

# Donation gets program underway

A \$1,500 contribution from Citizens Bank in Brodhead has helped a local group of concerned citizens get on their feet and start

That group is the local affiliate of Forward in the Fifth.





aphrodisiac and heart stimulant by some, and a cure-all by others. It is closely related to the Devils-Walking-Stick, Wild Sarparilla, English Ivy, and especially Dwarf Ginseng. The ame ginseng is a corruption of the Chinese Jin-chen (meaning "man-like"), referring to the forked root. Asian countries provide a large market for ginseng root.

The preferred time to collect "sang" root is in the very late summer and early fall, when the seeds have turned red. At this time the seeds can be pressed onto the surface of the soil beneath he leaf layer, with a finger. This allows the plant to reproduce itself and provides for another harvest in the future. This is a poor conservation practice and has produced many "sanged-out" areas. Dig only four-pronage plants. These plants are about four years old-the minimum age for collecting.
