

Many states, including Ken-tucku, require infants and children under four years of age be restrained in car seats while riding. 

Tobacco is in trouble, growers told

Kentucky tobacco grow-ers are staring down the barrel of a 38, say Kentucky Farm Bureau officials, and without a timely response, some could find their burley markets shot out from

under them this year.

The 38 is actually MQ-38, a form issued by the federal government requiring each tobacco allotment holders signature in order to

ment holders signature in order to obtain price supports on the crop and avoid selling the leaf at a severe price penalty. The forms have just recently been mailed from county ASCS offices to farmers, says Kentucky Farm Bureau President Ray Mack-ev. But the deadline for signing
