## Montgomery wins prosecutor's seat

Acting Commonwealth Attorney Eddy F. Montgomery was an easy winner in Tuesday's primary election for Commonwealth Attorney.

Montgomery defeated his opponent David Tapp, a former assistant prosecutor and Somerset attorney, 3,292 to 1,928.

In Pulaski County Montgomery defeated Tapp 2,647 to 1,502. In Lincoln County, Montgomery won 311 to 211. In Rockcastle County, Montgomery defeated Tapp 335 to 215.

Montgomery defeated Tapp in nine of Rockcastle's 13 precincts.

Although it didn't matter, Texas Governor George W. Bush beat Senator John McCain 467 to 31 and Vice President Al Gore defeated Bill Bradley, 126 to 17.

Democrat Michael Vacca defeated Sidney Jane Bailey 63 to 62 in Rockcastle County, but Bailey won overall in the fifth congressional district. She faces an uphill battle in the Fall when she will take on Somerset Republican Harold Rogers, who has been in Congress since 1989.

Rockcastle County Clerk Norma Houk said only 745 people voted Tuesday, or seven percent of those eligible. The fewest voted in West Livingston, where fifteen went to the polls and the most voted in West Mt. Vernon, where 111 cast ballots. Statewide only 12 percent voted.

## Former resident dies in fiery crash

A former Rockcastle County resident was killed in a single vehicle crash in Lexington early Tuesday morning.

According to police, Sarah Hiatt Lynch, 44, of Lexington and formerly of Mt. Vernon, was a passenger in a pickup truck, driven by Gilbert Head Jr., when he lost control and struck a guardrail on New Circle Road around 1 a.m.

The truck overturned and burst into flames. Both were pronounced dead at the scene. Police said they thought Head may have been drinking before the accident.

Funeral services for Sarah Hiatt Lynch, who is survived by her father Jones Bennet Hiatt and a son Shane Lynch, will be held on Thursday at Cox Funeral Home.

## Local man found guilty Thursday

A local circuit court jury has recommended a sentence of ten years for a Sand Hill man who has been accused of kidnapping and beating his wife and 10-month-old child in August of last year.

Benji Jones, 31, of Sand Hill was found guilty of two counts of unlawful imprisonment, two counts of menacing and one count of assault.

Jones had been accused of beating his now ex-wife, Nell, with a gun and taking his 10-month-old son with his fists last August 15.

The trial, which began last Wednesday lasted only two days. Jones will be formally sentenced on Friday.

## Waste water workshop

Kentucky suffers from a number of water problems, not the least of which is contamination of waterways with human waste materials. Many small homes on creeks and rivers have a septic tank, through which they flush their toilets in the stream.

Appalachia-Science in the Public Interest, (ASPI) of Mt. Vernon will be conducting workshops, beginning on Thursday, June 1, which will demonstrate how to build dry composting toilets and constructed wetlands on property that is not suitable for septic tanks.

The workshops will be held at the ASPI Nature Center on the Rockcastle River, at the Rockcastle - Laurel County line.

## I-75 injury accident . . . . .



A three vehicle pile-up on I-75 Friday afternoon sent four people to the Rockcastle Hospital. According to Kentucky State Trooper Jessie Lee Owens, the 6 p.m. accident occurred when a truck hauling camera tops stalled in the slow lane of the northbound side. The accident was in the construction area, where both the slow lane and passing lane are enclosed by barriers, with no shoulder available. Owens said another truck, which left the scene of the accident, made a quick move from the slow lane to the fast lane, causing a family from Ohio to hit both walls and a Corbin van to hit the car they were driving beside the wall on the right. One of the passengers in the car from Ohio was treated at Rockcastle and flown to the University of Kentucky Medical Center. The other three, including a man from Corbin, were all treated at the Rockcastle Hospital.

Graduation ceremonies at the Rockcastle County High School will be held Saturday at 2 p.m. in the high school gym.

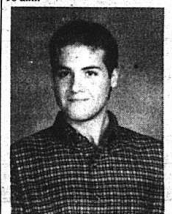
168 graduates of the twenty-eighth class at RCHS will receive their diplomas during the ceremony.

## Skin Cancer: Everyone Needs the Facts

Skin cancer is a serious disease that can affect anyone. As with any cancer, knowledge is our best protection. The following questions and answers will help you to understand more about skin cancer and how to reduce your risk of developing the disease.

**How common is skin cancer?** Skin cancer is the most common cancer in the United States, and rates of the disease are increasing. Each year, about a million Americans learn they have skin cancer.

**What causes skin cancer?** Ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun is the main cause of skin cancer. Skin cancer can be caused by a lifetime's worth of exposure to the sun. Artificial sources of UV radiations, such as tanning booths

and sun lamps, also can cause skin cancer.

**Do people who tan easily get skin cancer?** Anyone can get skin cancer. However, people who have fair skin that freckles, light-colored eyes, or a family or personal history of skin cancer are more likely to develop the disease. People who spend a lot of time in the sun also are more at risk.

**Can children get skin cancer?** Most skin cancers appear after age 50, but the sun's damaging effects begin in childhood. In fact, 80 percent of a person's lifetime exposure to sun happens before age 18. For this reason, it is important to protect children from too much sun. **Where on the body does skin cancer develop?** Skin cancer usually appears on the areas exposed

to the sun—the face, head, neck, hands, and arms.

**What are the warning signs of skin cancer?** The most common warning sign is a change on the skin, especially a new growth or a sore that doesn't heal. The cancer may start as a small, smooth, shiny, pale, or waxy lump. Or, it can appear as a firm red lump. Sometimes the lump bleeds or develops a crust. Skin cancer can also start as a flat, red spot that is rough, dry, or scaly.

# Louise Carter receives Spiritual Aims award

The Spiritual Aims Award, given each year by the Kiwanis Club to a deserving recipient, was chosen this year by this nomination, written and presented to the club by Mrs. Shirley Cox.

If angels are all around us, as I believe they are, then surely one such angel is Mrs. Louise Carter. No, she doesn't have large feathery wings (at least not visibly), but I think that she fulfills the role of an angel very well.

Although Ms. Louise shows abundant love and concern for people of all ages, I believe that God has called her to minister lovingly to young people through loving counsel and encouragement. She does this quietly and gently, whispering soft words of affirmation and validation. When Ms. Louise lost a granddaughter in a

car accident several years ago, I watched ash she courageously put aside her own grief and stood at the back of the funeral home, comforting teenagers who came to the visitation. Instead of focusing on herself and her own loss, she wisely used this time as an opportunity to advise other young people in a kind, gentle manner—always with a pat and a smile.

Ms. Louise taught Sunday School at First Baptist Church in Mt. Vernon for many years. Every Sunday, petite Ms. Louise would carry in a large grocery bag filled with goodies to delight her students. It was much later before I realized that once a child entered Ms. Louise's class her she actually became an adopted child of hers—for life. My own son, for example, has received birthday cards from her for about 20 years along

with money tucked beside some well selected words cautioning him about the new temptations that he would face with his new age related privileges. After he left home, I found a graduation card for him that said, "To my Grandson." It was from Ms. Louise. Imagine how special he felt when he realized that someone besides his family had that kind of love and admiration for him. For a long time, I selfishly thought that Ms. Louise has especially chosen my son until overheard another young man in our church thanking her for his first birthday card from Ms. Louise. I was babysitting. Barely able to read, she came in smiling and shaking with excitement as she murmured, "This letter is to me. It has my name on it." Gradually, I realized that Ms. Louise's birthday ministry extended to nearly every child in our church. Only an angel could possibly de-

velop a method that is complex enough to remember all those birth-

days. Ms. Louise has a swimming pool in her backyard that she uses to welcome church groups as well as the friends of her children and grandchildren. She makes each person feel important and loved. She also uses her yard for annual church Easter egg hunts and fills a closet in her home with future shower gifts. She loves gardening and freely shares her flowers with others. 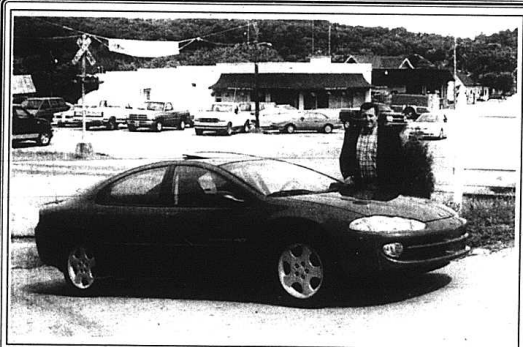

## World No Tobacco Day is May 31st

May 31st marks World No Tobacco Day and in recognition of the day the Rockcastle Tobacco Use Prevention Coalition will be recognizing and thanking those retail establishments that consistently do not sell tobacco products to youth. Members of the coalition will be visiting various retail establishments throughout the day and presenting them with a certificate thanking them for their dedication to tobacco use prevention among young people.

According to the state law no person shall sell or cause to be sold any tobacco product at retail to any person under the age of 18, or solicit any person under the age of 18 to purchase any tobacco product at retail. Any person selling tobacco products must require proof of age from a prospective buyer or recipient if the person has reason to believe that the prospective buyer or recipient is under the age of 18. Violators may be fined \$100 to \$500 for the first violation

and \$500 to \$1000 for subsequent violations.

"Despite the fact that it is illegal to sale tobacco products to youth, we know that tobacco is easily accessible by youth in our community.

Today we wanted to recognize those establishments that are doing the right thing and protecting our children from the dangers of tobacco use," said Beverly Sexton, Tobacco Use Prevention Coordinator.

The following stores will be recognized: Young's Pharmacy, Super Test, J&I Cigo and Derby City South Truck Plaza.

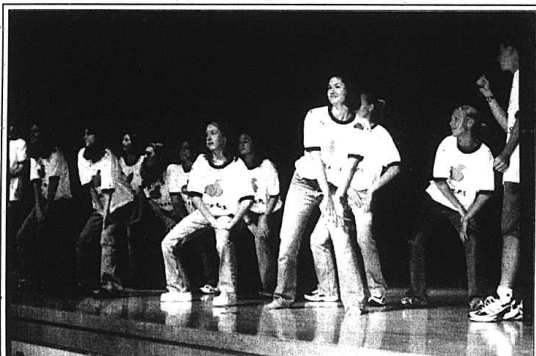

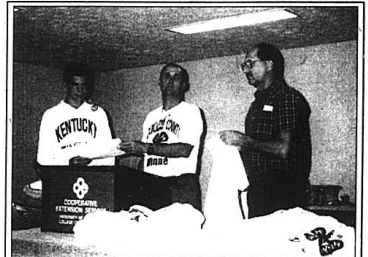
## 4-H Recognition Banquet Held

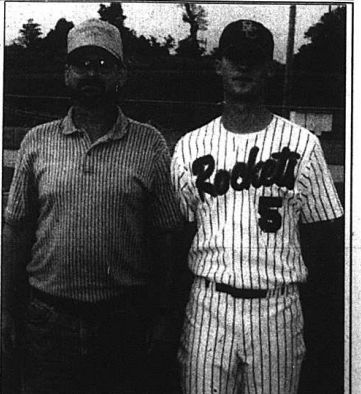

The objectives of the Renaissance Kentucky is to utilize to the fullest extent possible the expertise and resources within state government to focus and direct state funding to selected cities. This would help our community in locating funding sources and other pertinent information for the revitalization of our downtown. In addition to state government representatives, seven other private and federal entities have appointed Renaissance Kentucky commissions within their respective agencies and will provide technical assistance and funding resources when available.

There has never been a time when it was so important as it is today to seize every opportunity available to

help create a community where our young folks can find job opportunities and recreational centers close to home. There has never been a more opportune time for our community to rally together, as never before, to take advantage of and to expand our many assets.

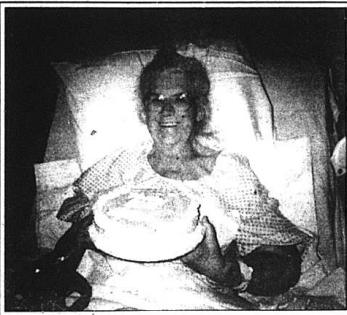

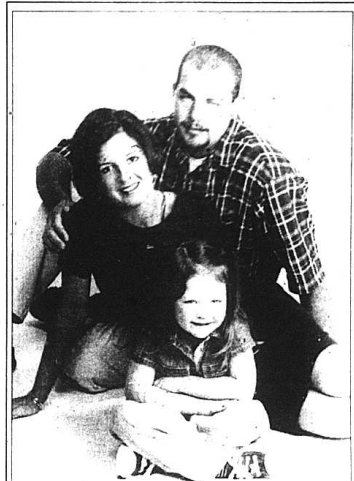

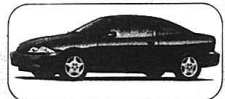

## There Is Some Quick Help For Mild Depression

I did not feel well last weekend. Physically, my body was fighting off a cold, and emotionally I felt sad and depressed. After sitting around feeling blue for a few hours, I decided to look of ways to feel better.

The first thing I did was to begin a project that I had wanted to do for some time. I pulled out some old computer disks and began to copy files off them onto my new computer. It took some effort to get up and moving, because a large part of me would just as soon have vegetated on the couch for the afternoon. I began to feel better as I got involved in the project.

As the afternoon wore on, I had

done all I could do on that project and still was not feeling up to par. I decided to go to a movie. While watching the movie, I was able to lose myself for two hours in a land on the far side of the world. Going to the movie gave me the change of scenery I needed. Other excursions can accomplish the same thing. Baseball games, parks and swimming pools are good places to visit when depressed.

This got me to thinking about other courses for "the blues." Exercise often helps. During exercise the brain releases chemicals called "endorphins." These are nature's way of providing a natural high. Endorphins elevate mood without the need for drugs. A long, brisk walk can be a good anti-

de to mild depression.

Engaging someone else in conversation can also fight the blues. Whether I talk about my bad day or about another subject entirely, sharing my thoughts with another almost guarantees that I will feel better. Visiting with positive-thinking friends can change my outlook from negative to positive.

Some methods for fighting mild depression do not work well. One of these is eating. Those with a food addiction are inclined to eat when depressed. Sitting on the couch munching junk food and watching TV is almost guaranteed to make the depression worse. Also, getting on the scales after an eating binge and discovering a weight gain, almost guarantees that the person will be even more depressed!

Any addiction is not good way to deal with depression. Alcohol is a depressant and will make the depression worse. Shop-a-holics who spend

a lot of money when depressed may feel better for a little while, but when the Visa bill comes in, they are even more depressed. Watching television for hours on end can also make one more depressed.

Being active rather than passive is the best way to deal with the mild depression of a bad day. Sitting around waiting for the blues to go away usually does not work. Beginning to do something is the way to fight those feelings.

There are occasions when nothing seems to help. If neither exercise nor a change of scenery gets rid of the depression, then it is time to look for some help. Depression that lingers and that will not go away with self-treatment needs professional help. Doctors and counselors are trained to treat such depression with counseling and/or medication. Do not despair! There is hope. Take control of your life today, and fight that depression.

## Agricultural News

By: Warden Alexander, FSA Director

### Tobacco Leasing

July 3rd is the final deadline to sign tobacco leases! Producers are reminded leases filed and/or on file in the county office must have all signatures (transferring and receiving farm) by the deadline to be approved. Leases with all signatures not obtained by the deadline shall be disapproved. If someone is growing your tobacco quota on a farm other than the farm the quota is established to remember: you MUST sign a lease in the county office by the deadline of July 3rd.

### Farm Acreage Reports

Farm acreage reports of crops are now being taken for the current year. When all crops are planted, producers are encouraged to report all acreages of crops for history, disaster programs and land deficiency program. The final reporting date for all crops, except small grains and tobacco is July 15th. Producers failing to file by the final reporting date will be charged a late fee.

### Small Grains

Producers growing small grains (wheat) must report their acreage by May 31, 2000. If crop acreage is not filed timely and producer applies for a Loan Deficiency Payment, then a charge of \$26.50 will be applied for a late fee.

### Farm Changes

Producers who have purchased or sold land need to contact the local FSA office for proper reconstitution

of farms. Farms enrolled with PFC have until the deadline of June 1st to file for reconstitutions of farms. Farms not enrolled with PFC have until the deadline of July 1st. Remember to bring your deed and/or to notify the new owner to do so. Also notify this office of any and/or all address changes. REMEMBER: our records are only as current as producers inform our office.

### Conservation Reserve Program's Continuous Signup

Agricultural Secretary Dan Glickman has announced that landowners can receive more money for participation in the Conservation Reserve Program continuous signup. The new financial incentives—totaling up to \$350 million in the next three years—include signing bonuses and more money for installing and maintaining conservation practices.

Unlike the regular CRP program, the continuous signup program allows producers to enroll eligible highly environmentally sensitive land at any time, without waiting for a sign-up period or competing against other offers. Conservation practices protect streams and rivers by keeping sediment and nutrients from entering the water, providing cleaner drinking water, enhancing recreation and improving wildlife habitats.

Mt Vernon Water Works routinely monitors for constituents in your drinking water according to Federal and State laws. This table shows the results of our monitoring for the period of January 01, 1999 to December 31, 1999. The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or human activity. Contaminants that may be present in chemical contaminants, and radioactive contaminants. In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations that limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. All drinking water, including bottled drinking water, may be reasonably expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. Non-Detect (ND)-laboratory analysis indicated that the constituent is not present.

Parts per million (ppm) or Milligrams per liter (mg/L)-one part per million corresponds to minute in two years or a single penny in \$10,000,000.

Parts per billion (ppb) or Micrograms per liter-one part per billion corresponds to one minute in 2,000 years, or a single penny in \$10,000,000.

Picocuries per liter (pCi/L)-picocuries per liter is a measure of the radioactivity in water.

Million Fibers per Liter (MFL)-million fibers per liter is a measure of the presence of asbestos fibers that are longer than 10 micrometers.

Nephelemetric Turbidity Units (NTU) - nephelemetric turbidity unit is a measure of the clarity of water. Turbidity in excess of 5 NTU is just noticeable to the average person.

Action Level AL-the concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

Treatment Technique (TT)-A treatment technique is a required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.

Maximum Contaminant Level- The "Maximum Allowed" (MCL) is the high level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCL's are set as close to the MCLG's as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCLG)- the level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

All drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that the water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1-800-426-4791.

MCL's are set at very stringent levels. To understand the possible health effects described for many regulated constituents, a person would have to drink 2 liters of water every day at the MCL level for a lifetime to have a one-in-a-million chance of having the described health effect.

Total Coliform: The Total Coliform Rule requires water systems to meet a stricter limit for coliform bacteria. Coliform bacteria are usually harmless, but their presence in water can be an indication of disease-causing bacteria. When coliform bacteria are found, special follow-up tests are done to determine if harmful bacteria are present in the water supply. If this limit is exceeded, the water supplier must notify the public by newspaper, television or radio. To comply with the stricter regulation, we have increased the average amount of chlorine in the distribution system.

In our continuing efforts to maintain a safe and dependable water supply it may be necessary to make improvements in your water system. At the present time our water plant is being upgraded from 1.7 million gallons per day to 4 million gallons a day.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by cryptosporidium and other microbiological contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

\*\* (11) The current MCL for total trihalomethanes (TTHM) is 100 ppb but will change to 80 ppb in the year 2001. Although the TTHM level in our water is below the current MCL, it has been detected above the future MCL and we are including health effects language.

Some people who drink water containing trihalomethanes in excess of the MCL over many years experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous systems, and may have increased risk of getting cancer.

## Continuous Sign-Up for CRP

Landowners can sign-up for the Continuous Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) at their local USDA Service Center with the Farm Service Agency (FSA).

Program rules have been streamlined and enhanced compared to rules in the general sign-up CRP. Most times, the waiting period for approval is minimal. Enhancements consist of additional economic incentives and updated rates.

"To participate in the continuous sign-up, landowners must meet certain eligibility requirements," says Randall Templeman, District Conservationist with the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) in Rockcastle County/Mt. Vernon. "Cropland is eligible, even if it is not classified as being 'highly erodible.' However, cropland must have been planted or considered planted in an agricultural commodity during two of the last five years.

"As long as land being offered meets program requirements and includes eligible buffer practices, contracts can be approved," said Templeman. "On top of everything

else, landowners can benefit from additional program incentives."

Extra financial incentives are available when landowners agree to install certain Continuous CRP practices. In Kentucky, eligible practices include filter strips, grassed waterways, contour buffer strips, riparian buffers and shallow water areas of wildlife.

Continuous CRP contracts last 10 to 15 years, depending on the applied practice. Contracts will include cost-share payments up to 50 percent of the cost of establishing permanent cover and other eligible components. Cost-share payments are made when approved practices are completed. Annual rental payments are made after October 1, each year of the contract period.

NRCS provides technical assistance to landowners who participate in CRP. USDA agencies are co-located at your local USDA Service Centers throughout the state. For more information contact Randall Templeman, at the USDA Service Center, located on Hwy. 150, Mt. Vernon, or call 606-256-2525 Ext. 3.
