Police find another meth lab

A Rockcastle County man remains in the Rockcastle County Detention Center under a \$25,000 bond, after police apparently found yet another methamphetamine (meth) lab in the county.

According to police, a joint investigation by the Rockcastle County Sheriff's department and the Kentucky State Police, led to the discovery of the meth lab and 48 marijuana plants last Wednesday night.

According to police, Deputy Sheriff Doug Thomas and Trooper Scott Miller discovered the lab and marijuana at the residence of Clinton D. McCowan, 30, of Carter Ridge in Mt. Vernon.

McCowan was arrested and charged with cultivation of marijuana and manufacturing methamphetamine.

McCowan is due back in district court on August 6th.

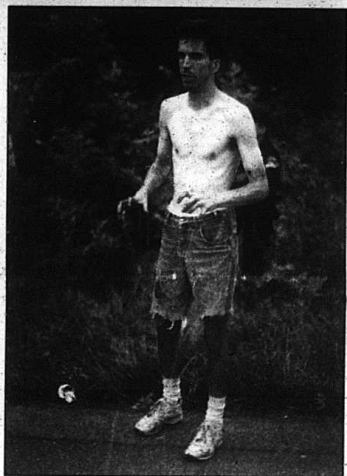

School begins August 15th New Brodhead School will not be completed

The Rockcastle County school system will officially open for students on August 15th.

That is all students except those who attend Brodhead Elementary School.

Rockcastle County Schools Superintendent Larry Hammond announced Wednesday that students who attend Brodhead will not go to school until August 27th because construction on the county's newest elementary school is not complete.

It is a first for Rockcastle County, but a common practice in other areas of the state when construction is not complete, according to Hammond.

Brodhead students will not be required to make up the eight school days they miss at the end of the year, but will make it up a few minutes each day, according to Hammond.

Actually Brodhead students already go to school each day longer than the required time - so making up the days will not be a problem for them," he said. "Everything we do about making up the missed days will be reviewed by state department officials." Hammond said.

All school personnel at Brodhead will be required to attend during the eight days when students are not in attendance.

The new buildings has been under construction less than one year.

The contract for construction of the school was for one year, so the general contractor D.W. Wilburn is still within the time frame of the construction contract.

Hammond said that problems with the parking lot - mainly the fact that the soil where the old school building sat was too damp was the main delay in opening the school on the 15th.

When school does start at Brodhead the gymnasium will not be completely finished either, but it will be completed soon after the first day of school, Hammond said.

The 60,000 square foot facility is

costing the local system \$6 million. That figure includes everything from construction to new equipment and furniture.

Bus routes for the school system will remain the same with buses running the same routes and exchanging students at a designated place in Brodhead.

A lot of furniture that was in the old building will be used in the new facility.

District wide day for all school personnel will be August 14th.

School will be dismissed on Labor Day September 3, October 5 for CKEA, November 5 and 6 for election day and November 22 and 23 for Thanksgiving.

Christmas break will be December 20 through January 1.

Surgery on Donnie Warf, a former Rockcastle County resident was performed at the University of Cincinnati Hospital.

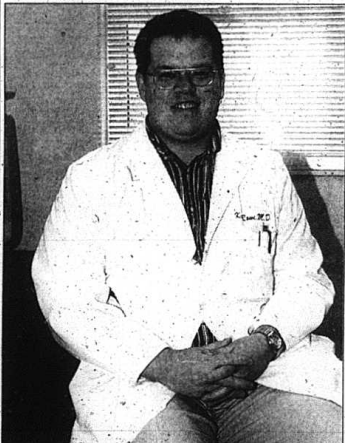
"We are so thankful," said Becky Smith, a Brodhead resident and middle school teacher, who was going to give a lobe of her liver in an effort to save his life.

Mrs. Smith said that her family was very thankful for the kindness and support shown to them in recent weeks.

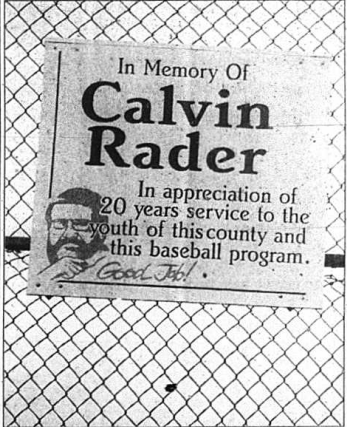

Memorial to the late Calvin Rader

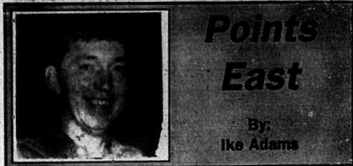

The tent and the sleeping bag and yours truly have just returned from Fred Beste's Bash in the shadows of the Pocomos and there is no doubt that we are better than we were before we left Kentucky. The camping gear is all aired out now having quality time beside the bull frog pond and I have eaten better for three days than I have in years. Wind Gap Pennsylvania has cleaner air than Kentucky and Fred had ordered up weather similar to what we get here in late September.

Fred brought in several dozen guests to his place for two days of music, food and camaraderie. I actually packed a Marine Corps expedition-grade sleeping bag that pretty much filled one duffel bag and the tent and stakes in yet another along with a couple changes of clothing and I marched through the airports lugging them and a guitar case and looking for all the world as though I was going someplace to take up a new residence.

Fred had warned me that getting a cab ride to his place might prove troublesome.

Sure enough, when I got through the luggage claim at Allentown International there was only one cab in sight and it looked like it had been sitting in the same spot for at least three rain storms.

Inside the terminal there was a desk that said "Taxi" on it and one of those little bells like the ones you can ring to wake up the clerk who is supposed to be taking care of the sporting goods counter at Wal-Mart. I had no sooner hit the button than a nice young fellow came tearing around the corner.

"You rang?" he asked and I asked about the chances of getting a cab to Wind Gap and he literally beamed.

"You've just made Charlie's day," he said.

"Who's Charlie?"

Charlie, it turned out, was dozing in a lounge chair and he had to be pushing 80.

But he was alert enough to recognize his name and he sprang to attention.

When told that he had a fare to Wind Gap, some 25 miles away, I honestly thought he was going to commence weeping. I've rarely seen such joy on a human face.

In minutes we were northbound on Interstate 33 and Charlie was obviously anxious to please. Maybe it was my guitar case that had him

fooled but he treated me like royalty, dutifully honking his horn and motioning other drivers to get out of his way.

I gave him Fred's address and he told me he knew right where it was.

"Oh you know Fred?" I would not have been the least bit surprised if he had but, "No, I know Jacobeburg Road like the back of my hand."

Fred's house is at the end of a very serious "S" curve that is probably safe at 20mph. Charlie passed Fred's mail box going 60 and upon realizing his mistake, promptly locked here up, threw the taxi into reverse and suddenly we were going backwards on the wrong side of the road in a blind curve. Someone nearby rear ended us and sat down on their horn. Charlie pulled into Fred's drive. I've never been any happier to get out of a car which Charlie would only allow me to do after promising to call

him when I was ready to go back to the airport.

"You can call me at midnight," he said "and I'll be here in 30 minutes. I didn't have the heart to tell him that hitch hiking seemed a more viable alternative."

Fully describing the weekend would take the entire space available in this newspaper and then some. But as I said before the food was to die for and it's probably a miracle that I didn't do just that because I stopped

counting at 50 the fresh clams that I was tossing down as fast as Terry Collier could chuck them. And Red Clark's salsa fixed straight out of the garden is something that dreams are made of.

In the final analysis, it is simply wonderful to have a friend as wonderful as Fred Beste and Fred has dozens of friends himself. We've got to do this again and I know Fred well enough to know we will.



"Preach"
The Sunday evening service at the First Baptist Church on West Main St., Mt. Vernon was a bit unusual. Instead of "Preach" the title Rev. Wendell Romans preferred, standing behind the pulpit with a cheerful greeting, followed by message of love or warning of God's wrath for those needing it, is there one among us who hasn't strayed from the "Path of Righteousness" and need to be reminded of it? Preach sat on the front row of the chapel with his wife, Lena and niece surrounded by those who loved him. So, instead of hearing a message about God's love and the joy of serving Him, we viewed slides of pictures I call "Precious Memories" that were taken of events and members of the congregation he and his wife had served, and spent many hours with during his eight years as the Pastor of First Baptist Church.

He had shared happy times, such as weddings, welcoming a new baby into the flock and being invited to Sunday dinner where the hospitality and good food vied for top honors. There were also the sad occasions when Preach had to sit beside a beloved one and watch him or her

drift into the final sleep. Then help soothe the grieving family of their loss. Beside vigils and funerals were as much a part of "Preach's" life as preaching on Sunday and attending prayer meeting on Wednesday night.

He tended his flock, He knew their voice and they knew his. If a lamb drifted too far away he searched till he found it. If the flock got restless and began to scatter, he calmed and corralled them with a quiet voice. Preach, or Brother Wendell Romans has well earned the title of The Good Shepherd.

When the last picture was faded away the newly awakened memories brought mixed feelings of the past, present and what the future holds in her hand. Some dear ones shown in the pictures, are no longer with us, and the chapel is now filled by many who were not with us then. The youngsters Preach patted on the head when he was here before now have their own little ones for him to get acquainted with and pat on the head, if he can get them still long enough to do so.

Next on the list was a trip down the long hall to the new auditorium where the table was spread and the

song "Come and Dine" would have been welcomed. There were sandwiches of everything from peanut butter and jelly, olive and nut spread, baloney and cheese to chicken salad and hamburgers. Name it and it could be found, somewhere between the trays of salad makings where one could find his choice of fresh veggies and a variety of dips to finish off with. This was one of the meals we remember as belonging on a white cloth spread under a big old shade tree in an open space beside the road, that we called, a pic-nic. All that was lacking was a shade tree and watermelon where we could spit the seeds out while the water from it ran down our chin, and the small kids could run freely without fear of knocking a tray from someone's hand. Good food, prepared and served by willing hands, brings to mind the LAST SUPPER in the Upper room where Jesus showed his humility by washing His servants feet and asked Peter, "Simon, son of Jonas, Lovest thou me more than these?" Peter replied, "Yea Lord, thou knowest that I love Thee." He replied, "FEED MY SHEEP." Jesus again repeated the question, "Simon, Lovest thou Me?" and the same order, "Feed My Lambs." For the third time He asked, "Simon, lovest thou Me?" With the same reply, "Lord Thou knowest all things and know I

love you." He answered with "FEED MY SHEEP."

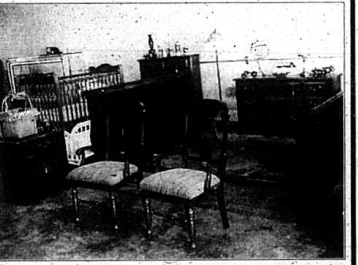

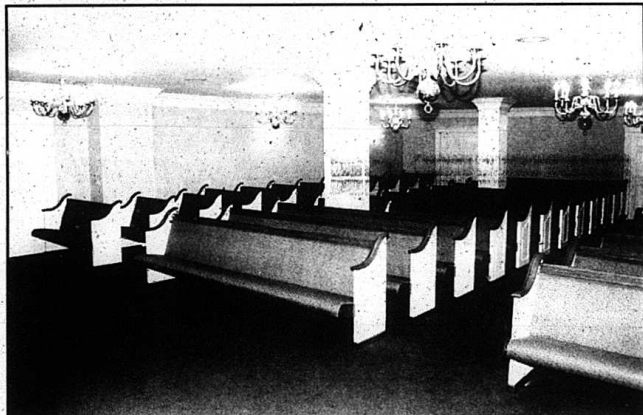

This is a letter to the person who dumped carbofuran (Furadan) at the sinks in Roundstone Creek. You Killed Her! Your intent was not to kill my little one anymore than the drunk who gets in his car intends to kill the little girl in the car in the next lane. Tell her parents that. She's just as dead. Her bed is empty, her play things gathered in a basket never to be touched again. Their arms are empty. As mine are. I am the lady whose dog was poisoned at the Sinks while hiking on July 6. I have no husband or children, all I had was that loyal, friendly, innocent being that you took from me. Shall I tell you how she died? Not from drinking the water and not within three minutes as falsely reported. Carbofuran was found in the water, but probably from being washed off the bank. Every system in her body exploded. The details are graphic. I'll just say that after 25 minutes when her tongue turned blue and the convulsions came

without interval, I placed my revolver against her broken body and pulled the trigger. We couldn't even get her out of the creek bed in time to get help.

The community has not been told all of the truth. Many species of wild life lost their lives in that illegal incident. No agency analyzed one animal prior to my efforts to obtain analysis.

"Massive carbofuran" was found due to ingestion. On July 16, after officials buried the animals, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife agents and I found several animals that had been missed and lying in the creek bed since this incident happened. We had rain shortly afterward.

You got by with murder! I have been to the Sinks before and have seen young people riding their four wheelers there. Your child, their pet could have easily gotten killed. If carbofuran is still in the area, in the form of baited animals, etc., death is still very possible. Sources report that carbofuran is viable for up to six months. One tablespoon of the granulated form can kill an adult. One granule, a songbird. If God sees every sparrow, he is mourning the loss of the song birds killed that day. Perhaps his mate mourns the raccoon that once scampered on the bank. Only I am left to mourn "Prancy."

Let this letter be a wake-up call to this community. Using carbofuran, other than as an insecticide is illegal. You must have a restricted use permit to use it. The granulated form was to be used up by 1997. Baiting coyotes is illegal. Demand fuller disclo-

sures of findings, demand that your environment by safe. Demand more efficient coordination among agencies. Many of the officials seem bent on avoiding blame. This is not what this is about. An analysis of this event and agency response should be conducted to see where improvement is needed. This is a chance to learn. Your intent to illegally kill an animal or animals resulted in tragedy for me. The loss of the wildlife was a tragedy. Another tragedy, your ac-

tions brought about was the loss in this community of some of the safety and well-being we cling to. I visualize you lounging comfortably this evening in the arms of your family. My arms are empty thanks to you.



SCHOOL BUS RULES AND REGULATIONS

The privilege of any pupil to ride a school bus is conditioned upon their good behavior and observance of the following rules and regulations. Pupils violating these rules and regulations shall be reported to the principal of the school which the pupil attends for necessary corrective action. Safety is the primary concern in the transportation of pupils. In order to assure proper safety, it is vital that pupils and parents understand the rules and regulations of school bus riding. Following is a list of basic rules and regulations adopted by the Rockcastle County Board of Education and the Kentucky Department of Education:

1. Arrive at bus stop on time. The bus has many scheduled stops and cannot be delayed.
2. Never stand in the road while waiting for the bus. Parents should encourage safety measures for pupils as they wait for the bus and walk home from the bus.
3. Cross a safe distance (10 feet) in front of the bus so the driver can see you.
4. Take a seat upon boarding the bus and do not change seats while the bus is in motion.
5. The driver is in charge of the bus and pupils and has the authority to assign seating arrangements.
6. Keep noise to a minimum so that the driver's attention can be devoted to driving.
7. Do not extend arms, legs or head out the bus windows.
8. Obey the rules posted on each bus.
9. Do not block aisles in any way.
10. Knives/other sharp instruments are not permitted on the bus.
11. Never run toward the bus. Always load and unload when the bus has come to a complete stop.
12. Apply the above rule (No. 11) when transferring buses.
13. Never use the rear exit unless an emergency exists.
14. Ride only your assigned bus unless you have a signed note from the Principal. Parents must write or call the principal to obtain permission for pupil to ride another bus or to exit at a different stop.
15. Report any damages to the bus.
16. Do not occupy more space in a seat than required.
17. Open and close windows in compliance with the driver's instructions.
18. Pupils and parents are to accept the responsibility of listening for dismissal announcements on the radio on days when inclement weather disrupts the regular schedule.
19. The following rules are of particular concern and the activities mentioned are prohibited at all times:
 - a. Use of profane/foul language
 - b. Smoking or other use of tobacco on the bus
 - c. Fighting on the bus
 - d. Destruction of bus property
 - e. Defiance of driver's authority
 - f. Throwing objects on or from the bus.
20. **Disciplinary Action:** Violations of the above stated rules and regulations shall be reported to the appropriate school principal. The principal shall record the incident and determine the appropriate disciplinary action. Should any pupil persist in violating any of these regulations, it shall be the duty of the driver to notify the principal and, after due warning has been given to the pupil and such violation persists, the principal and/or board of education shall then forbid such disobedient pupil the privilege of riding the bus. Written notice of the action of the principal shall be furnished to the parents and the superintendent.



Parents & Teachers School Bus Safety Alert

A child's clothing can be dangerous when getting off the bus. A number of children have been injured or killed when their clothing became caught when exiting the bus.

Dangerous clothing that can get caught in handrails, doors or other areas include:

- Jackets or sweatshirts with drawstrings
- Backpack straps
- Scarves or other loose clothing

Please talk with your children about these Safety Rules:

Stay away from Danger Zones around the bus

If you drop something near the bus, don't pick it up. The driver may not see you. Tell the driver & follow his/her instructions.

Remember that motorists don't always stop for the school bus. Use extreme caution when getting on or off the bus.

Phase II Tobacco Payments

By: Tom Mills

County Extension Agent for Agriculture/Natural Resources

Rockcastle County tobacco quota owners, growers, and tenants will soon be completing applications for the 2001 Phase II Tobacco payments. Applications are anticipated being mailed out on August 6 and should be completed by September 15. Applications will be mailed to Farm Service Agency listed operators. Anyone who was a tenant for the past 3 crop years will need to be sure the operator includes them on the application.

Payments will be divided into three parts, just as in past years. One-third to quota owner as of July 1, 2000; one-third to growing farm, and one-third to tenant. The growing farm and tenant portion will be based on

payment pounds. Payment pounds are the average of effective quota and marketings.

This year the growing farm and tenant sections will be an average of payment pounds for the 1998, 1999 and 2000 crops. Tenants that were on a farm in 1998 or 1999 will share in the payments even though they may not be farming at this time. As in the past, checks will be mailed the last business day in December.

With the short turn around time, farmers are reminded to complete applications early, and where necessary, get the out-of-state signatures for absentee land owners as quick as possible.

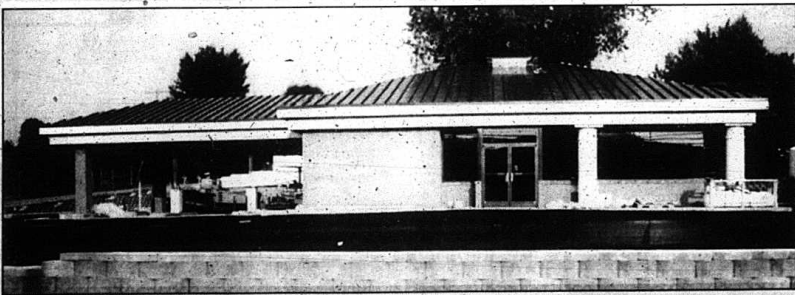
