

Towery unhappy with scores

County finishes 156th among state's 177 school districts

Faced with declining basic skills test scores, Rockcastle School Superintendent Bige Towey declared his week if he academic outlook for the county school system does not improve over the next two years he will consider resigning.

His gloomy portrait came on the heels of a Kentucky Department of Education report that showed the average student test scores dropped from 45-1 last year of 471 this year.

He stressed there is no reason why Rockcastle County Schools cannot be in the top 100 systems with test scores well into the 50s.

"Academic excellence should be the top objective in any school system,

Adactinic excellences should be the top objective in any school system, and as far as I am concerned it is the number one priority of this system, Towery said.

"We have gotten off to a very pro-

ductive start this school year and I hope the low test scores don't put a

this year to growth in our instruc-tional program and we intend to see that administrators, principals and teachers do everything possible to guard the instruction time and utilize it to the benefit of the students," he

said.
Towery, who has two years left of a four year contract, admitted Tuesday four year contract, admitted Tuesday that during his first two years at the helm he has had little time to work with the instructional part of the school system mainly because of a building program at Mt. Vernon and the hiring of many new administra-tors and teachers. But, the superintendent wants to see improvement

tendent wants to see improvement over the next two years.

Towery said that he felt like he had good staff in place and that every-one was dedicated to improving the quality of instruction in the county.

Among some of the changes are more hours of teacher in-service in on instruction, especially in the lower grades, faculty meetings at each school and strict evaluation of teach-

He told them to stop and give him a breathing shot. He went to the extensive care ward for over a week. They then transferred him to the ward and put him in a moom by the nurses station. A couple of hours later they moved him saying a more serious patient teach the room later and the patient was lying in the bed smoking. He went home the next day. My husband ended up in the inten-

Then only an intern was there to put, him the intensive care. It was Saturday and the two doctors that treated him weren't available which by the way are paid in full for their wonderful service. 





Health Note

The Rockeastle County School Health Program started screening students the first week of school for Pediculosis Capitis (Head Lice). This early detection of the problem can help prevent spreading. There have been scattered cases throughout the county.

Parents are notified by the school, if their child appears to have nits or head lice when screened. The list below will help in being more alert to the problem.

frequent head-scratching. Anyone can get lice . . . from another person or from sharing hats, brushes, combs, etc.

Check all family members for lice and nits (lice eggs) at least once a week. (It helps to use natural light and a magnifying glass.)

Treat only those family members who do have lice. Buy a lice product at your drug store, the pharmacy section of your foodstore or call your doctor for a prescription.

Follow package directions carefully! Use the product over the sink (not in the tub or shower). Keep the eyes covered with a washcloth.

Call your doctor first if you are pregnant, nursing or allergic to weeds, plants, e Never use a lice product on your baby

Remove all nits (which will stay on the hair after treatment). This is essential! You can do this with a special lice comb, scissors or your fingernails.

Wash sheets and recently worn clothing in hot water and dry in a hot dryer. Combs and brushes may be soaked in hot (not boiling) water for 10 minutes.

Vacuuming is the safest and best way to control lice on mattresses, rugs, furniture and stuffed animals.

Continue to check heads every day for 2-3 weeks to make sure head lice are gone.
Regular checking is the best prevention.

When you find a case of lice, tell others! Call your child's school or daycare. Notify neigh-borhood parents.







standards.

Among the problems cited were a dirty and deteriorating shower and restroom facility in a concrete block

and detertional shows a correcte block building on the grounds. Another problem, said Cromer, is an unsafely protected electrical system that allows campers to hook propower and lights while there. Both electricity and water are available at the commender.

electricity and water are available at the campgrounds. Still, the move surpirsed grounds manager Jim Hale last week. He knew the city had announced the closings, but did not know they would be last week.

was asked if the city might have let them stay open through the nearing Labor Day weekend, the "last weekend of summer" for many fami-

lies now. He said the council had planned to close the grounds as soon as possible when the announcement was originally made.

C-F gene may be isolated

Researchers announced yesterday that they had discovered and isolated the gene that cause cystic fibrosis, a landmark finding that could lead to new treatments for the devastating killer of young people. The discovery should help revelal just what goes wrong in the body to cause the disease, which in turn may suggest how to treat the root of the disease rather than just its effects, scientists said.

Researcher Lan-Choe Tening of the country of the cou

scientists said. * Researcher Lap-Chee Tsui said the work also would expand testing to identify the 12 million Americans who unknowingly carry the gene in a defective form that causes the disease and who could pass it along to offsoring. ffspring,
These "carriers" remain health

offspring.
These "carriers" remain healthy because they carry only a single copy of a defective form of the newfound gene. The disease does not appear unless a person inheris two defective copies, one from each parent.
Currently, carriers can be identified only if their family has had case of cystic fibrosis, and oven then not all carriers can be detected. Knowing the gene should eventually make testing available to the general population, scientists said.
Tsui, of the Hospital for Sick Children Research Institute in Toronto, commented in an interview before participating in a news conference to announce the finding.
Tsui, Jack Riordan of the institute and the University of Michiganat Ann Arbor led the research team, which also included scientists from the Tederick Cancer Research Facility in Frederick, Ma, and the University of Pirteboris. Ma, and the University of Pitsburgh.
Cystic fibrosis is the most common lethal genetic disease of young people in North America, It afflicts

mon lethal genetic disease of young people in North America. It afflicts people in North America, it attricts 30,000 Americans, and 1,000 to 1,200

30,000 Americans, and 1,000 to 1,200 mew cases are diagnosed each year, according to the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation in Bethesda, Md.

The disease makes the body produce abnormally thick, sticky mucus that clogs the lungs and digestive system, interfering with breathing and eigestive

Half of patients die before reaching their mid-20s, mostly from repeated lung infections.

For cystic fibrosis, the discovery of the gene is "the most exciting event since this disease was first described in the medical literature 50 years ago," said Robert Beall, exceutive vice president for medical friends affaire. ve vice president for medical affairs at the cystic fibrosis foundation which helped support the research. It may allow researchers to mimic

the dis se in cells in the test tub allowing them to scre

therapeutic effect, he said.
"It's incredibly important," said Nancy Lamontagne, director of the cystic fibrosis program at the National Institute of Diabetes and Diseases in Bethesda, Md.
It will cause "an exponential burst of good research" to identify the basic problem that causes cystic fibrosis, and then seek treatments aimed at hat problem, she said.
"If you know exactly what you're trying to fix, then you can approach it with a more specific bullet," she said.
Because of the disease's importance, finding the gene is "the big prize," said Michael Conneally, professor of medical genetics and neurology at Indiana University Medical Center.

But Arthur Beaudet of the Howard
Hughes Medical Institute at the
Baylor College of Medicine cautioned
that the discovery will not necessarily lead to effective treatment. The

basic defect that causes sickle cell anemia has long been known, but that has not led to an effective therapy, he

Genes are segments of a threadlike structures called chromosomes. The newfound gene is on the chromo-some scientists refer to as No. 7.

One important job of genes is to oversee the body's production of key proteins. Genetic diseases such as cystic fibrosis can occur when a gene is defective, so that it fails to produce

a normal protein.

Tsui said the normal role of the newly discovered gene is not known But the protein it helps produce appears to be similar structurally to a family of genes involved in trans-porting substances across cell mem-branes, he said.

That fits in with the suspicion that cystic fibrosis results from a defect in a cell's ability to transport electri-cally charged particles across cell walls, he said.
