

You're probably tired of health experts telling you what you can't eat. If so, here's a recommendation you'll like from UK's College of Agriculture: Eat more foods with starch and fiber

UK's College of Agriculture: Eat more foods with starch and fiber As a complex carbohydrate. As a complex carbohydrate starch provides energy for the body Starchy foods provide esential/vitamins and minerals as well as an important nonnutrient, dietary fiber. Fiber-Grandma called it "roughage" -furnishes bulk in the diet that helps the digestive system work properly. Many people think that starchy foods such as bread and potatoes are fattening. In fact, most of the calories come from the company they keep-calorier-rich additions such as butter, margaries, sour cream, gravy, jam and jelly. March is National Nutrition Month, and a good time to check your diet for starch and fiber. How often do you eat the foods listed here, in the amounts specified?

The best answer for an of the above is "almost daily". Breads. cereals, and other grain products and fleshy vege-tables provide starch. Whole-grain products, fruits and vegetables, especially those with edible skins and seeds, are good sources of fiber.

Beans and other legumes are good sources of both starch and fiber, perhaps explaining a renewed interest in them. Plus, they play a dual role in a varied diet by providing protein as well. Try them in salads, dips and main dishes, as well as soup.

RENOVATING GRASS FIELDS by: 10m Mills County Extension Agent for Agriculture

Why renovate grass fields? There are several reasons why assure and hay fields which have a good stand of grass should be renovated. The primary ground cover on most of Kentucky's acreage are cool season grasses, such as fall fescue, orchard grass bluegrass and tmothy. By adding legumes to grasses, there is an increase in the quality of feed produced, legumes increase the summer production and legumes taken titrogen from the air.

In Kentucky, productive affaif as stands can fix 200 to 300 pounds of nitrogen per acre each year Red clover can fix 100-200 pounds, wetch, Kgrean lespedeza and other annual forage legumes can fix 75-150 pounds of nitrogen per acre each year. have a better chance to germinate and lace.

planted If a once-over renovator is used to till, plan - the legume seed, and press the seed into firm soil, special attention must be given to grass management. After given to grass management. After planting legumes, the grass should be kept grazed or mowed very 'closely to control grass competition. When the animals begin grazing the legumes, remove them and permit the legumes to become established. If the newly seeded field cannot be the newly seeded field cannot be properly grazed or clipped. Para-quat (Gramoxone), may be used to aid in grass suppression. Apply Paraquat (Gramoxone) at the rate of 0.5 lbs. of active ingredients per acre in bands over the seeded row.


