the tobacco program.

This year's reduction in quotas is the first one based on a new formula included in the recently enacted Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985.

Under the new formula, quotas to the Agricultural Act of 1938, burley quotas for 1986 and future years will be based on three factors: intended purchases by cigarette manufacturers, preceding 3-year average annual exports, and supplies needed to attain minimum reserve stocks.

Quota reductions will be limited to 6 percent each year through 1989, and a maximum of 10 percent per year from 1990 through 1993. Other modifications to the tobacco program include the amount of burley marketed.

**Disadvantaged and Handicapped Students**

The Carl D. Perkins Vocational Education Act of 1984 puts heavy emphasis on meeting the occupational training needs of disadvantaged and handicapped individuals.

Rockcastle County Schools are helping to meet these needs by offering special vocational courses and programs for disadvantaged and handicapped persons in this community.

Several kinds of assistance are available to students with special needs. One example of such help includes identifying the occupational skills and capabilities of the individual, and then designing vocational training with a goal of employment. This is done prior to enrollment in the program.

For the "special needs" student, an individual plan is drawn up. The student knows his/her potential, and the plan serves as a motivator as well as a chart for progress.

Besides working with the student, parental input is being sought, too. We need to work with parents so they may help with the career development process.

All programs will be offered to disadvantaged and handicapped students at Rockcastle County High School and the Harry Sparks Vocational School.
