Henderson also said that according to Clerk Kaye Rader's minutes the vote to buy the property was unanimous, but evidently those minutes were incorrect.

Price said Hammons talked to the man who stole his truck only moments before he drove off.

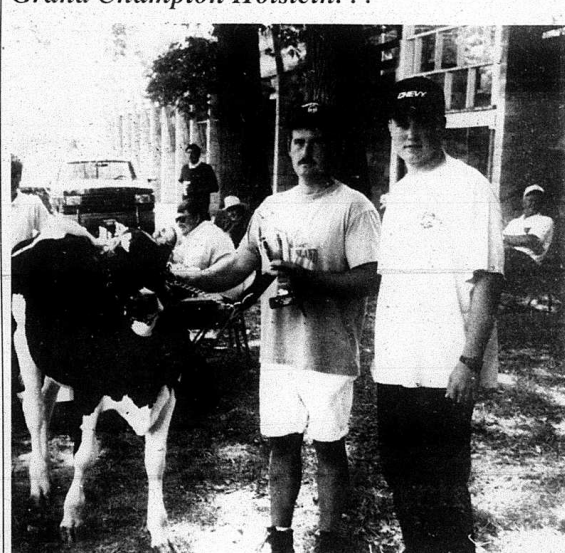
Price said that Wendell Lee, 22, of Woodbine was arrested and lodged in Whitley County jail after he wrecked Hammons' truck in Jellico.

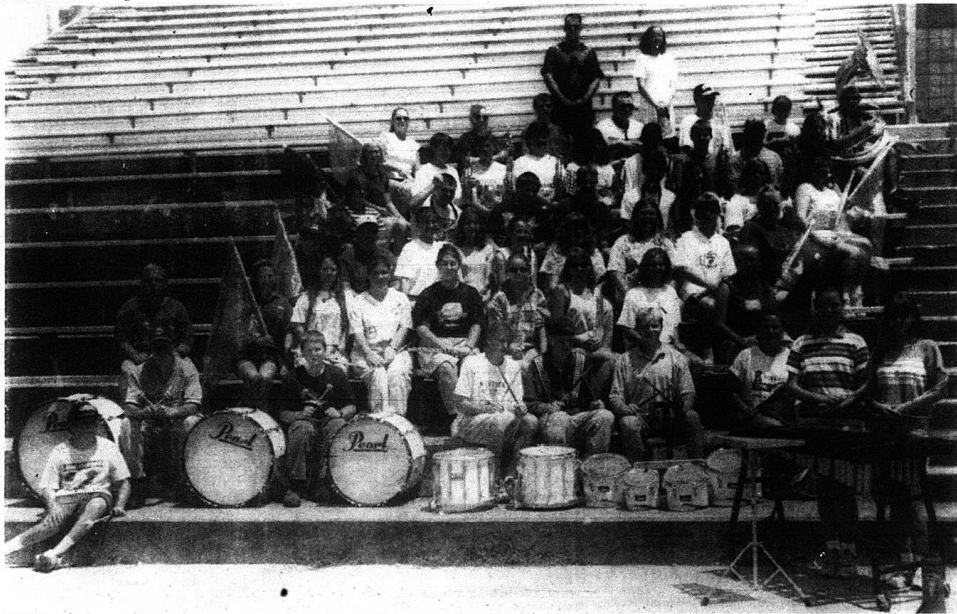

# Rockcastle Countians take home 14 medals in Bluegrass Games

When the 1997 Bluegrass State Games wrapped up more than 19,600 amateur athletes had competed during the two weekends.

About 3,718 medals were awarded to participants from 105 counties throughout the state.

Participants came from 114 Kentucky counties vying for gold, silver and bronze medals in the 26 different sports.

Fayette County won the medal count with 718 followed by Jefferson with 434. Rounding out the top five counties were: Boone, 195, Kenton, 172, and Campbell, 144.

Eleven Rockcastle county participants hauled in a total of 14 individual medals and 10 team medals with swimmer Andrew Hammond leading the way with five.

Hammond won a gold medal in Freestyle, a silver in backstroke and bronze in butterfly in the 13-14-year-old division. He also won a gold in the freestyle relay and a silver in the medley relay.

Kacey Taulbee won a gold medal in martial arts in the 15-17 Kumite Division. Bill Noe won a gold medal in the 18-55 archery division in barebow unaided and Ray Kirby won a gold medal in traditional archery, also in the 18-55 division. Gary Langford rounded out the archery winners with a silver medal in bowhunter limited.

Jared Taulbee won two silver medals in martial arts, one in Kata and one in Kumite. He was in the nine and ten year old division.

Dakota Mahaffey took home a bronze medal in Kumite Beginner, six and under and Chris Frith won a

Kentucky's First Lady, Mrs. Judi Patton, presented two special awards to Pacesetters Perry Bowman and Ruth Caskey.

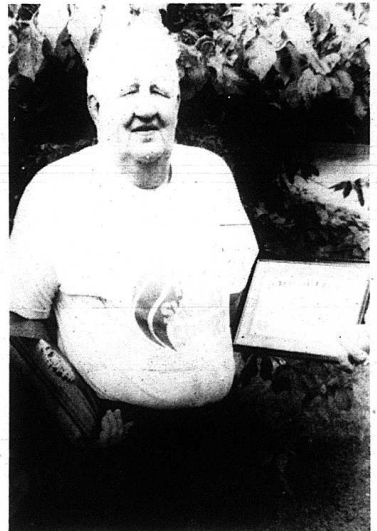
Rockcastle County's own, Perry Bowman, 74, Mt. Vernon was honored as having walked the most miles (4,442) this past year.

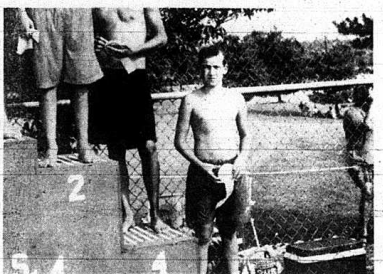

# Agricultural News

By Warden Alexander, Director

The final date to report crop acreage for tobacco and all other crops except small grains was July 15. If a crop WAS NOT PLANTED by the final reporting date of July 15, the acreage must be reported by 15 calendar days after the planting is completed to be considered timely filed. If a crop report is filed after a final reporting date because the crop was planted late, a statement will be added to the producer. Late-filing fees will not apply if the crop is reported within 15 days after planting. Late-filing reports may be taken on tobacco even if planting was completed prior to the deadline, with no late fee charge.

Nominating petitions for the FSA Committee election are being accepted now through October 27. The County Office Committee election will be held in November and December. By the first week in October, FSA will have the finalized list of all eligible participants—all local farmers—and nomination petitions will be due near the end of the month. Those people elected to the Committee will become part of a national network of farmers and ranchers that have a unique opportunity to help the future of all local producers. This is government at its best—local in nature, focused here at home, and bringing the resources and expertise of the

USDA together with the FSA's customers in rural America. For further information about the County Office Committee and the election process, interested parties should contact the local Farm Service Agency Office.

The Non-Insured Assistance Program (NAP) provides protection against a widespread loss caused by a natural disaster to designated areas for which crop insurance is not available. To qualify for this program an area must have at least 3 producers of crops on separate and distinct farms that were affected by the same natural disaster with total production loss of at least 35%. Producers must have a crop report on file prior to the July 15 deadline to be eligible for benefits. Late-filed reports may be filed, but will require a filing fee. Some of the non-insurable crops in Rockcastle County include soybeans, sweet corn, green beans, any fruit or vegetable grown

commercially for food.

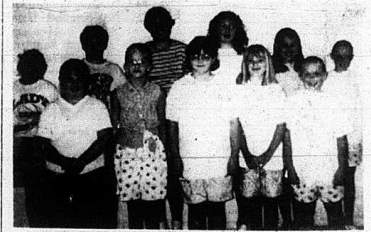

**"It is Written"**

May we consider for a few moments Paul's statement in Romans 6:17-18, "But God be thanked, that ye were the servants of sin, but ye have obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered you. Being then made free from sin, ye became the servants of righteousness."

Now notice that Paul says that the Romans brethren were made free from sin, and had become the servants of righteousness. When did they become free from sin? When they obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered you. This word form suggests the idea of pattern or print. Now just what is that pattern of doctrine that Paul speaks about? Well let's look back in verses 3-5. "Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death? Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the likeness of his resurrection." That form of teaching is the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We follow the Lord in a similar pattern in faith, when we die with Christ, are buried with Christ, and are resurrected with Christ, then we raise to walk in a new life with Christ. Are people made free from sin before they obey this form of doctrine? The answer is of course "no" in verses 6-7, "Knowing this, that one who is crucified with him, that the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin. For he that is dead is freed from sin." When are we free from sin? When we die. When do we die? When we are planted together in the likeness of his death, which takes place at baptism, verse 5. Said to say, but those who fail to follow this form of doctrine have not been made free from sin!

deprived and about half of us don't get enough sleep.

If you have a tendency to doze during a long meeting, or while sitting and reading, or when watching TV, or when you are a passenger in a car, chances are you're not getting enough sleep. On the positive side, if you usually go to bed at about the same time and don't wake up well-rested without the aid of an alarm clock, you're probably getting sufficient sleep of a high quality.

Sleepiness and the related lack of alertness are principal or contributing factors in accidents of all kinds. For example, American drivers who fall asleep behind the wheel account for nearly 50,000 collisions and 1,500 deaths annually.

A lack of rest affects our relationships. When we are weary, it's so much harder to be sensitive to others and to listen really well. When family members are tired, fights are more likely to break out, children are more irritable, discipline becomes more of a problem, and the healing power of laughter is heard less frequently.

When we go to work with insufficient sleep, our productivity drops. Similarly, insufficient rest is a serious problem in the daily activities of many of our children. Lack of rest takes an enormous toll on school performance. Sleepiness interferes with clear thinking and learning.

And how do you think lack of rest affects judgment, our immune systems, our creativity? It doesn't take a rocket scientist to figure out that simply getting enough rest could drastically improve our individual and collective well-being. Sleep doesn't cost money, it's not controversial, and for most of us it's a pleasant, no-effort activity with lots of positive after-effects.

So...turn off those lights a little bit.

## Some tips for breathing easier

Some people say they know when it is going to remain byches in their joints. Others say they have "nose" for the weather—and they may. "The lining of the nose is an excellent barometer," says Dr. Sanford Archer, University of Kentucky ear, nose and throat specialist. "Changes and fluctuations in temperature and humidity can cause changes in the lining of the nose."

Kentuckians experience humid summers and wet winters accompanied by high seasonal pollen and mold counts. As a result, many are accustomed to having regular nasal congestion and drainage and resign themselves to living with their symptoms. For those who can never find relief, it becomes a question of when the problem is irritating enough to prompt a visit to the doctor.

"When people complain about having 'sinuses' or sinus trouble, it usually means they are experiencing a lot of nasal drainage, stuffiness and irritation. Most of the time this is an inflammation of the lining of the nose called rhinitis. Sinusitis, on the other hand, is an actual infection in the sinuses," says Archer.

There are four paired sinuses in the head which lie behind the eyes, cheeks and forehead and between the eyes. No one knows exactly what function the sinuses have. They probably help in resonance of sound when we speak, and they make mucus which drains from the sinuses into the back of the nose and throat. The opening of the sinuses is only a few millimeters in size and located at the top of the sinus cavity.

According to Archer, patients who suspect they have a bad sinus infection are usually correct, because swelling and soreness in the face and excessive drainage (sometimes accompanied by a fever) make sinusitis easy to diagnose. Sinusitis is caused by a cold, flu or allergy that irritates the nasal membranes, causing them to increase mucus production, swell and block the sinus opening. This prevents drainage and creates a good environment for bacteria to develop. Since sinusitis is an infection, it is treated with antibiotics prescribed by a doctor, who may also recommend over-the-counter medications to help the sinuses drain.

"It is easy to understand how you could get up with a sinus infection, but surprisingly we get very few. Most people will have one acute sinus infection and not many more. If someone is having recurring infections, there could be an anatomic problem with the nose that may need to be corrected surgically," says Archer.

The septum, the mid-portion of the nose, is a fairly rigid structure that can block the airway and cause breathing problems if it is crooked. The turbinate bones, which grow on the side of the nose into the nasal passage, are very vascular and shrink

and swell depending on circumstances like the weather. The turbinates also warm and humidify the air we breathe and are part of the natural nasal cycle, in which one side of the nose gets "stuffy" and the alternate side opens up every few hours. The lining of the nose can also shrink and swell and houses histamine—the chemical responsible for allergies. Anatomic abnormalities or irritation with any of these structures can lead to nasal problems.

"The majority of people only have rhinitis which can be treated with medical management. This means avoiding allergens, such as cigarette smoke and dust mites, and using medications to help control the problem. There are many over-the-counter medications that act in different ways to do the same thing. You need to find one that works for you," suggests Archer.

If you have symptoms related to allergies, such as teary eyes and sneezing, a product containing an antihistamine will help dry up the nose. If your symptoms do not have these allergy components, then a decongestant may give you some relief. For short-term relief, most over-the-counter decongestant nasal sprays work in a few seconds and can last up to 12 hours. However, if used too much or more often than directed, sprays can cause a rebound effect, leaving you with worse symptoms in the end.

One of the most effective treatments for rhinitis are steroid nasal sprays, which are obtained by prescription only. Unlike traditional nasal sprays, steroid sprays can be used long-term. The word "steroid" may sound like something scary, however, these sprays are not absorbed into the blood, so there is no danger of harmful side effects commonly associated with steroids. Still, any medication should be used in moderation. Spray, decongestants and antihistamines are helpful in alleviating the symptoms of rhinitis only; sinusitis requires antibiotics and a visit to the doctor.

Says Archer, "There is no time limit for consulting a doctor about having trouble with nasal congestion, drainage or breathing. Unless you see signs of infection, you can attempt to treat your symptoms at home. Most people seek help when they just can't live with it any longer."

Winners at the Tiger level were: First Place Den—Chris Ayers; Second Place Den—Anthony Smith and Third Place Den—Kyle Lear.

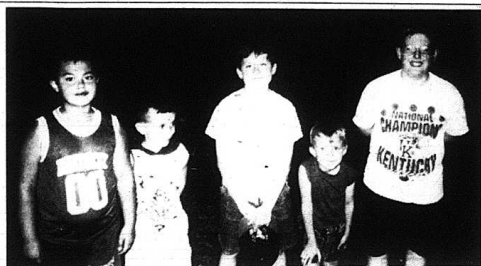

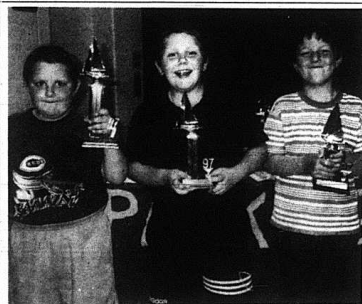

Cromer said pay-back monies from Urban Development Action Grants would be used to pay back a low interest loan on the park.

The Mayor said that the City of Mt. Vernon had loaned several local industries, such as Mt. Vernon Plastics, Image Entry and C.B. & R. Investments money through the UDAG program and that once that money is paid back to the city, it can be used for things such as the park.

"Not one taxpayer dollar from the City of Mt. Vernon will be used to pay for this park," Cromer said. The Mayor said that the city would also accept donations from citizens toward the purchase.

Defending the purchase, Councilwoman Karen King told Henderson that it was the consensus of the majority of the council that property within the city limits was a scarce, therefore demanding the purchase price.

Mayor Cromer also told Henderson that he had not hired a local contractor to clean up the site because it was 75 percent concrete and it would have cost the city five or six times what it actually cost.

Cromer said that Howard Engineering from London, the same company working on a sewer project for the city, cleaned up the site for \$9,500.

The Mayor said that Kentucky law allows cities to spend up to \$10,000 without accepting bids and that no vote had to be taken by the council. Henderson said he thought

that was a bad law allowing the spending of \$10,000 on anything without prior approval.

Councilman Lee Keene told Henderson that some of his fondest memories as a child growing up in Pikeville were of spending time at the city park. "I'm going to donate to this project, are you?" Keene asked Henderson.

"Are you against a city park for our children," Keene asked Henderson. "Yes, I am if it is not done correctly," Henderson said.

The Mayor said that the developer of the park would be at the council's September meeting to present plans on the park.

In other business, the council voted to recognize property owners in the city limits who had improved their property. The recognition will be done by the city on an annual basis with the first awards coming this Fall.

Police Chief Bill Mink reported to the council that his department had issued 63 citations, made 15 DUI arrests, had 343 calls for service, worked 11 wrecks, made 51 assistants to other agencies, assisted 7 motorists and opened 10 criminal cases.

The Mt. Vernon fire department made nine fire runs.

**A Balanced Budget for America**

*Tax Relief, Medicare Protection & Welfare Help for Kentucky*

A truly historic event has happened in the nation's capital. The Congress passed and the President will sign a Balanced Budget package that balances the budget for the first time in 30 years and gives Kentuckians tax relief for the first time in 16 years.

I have long preached the goal of deficit reduction, because it brings so many positive things to our people. Interest rates will go down. That means you pay less for your credit card payments, student loans, or a home of your own. The economy will continue to flourish, which means more jobs and economic opportunity. If we all sacrifice a little—none too much—then we can balance the budget and everyone will benefit.

But, not only will this historic agreement lead to a balanced budget in five years, it also delivers critical tax relief for Kentucky's families, farmers, college students and businesses. For example, next year families with children ages 16 or younger will receive a \$400 per year tax credit, which will increase the following year to \$500. College students will be eligible for a tax credit of up to \$1,500 for the first two years of college, and up to \$1,000 during years three and four, graduate education, or continuing education. There is also a reduction in the estate tax and the capital gains tax that will help Kentucky's farmers and family-owned businesses.

In addition to tax relief, this bill also protects Medicare for Kentucky's seniors, and expands coverage for mammographies, diabetes testing, and prostate screening. It establishes a new health insurance program for children. And, it provides states with additional resources to move people off welfare rolls and onto payrolls, and gives states the flexibility to exempt up to 15 percent of able-bodied welfare recipients without children from welfare work requirements.

One of the items in this package that was very hard for me to swallow was the increase in the tobacco tax. The proposal increases the tax by 10 cents per pack in the year 2000 and an additional 5 cents in 2002. Additionally, the amount of the tax increase will be credited towards the tobacco settlement.

Given the anti-tobacco crusade of the Clinton Administration, the fact that Clinton proposed a 43 cents per-package tax, and that the Senate was pushing an immediate 20 cents tax increase, we could have been looking at a lot worse. Frankly, this was the best we could do under the circumstances. The tobacco settlement is where the real battle will take place, and I will fight tooth and nail to take care of our farmers.

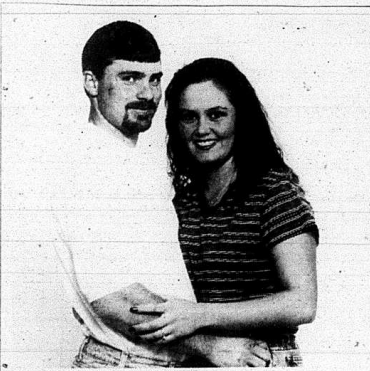

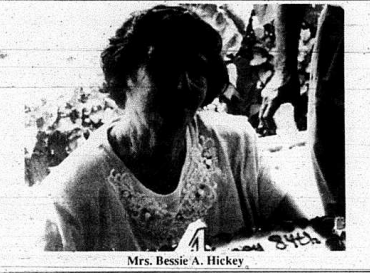

"Vera," said Mom, "how many times do I have to tell you there are no elephants around here?"


Vera decided that Mom probably knew best. She went back to playing and ignored to herself. "That's probably just a herd of couch cushions running across the field."
