The U.S. Department of Agriculture has cut burley tobacco quotas by 6 percent for the 1986 crop, and at this time, is standing firm on reducing loans 4.3 percent that would be paid to producers under the price support program for tobacco going to cooperatives.

Individual farm quotas 'are expected to be mailed to producers about May 16.

The 463 million pound effec-tive quota is 45 percent lower than the record \$41.9 million pounds set in 1981, and is the lowest effective in the modern history of the robacco program.
