Thanks to Chad and Angie, I had two wonderful escorts to take care of that problem when we went to my grandson, Deno's wedding in Oakland, California last week.

The problem of needing assistance began when we arrived at the Greater Cincinnati Airport and began looking for the attendant with a wheelchair Chad had asked for. That once familiar airport to me has gone modern and joined the ranks of a "bigger must be better, so we will expand and change things about so people will have to search for the line of their choice." I thought I would know it well for it was the one I had used for years. That is I did before all of the changes had taken place. Now there were no ticket nor information windows to be seen nor fare counter or gift shop. I suddenly felt lost and suddenly old and tired from the miles we seemed to be walking while hunting for the familiar sign of Delta Airlines where a wheelchair should be waiting for me. Then the sign above the escalators caught our eye, it said DELTA. Since I couldn't ride on them we looked for and found the elevator. Sure enough Delta Airline in big letters was above a window and all the things we had missed on the first floor, such as candy, gift shops and snack bar were lining the walls. Also a wheelchair with an attendant was waiting for us. After placing some of the luggage on the chair, we were guided us to the plane where we would be boarding our plane, which was the last one on that long concourse, that seemed to me to be at least a mile long and I knew for sure that I never could have walked it. Angie and Chad had been carrying all the luggage so I am sure they were glad it a minute before boarding time. Luckily, because I was being escorted, they were allowed a chair early to avoid the push and shove of other passengers as they filed by seeking their seat. Our seat was above the wings, the seat was heavily overcast, therefore since we couldn't see neither earth nor sky we settled down to reading and talking.

The five hour flight flew by quickly and there we were, in San Francisco, California. Our hiking down the long corridors in Cincinnati was just a warm up for what we were in for now. And right now let me tell you a little secret, (any time you are flying into a strange or big-time airport arrange ahead for a wheelchair to meet you at the entrance, and exit from the plane.) Those guys-or dolls, know where to go and how to get around, they can get a wheelchair through a swarm of people quicker than mouse, (unless a woman saw the mouse first and zoused a rat.) An attractive young woman with wheelchair in tow was waiting for us as we reached the exit and told me proudly as she wheeled me to get the luggage she was going to school and learning the local language. No wonder they are so trim and agile, I'm sure she must have wheeled me a couple of miles to pick up the luggage, then that far again to get the shuttle that took us to the car rental garage. Once again we had to wait a good half hour while Chad did the paperwork to rent a car. Three hours later we were at our motel, The Best Western, in Oakland.

Judy had already arrived and soon found us with my new roommate, Jody Arvay, in tow.

At 5:00 p.m. Saturday, August 19, 2000, (Deno) Konstantin Prokos and Christa (Chicadee, made their vows to each other of "I will be true with tender loving care till death do us part." In a secluded area of Merrit Lake Park, with natures own decoration of foliage and flowers surrounding them and the quiet beauty of Lake Merrit facing them. This was preceded with dinner the night before for the attendants and selected members of the family.

Following the ceremony the typical feast of their Grecian heritage was spread in the community room at the park. Both Deno and Christa's fathers were second generation Greek Citizens and both mothers born in the south. Deno's mother in Ohio and Christa's in Tennessee. I missed the presence of my other two kids, Polly and Chuck, and Helen, but as it so often happens circumstances beyond our control interfere with our desires. I told her we were in Berea and started to explain how to get to the office and she cut me off again.

"Good, she said, I need you to stop by my house on your way to work because I have a problem with my peanuts and I want you to look at them. Do you have a pen and paper handy so I can give you directions?"

I stumbled through the house shaking my head and probably muttering but I found the writing stuff and parked myself at the kitchen table dressed only in my skivvies and wondering what the lady on the other end of the phone would think if she knew she was talking to a man who was half awake and darn near naked.

had never heard of. When I told her I didn't know where it was she laughed and told me that that's why she thought it was a good idea for me to get something to take notes with.

In the meantime, if the phone rings at 5:45 again tomorrow morning, I'm just going to get dressed and go garden with my new friend. There's half of a big apple pie that I would hate to let spoil and I'd bet anything that coffee tastes better in the morning.

Pesticide Container  
Recycling



The Rockcastle County Extension Service will assist farmers in a plastic pesticide container recycling project on Monday and Tuesday, August 28 and 29. Farmers, and especially tobacco farmers, who have sicker spray jugs lying around can dispose of chemical containers and support a recycling project. Containers will be collected at the Extension Office on Richmond Street each day during business hours.

pesticide containers is easy to do. saves money, and helps protect the environment.

- How can you participate?
- 1) Triple rinse or pressure rinse all containers when emptied. Remember, it is best to rinse containers immediately after they are emptied. Some pesticide residues solidify quickly and become difficult to remove from the container if left in the jug.
  - 2) Dispose of the pesticide caps and remove sleeves and labels from containers. The pesticide caps are made of a different plastic material that can not be currently recycled.
  - 3) Bring all properly rinsed containers to the listed collection site on the date and time specified for your county. Keep empty containers in a dry, secure place until the collection date. Each empty pesticide container returned will be inspected to ensure it has been properly rinsed. Unrinsed containers will not be accepted.

Again, containers will be collected on Monday and Tuesday, August 28 & 29 at the Extension Office.

## Helping Children With Homework

Since school is back in session, many children and their parents are beginning to spend time each evening working together on homework. Homework is designed to reinforce the learning going on during the school day, set it can trigger a power struggle between parent and child. Here are tips to help:

- \*Set a consistent quiet time for children to do their homework. Parents and children could decide together on a particular time. The length of this quiet time will vary with children's ages and amount of homework.

- \*Help children complete one or two examples in homework, not every problem or question. When a child turns in homework that was done accurately, the teacher assumes that the child understands the material. If the child does not really understand the material because the parent finished the homework, the child may become frustrated and perform poorly on subsequent assignments.
- \*Help children organize a time frame for difficult homework and long-term projects. Science projects and term papers cannot be done overnight. Help children break

projects into smaller steps that do not seem so overwhelming to them.

- \*Reduce the stress in a child's life. Some children have so many extracurricular activities that they are too tired or distracted to do homework. One or two extracurricular activities are usually enough for most children.
- \*Reignite the limits of your patience. If you are constantly irritated by your child because she tries several times before spelling a word correctly or has trouble completing a math problem, get help from a tutor or other family member. Neither the parent nor the child benefits from tense and negative feelings that arise from impatient parents trying too hard to help their children with homework.
- \*Use a non-threatening approach. Children make mistakes in

homework assignments. Instead of saying "That's wrong - here's the right answer," ask the child how he got the answer. When the child is asked to explain the thinking process about the answer, he often catches mistakes and becomes less discouraged.

- \*Support the teacher. When you see problems with the amount or type of homework that teachers are assigning, make an appointment with the teacher to discuss the issue. Complaining to the teacher in front of the child can encourage the child to question the teacher's competence and authority, creating discipline problems in school.

## Agricultural News

**Signed Up For Your Free Money? Only a Few Days Left!**

FSA offices across the state are now accepting applications for the 2000 Tobacco Loss Assistance Program. If in the 2000 crop year you are a landowner with a tobacco quota, a land operator with a tobacco quota, or a producer who markets tobacco in your name then you are eligible to receive payment. All farms which will receive P&CP (planted or considered planted) credit are eligible due to the cut in the tobacco quotas. Planted or considered planted credit can be received by one of the following ways:

1. Marketing tobacco which was grown on the farm in the 2000 crop year.
2. Marketing tobacco which was grown on the farm in the 1999 crop year which has been held over.
3. Reporting to the FSA office the tobacco acreage planted on the farm in the 2000 crop year for which there will be no marketings due to a natural disaster.

4. Leasing the tobacco quota away from the farm in the 2000 crop year.

USDA will distribute \$340 million to compensate tobacco farmers who suffered a reduction of tobacco quotas for the 1999-2000 crop years. Kentucky's share is \$140 million. Individual farm payments for burley tobacco will be split three ways between farm owners, farmers and those in control of the quotas (farm operators). Payments will reach farmers between October 1-20, 2000.

TALPOO applications are available at your local FSA office through September 1st. Late filed applica-

tions will not be accepted. One last note-ALL OWNERS MUST SIGN THE TALPOO application for the farm to be eligible to receive payment even if you are getting 0- share. This pertains to husband and wife as well as other owners.

Contrary to rumors you may be eligible to receive payment even if you are not actually producing tobacco on your farm in the 2000 crop year. COME IN, FILL OUT THE FORM AND LET THE COCK MAKE THE DETERMINATION OF ELIGIBILITY!

**REMEMBER: SIGN UP FOR THE TOBACCO LOSS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM END SEPTEMBER 1, 2000!!!!**

### Report of Burley Tobacco Loss Before Harvest

Farmers who have suffered a burley tobacco disaster loss are reminded to file a report with FSA prior to harvest to retain their eligibility to lease quota away under the disaster loss provisions.

The disaster lease provision was implemented to provide relief to producers that suffer a disaster loss and are unable to produce and market the farm's effective quota. To be eligible for a disaster lease and transfer, the transferring farm must:

1. A crop acreage report on file with FSA
2. Planted an acreage sufficient to produce the farm's current year effective quota.
3. Made a reasonable and customary effort to produce the effective farm production quota.
4. Suffered more than a 20 percent crop loss.
5. Met all price support eligibility requirements.

Farms that fail to report losses before the harvest will be a required stop check.

### Pasture Recovery Program (PRP)

USDA's Farm Service Agency Administrator Keith Kelly has announced that about \$40 million will be issued to producers under the Pasture Recovery Program (PRP). PRP was established to help farmers whose pastures were severely damaged by drought in 1999 reestablish forage crops. Eligible land included pasture which was normally grazed by livestock, but was so damaged by drought that seeding was required to reestablish the forage crop.

County FSA offices conducted a sign up from March 20 to June 23, 2000. Producers receiving payment must maintain the practice for a 3-year period, using the land only for pasture-me, mechanical harvesting of the land is prohibited. Since the producer demand applied to all requests. Consequently, producers will receive about 75.5 percent of the amount they qualified for under PRP. Payments will be made by county FSA offices shortly provided the reseeded has been established successfully.

### Loan Deficiency Payment

Producers who retain beneficial interest in a commodity eligible for a loan or a loan deficiency payment (LDP) are eligible for payment if all of the following remain with the producer:

- Control of the commodity
- Risk of loss
- Title of the commodity

One of the eligibility requirements for Loans and LDP's is the crop must have been produced on a contract acreage (AMTA), exception to soybeans.

A recent bill will now allow non-contract crops to be eligible for LDP's for 2000 crop only.

For further information on the LDP program contact the local FSA office.

### Change in Tobacco Loss Payment Eligibility

Hampton Henton, Jr., State Executive Director of the Farm Service Agency in Kentucky, announced that the Deputy Administrator, Farm Programs has authorized a change in policy for the Tobacco Loss Assistance Program 2000 (TALPOO). Late-filed spring lease and transfers of burley tobacco may now be in-

cluded in the TALPOO payment pounds, if the lease is approved by the County and State FSA Committees. Henton said, "The request to allow these pounds to be included in the payment was made by Kentucky FSA. We feel one producer should not be penalized because another failed to sign a document timely."

Producers with a pending late-filed spring FSA-375 lease and transfer must file their TALPOO applications by the sign up deadline of September 1, 2000. Only lease and transfers for requests with all required signatures before the end of the TALPOO sign up will be eligible for TALP payment. Disaster lease and transfers

will NOT be eligible for TALPOO payment pounds.

Farmers with a burley tobacco quota are urged to apply at their local FSA county office as soon as possible for the TALPOO payment. USDA will distribute \$340 million nationally to compensate tobacco farmers who suffered a reduction of tobacco quotas or acreage for the 1999-2000 crop years. Kentucky's share is \$140 million. Individual farm payments for burley tobacco will be split three ways between farmers, quota owners and those in control of the quota (farm operators).

# Rockets roll over Lincoln

 The Rockcastle County Rockets rolled into Stanford Friday night for an early season showdown with Lincoln County and came away with an impressive 24-14 win.  
 The final score wasn't indicative of the game, which saw the Rockets dominate the Patriots for three of the four quarters played.  
 "It was a good win for us - we needed it for our players, especially the younger ones - to get off to a good start," said head coach Tom Larkey.  
 Senior quarterback Christopher Parsons was named most valuable player of the game.  
 Parsons completed seven of twelve pass attempts for 127 yards and he had 24 yards on ten carries.  
 The three year starter also threw for one touchdown and ran for another in leading the Rockets to victory for the second straight year in the Death Valley Bowl.

The ROCK fell behind in the first quarter, after Lincoln County scored on a reverse around night end.  
 Defensive coordinator Tony Saylor recognized the formation and told his unit what to look for, but they didn't execute and it cost them.  
 A Lincoln County back scampered 28 yards for the score and the Lincoln County players and fans alike, thought the rout was on.  
 Although the ROCK seemed extremely flat at that point - they responded with a drive that resulted in a touchdown by senior Derrick Bussell and an extra point by Rocket placekicker Greg Terry, which tied the score at 7.  
 And then the condition factor kicked in.  
 Although Lincoln County had a much older and bigger bunch of kids, they lacked a very important thing, being in shape.  
 The Rockets superior condition

began to show as early as the second quarter and the young Rocket players, who had not seen much action on Friday night a year ago began to realize they could handle themselves against the older Lincoln County team.  
 The Rocket defense completely shut down the Patriots for the next three quarters while scoring three more times of their own.  
 The Rockets second score of the night, which gave them a 10-7 lead, was a fifty yard field goal by Terry.  
 The kick set a new school record, which was formerly held by Raymond Blackburn, who had booted a 47 yarder.  
 Senior Greg Harper scored the third time for the Rockets on a forty yard pass play.  
 Parsons hit Harper on a dead run, on the right side of the field, late in the second quarter to give the ROCK

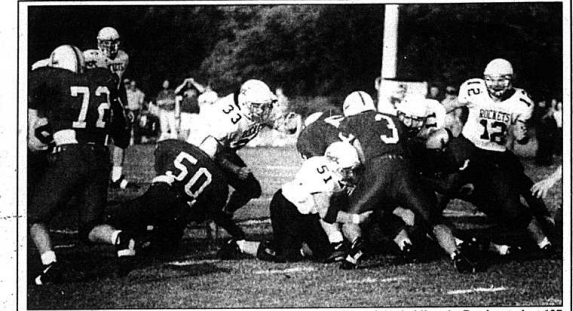
ets a 17-7 lead, which they took into half-time.  
 Neither team scored in the third quarter, although Rockcastle kept the ball on their end of the field most of the quarter.  
 Rockcastle's last score came on a one yard run by Parsons.  
 Terry, who has had contact with several colleges, was three for three in extra point kicks and he added the 50 yarder.  
 All total the ROCK rolled up 290 yards of offense, on 41 running plays and 13 passing plays.  
 Besides Parsons 177 yards of total offense, Bussell had 67 yards on 2 carries and he caught three passes

for 38 yards.  
 Junior Josh Hale had 11 yards on six carries and he caught two passes for 27 yards.  
 Junior fullback Clay Dooley had 14 yards on three carries and sophomore Aaron Anderkin had three yards one carry. Anderkin also completed one pass for 20 yards.  
 Harper caught three passes for a total of 98 yards.  
 Sophomore Marty Reagan had one carry for no yardage.  
 The ROCK's solid middle linebacker, senior Travis Ingram led the team on defense with eleven tackles and he also had a quarterback sack.  
 Defensive lineman William Blair

had seven tackles and assists.  
 Defensive Rover Josh Hale had seven tackles and assists and one of the four Rocket interceptions.  
 Junior defensive lineman Adam Childress had six tackles and assists and he also had a quarterback sack.  
 Childress also played three of the four quarters with an injured right eye. Childress was injured after his helmet came partially off and someone stepped on his head. He has not practiced this week, but he is expected to play Friday night.  
 Sophomore cornerback Marty Reagan had five tackles and assists and he also picked off a Patriot pass.

If the Rockets are to run their record to 2 and 0 on Friday night, they will have to figure out a way of stopping South Laurel's high octane offense.

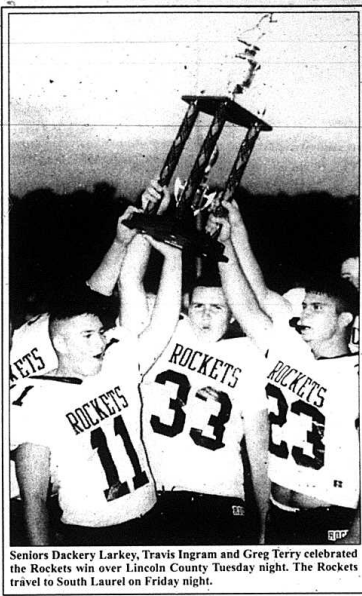
They don't go for first downs they go for touchdowns," Coach Saylor said of the Cardinal offense.

Game time is 7:30 Friday night at the South Laurel field (former Laurel County High School) in London.

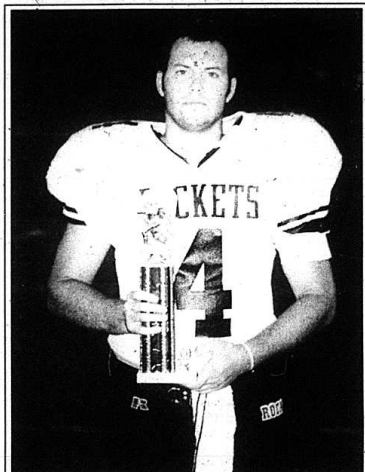

The RCHS freshman team also defeated Catholic on Monday night by a score of 16-14.

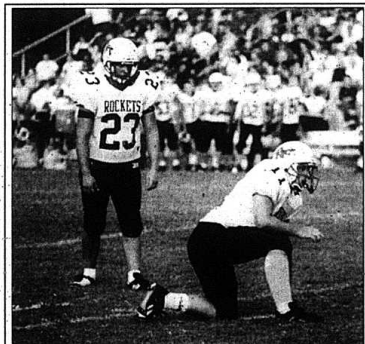

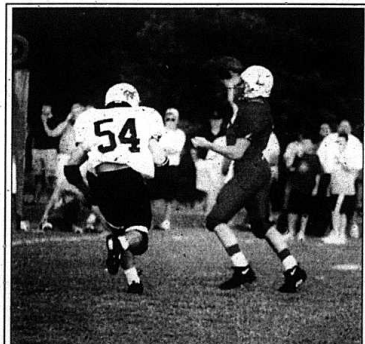

left turn lane that goes into the high school and directly into the path of the Rader vehicle, which was sitting still.

"There was absolutely nothing Kyle could do," Owens said.

Owens said there were apparently two cars sitting in the northbound lane of the by-pass and that the Henry vehicle went around both of those vehicles at the light and struck the Rader vehicle.

"Both of those cars drove off after the wreck and the only eyewitnesses left at the scene were behind the Henry vehicle."

"The driver of the Jimmy said he did not know what happened," Owens said.

Kyle Rader was wearing a seat belt and received minor injuries, but his Dad was not wearing a seat belt and the Saturn did not have airbags.

Calvin Rader, died a very short time after being taken to the Rockcastle Hospital.

David Henry and his parents, Edward and Margaret, both 39, were all treated at the Rockcastle Hospital and released.

Owens said that no charges had been filed against Henry, but that an investigation into the wreck was continuing.

Visitation for Calvin Rader was held at the Dowell and Martin Funeral Home and was one of the larg-

est ever in the county.

At least 1,000 people made their way to Calvin Rader's casket. Visitation began at 6 p.m. and the last person went through line at midnight.

Calvin Rader was the ninth person killed on the by-pass from McDonald's to the traffic light on Hwy. 150, since the by-pass opened in the late 1990s.

Calvin Rader was very active in the Rockcastle County Little League program where he had coached for 20 years.

He was presently store manager at Movie Warehouse in Mt. Vernon.

## Classified Deadline is Noon Tuesday

Participants will register at the Rockcastle County Health Department. Each person will receive a registration packet with a free gift and a walking log-book to track their time or mileage. At the time of registration, walkers will have their height, weight, blood pressure, cholesterol, and pulse recorded. Optional body measurements, such as circumference of waist, hips, and thighs, and arms can also be recorded. These body measurements are optional but will provide the walker valuable information and encouragement as you see positive changes in your body with a consistent exercise program. Follow up measurements will be offered at the end of the program. (Cholesterol monitoring will have a small fee.) Walking will be done at each individual's convenience, wherever he or she desires, and a headmist is acceptable or walkers will be invited to walk as a group with a health department staff member at announced locations. Mileage or time will be documented on the honor system. At the end of the program, walkers that complete the program will be eligible to receive a T-shirt and recognition for their outstanding effort!
