

NITROGEN PLACEMENT FOR NO-TILL CORN By: Tom Mills

An estimated 18 to 20 percent of all corn grown in Kentucky is no-nil planted This 400 to 500 to 500 thousand acres is directly planted into sod, residues from the previous year, or a winter cover crop. Many field trials have been conducted by University of Kentucky agronomists during the past 15 years to determine nitrogen fertilization practices best suited for this kind of corn production. These recommendations are published annually in "AGR. I Lime and Fertilizer Recommendations," and call for 25 lbs. more actual and Fertilizer Recommendations and call for 25 lbs. more actual fertilizer Nitrogen per acre than conventional corn. 

Annual Questionnaire Provides Important Information

This year, I am again pleased that thousands of you returned your answers to my annual Fifth District Opinion Poll. This questionnaire, which each of you receives by mail, offers you many of the same choices I have to make as congressman, and helps give me one more tool to use in determining the best way to represent you in the House.

This year's results offer some especially strong messages. To begin with, when asked the number-one problem facing rural Kentucky, a full 40 percent said "jobs." We are attacking that problem with our Southern Kentucky Economic Development Corporation, which is now actively recruiting jobs for our region. This 27-county district-wide organization, which we formed last year, has sent representatives to companies which coloning to expand or locate new industry. By rewarding outstanding teachers, but increasing attendance and test scores, by graduating more of our young people, and by encouraging dropouts to societa e GED degree, "Forward in the Fifth" is helping our district make great strides in education.
