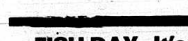

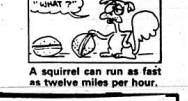

Care center planned at Mt. Vernon

A new building to house the local Cumberland River Comprehensive Care Center may not be constructed at the planned location.

The Mt. Vernon City Council at a called meeting agreed the city does not have the money to install a \$25,000 sewer lift station and lines that the center requires.

Center officials planned to build on city owned property on Old Brodhead Road near property owned by Leo Hunt and Joe Martin.

The city would lease the property which is near Lake Linville, for \$1 a year for about 35 years. The building is to be about 4,500 square feet, costing an estimated \$200,000.

Roland Mullins, executive director of Cumberland River Mental Health, Mental Retardation Center at Corbin, said the project is in the planning stage.

"We are getting the finance package together now and we'll know more after July 1, Mullins said. He added that no other location for the building has been discussed. He said that perhaps some help to finance the sewer lines might be found.

"There are several residents in the area, and there'll be more in the future, that may be interested in getting sewer service," Mullins stated.

Currently, the programs operated by the center at Mt. Vernon are scattered about at three locations.

The new center would house the out-patient office; work adult habilitation program; partial hospitalization, and pre-school program, the latter of which is now at Maple Grove.

Under terms of the city's lease, if the building were no longer used by the center, it would be turned over to the city.

Rainfall

Bige Towery chosen school superintendent

Bige Towery, curriculum director and federal programs coordinator for Rockcastle County Schools, was chosen superintendent by the Rockcastle County Board of Education at a called meeting Friday night.

After going over 26 applications and sitting through three interviews, the board chose Towery who has been in the school system for the past 22 years. The vote was unanimous.

The board did not choose a principal for Rockcastle County High School to replace Cleston Saylor who retired.

Towery said during an interview Tuesday that he would likely be ready to make a recommenda-

tion for the principal's job by July 7, the next regularly scheduled board meeting.

He said he had nine applications for the principal's position. "Some of the applicants are from persons out of state and out of the county, and some in the state," he said. "A few are from people already working in the system."

He confirmed that three local applicants were Ronnie Cash, Charles "Tuck" Baker, and C.K. Cornelius, who was assistant at the high school before taking the job of the Superintendent in the Laurel County Schools.

Towery was chosen after the board narrowed their choices to four—Towery, Cornelius, Howard Hall Jr., and Robert S. Boggs. Boggs withdrew his name from consideration before the board was to conduct the interviews. Cornelius and Hall were interviewed along with Towery.

The new superintendent took

over his duties officially Wednesday replacing Charles B. Parsons who retired after 19 years.

At the meeting Friday, board member Willie Taylor made the motion to hire Towery and pay him a salary of \$45,840 a year for his four-year contract.

The decision to choose Towery indicates a continued academic trend for the school system, one official said, and added, that the board could have chosen a superintendent with an administration-only background.

During Tuesday's interview, Towery said that he intends to remain very involved in the instructional program in the county.

"I am very interested in that field," he said. "I have worked hard the past few years in that particular area and I will continue to do so."

As far as filling the curriculum position he was just left, Towery said that he was going to think about

Among requirements set down for the beach were:

Owner has the responsibility for assuring there are no underwater hazards; must be able to see the bottom of the swimming area which will also be made up of sand and gravel and on a uniform slope.

The beach should be maintained free of litter and debris. Lifeguards are required where bathers 16 and under are allowed to enter without guardians 17 or older. Area must be fenced. Elevated lifeguard chairs are required for each 100 feet of beach front.

Safety equipment is required to be handy at all times.

The council did not make any decisions concerning the lake area at the meeting.

In other action, the council voted to paint the curb yellow at West Main and Williams streets because of the vehicles that park blocking the view of motorists. Several wrecks have occurred at the intersection.

A low bid of \$19,918.32 for a 1988 GMC, 2-ton dump truck was accepted by the city council from Blakeman Motors of London. The Blakeman bid was the lowest of five that were submitted. The truck will be used to haul sludge from the new sewer plant that will go into operation about the end of July.

Livingston man charged

A Rockcastle County man was arrested Monday morning and charged with first-degree manslaughter in the shooting death of his former brother-in-law, Kentucky State Police at London reported.

Allen Charles, 28, of Livingston, is accused of fatally shooting Larry B. Kirby, 36, of Mt. Vernon during a domestic dispute June 15 in a second floor apartment on Main Street in Livingston.

The shooting occurred about 8 p.m. after Kirby came to the apartment to talk to his ex-wife Donna. Police said he was armed

with a knife. Rockcastle County Coroner Bill Dowell said that an autopsy revealed that Kirby had been shot three times with a .22 caliber pistol, twice in the head and once in the chest.

Charles told police that on the night of the shooting his former brother-in-law had threatened to kill him and his sister on several occasions.

Charles is presently lodged in the Rockcastle County Jail under a \$20,000 cash bond. He is scheduled for a hearing before Circuit Judge Dan Venters on July 24.

Vehicle damaged in chase

A Laurel County man was seriously injured last Wednesday night when his car collided with a state trooper cruiser chasing a stolen truck, according to Warren Wilkerson a dispatcher at the London post.

Joey Baker, 22, of London, was in serious condition Wednesday at Marymount Hospital following the accident. He is now listed as "improving greatly."

Trooper Joe Schenkelfelder, 27, also was injured in the crash and spent the night in the hospital. He was later released.

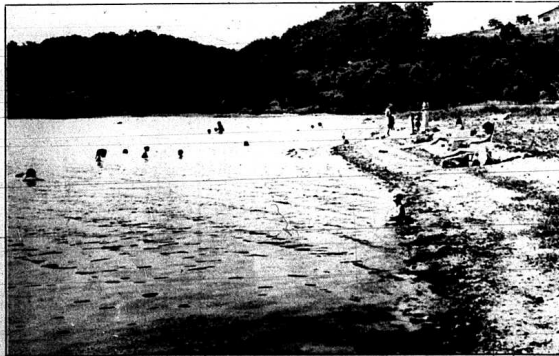
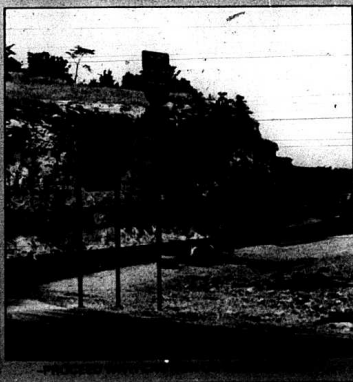
It came as no surprise that there was an early accident on the poorly designed, dangerous road even before it opened.

A Victory For Tobacco Farmers

President Reagan signed into law his Sodbuster Clarification legislation recently. This is great news for thousands of small Kentucky tobacco farmers, especially as planting begins.

My bill will give the Soil Conservation Service (SCS) and Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS) the flexibility to administer the so-called "sodbuster" provisions of the Farm Bill in a much more sensible manner.

The Sodbuster legislation in the 1985 Farm Bill required every farmer to have an approved farm conservation plan in place by 1990 to maintain eligibility for price supports for all program crops. This legislation required that aggressive conservation practices be implemented by farmers to avoid harmful soil erosion on their farm. It was primarily aimed at grain farmers who plant the same crop in the same field year after year. Farmers breaking new ground on land that had not been planted since 1981 were required to have a farm conservation plan approved before they could start planting their 1987 crops, or risk losing price support eligibility.

The Sodbuster Clarification Act of 1987 simplifies the required reporting process to make it easier for farmers to meet the new conservation requirements. Under my proposal, farmers will only have to certify their planting and conservation intentions for 1987 thru 1990 then have it approved by SCS and the Chairman of the local Soil and Conservation District. This certification will suffice as the Farm Conservation Plan required by the 1985 Farm Bill for most of Kentucky's tobacco farmers.

This special certification of the 1986 Farm Bill will prevent a lot of aggravation for tobacco farmers and will save the taxpayers thousands of dollars in workload for ASCS and SCS. More importantly, my bill guarantees that farmers will remain eligible for price supports on their 1987 tobacco crop. I want to ensure that the Department of Agriculture implements my legislation as it was intended. My legislation was necessary only because of USDA's previous record of bureaucratic inflexibility. I don't want that to happen again.

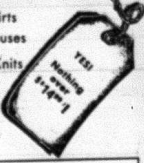

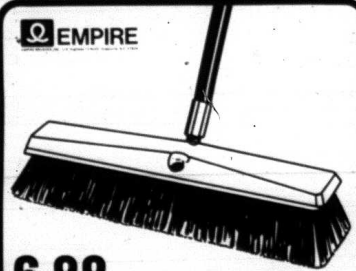

MICROWAVING TIPS

- *Microwave sugared honey 30 to 60 seconds to clarify.
- *Freshen slightly soggy chips, cereal, crackers or popcorn by microwaving 30 to 60 seconds.
- *Softened foods like butter, cream cheese, cheese spreads or refrigerated frostings to spreadable consistency.
- *Softened hardened sugar by microwaving 15 to 45 seconds.
- *For microwave speed and conventional browning, start casseroles, potatoes, meats, 2-crust pies etc. in microwave and then complete baking in the conventional oven.
- *Microwave bacon slices a few seconds for easy separation.
- *When cooking a quantity of bacon, arrange bacon with a piece of paper toweling between each layer. Be sure container is large enough to hold all the drippings.
- *Softened ice cream for easy

- scopping and frozen juices for easy mixing.
- *Increase juice from oranges and lemons by microwaving 15 to 20 seconds before squeezing.
- *When placing waxed paper or paper toweling on a dish, place the curled side down so it bends around dish.
- *Elevate dishes of non-stirred foods on an overturned saucer to help the center bottom cook more readily in some ovens.
- *Save leftover fresh parsley by drying in microwave oven.
- *Whenever possible, eliminate corners by selecting round rather than square or rectangular cooking containers.
- *Dry leftover bread in the microwave, then process in food processor or blender for crumbs.
- *Turn leftover bread into croquettes by combining bread cubes with a little oil, garlic and Parmesan cheese. Microwave until just about crisp.
- *Purchase day-old sweet rolls and freshen by microwaving

about 10 seconds per roll.
*Melt semi-sweet or milk chocolate in zipper-type plastic bag. Cut off corner and squeeze out to decorate cookies and cakes.
*Make your own baby food and freeze in ice cube shapes or leftover baby food jars. Then, just warm in the microwave oven when ready to use.

Sexual abuse case

A Rockcastle County Circuit Court Jury could not reach a decision last Thursday in a sex abuse case against two local men.
Circuit Judge Dan Venters declared a mis-trial in the trial of Vernon Lee and George Denney of Route 4, Mt. Vernon.
Commonwealth attorney Benny Ham prosecuted the two men on charges of First degree sexual abuse. The case involved a 7-year-old girl.
One jury member said after Venters declared a mis-trial that 11 of the 12 jurors were for conviction but that one man simply would not change his mind.

Jailed for booze

Two Laurel County men were jailed in Rockcastle County Saturday after they were intercepted on I-75 with a pickup truck load of beer and liquor.
Albert Moore and Marty Anders, both of Rt. 1, London, were charged with illegal transportation of alcoholic beverages for resale.
The arrest was made by KSP troopers Nick Hensley and Danny Alton. When stopped eight miles north of Mt. Vernon, the Laurel men were hauling 831 cans of beer and 12 bottles of liquor.

Traffic report

A total of 238 motorists were issued citations for traffic violations in Rockcastle County during May, according to a report from the Kentucky State Police Post at London.
A total of 25 were cited for driving under the influence of intoxicants and 66 for faulty equipment.
There were 37 traffic accidents, 19 of which were property damage only and 18 were personal injury. There were 25 personal injuries and no fatal accidents.
There were 12 criminal investigations resulting in 14 arrests.
In the entire London Post area there were 1590 traffic citations with 135 for driving under the influence.
