## Judge says Litter control one of county's best programs

Rockcastle County's Litter Control is "one of our best programs for the money," according to County Judge/Executive Buzz Carlifos. Formerly the All American Club, the unit works for the Rockcastle Fiscal Court, and also does an "excellent" job, the judge said. Mainly with just three full time workers, Litter Control "amazes other counties that we have a litter control unit in our county," the judge noted. "They think it's unusual." "It is one of the best," the judge concluded, "we spend only about \$200 a month to keep our roadsides as clean as possible. We use prisoners from the county jail four days a week and one weekend. We also use persons who were fined and didn't pay and persons caught littering."

What is the biggest problem facing the group? It's fast food litter thrown out of vehicles. The worst litter is found from Renfro Valley through Conway. Another is around Lake Linville and from Jean's Restaurant on Ky. 1004. Livingston is the cleanest of the towns in the county, the control employees say. That's probably because they have mandatory garbage pickup in the town. The cost goes on Livingston's water bill. The full time workers are just three, Wayne Bullock, Cooperator Bobby Bullen and Junior Griffin. They were recently awarded by the state for their work by the Commissioner of Highways. The group spent \$775 during June. They spent \$200 for their salaries, 109.35 for gasoline and they picked up 254 bags of litter. "It runs about \$80 on the average for gas," the judge confided. "So I'd say it is one of the cheapest things the county does. It's much cheaper than (Cont. to A8)

For Hal and Carolyn Hunt and their two children, dairy farming is more than an occupation, it is a way of life. And Hal Hunt should know. He has been working in the dairy business for nearly thirty years and his family has been involved with dairying for 46 years. Hal's parents, Lew and Alice began their dairy herd in 1950 when they hand milked about twenty cows a day. In those days the Hunts would separate the cream and sell it to local creameries and use the remaining milk to grow feeder pigs which were later sold to local farmers. Lew and Alice are now deceased but Hal and his family carry on the family operation on their 180 acre farm. At present, Hal works his Cardinal Hill Dairy Farm almost completely by himself, with just some part time help. His wife Carolyn is the farm (Cont. to A8)

Wally June Kirby, 38, is charged with the shooting death of Tracy Caudill, 22, of Orlando, who died on February 25, 1995. According to court records, Miss Caudill died from a gunshot wound to the face. The incident occurred at a vacant house on Chestnut Ridge road on February 24. At the time of the shooting Miss Caudill was pregnant and personnel at the Rockcastle Hospital emergency room were able to deliver a healthy eight and half pound girl before Miss Caudill was flown to the University of Kentucky Medical Center where she later died. According to family members Kirby and Miss Caudill had two children, the one that was born at the time of her death and another child about

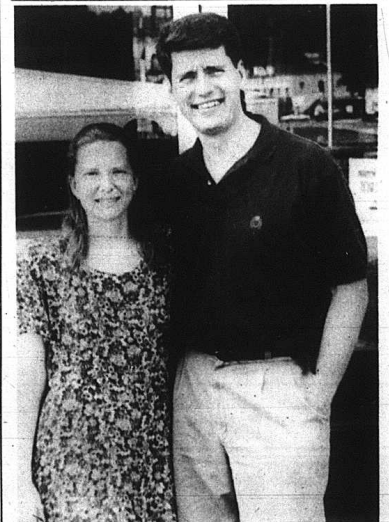
two years older. Family members have been in-

## Points East

It had been at least fifteen years since I grew a row of taters. Loreta and I latched onto each other 14 years ago and one of the first things we did together was plant a big garden. But we didn't grow any taters because I carefully explained to my new bride that you could buy them cheaper at the supermarket then you could even think about growing them.

And if well-kept taters is what you want to eat—good solid taters to dice up and fry or cook up and mash or quarter to put in your stew, then go to the store and buy them because there is no way that you can grow keeping taters in Kentucky as cheaply as you can purchase them in the grocery store. And you don't even have to go to any trouble.

When I was growing up it seemed like my life revolved around that darn

tater crop.

The first thing you did in the spring was plow up a big tater patch. You planted them along with a ton or so of 10-10-10 fertilizer and you waited for them to come up. About the time they started sprouting up out of the ground, so did the weeds, and then you had to hoe them. A few days later all the tater bugs in the world would descend upon the vines and you'd have to rush home after school and put on your work clothes and crawl on your hands and knees for miles through the darn tater patch and squash tater bugs between your thumbs and forefingers. And your thumbs and forefingers would get approximately the color of glow-in-the-dark sulphur and it wouldn't wash out or off. You'd spend months repeating that process over and over and over again and you'd be way too sick of

taters to ever think about putting one in your mouth.

Of course everybody didn't spend their springs growing taters. Especially good looking girls. You could spend a month moseying up to a potential sweetheart and writing notes every night that you stuck in her locker early the next day. You could talk her into letting you pack her books to the next class or even the bus and finally you'd get to the point of holding hands. You could buy a banana split with two spoons—and she'd eat her half with one hand and hold onto your's with the other until you got down to the last bite.

Then she'd notice your fingers. Thumbs and fingers brightly yellowed with the entrails of a hundred thousand tater bugs squashed between them. Yellow that you couldn't wash out with Tide or even Clorox straight out of the bottle. Tater bug yellow to the bone. I'd rather not go into the details, but tater bugs cost me at least a dozen bananas because girls didn't want to fool with you once they found out that your hands were semi-permanently stained with bug juice. And, in retrospect, I don't blame them a bit. I don't know that Loreta and I would have hooked up if she'd had dead bug stains all over her hands. I know for sure that it wouldn't have been a turn-on.

So I've avoided growing taters in the garden over the last couple of decades. Until this year. Loreta and I are both old enough and so well-seasoned that one dead bug or even a hundred thousand aren't apt to upset our relationship.

This Spring we planted a fifty foot row of taters through the garden. Someone gave us the seed and we thought why not? We also planted some peas and early beans the same day. Some onions and lettuce and a host of other greens.

So we've been eating out of the garden for several weeks now and finally last week our first little row of beans were big enough to pick and the taters were blooming like crazy. I decided to grovel down around the plants and see if I could find a few

little taters to cook with the beans. I hoped to find a hand-full of golf-ball sized spuds that would provide seasoning if they did nothing else. But that's not the way it turned out.

The taters I found were, on average, as large as baseballs! They had to be split and quartered to come close to cooking size. I found lots of smaller ones that could be cooked whole the way you want your new taters to be but anyway I dumped the chunks and the littens into the pot of beans and let them stew for about half an hour. And as far as I know, not a bean has been eaten. Loreta and the youngins keep coming to the pot and fishing out the taters. I've had to get myself a big bowl-full and sneak them out into the frig I keep in the garage for my fish bait.

Next year I'll be growing a row of Kennebecs or Maine Wonders again. I know that I've been beating around the bush but as far as I can tell there's not a garden you can get out of your tater that tastes as good as a fresh grown tater. And Loreta doesn't even look at my fingers anymore. She likes them taters too much to pay any attention to how I look.

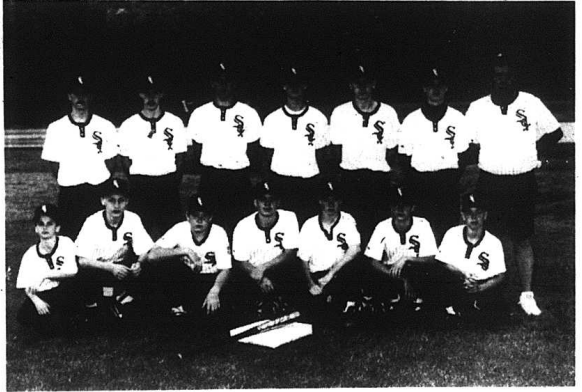

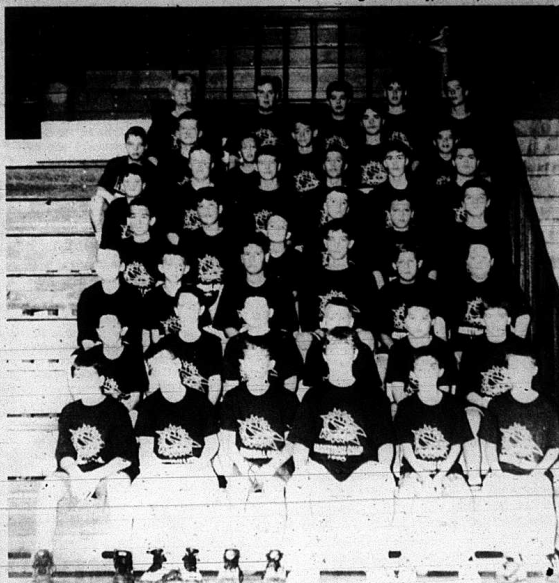

## Fishing is good, if you know where to look

The warmer temperatures of June are drawing more folks out to fish. Some spots, of course, are hotter than others and if you know what to look for, you might get better results.

The species foremost on the minds of many anglers is bass. Here are some notes: White bass have just finished spawning and ideal sights are near deep rock walls or steep rocky points. Night fishing for white bass is a good bet, but they can also be taken in "jumps" in early morning or late afternoon when they're feasting on shad. Fishing for white bass should be excellent this year at Nolin, Green River, Rough River, and Barkley lakes as well as in Barkley tailwaters and from lock 2 to the mouth of the Green River.

One of the most abundant and popular species of fish in Kentucky is black bass. This group includes largemouth, smallmouth and Kentucky, or spotted bass. After spawning is completed, bass retreat to cooler depths and will seek well-oxygenated water in the mid-70s. They are more active at night, especially in areas that receive heavy use during the day.

Fishing for largemouth bass should be excellent this year in wide range across Kentucky. Use artificial nightcrawlers and deep-running lures near rocky points and deep drop-offs where the fish have good cover. The forecast is excellent for Barkley, Kentucky, Bearsh, Bullcock Pen and Kincaid lakes as well as the Kentucky Lake tailwaters.

Smallmouth bass have a more limited range than largemouth bass, but they are an important and widespread stream fish. They can be found in sections where they feed on crayfish. In lakes, smallmouth bass can be found near areas with large gravel, rubble or submerged logs, but usually not near vegetation. Fishing should be excellent in Dale Hollow Lake, Kentucky Lake and Elkhorn Creek.

Kentucky bass are most abundant in streams that have rocky bottoms and well defined riffles. In lakes, they can usually be found near steep, rocky banks and suspended over deep, open waters. The forecast is excellent for spotted bass at Nolin River Lake. The fishing should also be good at Paintsville, Laurel River, Barren River, Rough River and Kentucky lakes, Kentucky Lake tailwaters and the Ohio River.

There is no size limit on Kentucky bass. The size limit was lifted to improve size and growth rates of

largemouth and smallmouth bass. Because of this, it is important to be able to tell them apart. This determination can be made by performing the tooth patch test. Almost all Kentucky bass, smallmouth bass and some largemouth bass have a rough area in the center of their tongues. This is actually a patch of teeth, which can easily be felt by rubbing a finger over it.

The regulation states that any black bass, except smallmouth, with a patch of teeth on its tongue is considered a Kentucky bass for size limit purposes. This means anglers must be able to identify smallmouth bass without relying on the tooth-patch test. After determination that the fish is not a smallmouth bass, the angler may keep the bass, regardless of size, if a tooth patch is present.

Determining a smallmouth from a largemouth bass can be done by looking at the color and mouth of the bass. Largemouth bass have a dark horizontal stripe and their upper jaw extends well beyond the back of the eye. Kentucky bass have a dark horizontal stripe and rows of dark spots on their sides, but their upper jaw does not extend beyond the back of the eye. Smallmouth bass have no horizontal stripe, their sides are plain or have vertical bars, and their upper jaw does not extend beyond the back of the eye. Read the 1996 Kentucky Sport Fishing Guide for size and creel limits. Also, know if there are special regulations before you fish an area.

Last year 19,749 athletes from 112 counties came to Central Kentucky to participate in the Games. Ages ranged from two to 85.

to hire someone to go around the county and pick up litter."

It's interesting to see the May report from Bullock.

In District 1, they cleaned on Mt. Zion Road, two dumps on Old Rocky Road, Lake Road and one dump on Copper Creek Hill, where they found 7 road signs.

In District 2, they cleared 6 roads, including Skaggs Creek Road down by Livingston.

In District 3, they got the city of Brodhead, the fairgrounds, and four roads.

In District 4, they cleared 6 roads including Ky. 1505 and Johnetta to Climax.

In District 5, they got Red Hill Road, Ky. 490, Old U.S. 25, Mullins Station Road, Maple Grove Road and Cove Branch Road.

Some where in all the clearing they got the city of Mt. Vernon and Livingston as well as Brodhead.

In May the group picked up 254 bags of litter and spent \$114.30 on gasoline.

manager and their two children Carri, 5, and Casey 2, provide moral support.

Each morning about 5 a.m., you can find Hal in the milking parlor milking approximately 36 cows which produce one ton of milk per day. You will find him there again about 5 p.m., seven days a week. The modern double 3 herring-bone milking parlor makes it much easier for Hal than it was for his family in the early days. The parlor is

also equipped with a 1,000 storage tank which keeps the milk cool while awaiting pick-up from Southern Belle.

Always thinking about the environment and the impact his farming operation could have, Hal built a modern animal waste system in 1994 that allows him to keep animal waste away from ground water and possible stream contamination. The animal is also used as fertilizer for Hunt's 40 acres of corn that is used for silage to feed his cows and for the 40 acres of alfalfa he grows each year.

Hal admits that dairy farming can be a tricky business.

"Sometimes it can be very hard to tell if you are making any money or not and there seems to always be

something that will cut into your profits," Hunt said.

For example, this year milk prices have been a little higher, but in turn feed prices have skyrocketed because of the bad weather in the west.

"Farm management has never been more important than it is right now," he said.

And indeed the dairy business can be tough which is evident by the declining number of dairy farms in Rockcastle county.

Currently only 23 dairy farms are operated in Rockcastle with 1,000 producing cows. The average dairy cow produces 11,000 pounds of milk per year.

The average price of milk this year has been \$14.60 per 100 pounds.

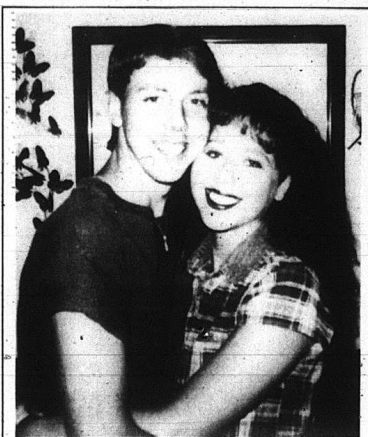

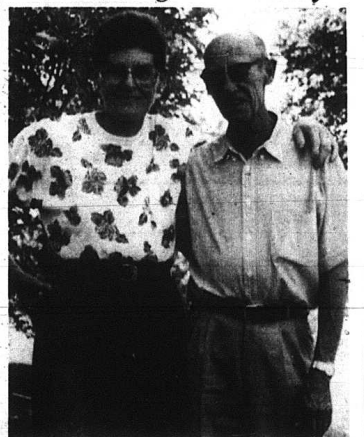

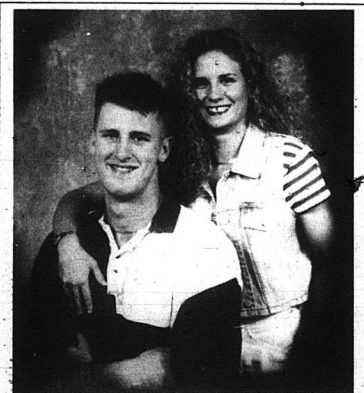

**The Wisdom of the Young & Old**

In our fast-paced society we sometimes overlook the young and old, but both groups have much to teach us.

Young children have a unique perspective on life. Unlike adults who are more concerned with the future, children concentrate on the here and the now. Each action has a result, and every event is a lesson.

When asked what he had learned from life, one child answered, "When Mommy and Daddy shout at each other, it scares me." Parents who hear this statement may immediately become concerned about what the child hears without seeing the wisdom behind it. If they were to think about it, the arguing pair would realize that their own fears contribute to the shouting, and that they too are scared by it.

Older loved ones are wells of experience and education, but we seldom fully drink of their wisdom. Talking with older relatives can relay a flood of information. Facts

about the family tree, or lessons learned from life are only taught if someone takes the time to listen.

One older person shared this gem: "If you pursue happiness, it will elude you. But if you focus on your family, the needs of others, your work, meeting new people, and doing your very best, happiness will find you." What a wonderful insight!

**Crop certification time**

Crop reports are currently being taken at the FSA Office. The deadline to file a crop report is July 1st for farms with tobacco, July 15th for farms with crops other than tobacco. ALL crops must be planted at time of certification. It is important for ALL producers growing burley tobacco on their farm(s) to file a crop report. This provides a record of crops grown on the farm for disaster purposes, such as disaster leasing etc. Crop reports are required from farms that are participating in the Production Flexibility Program and the Conservation Reserve Program. An appointment will be scheduled at your convenience to file the crop acreage report.

Sign-up is currently underway for the Production Flexibility Program (formerly the Wheat and Feed Grain Program). Farms with crop acreage bases for wheat and/or corn can sign

a 7 year contract to receive payments. There are no planting requirements and no set aside acres required, the contract may be terminated by the producer anytime during the 7 years to get out of the program. Deadline to sign up for this program is July 12. If you have any questions concerning this program, feel free to stop by or call us at 256-2525.

Deadline for signing burley tobacco leases is July 1st. There are numerous leases in the office which require signatures before being complete.

Producers who elected to continue the FCIC insurance, and will not be able to get their tobacco planted by the June 30 planting deadline, need to come into the office to file an FCI-9, Late Planting Agreement. This form should be filed PRIOR TO JULY 1. It will insure FCIC coverage of your

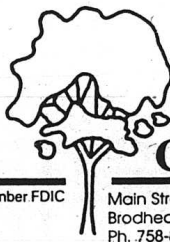

Eastern Kentucky University is a comprehensive university serving about 15,700 students on its 560-acre Richmond campus, throughout its 22-county extended service region and beyond.

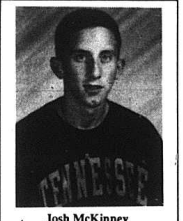
## McKinney receives scholarship from RECC

## USDA announces continuous signups

Agriculture Secretary Dan Glickman announced that USDA will have a continuous signup for producers wishing to enroll lands in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP). Glickman also said USDA is continuing extensive efforts to establish the long-term CRP policy and implement CRP provisions contained in the 1996 Farm Bill.

"Starting by late summer, acreage that is to be placed in filter strips, riparian buffer strips and grassed waterways will be eligible to enter the CRP throughout the year and producers will no longer have to wait for a specific signup period," Glickman said. "In addition, other high priority practices such as field windbreaks, shelter belts, living snow fences and wetland protection areas are being considered for eligibility under the continuous signup."

"While this type of acreage makes up a very small percentage of the total CRP, these practices have very high environmental benefits," he said. "Having the ability to enroll these acres at any time will give farmers and ranchers more options for better land management."

Local Farm Service Agency offices will calculate per-acre bid caps to determine the maximum acceptable rental rate that USDA is willing to pay for land entering the CRP. The producer could then decide whether to enroll in the program.

"In July, we expect to issue several conservation rules, including one that will extend the CRP through the year 2002," Glickman said. "We are not going to rush to make snap judgments disregarding the longer term policy of the CRP. First, because the

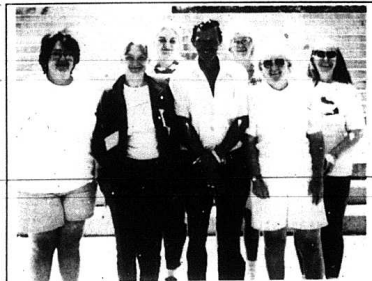

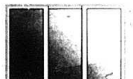

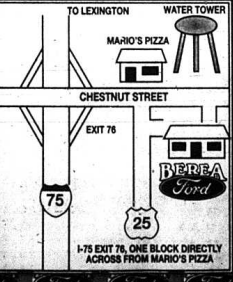

# Coffeville, Carolina finds a home at Brodhead

The citizens of Coffeville, Carolina would like to express their deepest appreciation to all who helped to make their Coffeville Book Talk a fabulous success.

Recently, the citizens of Coffeville, Carolina, a mock community created by the primary class of Mrs. Caroline Graves and Susan R. Coffey of Brodhead Elementary, held a book talk to share the family stories they published during their studies from "American Family Stories," a module from a teaching tool called *Different Ways of Knowing* which is

being used by more than 273 elementary schools throughout the state of Kentucky to support teachers in their efforts to integrate the study of history and social studies with reading, writing, math, science and arts.

The citizens initiated their study of "American Family Stories" with the creation of family treasure boxes and lifelines. The boxes included items significant to their families. The idea being that a person who found the boxes would be able to know what was important to each particular family. The lifelines they

made represented significant events from each year of the citizens' lives. This was a fabulous experience for all of us! As these provided each citizen an opportunity to work alongside their parents to accomplish a common goal. Through the development of these boxes and lifelines, many learned a great deal about their families they had not known. For others, they were able to "revisit" family experiences that happened long ago. These appeared to be a positive experience for the parents as well because they involved the whole family. For each of these projects we had special family circle times to provide the citizens with an opportunity to share a family story from their work. They absolutely loved this!

After several oral storytelling experiences, the Coffeville citizens then worked to tell a family story using various art forms. It was requested that they use several art forms to tell their stories. You would not believe the many different ways the citizens chose to tell their stories. For example, one student shared her family's experience of vacationing at Walt Disney World by researching to find out the characteristics of a brochure and then wrote a brochure based upon her experiences there with her family. She then read to learn how to make a gift bag in which she placed some souvenirs from her trip. When she presented her "story" she shared these in hopes of persuading fellow citizens to visit Walt Disney World with their families too.

All this led up to each citizen writing a family story. Through the Eastern Kentucky University Art Institute, under the direction of Dr. Joanna Guilfoi, we learned to make books from clay paste papers. The citizens then decided they would like to put their family stories into books to share with others, so the Coffeville "city council" after having a budget which projected the cost of publishing these books submitted to them by their fellow citizens and consent given by Mr. Mark McKinney, principal of Brodhead Elementary School, wrote a letter requesting a grant from the Eastern Kentucky Writing Project which is supported by the Kentucky Writing Program, the National Writing Project, and Eastern Kentucky University. The Eastern Kentucky Writing Project, is directed by Dr. Charles Whitaker, an EKVU professor from the English Department and his wife, Julie Whitaker, an English teacher from Madison Southern High

School in Berea. The citizens were fortunate enough to be awarded the requested grant to fund this year-long project to publish a series of books called Coffeville Family Stories Series.

The Coffeville citizens, after having reviewed many different pictures story books from their library for ideas, created "dummy books" from their stories to work from to publish their actual books by typing their texts and using various art pieces they had painted to create college illustrations for the text in their books. The authors at work met regularly in their authors' circle to conference with fellow authors about their work for ideas and for support.

Coffeville citizens had an opportunity to share their publications at their Coffeville Book Talk on June 6th with some very special guests: Mr. Shelby Reynolds and Mrs. Loreta

Powell from the Rockcastle Board of Education; Mr. Mark McKinney, principal of Brodhead Elementary; Dr. Joanna Guilfoi, art professor from Eastern Kentucky University; Mr. Jean Gentry, counselor from Brodhead Elementary and Ms. Satika Morgan, director of the Brodhead Elementary Family Resource Center as well as several parents of the Coffeville citizens. The citizens of Coffeville would like to extend a very special "thank you" to these people who were willing to take time out of their busy schedule to be a part of this very special event.

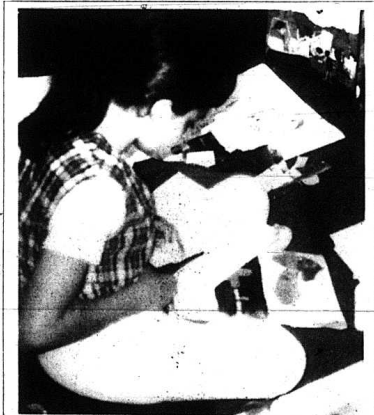

## "IT IS WRITTEN"

In Ac. 2 we read that on the day of Pentecost, Peter preaching to the Jews there in Jerusalem, taught some important things. He made known to them that Jesus was crucified and slain by wicked hands. Yet God raised him from the dead. This was proved and established by O.T. prophecy, vs. 25-28 which is a quotation of Ps. 16:8-11. Then Peter establishes the Resurrection by the fact that they were witnesses, vs. 32. Oh no beloved, when ye have crucified, both Lord and Christ, men must meet to receive the free gift of salvation, notice the answer Peter gave to them in vs. 38. "Then Peter said unto them, repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost." Repentance demands a change of heart, a change of mind, that will be seen in a changed life. Baptism is a burial in water. Rm. 6:3-4. Sprinkling and pouring are not acceptable to the Lord, why? Because God said it's a burial in water, Rm. 6:3-4, Col. 2:12. The promise of remission of sins comes only to those who meet these conditions! The promise is open to all, vs. 39. We must save ourselves from this untoward, perverse generation, how? not by becoming our own Savior but by believing and obeying Jesus. 3000 or so did that very thing on the same day, vs. 41. What about you, have you done these things?

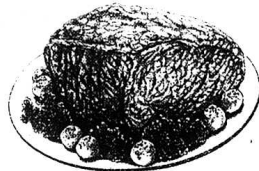

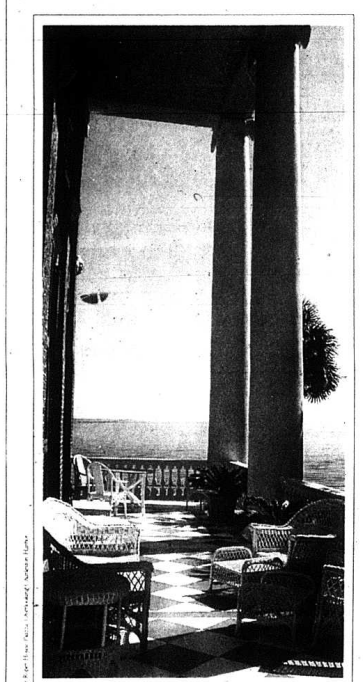

1. Books, our number one priority. These include a large variety of books for all age groups including best sellers.
2. Newspapers: Lexington Herald, Mt. Vernon Signal and the Renfro Valley Bugle.
3. Magazines and Periodicals.
4. FAX machine.
5. Videos and audio tapes.
6. Projectors to loan. 16mm, film strip and slide projectors.
7. KET Satellite available for college courses for the public.
8. K.L. Network allows this library to borrow books from libraries all over the state of Kentucky and if it's not available in this state, several adjoining states participate in this service.
9. An excellent reference section with information for students and adults. Also reference material in the children's section.
10. The Heritage Room- In this room we have all the Kentucky books (By Kentucky authors and about Kentucky). A genealogy section for those people searching for family history. A table and chairs has been purchased for this room by the Kiwanis Club and the Arts Council.
11. A large number of tables and chairs for study purposes are available.
12. Exhibits: This is a new addition to our library since there is now more space. We are pleased to be able to display crafts and special exhibits from the citizens of Rockcastle County.

16. The Summer Reading Program began this week and will run through July 20. A Pizza Party is planned for July 23rd. A lot of children are enrolled already but it's not too late to sign up.
