


The next step for the court will be a franchise agreement, with the country setting the time and date for opening bids on the franchise. The court will take the tighest and best bid.

Council members told Ford that they would consider his suggestions and see what could be done In the last year alone, three trucks have gone out of control one hill, and one man was critically injured when his Pepsi Cola truck sammed into the roof of a Stewart Fertilizer storage building. In other business, Mayor Elizabeth Baker recommended that the council renew the boat dock lease with Jimmy Hale, although they had voted in recent months not to do so.




