



And, County Attorney Jeff Burdette agrees that it is a burden on the county but, as he told the fiscal court Tuesday, it is only going to get worse for a while. "I'm not going to turn my back on my responsibility to prosecute these juveniles. They need to learn a lesson and they need to be off the street, in a place where they can begin rehabilitation." The county judge agreed. "We are currently spending around \$5,000 a moint to house these offenders in other juvenile facilities," he said. "Ninety percent of the people will not







Renfro presents Rogers with protest petition




