

Mt. Vernon Attorney Joseph E. Lambert won a primary victory for a seat on 'the Kentucky Supreme Court in Tuesday's elec-tion that observers said was the "lightest" vote in memory. Lambert will face Charles R. Luker of London in the November General Election.

Although the election is non-partisan, both finalists are Repub-licans.
The unofficial total showed Lambert with 13.744 votes, Luker with 11.680; Morris R. Butler with 10.379, and Norma' Adams of

10.379 and Norma Adams of Somerset with 8,687. Butler was the only Democrat on the ticket in the predominantly Republican 28-county Third Dis-In the Republican race for the

right to face incumbent Democrat U.S. Senator Wendell Ford in November, Jackson Andrews ap-peared to be the winner over three

Unofficial totals in that race showed Andrews with 15,127 votes, Carl Brown with 9,061, Tommy Klein with 8,301, and Thurman Hamlin with 6,708.

In Rockcastle, in the Supreme Court race, Lambert received a lopsided 1,062 votes, Luker had 90 votes, Butler, 56, and Adams, 52. In the Senate race in Rockcas-tle, Andrews got, 202, Brown, 99, Hamlin, 70, and Kjelin, 69. As expected Lambert ran well

ahead of his opponents in Rockcas-tle. He did not fare as well in Laurel, the home of Luker, who received 4.095 votes to Lambert's 477. Luker also did well in Clay where he got 1.986 to Lambert's 246 and in Know where he 246. and in Knox where h received 1.435 to Lambert's 194.

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



### EARLY GARDEN PRODUCE

Soon many of you will have fresh peas. spinach, and new potatoes right in your garden or available at produce stands.

For peak flavor, it's best to prepare produce as soon as it's picked. And, proper storage helps retain the nutrients and freshness from garden to microwave. Peas are sweetest when freshly picked, tand be refrigerated in pods in uncovered containers up to two

days. New potatoes should be stored in a cool, dark, dry place front refrigerated). Spinach should be washed thoroughly, drained and stored in a nitright container. Your microwave is perfect for cooking vegetables. Since less water is used in vegetable cooking, more of the nutrients and color are retained. The following recipes will guide you to easy, healtful cooking in the days ahead.

### COUNTRY PEAS

4 cups snapped sugar snap peas Dash nutmeg 2 green onions, sliced 1/4 teaspoon salt




