

Brodhead store reports break-in

lower speeds, the use of occupant restraints and fewer drunk drivers on the road have definitely made an impact in the reduction of fatalities," said Elkins.

The 1985 report identifies unsafe speed as the major contributing factor in fatal accidents, followed by alcohol involvement and failure to yield the right-of-way.

The report also demonstrates the lifesaving advantages of wearing safety belts. Ninety-five percent of those vehicle occupants killed in Kentucky traffic accidents last year were not wearing safety belts.

Another reason for using safety belts is cited in the report—the ejection rate. "A person ejected from a vehicle is 25 times more likely to be killed than a person who remains in the vehicle. This is evident in the report, where 69 percent of those thrown from a vehicle last year were killed," says Elkins.

Other highlights from the 1985 Traffic Accident Facts report: While 1985 fatal accidents declined by 8.4 percent, non-fatal damage accidents rose by 3.4 percent.

Motor vehicle accident costs in Kentucky exceeded \$659 million, which includes wage losses, medical expenses and damage to property.

There was a 10 percent

decrease in the number of alcohol-involved accidents from 1984 to 1985. Altogether, 7,744 alcohol-involved accidents were reported last year with 168 persons killed and 5,297 persons injured in these accidents.

Fifty-three children under the age of four were involved in fatal accidents. Twelve of these were killed and only one was in a child safety seat.

Of the drivers involved in accidents, 56 percent of them were between the ages of 16 and 34; 61 percent were male and 7.8 percent were out-of-state drivers.

As a result of 12,893 "hit and run" accidents last year, 13 pedestrians were killed and 495 pedestrians were injured. Passenger cars made up 88 percent of the vehicles involved in accidents in 1985. Trucks made up six percent and other vehicles (motorcycles, buses, etc.) made up six percent.

Fifty-three percent of Kentucky's accidents occurred on U.S. Routes and State Highways.

where the population grew by 13.6 percent largely because of 12,000 more people moved in than left, and Warren County, where an immigration of 7,200 people pushed the population increase to 14.1 percent.

In southeast Kentucky, Breathitt, Letcher and Owsley counties lost 5 percent or more of their population. Surprisingly, some counties in Eastern Kentucky had migration gains despite relatively high rates of unemployment. They included Estill, Jackson, Johnson, Lawrence, Lee, Menifee, Powell and Wolfe counties.

"The unusual combination of in-migration and high unemployment is not easy to explain, but analysts see it as indicative of the lack of job opportunities either inside or outside the region for workers with below-average schooling," Ford's report said.

unopposed in his candidacy for re-election to a fourth term. In the statewide election, Democratic incumbent U.S. Sen. Wendell Ford is seeking another term. His republican opponent is Jackson M. Andrews of St. Matthews.

Two constitutional amendments will be on the ballot. Voters will decide if the state school superintendent should be appointed rather than elected.

A second amendment would allow the mayor of first and second class cities to serve two consecutive terms beyond the original term, in short, three terms.

According to the Hunt application, the station studios would be in Mt. Vernon. The transmitter and 254-foot tower would be located atop Bowling Ridge two miles west of Brodhead on property owned by Devala Bussell Sr.

The station, no matter who receives the permit, will have limited range and can be heard in such communities as Brodhead, Crab Orchard, Roundstone, Wil-Conway, Broughtontown, Conway and a small section of Garrard County. Livingston would be generally out of the listening area. Unlike AM stations, FM stations listening areas are dictated by terrain (mountains, buildings). The Hunt application indicates a small portion of southeast Mt. Vernon would not receive a "predicted" signal and would be in "shadow." But 80 percent of the city would receive the full signal.

The Hunt station proposes a format of middle of the road programming with religious and public affairs features. They will abide by the requirements of the fairness doctrine in its public affairs programming.

The Cochran-Smith application indicates the station would be jointly owned by Smith, Other officers in the company are his wife, Velma Smith, listed as vice president.

The transmitter and 299 foot tower would be located just off "C" Creek Road southeast of Brodhead on land owned by Sammy Ford. Studios would likely be at WVK since it is co-located at a Mt. Vernon station. Like the Hunt station, there could be possible "shadowing" in some areas, particularly south of Mt. Vernon because of the mountains.

The Smith station proposes a country music program format and would provide local and national news coverage with emphasis on local news. The station would abide by the requirements of the fairness doctrine.

The Hunt station would be 3,000 watts; the Smith station, 2,200 watts. Since both cover the same service area, it takes more power for the Hunt station signal to reach the area than the Smith station, since the Hunt transmitter and tower would be farther away.

Hal Smith and songwriter Hank Cochran are former owners

of Renfro Valley. Later, Smith became the sole owner of WVK and moved the station west of Renfro Valley to the KOA campground area. Cochran's name was left on the title after he sold to Smith.

Although the cost of an FM station depends on many factors, a considered estimate would be about \$50,000, including transmitter, tower, studio/offices, legal and engineering fees.

There has been no indication from the FCC when it will act on the applications. It would be one month or six, or more. The next step would be the notification by the FCC that the applications have been filed.





Garbage hearing scheduled today at courthouse

A working session on the proposed garbage plan for Rockcastle County has been scheduled for 11 a.m. today (Thursday) between the Rockcastle Fiscal Court and the Cumberland Valley Area Development District (CVADD) at the courthouse.

The public is invited to participate in what is billed as an "informal" meeting at which time questions can be answered and any difficulties ironed out.

The meeting is "unofficial" and no decisions are expected. "We simply want to talk things over with the court and answer any questions the magistrates may have," said Tim Schwendeman, division specialist for CVADD. "We also want to assure the court we will help with the solid waste program when it is finally adopted. We just won't walk away and leave them."

Schwendeman said a recent request by the Kentucky Department of Water Management to correct "deficiencies" in the county program will be clarified.

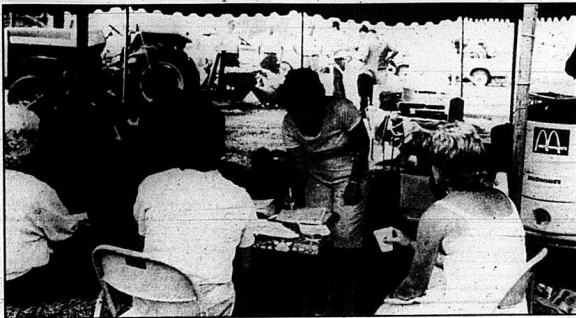
"Some of these call for just a clarification, so we hope to have the program back to the state quickly," Schwendeman said.

Although some officials believe the "voluntary" program that the county plans to put into effect could work if there is cooperation by all concerned, others say it is unlikely and the program should be mandatory.

"We hope the voluntary program will work," Schwendeman related. "At least the county should try that method. After a reasonable time, if it doesn't, then the plan could be made mandatory."

There were 16 deficiencies in the plan, according to the state review. They range from detailed explanations of Mt. Vernon's role.

County receives more grants

Area Development Fund grant awards totaling \$50,000 for Rockcastle County have been announced by the Cumberland Valley Area Development District.

A grant totaling \$30,000 for repairs at the Rockcastle County Fairgrounds in Broadhead is the largest of the awards.

The money will be used specifically to construct a cover over the fairgrounds grandstand.

Any money left will be used for other purposes in the grounds that would be determined at that time.

No county funds were involved in acquiring the grants.

The cities of Mt. Vernon and Livingston were each awarded \$10,000 grants for the purchase of new police cruisers.

The grants are for the 1987-88 biennium as allocated by the Kentucky General Assembly, with the money becoming available in 1987.

Figures for Kentucky accidents in the Kentucky State Police, and in Rockcastle in 1985, the number of accidents were up over 1984 and more people were killed.

In 1984, there were 350 accidents compared to 422 in 1985. There were six fatal accidents in the county in 1985 compared to four in 1984. Non-fatal accidents in 1985 totaled 110 with 83 in 1984.

There were 306 property damage accidents in 1985 compared to 269 in 1984.

Alcohol played a part in accidents, with 39 in 1985 and 30 in 1984. In all cases it was the driver who was drinking. In Kentucky in 1985, 715 persons were killed in motor vehicle accidents, 52 fewer fatalities than 1984, and the lowest fatality rate since 1961.

Motor vehicle fatalities have

Election campaign begins with first candidate filing for local school board seat

The opening round of the fall election campaign was fired this week when Dr. Rudolph Burdette announced he is a candidate for a fifth term on the Rockcastle County Board of Education in the Nov. 4 General Election.

Dr. Burdette, who is chairman of the board, has been a member of the board since 1970. He said the continued support of voters would be greatly appreciated.

He will file in Division I which includes West Mt. Vernon, North Mt. Vernon and Bullock.

Another board member's term also expires, that of Division 3 incumbent George Poynter of Livingston.

Division 3 includes South Mt. Vernon, East Livingston and West Livingston. Poynter has not indicated whether he will be a candidate for re-election.

No other seats on the board are up for election. Other members are Willie Taylor, Edna Cameron and Kenneth Adams.

Filing for the two seats will continue to 6 p.m., August 28.

A candidate must live within the district in which he is filing, and present a petition with the names of 20 qualified voters from

that district to County Clerk Norma Hook.

A new law on elections went into effect this month. All candidates for election (including school board candidates) must file reports and expenditures with the Kentucky Finance Cabinet at the conclusion of the election regardless of whether the candidate won or lost.

In years past only county-wide candidates were required to file campaign receipts and expenditures. Clerk Hook will have additional information.

Also on the fall ballot will be two local candidates, one of whom has been campaigning since the May primary.

Attorney Joseph F. Lambert is opposed by Laurel County Judge Charles R. Laker for a seat on the 28 county, Third District of the Kentucky Supreme Court.

Attorney Lambert was the front runner in the non-partisan primary in May. Both candidates are Republicans.

Lambert said this week his campaign is progressing well and that he had already visited 17 counties in the district.

Incumbent Republican State Rep. Danny Ford of Mt. Vernon is

Applications filed with FCC for FM radio station

Two applications have been made with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) for the construction of a frequency modulation (FM) radio station in Mt. Vernon.

One application has been made by . . .

owner J. Hal Smith of Goddetsville, Tenn., doing business as Cochran-Smith Broadcasting in Mt. Vernon. The other was made by George L. Lovel Hunt and his wife, Padmine C. Hunt of Mt. Vernon, doing business as Rockcastle Broadcasting.

There could be another application from an out-of-state applicant, but this has not been reported. A public notice has not been forwarded to the Signal as prescribed by law.

Applications were to have been at the FCC offices in Washington, D.C. by July 7. That does not mean the application was actually filed by the deadline. It must have been accepted by the FCC before it can be considered legally filed.

When asked, Jim Gaskin, general manager/engineer for

WRVK said an application can arrive at the FCC and lie on a desk for days before it is actually found and filed. When it's found, and stamped it is only then considered filed.

"You never know," Gaskin stated. "The FCC could turn both applications down for not filing on time and still say we could file again during July 1990 or some time."

Police destroy marijuana plants

Three patches of marijuana have been discovered and destroyed in Rockcastle County, according to a report by Kentucky State Police.

Detective Ernie Boggs and Trooper Gary Lane located the plants on property owned by Leroy Monk, Marlow Hollow Road in the Sand Springs area.

Monk, 36, was charged with cultivating marijuana and jailed. Seventeen plants were destroyed.

Also located and destroyed were 25 plants found six miles west of Mt. Vernon in the Ottawa section. No arrests were made.

County gained population

Although nearly 10,000 people moved out of Kentucky in the first half of the decade, there was a 2.7 percent gain in Rockcastle County's population.

The figure, and several others, were reported by the University of Kentucky's Center for Developmental Change.

The county grew by 618 persons from 1980 to 1985 to the current county population of 14,591 for a 4.4 percent change.

When births and deaths are added and subtracted, it is estimated that 400 migrated during the period for a net gain of 2.7 percent.

However, in Kentucky as noted, it is estimated that 10,000 more people left Kentucky than

came into the state. Population is now estimated at a little over two million.

The nation's population grew 5.4 percent in the time period and Kentucky's increase was only 2.4 percent.

In surrounding counties, Jackson had a 4.4 percent increase; Garrard, 5.3 percent and Madison lost one percent.

In comparison, Todd County lost 10.3 percent and Fulton, 9.8 percent.

A bright spot on the population map of Kentucky is south-central Kentucky, where most counties had migration gains. The leaders were Edmonson County.

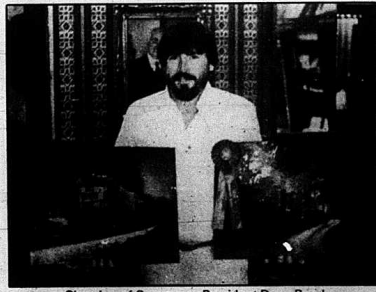

ripe ones, or any with bruises, or soft spots.

Wash tomatoes. To loosen skins, dip tomatoes into boiling water for about 1/2 minutes, then dip quickly into cold water. Cut out stem ends and peel.

Raw Pack

To raw-pack tomatoes, leave them whole or cut in halves or quarters. Pack them to within about 1/2 inch of top, pressing gently to fill spaces with tomatoes, or juice. Don't add water.

To each jar add the recommended amount of lemon juice or tomato canning tablets. When using lemon juice, add 1 tsp. salt to quart jars and 1/2 tsp. to pints for flavor, if desired.

Work out any air bubbles with a table knife or spatula. If there is more than 1/2 inch of headspace in the jar, bring up the level by adding a slice or two of tomatoes. Wipe jar rims clean. Adjust jar lids. Process in boiling-water bath canner. 35 minutes for pints

and 45 minutes for quarts.

Hot Pack

To hot-pack, cut peeled tomatoes into quarters and bring to a boil, stirring to keep from sticking. Pack boiling hot into the jars, processed as above, and add the recommended lemon juice or tablets. Process in boiling-water-bath canner, 10 minutes for both quarts and pints.

Freeze Your Corn For Winter Treat

If you have the freezer space, freeze your fresh corn this summer for pleasurable eating this winter.

Freezing Corn-on-the-Cob

When freezing sweet corn any style, work with small batches. Pick, husk and process quickly for that fresh-from-the-garden flavor in the frozen product. Using a vegetable brush on the ear of corn, under cold running water, helps clean off the silks that cling.

Choose the best ears you can find, with plump, tender kernels and thin sweet milk. Husk, remove silk, and wash, and sort ears according to size. Heat them in boiling water: 7 minutes for small ears, 9 minutes for medium ears, and 11 minutes for large ears. Cool the ears or corn promptly and very thoroughly in ice water and then drain. Pack into freezer containers—freezer bags are especially handy for ears of corn. Seal, label and freeze immediately.

For the best flavor, eat up within 12 months.

Freezing Whole-Kernel Corn

Choose ears with plump, tender kernels and thin, sweet milk. If the milk is already thick and starchy, save ears for fresh eating right away.

*Husk ears, remove silk, and wash corn. Heat ears in boiling water for four minutes, then cool promptly in ice water. Cut corn

from the cob at about two-thirds the depth of the kernels.

Put corn into containers, leaving 1/2 inch headspace. Seal, label and freeze immediately.

Freezing Cream-Style Corn

Follow the same directions for cream-style corn, except cut corn from the cob at about the center of the kernels. Then scrape the cobs with the back of the knife to remove the juice and the heart of the kernel.

Canning Tomatoes

To increase the acidity of home-canned tomatoes, we now recommend adding bottled lemon juice or commercial tomato canning tablets containing citric acid and salt to each jar before processing.

Don't substitute fresh lemon juice, however, because the acidity varies. To each pint or quart jar of tomatoes or juice you should add one of the following: Bottled lemon juice, quart jar-4 tsp; pint jar-2 tsp. Tomato canning tablets, quart jar-2 tsp; pint jar, 1 tsp.

Use Perfect Tomatoes. Can only firm, ripe perfect tomatoes. Don't ever can overly-

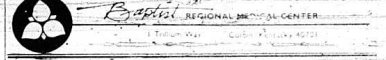
Rockcastle Raceway news

Rogers Reports

Helps for our tobacco growers' a push for more coal sales overseas, reductions in imported textile and clothing products, each of these issues is important to the Fifth District. This week in my House Appropriations Committee, I was able to work, in a positive way, on each of these problems which faces our district's economy.

When I was first chosen for the Appropriations panel in 1982, it was with the idea of working directly on the key issues which face our people: jobs, public works projects, and other improvements to life in rural Kentucky. In our current work on next year's appropriations bills, I believe we are making important progress in many of these areas.

For example, in the area of agriculture, I was able to include instructions in the appropriations legislation to continue the work on researching the marketing potential for supplemental crops for our Kentucky tobacco growers.

We approved another \$142,000 for "Project: Agriculture Diversity," which links U.S.D.A. and the University of Kentucky in a major effort to fine new markets for Kentucky produce. I also was successful in getting the Agricultural Marketing Service to become involved in helping a new federation of farmer co-ops, including two in our district, as they expand their sales of vegetables nationally. This will hopefully improve our farm income in the years ahead.

In the area of coal, I included instructions in the spending bill

for the Departments of State and Commerce which will help set up coal "receptions" at our foreign embassies. There, we can pitch a American coal directly to foreign buyers, with the strength of the federal government behind us. We need to sell more coal overseas to help employ more miners, and these gatherings can help. I also was successful in getting coal more attention at the ongoing trade talks we have with Japan, traditionally our biggest coal buyer.

For our textile and clothing workers, I helped push through some instructions for the Commerce Department to tighten up on its regulation of imported textiles and clothing. We need to stem the rapidly rising tide of imported textiles, and this provision should help prevent major new increases in textile imports of specific items.

Most of us associate the Appropriations Committee with specific projects. The Cumberland Gap Tunnel, Big South Fork recreation area, Upper Cumberland River flood control and more. These, of course, are vital projects for the future of the Fifth District.

But through my work on the committee, I am also working to change some of our government policies which also have a major impact on the residents of our region. By helping tobacco growers find new crops and new markets, by selling more coal abroad, and by tightening up on textile imports, all of us can benefit.

The series was acquired from the British Broadcasting Corporation and adapted for the "Frontline" presentation. Each documentary will be followed by an in-studio segment with "Frontline" anchor Judy Woodruff and experts in Soviet affairs.

"Comrades--A Special Frontline Series with Judy Woodruff" profiles Soviet citizens of various backgrounds, cultures and professions. Never before has a Western film team been given such freedom in the Soviet Union. The people in the series express opinions about politics and the West, but the series is really about the way they live, their homes, jobs and families.

She is a model Soviet citizen who talks with humor and frankness about love, sex and marriage in a revealing documentary about the lifestyle and ambitions of an outstanding Young Communist League member. It follows Rita as she completes her education at a prestigious school and begins her

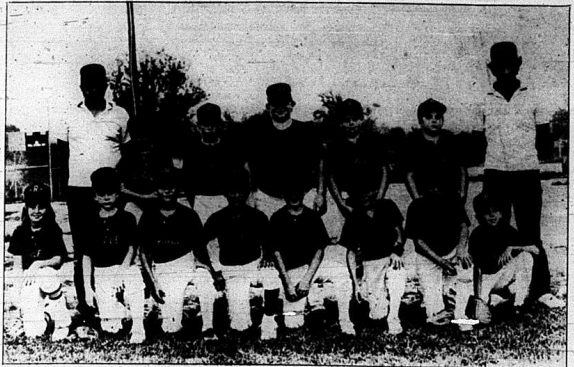

If the purchase price is not paid in full at the time of sale or upon delivery of deed, a lien will be retained to secure the unpaid purchase price plus interest. The purchaser shall be privileged to pay the purchase price in full upon the date of sale or at anytime prior to the maturity date of the bond. In which event, the purchaser shall pay interest only to and including the date of such payment in full.

The bond shall have the force and effect of Judgment and shall be remain a lien upon the property sold as additional surety for the payment of the purchase price.

A federal right of redemption shall exist if any federal agency has a lien or interest in said real property.

After making said sale the Special Master Commissioner shall pay the cost of the sale, court costs, delinquent property taxes, attorney fees and thereafter, the balance is to be divided among the plaintiffs and defendants as their interest shall appear.

Risk and loss of improvements shall be on the purchaser from the date of sale.

The 1986 property taxes shall be paid by the purchaser.

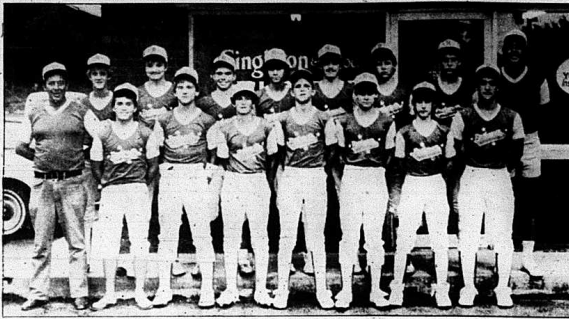

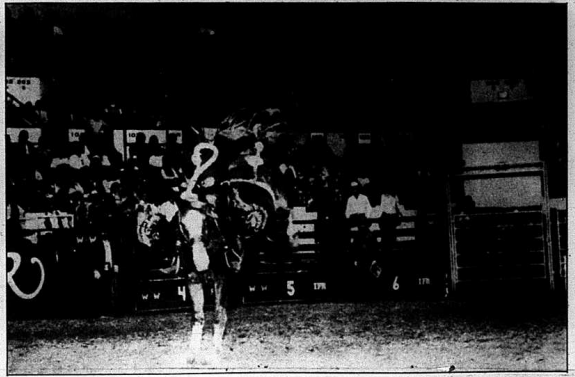

common behavior disorder of childhood. This condition appears to be up to six times more common in boys than girls. The reason for this is not known, but recent studies

suggest it may be because boys more frequently display aspects of ADD that adults consider "bad" such as hyperactivity and this leads them to come to medical attention.

Cause of the condition are not known, but certainly some cases

result from minimal brain damage at or around the time of birth. There is no scientific evidence that eating sugar or food additives causes the condition, though there is much popular belief in this.

For children who truly have the condition of ADD, it is not

an easy diagnosis to make, benefit can be obtained by the use of drugs such as Ritalin or Dextroamphetamine, which they are stimulants in adults, have a calming effect often times in the hyperactive child.
