



Rockcastle River area couple struggles with abandoned strip mine

Going to the store, the doctor, the dentist, or even to the mailbox can be a depressing experience for Leonard and Ethel Gabbard.
Their rutted, step "drive-way" lies beside an unclaimed strip mining site on the Rockastle River-that-has-beer. Wandoned since 1979, and there appears little hope for a remedy in the near future.

The company claimed that they were developing land and not strip mining, but of course would have to do some strip mining to clear the roads in the subdivisjon.

According to government At-torney David Parks, that kind of torney David Parks, that kind of operation was a "Common scam" in the 1970's that allowed strip mining under the clask of land development. It remained common practice until 1980 when the law was changed.

Soon after the mine was shut down. Smith disappeared and Watkins was left "holding the bag,"

City's water project gets financial boost with federal money

A grant of \$150,000 to help

A grant of \$150,000 to help finance improvements to the Mt. Vernom water and sewer system, has been approved by the Appathan Regional Commission.

The grant is about half the amount of the project that is estimated to cost \$305,000 by Crawford and Crawford of Burnstein, and the state of the project.

The city's share of the project will be financed through the sale of water revenue bonds.

COAL MUST BE PART OF OUR ENERGY FUTURE

Recently, the OPEC nations announced they were going to cut oil production in order to get a higher price on the world market. That means different things for different parts of the country should the agreement hold. But as a Senator from the largest coal producing state in the nation, it tells me that it's high time to get serious about making coal a bigger part of meeting our future energy needs. We simply cannot bank on a future free of energy shortages. And with coal reserves in the U.S. outstripping the known world oil reserves by some 250 percent, coal can offer us a lot of energy security.

Last year, Congress provided \$400 million for a clean coal technology program. I saw this as the cornerstone for expanding the use of coal while also reducing the sulfur dioxide emissions that some have theorized as the cause of acid rain. While studies on the causes of acid rain remain inconclusive, legislation in the Senate and House mandatines would impose costs of up to \$3.6 billion annually on the concerning the seven largest coal producing states.

We already have a Clean Air Act in effect. Since 1973, sulfur emiciones in spell S. have fallen by 28 percent, while coal use has increased by 50 percent. Further, we can expect that clean coal technologies would help continue this trend, But, according to the Edson Electric Institute, mandatory deadlines and compliance costs in the Senate and House bills would force us to abandon the development of clean coal technologies.

We need to be cost read about our environment, it is part of the standard of living we provide for our families. But government policies that promote environment all concerns must also be cost-effective and consider employment and energy goals. The acid rain proposals in the Senate and House do not offer this balance.



Figure Your Fat, Calorie Counters

Remember when counting calories was all you needed to do

Remember when courting clories was all you needed to do to make sure you weren't eating too much? Today. Sagalories is not enough. If you are really serious about keeping your weight down to protect your heart and guard against other weight-related problems, you need to adjust your colorie imake for fat contient. Most of us are getting about 40 percent of ou calories from fat. The U.S. Department of Agricul ture recommends limiting fat to about 30-35 percent of total calories. How can you know, when you have reached this percentage? First, estimate your total calories and you have reached this percentage? First, estimate your total calories. How can you know how save a day. An average woman, age 23-50, needs about 2000 calories a day to maintain weight. An average man of that same age needs about 2700. Of course, calorie needs vary with age, activity levels and body size. Once you know how many calories you need, make the following claculations to determine how much fat will provide 30 percent of those calories. Step 1: Multiple your total or many calories.

percent of those calories.
Step 1: Multiply your total daily calorie needs by 30 percent.
For example, 2,000 multiplied by

30 equals 600 calories. Step 2: Divide this number by nine, the number of calories in one nine, the number of calories in one gram of fat. In the above example: 600 divided by 9 equals 67 grams of fat. So. 67 grams of sprovides 30 percent of daily intake of 2.000 calories. There are 28 grams in one sunce of fat. Because fat is dispersed in foods in varying amounts, you will need to use a chart like the one below, which shows fat content in select-


