The new dates for the fall season will be Sept. 1 to 30, Oct. 8-31 and Dec. 1-6. The daily bag limit will be 15 doves and the possession limit is 30 after two or more days of hunting. Shooting hours for doves are 11 an. until sunset for during the September and October portions of the season. Shooting hours during the December portion of the season from surrise to sunset.

Drought stricken corn will feed cattle

Green corn stalks without ears are a

Green corn stalks without ears are a common sight this summer because of the drought, but producers can still use the crop by turning it mot reed for cattle. This type of corn is better feed than most people think. The average value of drought-stressed corn silage stabut 85 percent of normal, or well-cared, corn silage. The protein content of drought-stressed corn silage is slightly higher than normal corn silage. However, the energy value of drought-stressed corn silage is slightly higher than normal corn silage. However, the energy value of drought-stressed silage will be lower.

Drought-stressed corn should be harvested when it is dred down to about 30 to 40 percent dry matter. Farmers should not be in a hurry to put drought-stressed corn in the silos. If it is put in the silos when it is too wet, seepage will cause a loss of nutrients and fermentation will occur, which will result in lower feeding value and lower feed intake by cattle. If the weather conditions remain hot and dry, the moisture content of the plants is going to drop, but if we get rain again, they are going to stay. It takes about three weeks for corn to ferment in silos.

Farmers need to be careful about feeding green corn not only because of possible digestive problems.

One company that has moved into the county, Richardson Lumber from Monticello, buys different types of logs and transports them to their mill located in Monticello. In addition to buying logs they also buy tracts of timber. One such tract they are cur-rently working is located near Renfro

rently working is located near Renfro Valley.

According to their manager Paul Fry, Richardson moved into this area because there was an abundant spulp of timber and they felt they conductant the lumber at a fair price. They sometimes have crews that come into the county to cut the timber and they also control area loggers to cut for them.

was killed in a freak accident at Hum-mel in December of Last year. Henry Eugene Marcum, 56, of Monticello was killed when the top broke out of the tree he was cutting striking a dead tree which fell and hit him. According to Fry, Marcum had worked in the log woods all of his life, but the log woods all of his life, but the nature of the occupation lends itself to accidents of this type.

Many people are killed or left per-manently disabled due to accidents

that occur in the log woods each year. Fry went on to add that insurance for

Fry went on to add that insurance tor their employees is outrageous. For every 51 they pay in wages they must pay about 47 cents in insurance.

Practically every facet of the industry has its perils. From cutting the timber in the log woods to sawing the logs at the mill, it is a dangerous

PEACE IN THE PERSIAN GULF The Secretary General of the United Nations made a signifi

The Secretary General of the United Nations made a significant announcement earlier this month of a cease-fire in the Iran-Iraq war. This is the first time in the history of the bloody eight-year conflict that peace seems to be at hand. For the United States and the rest of the world, the hostilities between the two nations that once threatened to spill over and engulf the entire Middle East can end, and a peace process negotiated by the United Nations can begin. This war can be-characterized as the bloodiest limited conflict this century. Since 1980, over one million people have been killed and hundreds of thousands have been cipipled or maimed. Iran has used human waves of children to clear mine fields for attacking troops, while Iraq has repeatedly unleashed the horror of chemical weapons against civilian and military targets.

The United States has played a major role in helping bring about the end of the war through both diplomatic and military action. The President ordered the U.S. Navignetic proposes the control to the control of the

tions have forced them to come to terms with international public opinion.

The Senate Foreign Relations Committee expressed its view when it adopted a resolution I introduced calling for an immediate and peaceful resolution of the war and withdrawal by both nations to their recognized boundaries.

The next step in the peace process is the deployment of a multinational peace-keeping unit to monitor the cease-fire. This action will be followed by the eventual repatriation of thousands of captured prisoners of war on both sides. It is tragic to note that after years of war that began over a territorial dispute, the boundaries of the two countries are now virtually the same as they were when the conflict started.

For its part, the U.S. has demonstrated time and time again to our allies throughout the world our determination and commitment to protect our interests. Forty years ago we established a presence in the Gulf to preserve the flow of oil and freedom of international waterways as well as letting our regional freinds know we could be counted on to support this commitment. Now, with the war drawing to a close, the U.S. can be proud of a record which contributed to stability and peace as it reassured our friends we stood by our promises.





is cut in this county? As noted earlier, a good portion of it is used to make pallets or is used to build houses and pallets or is used to build houses amb barns. The high grade lumber such as ash, oak, hickory, walnut and others ash, oak, nickory, waintt and onless are transported to furniture factories in the Carolina and Tennessee. Some of it is sent overseas. Pallets that are on a is sent overseas. Pallets that are made in the county are transported to different areas of the country. Michi-gan, Illinois, Tennessee, Ohio and Kentucky receive most of the entucky receive most of the pallets

The lumber industry has been around for as long as anyone can remember. Gone are the days of cross-cut saws and snaking the logs out of the woods by mules. Today taken the place of back-breaking labor involved in cutting trees. A good, sharp chain-saw can rip through atough hickory in a matter of minutes. What used to take hours is now accomplished in a fration of the time.

Logs are now taken out of the woods with powerful skidders. The logs are loaded by one man operating loader.
If the work is so difficult and de

gerous why then are so many people involved in the industry? The answer is obviously for the money. "Wherever a tract of land is located

wherever a tract of land is located that has not been logged you can bet your bottom dollar someone has their eye on it," said one veteran of the

logging woods.
"The value of land incre ne value of land increases tre-mendously when it has good timber on it," Willard Bullock from Ford Realty and Auction Co. told us. The comparison indicated that land increases by about 40 to 60 percent when it has marketable, high grade timber on it. A tract of land that recently sold contained 77 acres and fought a total of 548,839 for an average of over \$600 per acre. Normally, rough land brings about \$200 to \$250 an acre. Another tract contained 171 acres and sold for \$87,000 for an average of about \$500 per acre. Normalized 171 acres and sold for \$87,000 for an average of about \$500 per acre. The largest piece of land sold recently for timber was located in the Hummel section of Rockassile County. There a total of 700 acres was sold to Richardson Lumber for \$500,000 an average of about \$725 per acre. Without the lumber located on the land it would probably have brought about \$175,000 but with the timber the value increased two-fold. Lumber companies do not spend a great deal of money without naving all the facts about what they are





According to the 1985 Food Secu-rity Act (Farm Bill) wetlands may not be altered, drained, or converted for the production of agricultural commodities. If wetlands are altered it may mean the loss of certain USDA

it may mean the loss of certain USDA program benefits. There is one exception. If the conversion of a wetland began before Doc. 23, 1985 aperson may apply for a determination that would enable the applicant to complete the conversion without loss of program benefits.

If you think you fall within this category you must file a commenced conversion request with the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS by Sept. 19, 1988. The applicant must show that the drainage or other modifications of the wetland began before Dec. 23, 1985 and that this drainage or other modifications were carried out each week.

The Sword of Hope I By: LuEd Nielsen, President

On the rainy night of May 22, 1913, fifteen men sat down to dinner at the Harvard Club on New York City's West Side. The group was small, but its purpose was huge-to change the world's beliefs and behaviors regarding cancer, one of the most lethal and least understood diseases.

The group, which included 10, physicians, was also determined to get members of the medical profession more active in detecting carciand more aggressive in treating the disease. These intentions coalesced into a single goal; the total controland, if possible, elimination-of cancer as a disease of humankind. These more diseases the control of cancer, it was reorganized in 1945 as the American Cancer Society. From that small band of health activists has grown a mighty organization. Today the American Caner Society influence extends into 3,400 communities, marshalling the efforts of 2.3 million volunteers.







A new addition has been added to the Rockcastle County High School this year. It's official name is PASS. or the Positive Alternative In-School Suspension program. By the students and faculty at R.C.H.S., it's known as the the Detention or the "Blue" room.
