## Hayes

David Burgess Hayes, an Aberdeen, Maryland town commissioner in the mid-1980s and a decorated retired Army officer, died April 25, 1996 at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore. He was 70 and lived in Aberdeen.

Born in Mt. Vernon, he was the son of the late Fred and Martha Price Hayes.

In 1970, he retired as a lieutenant colonel from the Army after almost 20 years of service that included the Korean and Vietnam wars.



Among his military decorations were the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Legion of Merit, the Air Medal with 23 clusters, the Purple Heart, the Bronze Star, the Army Commendation Medal, the Vietnam Service Medal, the Vietnam Campaign Medal

and the Senior Army Aviation Badge. After retiring from the Army, Mr. Hayes worked in real estate in and around Aberdeen. In 1984, he won a seat on the Board of Town Commissioners, the predecessor to the city council, and served for two years until he was defeated in a 1986 reelection bid. During his town board tenure, he worked to streamline town operations and make them more efficient.

He was a member of the VFW, Moose and American Legion, all in Aberdeen, as well as the Army Aviation Association of America, Retired Officers Association and national, state, and Harford County boards of Realtors.

He is survived by his wife of 42 years, Ursula G. Gerader Hayes; a daughter, Carol Davis of Mullica Hill, N.J.; four brothers, Raymond Hayes of Brodhead, Russell Hayes, Fred Hayes, Jr. and Leroy Hayes; two sis-

ters, Elizabeth Hassler and Trudy Honza; two grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Burial was May 3, 1996 at Arlington National Cemetery.

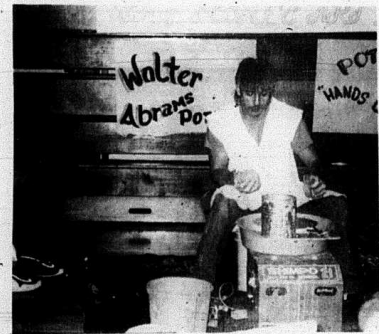
## Middle School holds Career Expo

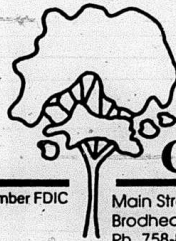

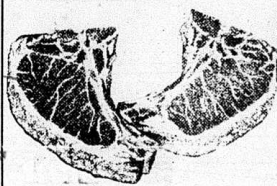

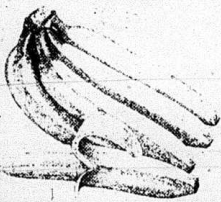

# School board votes to try and help juveniles

Juvenile offenders, who have problems with the law, at home and at school may soon find themselves in a day treatment program instead of behind bars or in another type of juvenile facility.

Mrs. Loretta Powell, Director of Student Services for the Rockcastle County school system, asked the board of education Tuesday night to approve an application for a \$59,000 grant to help fund the program. The

school board would commit \$40,000 of their own money toward the program as well.

The board approved Mrs. Powell's request, with one major stipulation - that Mrs. Powell will seek a pledge from Rockcastle County District Court Judges Mike Henry and Walter Maguire, that they will be very hard on students who begin the program and do not complete it.

Fifteen students would be enrolled in the classes. A full-time

teacher, counselor and instructional assistant would be employed to teach the class.

Mrs. Powell told the board she was of the opinion that these students would benefit much more from the day treatment program provided by the school system, than from being incarcerated.

The students enrolled in the class would be largely comprised of students, who are referred by the court system or the department of social

services. The Director of Student Services said that other school districts in the state already have the program and that it seems to work very well in most cases.

The classes would probably not be held on school property, Mrs. Powell told the board.

The fiscal court has traditionally budgeted only \$5,000 a year to house juveniles and the cost has steadily increased for the court.

Rockcastle County Attorney Jeff Burdette, who is responsible for prosecuting juveniles, said Wednesday that juvenile crime has increased steadily throughout the United States and Rockcastle County is no exception.

"We need as much cooperation from the state agencies as possible to help solve the problem and I think the board is taking a step in the right direction. This can be a great help to the entire county," Burdette said.

"It really is a Catch-22 situation for my office, because we are obli-

gated to prosecute these juveniles, but we are also obligated to help the fiscal court run the county as best they can and these mounting bills are certainly hurting the county's budget which, in turn, hurts other county projects that have nothing to do with crime," he said.

"I am committed to helping our young people who find themselves in juvenile court to changing their attitudes, most of them know right from wrong and it has been my experience that when we treat these juveniles firmly and fairly these juveniles begin to listen," he said.

"Maybe this new program will help these juveniles to become better citizens and get their life straightened out," he said.

## Cameras to be placed on county school buses

In order to help maintain discipline on Rockcastle County School buses, the board of education voted Tuesday night to purchase five video cameras, which will be placed at random on school buses.

The board also voted to buy boxes to hold the cameras for all county school buses, which will enable the cameras to be placed at random on school buses.

The good thing, School Superintendent Larry Hammond told board, is that riders will not be able to tell whether or not the cameras are on the bus they are riding on or not.

Rowland drives a bus in the Climax area of the county.

ball fields at the new high school, once high school play is complete. They also voted to approve applications for emergency substitute teaching certificates for Cynthia Rogers and Dawn Stallworth.

## At Rockcastle Hospital Board discusses loss of teacher

What normally would have been a routine item of business for the Rockcastle County School Board on Tuesday night, turned into a lengthy discussion about pre-school students at the Rockcastle Hospital, where the itinerant teacher there now is going and who will replace her.

Tammy Gabbard, director of the school system's pre-school program asked the board to create a position for another school psychologist, saying the need for two psychologists instead of one was certainly war-

ranted. Simple enough - right, wrong.

The board began immediately to question Gabbard about what was taking place, with the only apparent connection between the request for a new position and the position at the local hospital being money.

But, the board seemed most concerned that a certified teacher, Mrs. Dorothy Parsons, is leaving the hospital and intentions are to replace her with an instructional assistant.

Board members Dr. G.W. Griffith, Terry Burton and Doug Mullins questioned Mrs. Gabbard at length

about the changes at the hospital.

Mullins and Griffith told Mrs. Gabbard they had received several inquiries as to what changes were about to take place.

Mrs. Gabbard said that Mrs. Parsons, who is scheduled to work at the hospital one hour per day four days a week, would be replaced by a full-time instructional assistant, who would be at the hospital five days a week, six hours a day. The new instructional assistant would join the full-time special education teacher

# Ten more jobs Rockcastle Manufacturing expanding current plant

Rockcastle Manufacturing informed the Rockcastle Fiscal Court, at its meeting Tuesday, that it plans to expand its Mt. Vernon plant by 5,700 square feet.

The cost of the expansion is estimated at \$260,000 and, when completed, the company would add about 10 employees.

The \$260,000 cost will be financed by Kentucky Highlands, bringing the total of the company's indebtedness to that group to \$966,034. The company has \$1,441,721 equity in the building.

The court had the second reading of an ordinance to close Nicely Campground Road and approved the closing of Nelson Jones Road in the Copper Creek area, if work is completed as requested and an easement is granted the county for a turnaround.

The magistrates also voted to enter into an agreement with Montgomery County for juvenile incarceration

for \$100 a day and to raise rates for housing Jackson County inmates - charging adults \$22 a day and mental inmates \$32 a day. Rockcastle had 11 Jackson Co. inmates as of Tuesday.

Taking up the most time of the court was a discussion of the jail remodeling project that is required by the state Corrections Cabinet.

Jim Woodrum, president of Architectural Plus, Georgestown, Architects charged the project, reported to the court that the remodeling is "coming along." Phase 1 of the construction remodeling totaled \$204,000 and was the most involved phase. Phase 2 totaled \$114,000 and the decision for the court is now whether to proceed with Phase 3 or delay it.

Phase 3 would include a 10-bed dormitory on the west side of the courthouse to replace the 12 beds lost in Phase 2 and would also provide Jailor Joe Howard with an office. The 10 additional beds would bring the occupancy total of the jail to 42. Woodrum was told to proceed with

drawings and specifications for Phase 3 and bring them to the court who would decide on further action.

The court was told that bills for housing juveniles outside the county are still heating up. Montgomery County charged the county \$200; Lincoln Co. billed \$120; Mattison County charged \$200 and the Big Sandy Regional Jail in Prestonsburg charged a whopping \$3,357. The Rockcastle Co. Sheriff's department got \$775 for transportation costs.

This month's bills for housing juveniles outside the county exceeds the amount budgeted for the entire year.

In other action, the court plans to look into the amount cable companies doing business in the county, pay for a franchise to operate.

Also to be looked into is damage to McClure Road, Negro Town Hill and Hammonds Fork Road by overweight trucks and to decide if trucks can be held at least partially responsible for repairs.

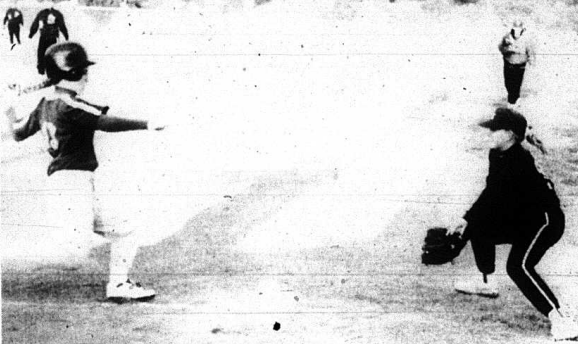

and other full-time instructional assistant already at the hospital.

But, Dr. Griffith said that he did not think that an instructional assistant could give the same quality instruction to students that a certified teacher could and he said that Linda Gregory, a hospital speech therapist was very concerned about what was going to take place. Griffith said Mrs. Gregory had told him that since Mrs. Parsons came to the hospital, the preschool students she works with have shown marked improvement. Mullins told the board that Mrs. Gregory had also voiced her concerns to him as well.

But, board member Terry Burton pointed out that certified teachers were paid to "instruct" and that what Mrs. Parsons was doing now, may not actually be instructing.

## Extension Home Economics News

### Food Safety Tips: From Purchase through Consumption

Symptoms of nausea, stomach cramps and vomiting may indicate more than just the flu. They may also point to food-borne illnesses caused by bacteria.

Following the three steps of keeping food clean, keeping hot foods hot, and keeping cold foods cold from purchase through consumption will keep foods safe and prevent possible illnesses.

At the store, watch for dented cans or damaged packages which may cause food spoilage. Avoid cracked or dirty eggs, and take foods home right after shopping so they don't get warm in the car. Once at home, perishable foods such as milk, eggs and meat should be refrigerated or frozen immediately.

Read labels to see which foods need refrigeration, and refrigerate items such as salad dressings and canned foods after opening. Foods in cabinets should be tightly sealed and away from heat and cleaning

products which might contaminate food.

Recommended refrigeration temperature is 37 degrees, and all foods should be wrapped thoroughly or covered. But opened canned foods in glass or plastic containers to prevent metallic-taste.

Meats, poultry and fish already in plastic wrap from self-service counters should be left in this packaging. If not, rewrap the meat in loose waxed paper so it has a dry surface to slow bacterial growth. Keep most meats in the refrigerator no longer than 2 days unless cured or smoked.

If longer storage is needed, freeze meats, fruits, vegetables and baked goods at 0 degrees. Fresh meats with the exception of roasts, steaks and poultry, can be frozen for about 4 months. The others will keep well for about a year. Fruits and vegetables freeze safely for 8 months to a year.

Make sure all work surfaces, utensils and hands are clean before handling food. Take special care to clean cutting boards, knives and hands with hot, soapy water after they come in contact with raw meats and poultry so bacteria are not spread.

Bacteria which cause food borne illnesses are usually killed in the cooking process, but more can grow if food is left out at room temperature. Foods should not be left at room temperature for more

than 2 hours, including preparation time. The basic rule is to keep hot foods above 140 degrees and cold foods below 40 degrees. Raw or cooked foods should be kept out of the 41-140 degree "danger zone".

Foods which favor bacterial growth such as meats, poultry, eggs

and milk require special care. They must be kept at either their hot or cold temperature, but never in between. Items such as cream

pies, custards, sandwich fillings and meat, egg, and potato salad need proper refrigeration.

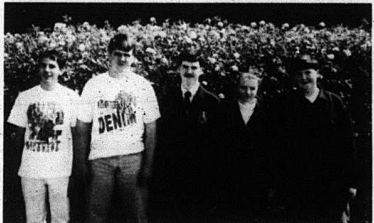

native warm season grasses, and red clover. Different species enable farmers to improve the seasonal supply of forage, grow more forage and grow better quality forage. Using these species also can reduce hay harvest costs.

## Rotational grazing means more money

By Tom Mills, County Extension Agent for Agriculture

Rotating livestock on pastures improves a grazing system and increases income. Rotating can be as simple as closing gates. The manager should determine when animals graze a field instead of running over the entire farm. All grass needs a recovery time, and rotating between fields allows grass to grow between grazing cycles. The cheapest feed on a livestock farm is the feed animals harvest for themselves. Nutrients harvested by grazing cost less than half as much as nutrients harvested and fed as stored feed like hay or grain.

Improving a grazing system increases pasture utilization and fertility, as well as forage quality and supply. Rotational grazing can increase pasture utilization by at least 10%. Depending on the forage, rotating results in pasture use of 60% or more, compared to use of 50% or less when pasture is continuously grazed.

Nutrient cycling reduces the need for fertilizer on grazed pastures. Less than 10% of the forage's phosphorus and potassium are removed by livestock; they return most of it as dung and urine. Phosphorus and potassium levels tend to rise near shade, water, and gate areas.

Nutrient removal is much less when pasture is grazed than when it is used to make hay. Thus, starting a good rotational system reduces fertilizer (especially nitrogen) needed compared to making hay.

Forage quality improves when pasture areas rest between grazings. Animals allowed continuous access to a pasture trample and defecate on significant amounts of forage. These areas often grow up, becoming more mature and lower in quality.

Rotating puts livestock on pasture when the forage is at or near its peak nutritive value. Rotated pastures have higher digestibility because forage is kept in a vegetative and growing stage with less dead and over-mature material, compared to continuously

grazed pastures. Animals tend to select only the best and leave the worst.

Rotational grazing systems also allow use of species that are more productive and responsive to management including alfalfa,

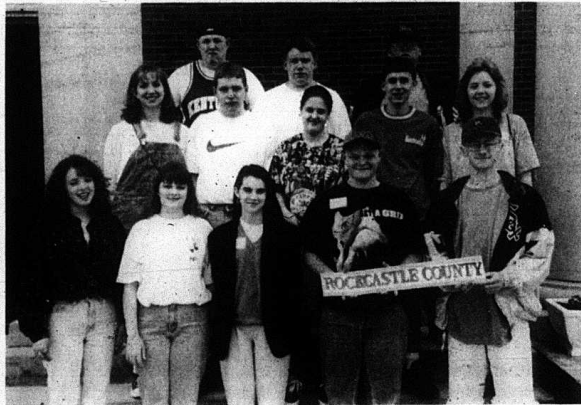
