# **McFarland** offers court a settlement

Last week, the state approved a permit for McFarland to operate a less than one acre landfill on his property, which he would use to dispose of construction debris, although the Rockcastle Fiscal Court passed a resolution against the landfill at their At that meeting several local residents of the debrish of the debri

nvironment.
After the court passed the resolu

tion, they joined the tesidents in sign-ing a petition against the landfill. Both the resolution and petition were forwarded to the state.

Kentucky Education Commissioner Cene Wilhort spent Friday af-ternoon at Roundstone School. We need guarantees from the state - not well meaning gestures - to saure us that a barrel of hazardous chemicals will not be dumped in the assure us that a barrel of hazardous chemicals will not be dumped in the landfill by an untercupulous person. The state is not willing to give, such guarantees. The barrel might say in-tact for a long time before polluting the streams. Once the dumage is done, it cannot be easily reversed, and it would probably happen after most of us have forgotten about the landfill would probably happen after most of us have forgotten about the landfill region - which means that almost verything that this the ground can quickly find its way find the unde-county. Furthermore, almost all of Rockeastle County's residents (with the exception of the Dis River water-shed near Brodhead) live somewhere ownstream from Little Clear Creek Little Clear Creek is, basically, the headwaters for all of Rockeastle County.

With a steadfast attitude, the Burley Tobacco Growers Cooperative Association Board of Directors reaffirmed its commission to the Tobacco Price Support Program and tobacco growers at a meeting last work its Elizabethiswin. The 30-mem ber Board of Directors met to discuss the roje of the Burley Co-bp in a profiminately contracting situation. The results of the meeting were rosoundingly strong support for the program and commitment to all growers, both those who choose not tocontract and to contrag. The Burley
(p-op believes all growers need-protection through quota, control and
rifice supports.

and continues to make a strong errort for regulation of contracting through legislation. Despite the concerns that contracting poses a serious threat to contracting poses a serious threat to-the choacco program: a system of supply and demand and price sup-ports established by federal law the Philip Morris USA contracting pro-gram was able to contract with na-merous growers this year. Philip Morris will increase its contracting program and all but two of the other tobacco companies and leaf dealers have also entered contracting situa-

tions.
"The industry is changing fast," said Danny McKinney, CEO of the Burley Co-op. "But one thing will remain, our commitment to the To-bacco Program and to protecting all

penalty for tobacco companies who do not purchase their buying intentions as far farmers who overmarket (this is 75 percent of the prior year's market average per pound). These changes are statutory and would require action on the federal level.

The Board, which is chaired by Coensboro tobacco farmer Rod Kuegel, also explored avenues of alternative marketing structures for those who choose not to contract or are displeased with the contracting grade they receive.
