The present system will con-tinue to operate only until the county's garbage plan goes into effect in about two months. Residents are warned not to purchase bag tickets for more than two months.

York and her attorney, Nicholas Williams of Berea, contended during the trial last week that the shot gun went off after Richmond grabbed the gun barrel and that she did not intentionally murder.

I know this is not "Truth or Consequences" but I also know it is a pertinent question. It is seems to me from all accounts of the meetings I have read, that the five magistrates don't have much leadership. Not 'only do the magistrates have very little help from County Judge-Executive Hubert Thacker with the major problems facing them. the Judge in fact, has help in doing his own job.

Nothing personal against

Judge, in fact, has help in doing his own job. Nothing personal against Joe Clark, a former magistrate, but Judge Thacker admitted during a recent meeting of the court that Clark did nothing for the \$50 a month he is paid. The court thas had to ax the ambulance service, lay-off employees and virtually halt or delay other aspects of county business.

delay other aspects of county business. Granted most of the problems center around garbage collection and some other financial problems were caused by a lack of revenue sharing monies that previous courts have been able to spend.

But, every court needs a leader and it is my opinion that for over \$36,000 a year the county is getting somewhat shortchanged. The judge could also save the county another \$500 a year by giving Clark his walking papers.

place. While this may be true, it seems to me that the county doesn't have enough money to pay for extra legal help when it is part of the county attorney's

upon.

Who cares, right? Wrong, you are a registered voter, a taxpayer, a citizen of Rockcastle County you should care. Nothing says that we have to elect people that will not do the best job for our county.
The way I see it, Magistrates Doug Bishop and Glen Ellison aftwe had to take over in teading the court in the direction it needs to follow. These men, as the other three magistrates, are paid only \$9.600 a year and should only be responsible for the district from which they are elected.

they are elected. \$36,000 is a lot of money in Rockcastle County. This amount is well above the average

income here. If we are going to pay someone that kind of money for leadership, then I think we ought to get more for our money than we are now.
