## Apply now for free septic systems

The Rockcastle County Fiscal Court has received federal grant ap-plicants for a new program that will pay [00 percent of the cost of install-ing and replacing septic systems in the county.

Rockcastle Judge-Executive Rockeastle Judge-Executive Buzz Carlotits said the program is part of the PRIDE program, which is headed by U.S. Congressman Harold Rogers of Somerset. The gold of the new program is to replace inadequate systems and to build new systems to replace straignt line pipes which allow raw sewage tor un into the ground. The Rockeastle Fiscal Court must have a assessment of the number of homes wanting the free septic sys-

tems by October 5.

Carloftis said priority would be given to homes that are grouped closely together in the first round of funding.

The determination of who will be pricked and who will not will be mycked to the first round of funding.

Those not selected will be con-ered in the next round of funding. To be considered for a free septic tem, Carloftis said it is imperative that his office or the local PRIDE office be contacted as soon as pos-

The Rockcastle County Conservation District recently announced the 2001 kick-for for the Rinse and Return Plastic Container Recycling Program. They encourage all farmers, farm supply dealers and other pesticide users to participate in this exciting recycling program.

The Conservation District has scheduled collection dates for Rockcastle will be Spenmer 6, 2001 Rockcastle will be simported, run through a chipping machine and the material will be shipped to a facility to be reused in the manufacture of new pesticide containers.

How to participate: (1) Triple rinse or pressure rinse all containers when emptied. Remember, it is best to rinse containers immediately after they are containers immediately after they are emptied. 





The Rockcastle County Fiscal Court has received federal grant applications for a new program that PRIDE has begun. The grant will pay 100% for the materials and complete installation of proper septic systems for those who presently have a straight pipe or otherwise inadequate system.

The fiscal court must have an assessment of the number of homes wanting the free septic systems by October 5, 2001. Priority will be given by the PRIDE office in Somerset to homes that are grouped closely together in this first round of funding. All inadequate and failing septic systems will be considered for future grant awards.

To be considered for a free septic system, it is imperative that you contact the county judge's office (256-2856 or 256-2310) or the local PRIDE office (256-1902). They will turn them over to the regional PRIDE office, who will then make the final determination of who receives funding in this first round.






