**Calendar committee meets today**

## Students face possibility of school on Saturday

For the first time in almost twenty years Rockcastle County students are facing the possibility of going to school on Saturday.

Nothing is definite, but members of the Rockcastle County school system's calendar committee are meeting Thursday, (today), to decide how and when school days missed due to snow will be made up.

As it stands now, Rockcastle schools are scheduled to close on Thursday, June 13, after missing 24 days of school this winter and spring. However, summer school at Eastern Kentucky University begins on Monday June 10 and therein lies one of the biggest problems.

Many Rockcastle teachers, who are required to continue their education by state law, are enrolled for EKU summer school and Rockcastle administrators must find a way to make up missed days in order for school to be over by June 8.

Rockcastle County School Superintendent Larry Hammond said on Tuesday that teachers in the school system have been polled by principals as to how they would prefer to make up the days. Those results will

be presented to the calendar committee on Thursday.

Because of the high number of days missed this year, Rockcastle would be eligible for five calamity days that were made available by the passage of House Bill 513, but before the school system can apply for those days, they must meet the requirements of the bill. Kentucky Governor Paul Patton has said he will sign the bill.

Those requirements to use calamity days include attending school on all scheduled vacation days and professional meeting days.

For Rockcastle schools that would mean that students would have to attend school on April 11 and 12 and May 27 and 28. Those days had been scheduled for non-attendance in the original calendar. The days in April are for Kentucky Education Association meetings and the days in May were for Memorial Day and Election Day.

If the calendar committee votes to go to school those days, the school system could use the calamity days and actually get out of school on Friday May 31.

Hammond said that other options, include going one hour and twelve minutes longer for five days, to make up one day, attending May 27 and 28 and going to school on Saturday June 8. June 8th would be the last day of school and students would only attend a half day.

School would also be dismissed on April 11 and 12, if that option is approved.

And, if that option is approved, the school system will not be allowed to use any calamity days.

The superintendent said he would more than likely go along with whatever recommendation the calendar committee approves Thursday.

## Ford gets state to include money in budget \$42,500 for purchase of school property approved

Mrs. Martin, who has been working on a revitalization project for the city of Livingston which includes complete renovation of the school property, credited State Representative Danny Ford with saving the project.

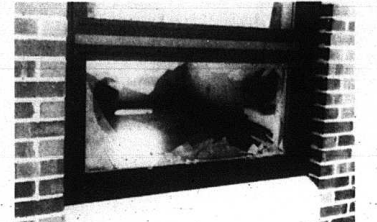
"Our option to buy the property had run out and the school board was considering other alternatives," she said.

## Sewer rates increasing to pay for expansion project

When the new sewer project going to the Industrial Park and Jerni Lane goes into effect, it will cost all Mt. Vernon sewer customers an added 22 cents per month.

Such was the prospect reported by city engineer, Richard Moore and approved by the city council at its

regular meeting Monday.

Rates to meet the million dollar project go from \$8.98 a month now for the first 2000 gallons to \$9.20. Over 2000 gallons of use, the rate goes from \$2.49 to \$3.50.

That is to cover the cost of the new system, Moore explained to the Council.

On a motion by councilwoman, Karen King, seconded by Lee Keene, the council approved the preliminary report. Councilman, Clark "Joe" Mullins abstained.

Mullins asked Mayor Gary R. Cromer if money now in the sewer fund could be used to pay for the

## State approves money for new lane of U.S. 25

State Representative Danny Ford of Mt. Vernon announced this week that the state had approved money for construction of a new passing lane on U.S. 25 between I-75 at Renfro Valley and the Hwy. 461 by-pass.

Construction of the passing lane was originally set to begin in fiscal year 1999-2000, but Ford said committee members voted on Friday to move the project up.

The new passing lane, which will make U.S. 25 three lanes starting near where the Renfro Chevron service station sits now, will take Wendy's Restaurant.

Danny Settles, co-owner and manager of the restaurant, said Tuesday, that he had been informed that his restaurant would have to be torn down to make room for the additional road.

"We're not sure what the fate of the restaurant will be," Settles said. "You know how the state operates, they may build the road and they may not, we are taking the wait and see attitude," he said.

Purchase and construction on the new road could begin as early as next Spring, but no definite time line has been established.

Representative Ford said the project, which has been in the state road plan for years, was moved ahead because of the large volume of traffic that U.S. 25 carries between the inter-

state and Mt. Vernon. "I know things could change but I really believe this project will be completed in the 1997-98 fiscal year," he said.

## Suffering from back problems? WE CAN HELP!

As many people know, back pain is one of the most common health problems in the United States today. The most common causes of back pain are poor posture, poor body mechanics and lifting techniques, stressful working and living habits, loss of flexibility and a general decline in physical fitness. Back pain occurs most frequently in the lower back and low neck regions where a spinal segment of high mobility joins a spinal segment of limited mobility. 8 out of 10 people will suffer a significant episode of back pain in their lifetime. 90% will recover spontaneously within several weeks although future recurrence is common.

"What concerns those of us that treat back injuries is that people don't realize their injury is probably a result of postural problems, deconditioning, or chronic improper lifting and not the result of one single episode," according to Steve Coy, P.T., Director of Physical Therapy. Even reading in bed with a pillow under your head can lead to a future episode of back pain," Coy says.

Pain control, therapy, exercise and patient education are all a part of Rockcastle Hospital's Physical Therapy Department's treatment for back injuries. "When people first come to us with their back injuries, we generally begin with the use of pain control modalities. We may use heat or ice, ultrasound, electrical stimulation or a combination of these to promote healing and reduce or block the pain. These are all short term treatment strategies. Long term, we teach strengthening exercises, proper lifting techniques and proper posture. We have an exercise gym that includes aerobic equipment which we like to progress our patients to."

"What makes our program special is that we try to do a lot of patient education. We have great equipment and we are very pro-active in believing the patient should learn everything about their diagnosis, treatment, exercise program and basic back care so they can prevent future recurrence. We are very high on back injury prevention and do a significant amount of patient and community teaching on back injury issues. The answer lies in prevention: posture, exercise and proper lifting. We want everyone to have a healthy back."

**Extension Home Economics News**

**About Those Easter Eggs ...**

County Extension Agent for Home Economics

**Nutritional Value.** Eggs provide some of the highest quality protein available. Eggs are also one of the best nutritionally-balanced foods. They contain varying amounts of 13 vitamins, including vitamins A, D, E and K, riboflavin and folacin, plus numerous minerals. Because all this good nutrition comes for only 75 calories per large egg, eggs are nutrient dense.

**Egg Substitutes.** To reduce your daily intake of cholesterol, try an egg substitute -- either homemade or commercially-prepared. Some store-bought products are actually 98-99% egg whites with less than 1 gram of fat and cholesterol and less than 50% of the calories of shelled eggs. One brand advertises its product as liquid whole eggs but with 80% less cholesterol. All egg products are pasteurized and can be found as liquids in the egg section or solids in the freezer department

of the supermarket. Use substitutes for recipes requiring whole eggs.

To substitute for 1 whole egg, use 2 egg whites or 1/4 cup egg substitute or combine 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1 tablespoon white vinegar and 1 tablespoon liquid.

For baked goods, an eggless substitute may be used. Soften 1 tablespoon unflavored gelatin in 3 tablespoons cold water, add 3 teaspoons boiling water, cool. Beat until frothy; add to recipe (reduce other liquid by 2 tablespoons).

**Egg Hunt Safety.** If you would like to eat your dyed, hard-cooked eggs later, wash your hands thoroughly before handling the eggs at every step, including cooking, cooling, dyeing and hiding. If you will not be decorating your eggs right after cooking them, store them in their cartons in the refrigerator. Do not decorate or hide cracked eggs.

During that month, residential customers used 3.1 million gallons of water, for sewage removal, commercial customers used 4.2 million and industrial customers over half 1 million.

To build the sewer addition, \$350,000 comes from an Appalachian Regional Grant and \$648,000 from a Kentucky (KIA) low cost loan,

for a total of \$998,000.

Before construction starts, all-permework has got to be approved by the state.

In other action, the council approved the Mt. Vernon Police Department activity report. It showed:

64 citations issued, 109 total charges, 12 DUI arrests, 250 calls for service, 11 accidents, 45 other agent assists, and 12 criminal cases opened. The Mt. Vernon Volunteer Fire Department made 14 fire runs.

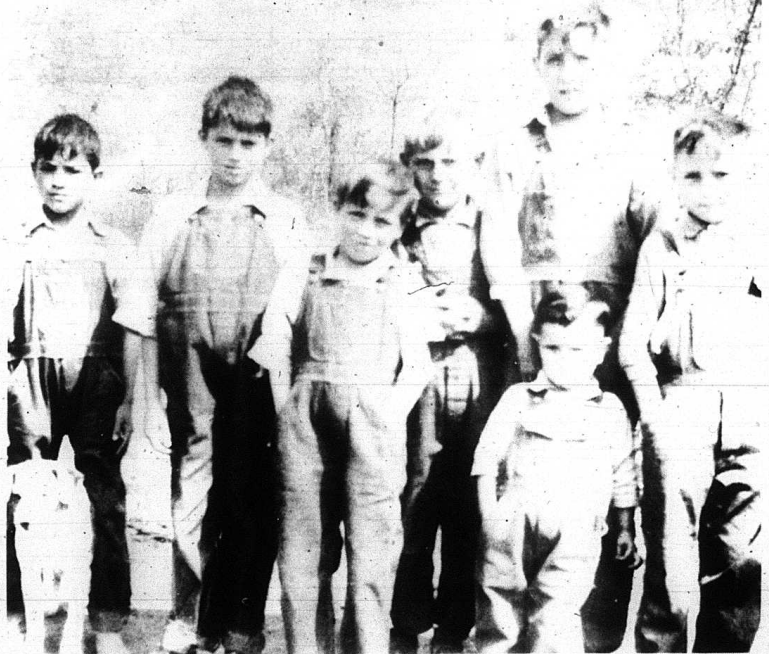

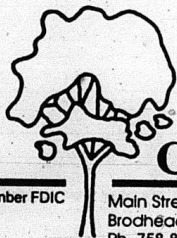
