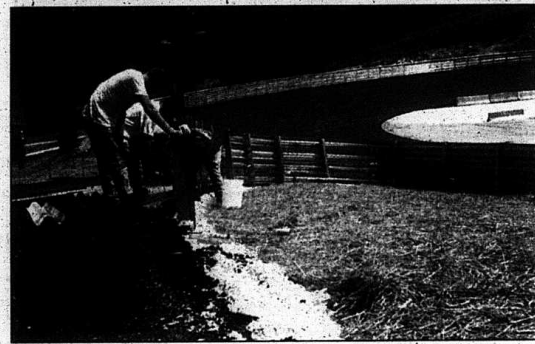

I-75 Speedway will hold races this Saturday

The I-75 Speedway at Cove Branch will open on Saturday, with racing on Saturday, Sunday and Monday of this week.

The former Rockcastle Raceway has undergone a major change, thanks to new owners Ronnie Bates and Johnathon Smith.

The two Lincoln County men are in the process of spending nearly \$800,000 on the race track, which is expected to attract hundreds of drivers and thousands of spectators to their stock car races.

After Labor Day, racing will be held each week on Saturday night and Sunday afternoons.

The feature race of the weekend will be Monday at 3 p.m. when the Coca-Cola 100 will be held.

On Saturday, gates at the track will open at 3 p.m. with qualifying at 4 p.m. and racing at 7:00 p.m.

On Sunday, gates will open at 10 a.m. with a church service at 11:30 and practice beginning at 12 noon.

Qualifying begins at 1:30 and racing will begin at 3:00 p.m. on Sunday.

Gates will open at the track at 10 a.m. on Monday.

Bates said that several different classes will compete at the 3/8 mile oval track, including Late Model, Super Street, Pure Street Chevetttes and Open Wheel Modified.

On Monday, the track will also sponsor a bicycle race for all youngsters.

Bates said the track would also be leased out from time to time for larger races, sponsored by different people.

Bates has been stock car racing for 35 years and said he hopes his connections will help bring out the best car and drivers to the new track.

Bates, who runs at Charlotte and the Kentucky Speedway himself, will not race at the track, unless he races when someone else has the track leased.

The new track has the ability to seat 1,800 and even more room in the grandstands.

There are also four luxury sky boxes, which have all been leased for this year, but Bates said that more will be constructed in the near future.

Bates said that he and his partner, a Chicago attorney, decided to buy the racetrack, because of their love for stock car racing.

"We wanted to mix a little business with pleasure and we are doing everything we can to make this a first class operation," Bates said.

Bates expects to employ 25 to 30 people at the track, with racing continuing this fall as long as the weather will allow.

Admission to the track will be \$8 for grandstand seating and \$20 for entrance to the pit area.

3-year-old dies after drowning incident

A three-year-old Brodhead boy visiting relatives near Crab Orchard Saturday wandered after from the house and into a neighbor's pool, where frantic parents found him minutes after noticing he was gone.

According to police, Stephen Russell Baldwin, son of Dean and Marilyn Chesnut Baldwin, was unconscious in the pool about 7:40 p.m. when he was found and his family took him to Fort Logan Hospital in Stamford.

The child was flown from there to the University of Kentucky Medical Center in Lexington.

Roundstone has highest CTBS scores in Kentucky

The report card from the latest round of testing is in for Rockcastle County Schools and each county school got a passing grade.

The scores from the Comprehensive Test of Basic Skills (CTBS) were released last week. In fact, according to data released by the State Department of Education, Roundstone Elementary School had the best overall scores in the state for elementary schools.

Roundstone had a total battery score of 91, one point ahead of the Anchorage school district in Jefferson County.

"We are really proud of Roundstone's efforts, the staff, parents and especially students should be commended on their hard work," said Rockcastle School Superintendent Larry Hammond.

"High test scores such as they have had in the past is something they should be proud of," Hammond said.

Principal David Penso also had praise for his staff and for the students.

"We have worked very hard to create the type of learning environment that results in good test scores but we are also a very community oriented school, which is supported by parents and community members and we are thankful for that," he said.

Roundstone primary students scored the highest in math and language and increased their scores four points in reading from a year ago.

Overall Roundstone increased their scores by a total of nine points. At Brodhead Elementary students had a total score of 69, an increase of eight points from a year ago.

Mr. Vernon Elementary scored 73, an increase of two points and at the Rockcastle County Middle School, (Cont. to A-8)

County eligible for disaster funds

U.S. Representative Harold "Hal" Rogers of Somerset said Wednesday that President George W. Bush has added three Kentucky counties including Rockcastle to those eligible for public emergency assistance.

Rogers said Rockcastle County is now eligible for emergency help from the federal government.

Seventeen counties were declared eligible for emergency assistance by the President earlier this month. The disaster declarations are in the wake of damages from severe storms, flash floods and torrential rains that have hit the region since July.

Areas of Rockcastle County were hit hard by flooding on August 3rd.

"The Federal Emergency Management Agency is already working with the State of Kentucky to provide assistance to our county and municipal governments and today's announcements expands that assistance to the people of Rockcastle County," Rogers said. "These communities are finding that the repair of public facilities and infrastructure is an expensive undertaking. With this disaster declaration, these local

and county governments will be able to begin the job of cleaning up and rebuilding," the Congressman said.

School underway at Brodhead

They are eating lunch in their rooms and the gymnasium is not complete, but school is underway at the county's newest elementary school.

On Monday, approximately 425 students and 31 teachers attended their first day of classes at Brodhead. School at Brodhead was delayed eight school days because the new \$6 million facility was not complete.

Principal Caroline Graves said that things are running very smoothly, given the circumstances and that everyone had been very cooperative about the entire situation.

"We really appreciate the hard work of the staff at Brodhead and they should be commended on making it possible to go to school on Monday," said Rockcastle School

Superintendent Larry Hammond. Lunchroom personnel are able to use the kitchen, but the tables for the cafeteria have not arrived.

Mrs. Graves said they were shipped a few days ago and should be arriving any day.

Students are also not allowed outside the building unless an emergency arises, so students are currently taking gym classes in an actual classroom.

"We teach things such as safety and nutrition in class, as well as do physical activities so we are doing the classroom work first," she said.

Mrs. Graves said it was her understanding that the gymnasium would be complete in about 30 days.

KCA dining hall renamed Colson Hall

At Sunday's annual meeting at the Kentucky Christian Assembly campground near Brodhead, Clay Colson was honored by having the dining hall renamed "Colson Hall."

Mr. Colson was recognized for his donation of the original land for the campground in 1963.

The presentation was made by Billy Hiatt of Mt. Vernon who was one of the five original trustees of the camp.

Calling Mr. Colson, "A man who gave his talent in service to the people," Mr. Hiatt gave a synopsis of Mr. Colson's life and career with the Soil Conservation Service.

Colson's first job, after leaving Berea College where he met his wife, Nellie, was in Rockcastle and Southern Madison County as an assistant county agent to Bob Spence. He then moved to Letcher Co. as county agent and took a leave of absence from there to return to the University of Kentucky to work on his graduate degree, taking 51 hours in one year.

Mr. Colson served as a naval officer during World War II and later retired from the Naval Reserve as a Lt. Commander. Following graduate school, he moved to Jessamine County to work and then moved about 17 times in a short span of time before coming to Rockcastle Co. in 1945 as the County Soil Conservationist. After coming to Rockcastle Co., he introduced the first fescue, helped start dairy farming and the first milk route, helped lay thousands of feet of tile, supervised the building of hundreds of farm ponds and developed springs for livestock and home use.

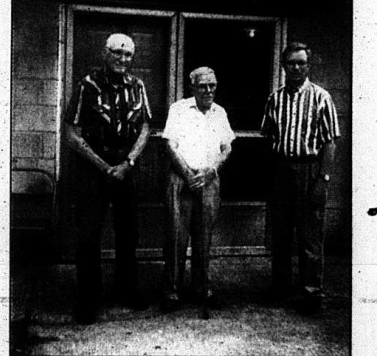
The idea for Lake Linville ori-

inated as he was driving home from a soil conservation meeting and he was very instrumental in getting the Mt. Vernon City Council to pursue the idea.

In 1956, he bought a farm in Rockcastle County and moved his family to it.

After retiring in 1972, Mr. Colson

On Friday, August 15, 2001, I bought a gallon of 2% milk off the dairy rack at Wal-Mart and never thought much about it until I got home.

I don't know about you all, but I'm not one of those people who pays much attention to expiration dates on food stuff because I figure it wouldn't be on the rack if it wasn't still good and I also know, from long experience, that a loaf of gallon of anything is going to disappear within three or four hours of the time I bring it home. So why worry?

Hot dog buns are the exception. Every once in awhile I'll buy one of those two-dozen-to-the-package of hot dog buns and only get a dozen weenies and in a day or two I'll look at the bun-bag still lying there on the kitchen table and it will be blue instead of toasty brown and I'll grit my teeth cause I know I should have broken down and gotten another 12-pack of Oscar Meyers.

Mold sets in fast here on Charlie Brown, Road and Ole Blue, my main dog. Blue would take all they have and Blue has friends.

Anyway, I got home with my milk on the 15th of August and started to put it in the fridge when I noticed the expiration

label in fairly bold print right there on top of the handle.

"Guaranteed Fresh Until Sept. 7"

And I thought to myself, "Surely this is a misprint." Surely they don't expect me to put this milk in the refrigerator and still be drinking it in three weeks because I've been around milk all my life and it normally goes in to three days in which case I feed it to Blue and my dog, loves bad milk even better than he loves moldy buns.

In fact, Blue's ideal gourmet meal is moldy buns marinated in bad milk and he has even suggested that as a flavor to the folks at Purina but so far we haven't seen it advertised.

So I called the store and inquired about the milk.

A series of textbooks could be written about the procedure's required to get information about milk that includes the various steps that milk goes through to get to from cow to you. Suffice to say that you will be referred to various law firms if you get deep enough.

"How," I asked, "can you still call milk 'fresh' after it's been on the shelf three weeks?"

"Our attorneys know the answer to that," I was advised three different times and upon calling the referred-to legal counsel I was asked if I had bought any bad milk.

"Actually, No. I have not."

"Does it taste fresh?" (The woman at this time was pinning me down)

"I actually don't know. It's been in the

fridge for 10 days and I'd rather not taste it but the label says its good for another 8 days and I was just wondering if your estate could sue you if I pour some of it on corn flakes and die."

"Corn flakes may kill you but I wouldn't blame it on milk until I sued them first," she said and hung up.

Folks, when I was growing up milk-kept for three days, max, if properly refrigerated, and then it went blanky in which case it developed a taste that would stop you from drinking it by gagging you and making your tongue swell into the size of a beef liver. Nowadays milk stays "fresh" for three weeks! (And at the end of three weeks you flush it down the toilet to clean the drains.) (Or feed it to Blue).

Bread is guaranteed "fresh" for two weeks minimum after they put it on the rack.

Ground beef is out there on the rack with your choice steaks guaranteed "fresh" for eight or ten days.

Bullshit!

What the heck are they putting in it?

The local funeral home can't keep a corpse fresh enough to open the casket after three or four days and yet the meat and poultry and dairy industry is keep-



Wishes Granted

Almost anything can be overdone, including the answers to our wishes and dreams. Therefore, be careful what you ask for, you may get more than you want, or your wishes may come in a different shape or form than expected. Wishes and dreams are for the future, so the planning and preparing for them is done at a time in life when they may collide with the dreams and plans of others you may not be ready to accept.

Most of those who have read "Sweet and Sour" since I began writing should remember the rough time I had, being what I thought I was, "a pioneer in the wilds of Appalachia." That phrase didn't last forever. Then, I come a time when the buckets of water carried from the spring weren't as heavy, nor the distance as far. A washing machine was found with a motor that used white gas for power that took the place of a washboard powered by strong arms and worn-out hands. The motor that powered the washing machine was also used to charge the battery for a radio, the first in our neighborhood. Listening to the Grand Old Opry

on Saturday night soon became a habit and the social gathering place for a few neighbors. To save fuel needed to keep the cycle going, the washing machine had to be used more often so the battery could be hooked up at the same time if it was to be charged and ready for Saturday night entertainment. Reece and Lala Miz, with their two little boys, Calvin and Conley, were the most frequent visitors. Alice Miz, Reece's mother, and her brother, Blind George Jones, often accompanied them. Blind George couldn't see, of course, but didn't need to since music was what he wanted to hear. Sometimes, he would bring his five string banjo along to fill in the time when the battery died. He really could make music on the banjo that would start other feet tapping to match his own that by then would be stomping on the bare wood floor beneath them. He often would break into a song. Pretty Polly was his favorite. George lived with Alice and her husband, Homer, were the most frequent visitors. He tried to pay his way by selling packages of chewing gum to neighbors and friends. He named me Teaberry because that was what I bought the most of. Blind George, the name everyone knew him by, was able to go anywhere he wanted to, using his cane instead of eyes to find the rocks, deep ruts, or mud puddles in the path or knock the overhanging brush out of the way. He often brought our mail the couple miles over the hill between our house and the post

office. He would visit awhile, talk to the kids, sell us food of chewing gum and perhaps sing a tune. Polly was his pet and she was usually, "Polly went to courtin'". For Christmas one year, when Polly was four or five, he made a bedroom set for her dolls. He had measured and whittled every piece of wood to make it to correct size and shape from odds and ends of rough lumber, nailed it with tiny nails that held it fast without leaving a sharp edge that could possibly injure her. It was a full three piece set. It included a dresser and chest with drawers that slid in and out perfectly. That gift, from Blind George, was a special treasure to Polly. She had received a gift made with hands of a blind person with a child that could hear the voice of his ears and make music from a banjo he loved.

Later in life, he bought a little plot of ground next to the river in Livingston and built, by himself, a two room cabin with plenty of cupboard and closet space where he could organize, and keep organized, his clothes and supply of food he could cook for himself. A few weeks later, when Mat and I visited him, the cabin was as clean as if a pernickety housewife was taking care of it. Missed Blind George after he moved to Livingston where he lived along until he died several years later.

The good things happening taught me there was more to learn about the other side of life where happiness was found in the heart of others and hardships were taken as a matter to be dealt with as a part of life and a little music and laughter could ease it away. I was still home-keeper for the life I had lived in town where street lights were on every corner and music was hymns sung in church or at home with the family joining in around the piano. We were a family of singers where

at a good spot, trio or quartet could appear at a moment's notice. When two or three of us got together, music would be in our mind. Put six or eight together and you had a hit. Harmony meant voices that blended into a pleasant sound. I missed this so I began to wish for a way we could live in town. It didn't matter where, as long as it had sidewalks and street lights.

That prayer was I answered for several years although we did spend the war years in Cincinnati. We didn't live on a street with a white picket fence around a cottage and sidewalks with a corner light that flicked shadows on the sidewalk from the trees that lined it.

Another problem with living on the isolated farm began to bother me after being enveloped with trees everywhere I looked. Over the years, they grew into a dense forest. I couldn't see through nor around. Now, I still love trees and the shade beneath where a person can sit and enjoy the squirrels chattering overhead, or watch the birds tending their young in a nest high above. Out of the dining room windows, I watched apple trees in the orchard, from the time they put forth buds in the spring till the last apple was made into applebutter in the fall, then all winter when snow took the place of leaves. Across the front lawn and highway was a hedge of dark trees blocking the rising sun till noon. Second growth timber crowded for a place at the fence out back. Oh, yes, they are pretty. The big oak in the back yard that held the swing my mother and I swung on so preciously. The dogwoods left set out and the one in memory of Mat are not for sale at any price. The memory of the glowing maples surrounding the home place are indelibly stamped in the recess of my mind. Yet, I wanted a change of scenery. So, I finally moved to Tevis Street in Mt. Vernon.

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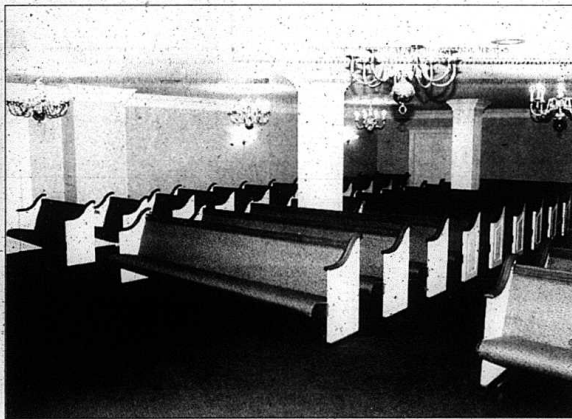

The squirrels became tame enough to come on the porch and eat out of my hand. The lawn between the window and Richmond Street was well kept with a few fruit trees bearing small plums or apples close to my driveway and a border of large cacti, or marbles, between the trees and raised their young there. A street light was just a few houses from mine so my dream was almost complete. The exposure of lawn between my kitchen and the trees allowed the beauty of each to be appreciated. When seasons changed, so did the beauty. Spring brought tender leaves developing into full size when summer brought the need for shade and all the glorious colors of autumn when I could see the trees from the window. Winter didn't slight them either. My shades were never lowered during winter for the beauty of new fallen snow on a field with trees showing beneath the weight of it and perhaps a red bird decaying the branches is something one never forgets.

Be careful what you wish for, you may get more than you want. The wish for a change of scenery can be devastating when the change turns into a nightmare instead of the dream you had of things being like they once were. The answer to the desire for a comfortable home in town, where I can rest in peace for the time that came to change into fall colors, with has become an albatross, loaded with weights too heavy for one person to carry alone. The hotel on the hill would have been a haven of rest for me then. I had turmoil in the house that was being completed by carpenters, turmoil in the kitchen were helpers were emptying boxes and wanting to know where to put them and turmoil in my soul

wondering when it would all end and allow some peace and quiet so an old woman could close the doors to keep out the noise of the jackhammers trying to dig through a cliff that was hammering the builders from getting deep enough for the foundation to the building they were replacing my view with. The jackhammers were shaking my house till the chairs and windows were rattling and hammers were rat-tat-tatting on nerves already frayed by last year's problems till I could do was close the doors, turn the T.V. on loud, slump down into the recliner and try to remember that the Bible said God would not put on us more than we could bear. But, I was not job and my patience was wearing out. But, the worst was yet to come. The owners, managers or directors of the Berea Bank that thought Mr. Vernon needed another bank surely must have known something about the wealth of Rockcastle county citizens many others don't know. The reputation of Rockcastle being one of the poorest counties in the state is well known. The managers or whoever decides when to light up the area almost must have known I needed a little light on the subject of what was going on for they turned my night into day when brilliant spotlights, the size of basketballs, flashed a blinding light into my eyes. I

was sitting in the living room and the light came from the window in the kitchen. It was so bright I couldn't see for a minute and a memory of Memo, My oldest grandson, flashing a bright light into my eyes when he was little to watch my reaction and found out quickly the results. I took the light away from Memo and never again did he try to blind me to his mischief making. This light from the building was coming from multiple ones located under the eaves of the building but hung in such a way they pointed directly into the windows facing the obstruction to my ability to see past it. There are six windows facing the back of the bank. I counted seven lights installed in such a

way each had a window to target. This is different, it is my grandson experimenting with reactions to human behavior but big business with no time for thought about the rights and needs of a community being invaded with destroyers of natural beauty but builders of banks where our savings can be kept safe and security lights to keep them so. I understand the necessity of having security lights but I also understand the need for privacy in ones own home and the courtesy of respecting it. I really got more than I was asking for when I wished for and bought a place with a street light on the corner to spend my last days in, did I not?

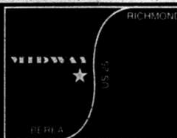

on three serves each by Sarah Mullins, Jessie Hayes and Laura Beth Bell and one by Allison Anderkin.

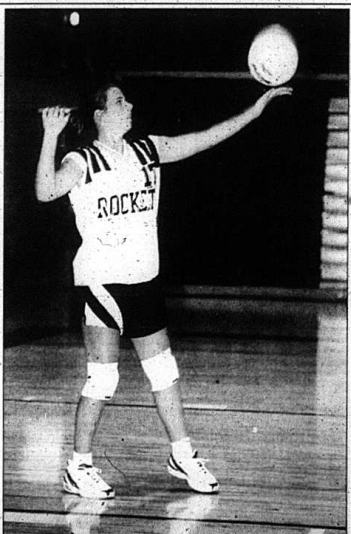
Tuesday night, the girls hosted South Laurel and, in the first match, the Jayvee went down to defeat 15-12 and 15-9.

In the first game, Krystal Parsons put five serves over to lead her team; Ginny Campbell got 3 and Jeni Durham and Jenna Owens 2 each.

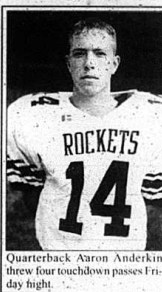
Parsons again led her team in the second game with 4 serves for winners; Kinsye Tucker and Jenna Owens got 2 each and Amanda Rogers 1.

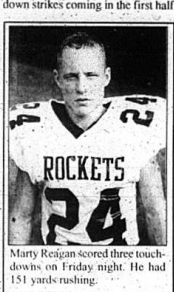

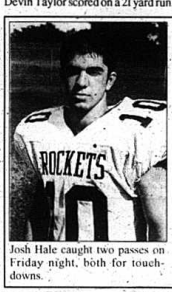

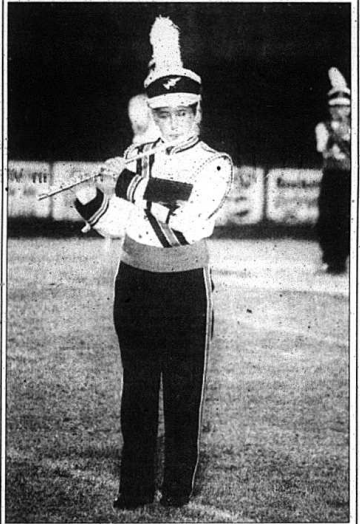
Quarterback Aaron Anderkin threw four touchdowns passes Friday night.



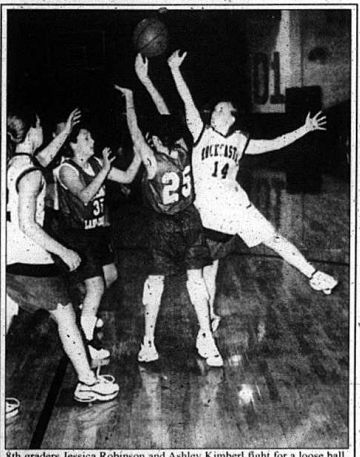

Rockets demolish South Laurel 54-0

The Rockcastle County Rockets used a wide open offensive attack and a smothering defense to win their second game in a row on Friday night.

The Rockets defeated the visiting South Laurel Cardinals 54-0 in a game that saw them rack up 431 yards of total offense and hold South Laurel to a minus 28 yards.

The Rockets struck early and often as they put three touchdowns on the board in the first quarter and two in the second to take a 35-0 lead into the dressing room at halftime.

Quarterback Aaron Anderkin threw only six passes, but he completed all of them, four, for touchdowns.

All total, Anderkin had 186 yards through the air, with all four touchdowns strikes coming in the first half

of play.

Tailback Marty Reagan rushed only eight times, but had 151 yards and scored three touchdowns, two on the ground and one through the air.

His touchdown catch covered 31 yards.

Female Alcoholism Is A Hidden Problem

"My wife has a problem," Sam reported to me in his first counseling session. "But she doesn't see it that way. I think she is an alcoholic, but she says she just likes the taste of liquor. She refuses to get help and no one would ever suspect she has a problem. What can I do?" (All characters are fictitious.)

Female alcoholism is often a hidden danger. A woman who drinks alone at home may be able to hide her alcoholism for years. This fact leads some to believe that alcoholism among women is rare. Nothing could be further from the truth.

Former First Lady Betty Ford went public with her problems with alcohol and other drugs twenty years ago. She recently helped to introduce a new study on "Substance Abuse and The American Woman." Here are some of the conclusions of that study (published in U S News and World Report).

1. One out of five women abuses alcohol or drugs at some point in her life (compared with one out of three men).
2. Almost seventy percent of women in drug treatment programs were sexually abused as children.
3. Female alcoholics "get drunk faster, become addicted sooner and

developed related diseases earlier than men.

4. Women most likely to drink heavily are those with incomes above \$75,000 and those with incomes below \$15,000.

5. Working women are more likely than homemakers to abuse alcohol.

6. Today's teenage girls are fifteen times more likely to begin using illegal drugs than were their mothers.

7. Teenage girls who drink more than five times a month are five times more likely to have sex than those who do not drink.

8. Today's male and female teens are equally likely to smoke, drink and try illicit drugs. There is no gender gap.

9. Only fourteen percent of women who need treatment get it. Sam and his in-laws decided to take the risky step of confronting "Jean about her problem." With the help of a counselor they prepared for this carefully over the course of several months. Finally they were ready.

"It worked," Sam reported one day. "Jean agreed to go into a treatment center. I know this won't solve everything but at least it is a beginning."

There is help available for abusers of alcohol and other drugs. Betty Ford started her own rehabilitation

center and there are many other centers, some of which are nearby. Alcoholics Anonymous provides help right in the community.

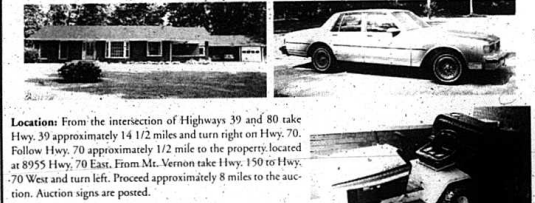

Agricultural News

2000 Quality Loss Program (QLP)

The 2000 Quality Loss Program is authorized by the Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2001. The 2000 QLP compensates farmers who suffered at least a 20 percent loss in the 2000 crop year due to weather related disasters.

Signup began August 13, 2001 and the ending date has not yet been set.

Eligible crops are those produced and harvested in the 2000 crop year and which suffered a minimum of 20 percent quality reduction. Applicants must provide FSA written documentation of the quality of the harvested crop. Examples of acceptable documentation includes: grading receipts from a warehouse or licensed grader, sales receipts providing the grade of the crop; University recognized test results; sales receipts showing disposition to a secondary market due to poor quality.

Supplemental 2000 Oilseeds Program Payments (OP)

The 2001 Agricultural Economic Assistance Act (AEAA), which was

signed by the President on August 13, 2001, authorized the Secretary to use CCC funds to make a supplemental payment to producers of the 2000 crop of oilseeds that previously received a payment under the 2000 Oilseeds Program.

According to AEAA, supplemental payments shall be issued to producers who were determined eligible and received payment under 2000 OP, proportional to the 2000 OP payments received by the producer, issued immediately on receipt of procedure and software, but no later than September 30, 2001.

No further action is required by eligible producers before issuance of the supplemental payments.

Create A Backyard Haven
