Fiscal Court lowers county tax rate

A 1997 tax rate of 7.7 cents per \$100 assessed value on property, down from this year, was set by the Rockcastle Fiscal Court at a called meeting Tuesday.
A motion made by magistrate John Holbrook to set the compensation rate at 8 cents per hundred dollars allowed by the state died from lack of a second.
A motion to set the rate at 7.7 cents made by magistrate Bill McKinney

and Donald Bullock was approved unanimously.
It was the third year the court did not take the increase amounting to \$6,000 and escaping a public hearing.
County Judge/Executive Buzz Carlolius told the court the decrease would mean about the same since the real estate valuation is up.
All other taxing districts remained about the same except soil conservation which took the increase. The

school board has not set its rate. It always sets it later in the year.
Tangible personal property rate was set at 8.2 cents per \$100. It included motor vehicles, watercraft and public service companies. Public service companies, real estate taxes, stayed at 7.7 cents.
Bank shares, now a "local deposit tax," is 0.025 percent.
The Rockcastle County Library rate was set at 1.7 per \$100 up from 1.6 cents including both real estate

and tangible property.
The Rockcastle Health Department, both real estate and tangible remained the same at 3.2 cents per \$100.
The Extension Service real estate was set at 2.6 cents and the tangible was 2.5 cents, the same as last year.
Forest land, which is in a separate account, remains at 0.02 cents on all privately owned forest land in the county to be used for fire protection, the same as last year.

The assessed value of property in Rockcastle County on which the tax rate is based is as follows:
Total of all, \$221,214,030; real estate, \$178,855,642; tangible, \$13,815,307; real estate, public service corporations, \$3,737,559; tangible, public service corporations, \$25,767,772; homestead exemptions, 1995, were \$29,228,200 and 1996 up to \$30,194,150.
Also on the Court's agenda Tuesday was a discussion of the jail. Judge

Carlolius made a statement and said there would be nothing further on the jail.
He said: "The County is remodeling and renovation of the jail is on track. The continued renovation to meet new standards will put the county into good condition to make money."
The court then went into a closed session to discuss "various personnel matters," the judge reported.

Everyone must register with hauler for disposal of garbage

The Rockcastle County Road Department crew has been busy this month cleaning up some of the illegal dumps in the county. Last week they disposed of huge amounts of garbage on Lower Piney, Lime Plant Hollow, Old U.S. 25, and the old rock quarry at Burr. This week they have been on Burnt Ridge Road and several other places.

Some of these dumps are caused by people from other counties bringing in truck loads of garbage, but most of it is done by local people who are not registered with a permitted hauler for regular disposal of their household garbage, according to Nancy Meadows, the Solid Waste secretary. She reminds us that everyone must register with a hauler or the

transfer center at Burr, according to the Rockcastle County Solid Waste Ordinance. Anyone caught illegally dumping will be prosecuted.
The permitted haulers are as follows: BEE Garbage, 256-2334; Linda McWhorter, 256-4498; Cassie Litter, 256-9010 and Owen Mink, 256-3372.

Kirby indicted

A Chestnut Ridge man was indicted August 9 by a Rockcastle County Grand Jury for possession of a handgun by a convicted felon.
According to court records, Clarence "Bearcat" Kirby, 36, was indicted in connection with a May 24th incident involving Kentucky State Trooper Steve Long. Records say Kirby had a .38 caliber handgun in his possession.
Kirby is being held in the Rockcastle County jail and will be arraigned Friday before Rockcastle Circuit Judge Daniel Venters.
Kirby was arrested on the same charge in 1994 by two Mt. Vernon police officers, but he was never indicted and he later filed suit against them in federal court for false arrest. That case is still pending.

Local farmers eligible for low-interest disaster loans from July flooding

Family farmers in 27 counties affected by severe storm damage that struck the area on July 19 have been declared eligible for low-interest disaster loans for property damages under a major disaster declaration issued by the federal Farm Service Agency.
The counties eligible for the assistance include Rockcastle, Boyle, Casey, Garrard, Lawrence, Lincoln, Marion, Pulaski, Taylor, Boyd, Carter, Adair, Elliott, Green, Jessamine, Johnson, Larue, Laurel, Madison, Martin, McCreary, Mercer, Morgan, Nelson, Russell, Washington and Wayne Counties. As much as six inches of rain fell in the Brodhead area on July 19.

The announcement was sent to Kentucky Gov. Paul E. Patton by the Farm Service Agency administrator of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Gov. Patton had requested that the USDA give assistance to Kentucky farmers because of the extremely-heavy rainfall and flooding.
Applications for "severe physical loss only" loans should be made before April 21 of next year and can be made at the Rockcastle Farm Service Agency which is located in the Rockcastle Agriculture Service Center until October 1, when they will move their offices to a new location on Hwy. 150 between Mt. Vernon and Brodhead.

Two sentenced for forging relative's checks

A father and son were sentenced Friday on charges of forging a dead relative's signature on U.S. Treasury Department benefit checks.
Herbert McPherson, 65, of Pulaski County, was sentenced in U.S. District Court in London to 13 months in prison on one count of forgery and two counts of submitting a fraudulent pension form to the Department of Veterans Affairs, according to Joseph L. Famularo, U.S. attorney for the Eastern District of Kentucky.
McPherson, who pleaded guilty in May, forged the name "Mary E. Miracle" on a Treasury check. U.S. District Judge Jennifer B. Coffman also ordered that McPherson must pay \$97,913 in restitution to the department, Famularo said.
McPherson's son, James McPherson, 25, of Rockcastle County, was also sentenced Friday to two years' probation for passing the check endorsed "Mary E. Miracle," James

McPherson also pleaded guilty to the charge in May.
Miracle died in February 1991, but the checks were endorsed in October 1992 and March 1994. Miracle was Herbert McPherson's mother-in-law and the son's grandmother.

Nothing yet on church fire

Federal and state officials still have not released any information on the origin of a fire July 27 that completely destroyed the Lighthouse Assembly of God Church at Burr.
Pastor Dwight Hensley said Tuesday that members of the church had been meeting in a shelter on the property and that construction would begin on a new building on the same site very soon.

There are few things more frustrating than spending half a day sneaking through the woods looking and listening for the best part of squirrel gravy and never hearing a squeak nor seeing a limb snake.

It's happened to me twice already this month. However, there is something far more frustrating that I have also experienced twice.

Twice you see, I have spent fruitless—well actually I've found some

apples and raspberries—then meatless, shall we say, days in the woods. I've returned to my pickup with my clothing covered with stick-tights and cockle burrs, with chiggers dug into places you'd rather not hear about, with large welts on my hands and neck from mosquito bites and with ticks crawling all over me. All this without ever having thought about pushing off the safety button on my 22 rifle or even looking through the

scope. Then, in the middle of the day when any self-respecting squirrel should be dozing in his den, I have eased my truck through rugged terrain and finally back to a blacktopped road. Then, by the time I've gotten up enough speed to shift into high gear, I've had to come to a screeching halt to avoid running over a squirrel hunkered up in the middle of the road gnawing on a hickory nut or a big black walnut.

One morning on a fifteen minute drive from the woods to my house, I saw at least a dozen squirrels either on or beside the road. And that's the very definition of frustration to me.

It's against the law to shoot game on a public road. I wouldn't do it even if it were legal. Two or three fox squirrels have taken up residence in a big silver maple in our back yard and I wouldn't think of shooting them. I'd just as soon eat a cat as to kill something that tame.

The point I'm trying to make is that squirrels are much smarter than most folks give them credit. They've learned that it's much safer to move into town where the only thing they have to fear is getting run over when they cross the road than to live in the woods where they have to deal with snakes, coyotes, hawks and hunters. Especially hunters.

Ravenna, Kentucky even has a street called Squirrel Blvd. And Berea ought to. Squirrels in Berea even use the telephone lines as major thoroughfares.

So what is a poor, frustrated hill-billy desperately craving a big pot of squirrel gravy to pour over his baked sweet later and fall beans to do?

The cops in Berea shot and killed a buffalo on the golf course the other day. (For you folks who live outside Berea, I swear I'm telling the truth.) I'm thinking about calling city hall and reporting that I was attacked by squirrels on Chestnut Street and then offering to dispose of any carcasses the police force might come up with in their quest to serve and protect. On the other hand, if you shot a squirrel with a .45 automatic there probably wouldn't be much left to put in the kettle.

The woods are full of mast this year and I figure that sooner or later some of these city squirrels are going to move back into the wilderness to get a change of diet if nothing else. I'm going to hold off hunting for a couple of weeks before I venture back out.

In the meantime, I hope my fall beans last that long. Squirrel gravy ain't near as good if you don't have a big one of hot corn bread and mess of fall beans to go with it.

PRECIOUS SOULS, CHILDREN OF AN EVIL AGE, greetings and considerations to you and yours for the placid Plains of Wabed, birthplace of the late Herman "Dully" Doledrum, long-time trapper and part-time whiskey gauger for Spirits of Spiro, who said, "It's lot easier to form an

opinion when you don't have all the facts."

Dear hearts, I had planned to tell you about my nearly being accosted by a Pentecostal, but a spate of mail demands that I use today's space to reply to a couple of missives from my readers. Here goes.

Dear John Norman: I'm a old-fashioned Baptist and I go to a church where women don't wear pants. You said one time that you studied the Old Testament when you were in the seminary. What do you think about a man wearing a woman's clothes, or visy-versy? It's no mystery to me why so churches nowadays aren't reaching the lost. (from Merulda Stipwedder, Burnside, Kentucky)

Dear Merulda: The biblical verse to which you refer is found in Deuteronomy 22:5 and reads: "A woman shall not wear anything that pertains to a man, nor shall a man put on a woman's garment; for whoever does these things is an abomination to the LORD your God." (RSV)

When I was in the seminary, Merulda, I was taught that we are more apt to rightly interpret Scripture if before we rush to apply it to present times we find out what that passage meant when it was written. In other words, knowing what it meant then helps us determine what it means now.

When Deuteronomy 22:5 was written, the greatest danger the Israelites faced was the life-style of the Canaanites whose land they had conquered. Baalism was the religion of the Canaanites, and it was highly saturated with sexual themes.

Worshippers of Baal believed in sympathetic magic, i.e., what they did on earth would influence the gods to do likewise. So there was a lot of sex going on in their temples in the hopes that the Baal and his female consort would do likewise. To put it pointedly, they believed that fertility in heaven would result in fertility on earth in terms of children, cattle, and crops.

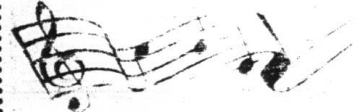
The magic of the Canaanites didn't stop at the male-female level. They believed that "oneness" between male and male and female and female would also bring about "oneness" in the heavens. As a result, distinctions between male and female diminished. We might say that the Canaanites started the "unisex" movement.

And that, Merulda — obliteration of the differences between the sexes — is what Deuteronomy 22:5 is all about. The Israelites knew very well what it meant: the distinction between the sexes is based on creation and should not be violated in any way as, for example, in the simulated changes of sex in pagan religions.

So, that's what the verse meant then. But what does it mean now? It means exactly the same thing: don't

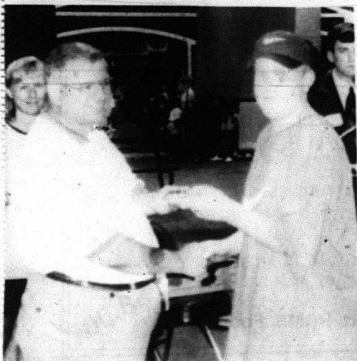

ties, 19 other KY counties are named as contiguous counties where eligible family farmers may qualify for FSA EM (emergency) physical loss assistance, pursuant to Section 321 (a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act. Rockcastle County is one of the 19 counties named. EM applications will be received through August 21, 1997 for SEVERE PHYSICAL LOSSES ONLY and applications pending on that date may be processed and completed. EM loans will be made under Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) In-

struction 1945-D.

Producers who elected not to take out the FCIC insurance should contact the office to make sure they have signed the FSA-570, Waiver of Insurance. This must be on file no later than September 30, 1996. This form must also be on file no later than September 30 if you are participating in the AMTA program (new 7 year program).

Producers who have FCIC insurance through the FSA office and experience conditions which affect their insured crop need to contact the

office as soon as possible to complete disaster credit forms which pertain to their insurance coverage.

Producers who need to make farm improvements may sign-up for the Interim EQUIP program. This program is being phased in to replace the current Agricultural Conservation Program (ACP). Practices in this program include: diversions, critical areas, sediment retention, water or erosion control, stream protection, animal waste system, permanent wildlife habitat, shallow water areas for wildlife. Special practices have

been developed to address unique problems such as: waste utilization, filter strips and heavy use areas.

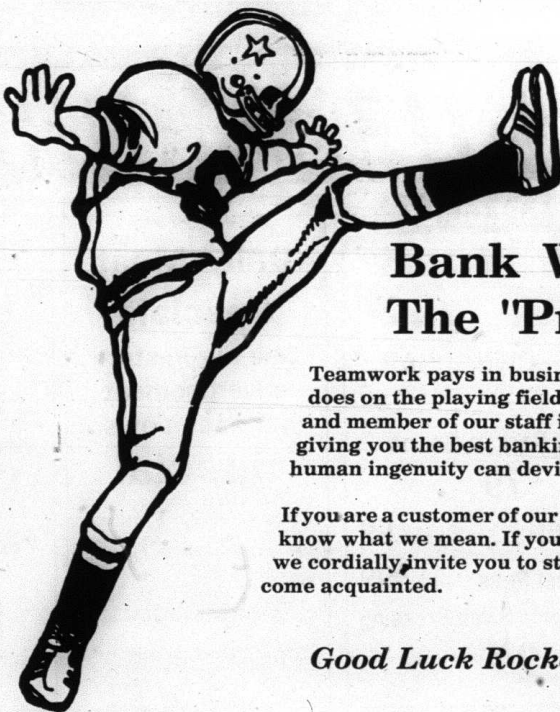





Rockcastle stages 'Livingston Day' to mark county's educational gains

(Taken from The Courier Journal - Monday, May 1, 1950)

Crippled Girl, 10, Paves the Way

Livingston, Ky., April 30. The plight of a crippled Rockcastle County schoolgirl started a movement which led her county out of an educational wilderness.

The story of the little girl - Lucille Simpson, 10, of nearby Copper Creek - was told on the street as hundreds of citizens of Rockcastle and adjacent counties gathered here yesterday to celebrate "Livingston Day."

Everybody Seems Proud

Now Livingston Day was set aside as a festive occasion purely and simply because of the great strides made in two years in the over-all county school system.

And everyone here was doggone proud of what had been done.

Richard Lee Gentry, principal of Livingston High School, seemed to hit the nail on the head when he said, "We believe this will be the beginning of a new Livingston."

In order to appreciate fully the feelings of the good folks of Rockcastle County now that the school system is so much better than it was, you have to move back to what were described as "the good old days."

"Good Old Days" Recalled

In the "good old days" Livingston was able to afford a grade school and a high school although the latter was not a large one.

In 1948, the Livingston Independent school consisted of a brick building in a run-down state of repair. It had only eight rooms in which were housed eight grades and a high school. The enrollment in the grades was about 175 pupils. The high school division occupied the other three rooms, one of which had to be used as a lunchroom.

Drops Below Minimum

The high school had a faculty of three. In addition to teaching, these faculty members also performed the duties of superintendent, athletic coach and librarian - each holding two jobs.

The enrollment started out at 80, but dropped to around 67 - just above the figure necessary for a high school under state regulations. There was a library, but the books were all old.

There was no laboratory equipment, no teaching aids, and often no proper

textbooks for the children. There were no inside toilets and the outside ones were close to the building and very unsanitary.

The building was in a high state of disrepair. The roof leaked - in some places rain poured, down onto students and their desks during thunder-showers.

Had 4 Separate Systems

The wiring was open in places and its insulation was bare. Windows were not, the furnace wouldn't work, there were no showers and no gymnasium equipment.

At this time, there were four independent school systems in Rockcastle County. The whole state was talking consolidation.

It is here that little Miss Simpson enters the picture. A victim of infantile paralysis, she couldn't walk to her county school located on Copper Creek. This was the one-room Wilmot Chapel School. The county Board of Education agreed to let her ride to Brodhead if her father would pay the tuition.

Lucille's Father Acts

After enrolling at Brodhead, little Lucille learned, so rapidly and well under the grade school system there, her father - Garfield Simpson - began to work for consolidation.

Spreading the gospel among the neighbors, Simpson got up a petition which requested consolidation with the Brodhead grade school system.

But there was a fly in the ointment. Brodhead was an independent district and nothing could be done about the consolidation plan along that line.

But the plan was altered so the two independent school districts - Brodhead and Livingston - could consolidate with and become a part of the Rockcastle County school system.

Consolidation Is Year Old

This consolidation was effected March 7, 1949.

The county immediately started plans to build a \$45,000 addition to the present structure. That addition has been completed. It consists of six classrooms, toilets and other facilities. The home economics room, with its built-in base and wall cabinets, three stoves, four sewing machines and other equipment, is a source of pride and joy to all residents here.

In addition, the county has repaired the old building, added showers and locker rooms to the gymnasium and made other needed improvements. The

enrollment of the grades has increased to 250 and three teachers have been added. The high school enrollment has increased to 130 and two teachers have been added there. Next year, the enrollment will be increased by 70 or more students, bringing the total to more than 450 students and 14 teachers.

The county has spent more than \$50,000 improving Livingston School.

Superintendent Optimistic

"My duties and responsibilities have more than doubled (since consolidation of the two districts), but I don't mind as long as Rockcastle County is progressive in education," the Rockcastle school superintendent, Mrs. Neureal Miracle, said.

"The children of Rockcastle County are as dear as the children of any county in the state and they deserve the best."

And if the residents of Rockcastle County have their way - and it looks like they have a flying start toward their goal - the children of this county will get the best.

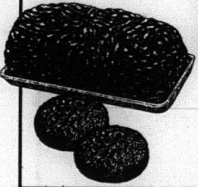

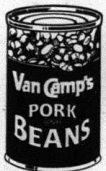

**OLESTRA:
Approved With
Special Labeling**

Products containing olestra, a fat-based substitute for conventional fats, are expected to start appearing on store shelves soon. FDA approved olestra last January, 24 for use in certain snack foods. The agency is requiring all products containing olestra to be labeled with specific health information.

Proctor and Gamble Co. developed olestra, which it is marketing under the trade name Oleo.

Because of its unique chemical composition, olestra adds no fat or calories to food. Potato chips, crackers, tortilla chips, or other snacks made with olestra will be lower in fat and calories than snacks made with traditional fats.

Olestra may cause abdominal cramping and loose stools in some individuals, and it inhibits the body's absorption of certain fat-soluble vitamins and nutrients. FDA is requiring Proctor & Gamble and other manufacturers who use olestra to label all foods made with olestra and to add essential vitamins - vitamins A, D, E, and K -- to olestra.

As a condition of approval, Proctor & Gamble will conduct studies to monitor consumption as well as studies on olestra's long-term effects. FDA will formally review these studies in a public meeting of the Foods Advisory Committee within 30 months from the date of olestra's approval.

The following labeling statement will be on all products made with olestra: This Product Contains Olestra. Olestra may cause abdominal cramping and loose stools. Olestra inhibits the absorption of some vitamins and other nutrients. Vitamins A, D, E, and K have been added.

Like all food additives, olestra's safety was the primary focus of FDA evaluation. For olestra, the safety evaluation focused not only on its toxicity, but also on the product's effects on the absorption of nutrients and on the gastrointestinal system.

Studies of olestra indicated it may cause intestinal cramps, more frequent bowel movements, and loose stools in some individuals. These gastrointestinal effects do not have medical consequences. The required labeling will give consumers needed information to discontinue the product if appropriate.

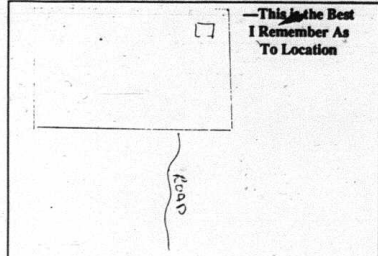

Greenhouse Project designed to involve all students at RES, connecting their acquisition of knowledge, skills and abilities to the real world of work and business opportunities.

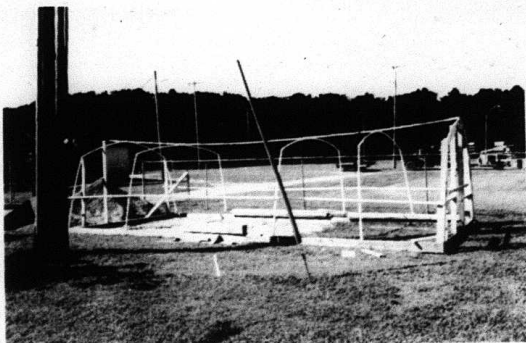
Initial planning for the Roundstone Elementary School Greenhouse

We're hoping all of you will have a safe and happy Labor Day Weekend! This being the last summer holiday, I'm sure a lot of people will be traveling to many destinations. This means we all have to drive with extra care, watching not only ourselves but the other drivers as well.

To all the Rockcastle County citizens that do not use your public library, I'd like to give you some reasons to visit with us.

We now have a special room (The Heritage Room) for the Kentucky collection and the genealogy of Kentucky. Some of the authors of Kentucky fiction are: Harriet Arnow, Rebecca Claidill, Billy C. Clark, John Fox, Jr., Jim Wayne Miller, Janice Holt Giles, James Sherbourne, James Still, Jesse Stuart, Bobbie Ann Mason, Frank Strunk and Betty Laymen Receiver.

In the non-fiction section there are books about all phases of Kentucky life both past and present.

A lot of booklets about things happening in Kentucky are available; Student guides and applications, a State Directory, Coal Journal, Crime in Kentucky, Services for the elderly, Traffic Accidents in Kentucky, Agricultural Statistics and many others.

We subscribe to three magazines about Kentucky. These are: Back Home in Kentucky, The Kentucky Explorer, and Kentucky Game and Fish.

In the genealogy area we have census records on microfilm and some census books, the Mt. Vernon Signal is also on microfilm dating from 1887

to the present time with the exception of a few years that were not made available. A lot of family histories, cemetery records, marriage records and a lot of other vital information for those people researching their family history.

This is a nice quiet room that provides an excellent place to do research. With help from the Kiwanis Club and the Rockcastle County Arts Council we were able to purchase a new table and chairs for the convenience of those people wanting to use this room. During the summer we have people from out of state nearly every day looking for help with their family history.

Another service that is used by a lot of our patrons but I'm sure many do not know about is the interlibrary loan department. This library can't provide every book that is needed but we are part of the Kentucky Library Network. Approximately 150 public, college and other libraries are part of this network. This means when a book is requested that is not on our shelves, we may ask to borrow from the other participating libraries in Kentucky. In most cases the borrowed book will reach us in less than a week. We are also able to borrow books from libraries in other states. Just last week I borrowed a book for a patron from a library in Louisiana. Let us help you with your requests.

Since the renovations have been completed, we now have a large room just for the children. One area is for the preschool children with a play area for the little ones. This helps

while the parents are looking for their particular needs. This also makes the adult section quieter.

Books are shelved according to reading ability in both fiction and non-fiction. We continually get new books for all age groups in these areas.

Many other services are available for everyone both young and old.

Some new books ready for your reading pleasure and information are EXECUTIVE ORDERS by Tom Clancy. This is a sequel to Debt of Honor and this book ended with Tom Clancy's most shocking conclusion ever: a joint session of Congress dead, the President dead, the Supreme Court and Joint Chiefs likewise. Dazed and confused, the man who only minutes before had been confirmed as the new Vice-President of the United States is told that he is now President. President John Patrick Ryan.

And this is where EXECUTIVE ORDERS begins. Ryan has agreed to accept the vice-presidency only as a caretaker for a year, and now, suddenly, an incalculable weight has fallen on his shoulders. How do you run a government without a government? Where do you even begin?

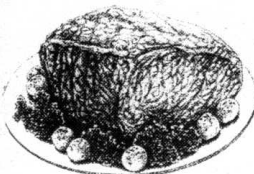

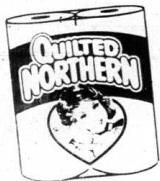

The Area Development Districts (ADDs) have been designated by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet as the proper channels for the public's input into the process. The Cumberland Valley Area Development District has a transportation committee that was established, pursuant to federal regulations setting a certain minimum for local input, at the direction of the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, Division of Transportation Planning. Documents, such as the Six Year Highway Plan and "Unscheduled Needs" list will be on display at the community meeting for comment. Currently, the ADD's Transportation Committee is evaluating and prioritizing "Unscheduled Needs" to be sent directly to the Transportation Cabinet for inclusion in the overall plan. The Transportation Cabinet will receive priorities from the local officials, area development districts and district highway offices before redeveloping the six year highway plan and the long range plan. The Kentucky 2001 Process is the procedure for developing the state's overall plan. The plan includes economic development, transportation, health care, aging and other issues. The process is a visioning approach for seeing where the area should be in the future. One meeting will be held in each of the eight Cumberland Valley Area Development District's Counties. The meeting for Rockcastle County is scheduled for September 20, 1996 at 2 p.m. at the Rockcastle County Courthouse.

Rockets open '96 campaign Friday

When the Rockcastle County Rockets kick off their 1996 campaign in London Friday night - it will be a totally different team from a year ago.

The departure of ten offensive starters and eight defensive starters may make 1996 an interesting year for the ROCK.

"We are inexperienced at the varsity level, to say the least," Head Coach Tom Larkey said.

Larkey, now in his 12th season as head coach, said last week that Rockcastle's schedule is tough, but a lot of players will not see action on both sides of the ball, which will keep his somewhat inexperienced team fresh.

"Right now we only have three players starting on de-

fense and offense, so we will at least have fresh people in the ballgame for the most part," he said.

And on the optimistic side, the Rockets are healthy heading into the '96 season.

"Other than some bumps and bruises we are fine," Larkey said.

The Rockets played two scrimmages in the pre-season, one against North Laurel, which is in a re-building year under new head coach, and former Rocket lineman, Larry Welch and Lexington Catholic.

Although Kentucky High School Athletic Association rules prohibit score keeping during a scrimmage the Rockets played better than both teams.

"We handled North Laurel

with relative ease, but it was a much tougher scrimmage against Lexington Catholic,"

Larkey said.

If the Rockets are to match last year's accomplishments which included a district championship and a 10 and 2 record, they will have to be quick learners.

"There is no doubt we will get better every game and if we can keep some key personnell healthy we will be competitive," the coach said.

Just how competitive - only time will tell.

When the Rockets line up against South Laurel on Friday night, they will start three sophomores on the offensive line and one sophomore in the backfield.

Sophomores Josh Martin,

Kevin Bradley and Andy Hale are presently starting on the offensive line and sophomore Andrew Carrera has the full-back position at this time. Martin will start at center, Bradley at one of the guards and Hale at an end.

Rounding out the rest of the offensive starting unit will be seniors Malcolm Shepherd, Andrew Gisler, Slade Calhoun, Kyle Kirby, Jon Cromer and Jason Brown. Calhoun will start at tackle, Kirby will start at a guard, Gisler at an end and Brown and Cromer in the backfield.

Shepherd will start at quarterback and junior John LaFevres will also start at one tackle.

Coach Larkey said that he is expecting a good season from Shepherd, who has little varsity experience, but who started for the freshman team and was a two year starter for the junior varsity.

"He has come a long way as a team leader and he is certainly a tough kid who has also improved a lot as a passer," Larkey said.

The Rockets leading rusher from a year ago is also back. Jon Cromer, who started for the Rockets the past two seasons, amassed over 2,400 yards in those two seasons and is expected to have another good year for the Rock.

Coach Larkey said that he is planning on splitting up his

playing time in the offensive backfield between Cromer, Jason Brown, Andrew Carrera, Chris Bishop and Dusty McClure.

"These kids have all worked hard this summer and at camp and they will each see their share of action," Larkey said.

When the Rock passes, Shepherd will be looking for Hale, Gisler and Anthony King, who is expected to get quite a bit of time at end. Roy Howard will also see playing time at end.

Brian Scalf, Jason Dillingham and Chris Cromer will also see action at offensive line positions throughout the season and may start some games.

Possibly the Rocket's top offensive weapon this season will only see a few plays of action each game, but those few plays could add up to a lot of points and senior Raymond Blackbum is probably the best place kicker to ever play football at RCHS.

He has kicked 55 yarders in practice and last year he kicked at least two 37 yard field goals during the game. "A lot of colleges are looking at Raymond and I think he has the talent to kick at a Division I school," Larkey said.

"Raymond has worked hard to improve his kicking and the last two summers he has attended the Doug Pelphrey Kicking Camp where he has

learned a lot," Larkey said.

"We have enough faith in Raymond's ability that when we get stopped inside the 30 yard line we will probably kick. Three points is better than nothing," Larkey said.

Seniors Slade Calhoun, David Coffey and Ronnie Vanzant, all returning starters from last year, will anchor the Rockets defense.

Calhoun will play one outside linebacker/defensive end position and senior Jon Cromer will play the other one.

Seniors David Coffey, Mike Muncy and Anthony King will play in the defensive line as will senior Daniel Forbes who will rotate in and out.

Senior Dennis Miller will start at middle linebacker and Jason Brown and sophomore Brooks Ingram will play the two inside linebackers.

Vanzant will start at cornerback and junior Dusty McClure will start at the other cornerback. Junior Chris Bishop will start at free safety.

Other players, including quarterback Malcolm Shepherd will see defensive action.

Defensive coach and head

assistant Tony Saylor said his squad is also inexperienced at the varsity level.

"We have a lot of seniors playing on defense but only three of them saw much action last year," Saylor said.

"We will be looking to Calhoun, Coffey and Dennis Miller to step up and lead our defense," Saylor said.
