



Homer and Jethro were part of Renfro Valley gang

Because John Lair, founder Because John Lair, Iounder of Renfro Valley, had an un-canny knack for finding excep-tional new talent, many well-known entertainers got their start in show business with the Renfro Valley Folks. Two of these where norme became those whose names became household words nationwide were the music and comedy team, Homer and Jethro.

Most folks remember them for their hilarious songs and antics, but both Homer, whose real name was Henry D. Hay-nes, and Jethro, or Kenneth C. Burns, were first-rate musicians In fact, at their audition for Mr. Lair, they presented themselves as straight musicians and singers. But, it was when Mr. Lair head their comic version of "Somewhere Over the Rain-gow," done in the dressing room, that he hired them on the spot. Thinking it may all be a joke, since they had been hired so fast, the boys nearly went back home to Knoxville instead of returning to Renfro Valley the

next day! Mr. Lair sent the team to Chicago as a guest act on the NBC network. It was their first visit to a city larger than Knox-ville, and they were an immedi-ate hit with radio listeners. Reports said they got more mail after one performance than the rest of the cast had gotten in a year. According to "The Illus-trated History of Country Music," Jethro's mandolin style--syncopated, rhythmic and heav-ily influenced by jazz -- made him, in the thirties, the only challenger to the great Bill Monroe. And, Jim Gaskin, present musician/singer/emcee in Renfro Valley, tells us Homer played an incredible slap-

hythm guitar. While they were at Renfro Valley; during World War II, both Homer and Jethro entered military service, and their mu-sical careers were put on hold for a time. Justra more during the for a time. Jethro reported that he had tried to get into Special bervices as an entertainer, but after his audition, he was as-signed to the Infantry!

signed to the Infantry! Over the years, the team of Homer and Jethro were regu-lars on the WLS "National Barn Dance" in Chicago, on the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville, and they made personal appearances na-tionwide. They appeared nu-merous times on television and even made a series of commereven made a series of commercials for -- what else -- com flakes. Their specialty was their pardies of popular songs, such as "How Much is That Hound Dog in the Window?" One of their first hits was "Baby, It's Cold Outside" with June Carter. "I'm in the Jaihouse Now" was also a success and, in 1958, they ad a best-selling album "The cials for -- what else -- com also a success and, in 1958, they had a best-selling album "The Worst of Homer and Jethro." Many folks remember other favorites such as "Hernando's Hideaway" and "The Battle of Workerway" Kookamonga." Many folks thought Homer

and Jethro were brothers, but they were simply life-long friends. They were born on the same day, July 27, in the same town, but in different years --Homer in 1918, Jethro in 1923, Homer in 1918, Jethro in 1923. The partnership they formed as youngsters, when they were heard on WNOX in Knoxville, lasted 39 years, until Homer's fatal heart attack in 1971.

Jethro went on by himself as an entertainer. He never tried to replace Homer in the act because he felt it would be impossible. As he said, "No matter how good the guy might be, I'd find myself comparing him to Homer, and he'd be a loser." As a single act, Jethro re-mainedsuccessful. Always ready with a funny line, even about his own talent, he referred to himself as a "finished musi-

cian with a great voice for cool-ing soup." Regarding his man-

For all history buffs Brodhead businessman Rhuel Thomas was a fixture on the Renfro Valley Barn Dance for many years. Besides emceeing the Sunday Morning Gatherin' in John Lair's absence, he conducted singing schools, where the shape-note singing system was used. Rhuel's wife Flossie also sang at Renfro Valley.

Disappearing Landmark

The man that entered the L&N depot in Brodhead was tall, unshaven, sunburned, and looked as if he'd been "on the road" for many a week. He looked steadily and cooly

at Agent J.R. Cress. Suddenly, as if to make up his mind, he drew a gun and levelled it at the agent

In the minutes that followed, he tied Mr. Cass, gagged him, took an undisclosed amount of money, and left. A conductor found the bound agent a consid-erable time later and released him. The Railroad reports the "culprit" is still at large.

Such were the "hazards of the business" in railroading in 1902, and especially for agents

in small depots across the land. In a short time, the sound of hammers will be heard, and the old Brodbead landmark that could tell many a violent story, will be torn down.

The depot is near Renfro Valley.

Maurice Howard, who operates a funeral home in the depot building, and Wilson Green are taking bids on the wrecking work. Mr. Howard plans to move the usable lumber to Crab Orchard to contruct a display room at his funeral home there. Many people in the area will

still remember the "good old days" of the Brodhead depot. It was to the depot that everyone headed when it was time for a train. "Who got off?" was a popu-

lar question if someone happened to be late. "I wonder who they're going to visit?" could become or be expanded into a general talk-fest.

In those days, the railroad boomed with passengers. Many Rockcastle residents still remember the fare was 15 cents from Mt. Vernon to Brodhead; and many caught old 21, 22, 23, and 24 between the two towns to do business, or to go to the fair, or to court the pretty Brodhead girls.

It was easy and convenient for Mt. Vemon people to catch the Louisville-bound train late in the afternoon, ride to Brodhead, and return about 11 p.m.



the day farmers set aside a futue to-bacco to help health. "We're on the cusp," said the Vir-ginia Tech plant pathologist. "There are a lot of hurdles still, but there's a real opportunity here."

But scientists from the United States to Holland are discovering a good side to tobacco that could pro-vide cheaper medicines and might help the small tobacco grower sur-vive. vive

"Tobacco is like the white mouse of the plant world," said Bob Erwin, president of BioSource Genetics, a new California company dedicated

to pharmaceutical tobacco. "You can do nearly whatever your imagination can come up with" Cramer agreed. Tobacco

Scientists could use the gelatin-like substance in cosmetics in as little as two years. They hope later to turn Fraction-1 into a non-allergenic tum Fraction - I into a non-allergent infant formula or perhaps even food for kidney patients, because it is so pure that it may help them avoid di-alysis. More intriguing, tobacco grows foreign geness oe asily that i one day could do what scientists now depend on expensive bacteria systems and transgenia enimals to provide: bio-engineered medicine.





Your most sublime dinner party can turn into a disaster within a few hours if you don't take caution to prevent food-borne illnesses.

The most common cause of foodborne illness is improper handling of food, which allows harmful bacteria NOO, which allows harmful bacteria go grow. Mishandling usually occurs in the home but also can happen in quantity food kitchens or in the food processing plant.

processing plant. Salmonella has been one of the leading causes of food-home illness in recent years. Poultry, eggs and dairy products are the most important vehicles of transmission. Kittens, turtles and ducklings also can trans-mit the bacteria. Wash your hands the touching any of them. The bacterium causing salmonel-losis, however, can be killed with cooking to a temperature of 165 degrees F, for a few seconds. Escherichia coli, another much-publicized bacterium causing illness, is found in foods of animal origin or water contaminated by sevage. Food-frigerated are expecially vulnerable ceasuse the bacteria population can increase rapidly. Most E, coli bacte-ring and washing also helps uard against this illness. ing. Proper hand washing also helps guard against this illness.

Clostridium botulinum is sometimes found in incorrectly canned or pouched foods and sometimes in thick foods stored in a too large container. foods stored in a too large container. Toxins produced by this anaerobic bacterium are deadly, but are inactivated by bringing food to a full boil for at least 15 minutes.

Staphylococcus aureau is found in 40 to 50 percent of all humans at any given time. It grows rapidly in foods such as custard and cream-filled bakery goods, potato salad and sliced meats. Most outbreaks are caused by meats. Most outbreaks are caused by not keeping foods cold or by not cooling the cooked foods quickly enough. Throw away leftovers that have not been kept cold. This bacte-ria produces a heat-stable toxin which is not inactivated by any amount of cooking. How can you avoid food-borne ill-nesses?

nesses? - Cook all foods to the proper temperature to kill whatever bacteria may be contained in the food - Handle foodsappropriately. Keep bot foods hot and cold foods cold. When refrigerating leflowers, divide large amounts into several smaller containers to assure that they will colf ast cnough to avoid rapid pro-tiferation of bacteria - Use proper hysiene in the kitchen.

Wash knives and cutting boards fre-quently and disinfect them using two tablespoons of household chlorine bleach in one gallon of waer. The utensils need to be dipped in the solu-tion for 2 minutes. Wash utentsils before using them on another food

For example, if you cut up a chicken, make sure you wash and sanizz ub knife and cutuing board before you cut up any other food. Designate two different cutting boards -- one for meat and one for fruit and vegetables -- Wash your hands thoroughly and often -- especially between handling different food items

different food items wire over for cooking, use a thermometer to make sure that the product is evenly cooked to the desired temperature with the product is evenly cooked such as in a delicatessen or cafterria, selectcarefully. Avoid problem foods if they appear to be improperly held. Remember, hot foods should be held above 140 degrees F. and cold foods should be kept at below 40 degrees F.

degrees F. Buy eggs from refrigerated cases. Avoid cracked or dirty eggs that might harbor Salmonella. Eat eggs only that are well cooked. Avoid milk that is Thaw frozen foods in the refrig-erator and not on the kitchen counter

There are EEG (electroencephalograph) services for all ages. These tests allow a physicians to detect any abnormalities in the brain waves. These tests are transmitted to Lexington where they are read by a neurologist.

Pulmonary Function testing is also available. This type of test helps determine if lung function is impaired and to what degree. Another use of these tests is to determine eligibility for Black Lung Benefits. You can also see the amount of improvement achieved after using a bronchodilator.

Stress testing is a very important step in evaluating cardiac function. The patient has lead wires hooked to electrodes placed at various spots on the chest. He/she will then be asked to walk on a treadmill while the technician and physician carefully monitor the function of the heart during the "stress" of walking.

With 10 seniors, 10 juniors, 22 sophomores and 15 freshmen, the Rockets don't have a whole lot of speed and natural talent as in the past.


What they do have are big strong kids that hit hard and have good work ethics, according to Larkey.

It wasn't until after camp that Larkey and staff rested a bit easier.


"It was at camp that we were able to make our decisions on who could play where." Larkey said. "We found our depth."

"We came out of camp with more people that could play than we thought." he said. The Rockets' strongest suit --- See Rockets, P-12




