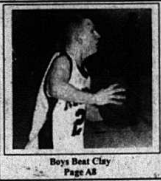

The Rockcastle County Kiwanis Club honored local veterans, firefighters and police officers during a special ceremony at the Rockcastle County Middle School on Sunday.

It was a well attended event and one that was appropriate at this time in the country.

### Mt. Vernon Christmas Parade set for Saturday

After rain cancelled last Saturday's Christmas Parade in Mt. Vernon, the city has rescheduled the parade for this Saturday at 10 a.m.

Line-up for participants in the parade will be from 9 a.m. to 9:50 a.m. at Mt. Vernon Elementary School.

The city has announced that there will be no parking on Main Street until the parade is over.

Children can visit with Santa Claus after the parade in the City Park until 4:15 p.m. on Saturday.

Veterans who have served in just about every war our nation has fought from World War II to Desert Storm took center stage to be honored.

Many local officials had words of praise for the veterans, firefighters and police officers.

About \$4,000 was raised at the event and was split between the county's four fire departments.

Veteran Alfred McNew was among those who spoke.

He talked about the 13 points of the American Flag.

His remarks follow:

## McKinney faces charge of attempted murder

A local state road department employee is in jail this week after he reportedly tried to kill his estranged wife on Saturday.

Mike McKinney, 30, of Brodhead was arrested by state trooper Life Owens around 8 p.m. following the 7:30 p.m. incident.

The incident occurred at a house on Hwy. 150 in the stretch.

Meleissa McKinney told police that when she went to her former home that McKinney fired a handgun through the door.

According to Owens' report, glass from the door injured Ms. McKinney.

Also according to Owens' report, when he arrested McKinney he told him he was under the influence of crack and marijuana.

McKinney is being held under a \$5,000 cash or property bond and charged with attempted murder and driving under the influence.

His next court appearance is December 17th.

## Saylor, Smith, McKinney file for local office

Well-known Rockcastle County businessman Howard Saylor, a Republican, has filed for the office of Rockcastle County Judge-Executive.

Saylor, 50, will run in the May 2002 primary along with all other hopeful candidates.

For 26 years, Saylor owned and operated Saylor's Pharmacy in Mt. Vernon and he has been very active and supportive of Rockcastle County sports programs.

Saylor is the son of former Rockcastle County principal Cleston Saylor and the brother of local pharmacist Johnny Boone Saylor.

May's run for office will be a first for Saylor who issued a written release on Tuesday.

In that statement, Saylor said that if elected, he would work with other leaders in the county to Rockcastle become one of the most progressive areas in the state.

"I am committed to forming an alliance between the county and state governments that will allow the people of Rockcastle to not only dream of improved standards of living, but to make those dreams a reality," he said.

Other candidates to file this week were Rockcastle Sheriff Shirley Smith who is seeking a fourth term.

Smith, also a Republican, has served longer than any other Rockcastle County Sheriff and resides in Wildie with his wife Libby.

Incumbent two term third district magistrate Bill McKinney has also filed for office.

McKinney, a local businessman, is seeking his third term. He is also a Republican.

George Renner also filed his papers for magistrate in district five and Shannon York filed for constable in district two.

Former Rockcastle County Deputy Sheriff Darrell Doan is also a candidate for sheriff.

John H. Kemper Jr., has also filed

for Sheriff in May. Doan and Kemper join Wayne Lear Sr., who filed a couple of weeks ago.

Others filings include Incumbent Fifth District Magistrate Donald Bullock and Albert W. Carpenter who filed for Constable in district five.

Incumbents Rockcastle County Attorney Jeff Burdette, County Clerk Norma Houk, Jailor James Miller, P.V.A. Margaret Offutt, First District Magistrate John Holbrook and Fourth District Magistrate Fred Mullins, Jr. have all made their intentions known for re-election.

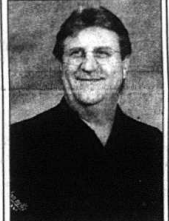
Others filing to date: Roger Rucker for magistrate in district four, William Denny in district two for magistrate, Mark Poynter and Merrill Keith Brown for magistrate in district five.

Delno McClure has filed for re-election as constable in district two.

The only Democrat to file as of this week is John Holbrook, magistrate in district one.

Every county office, including councils and Mayors will be on the ballot, except for the Circuit Clerk's position.

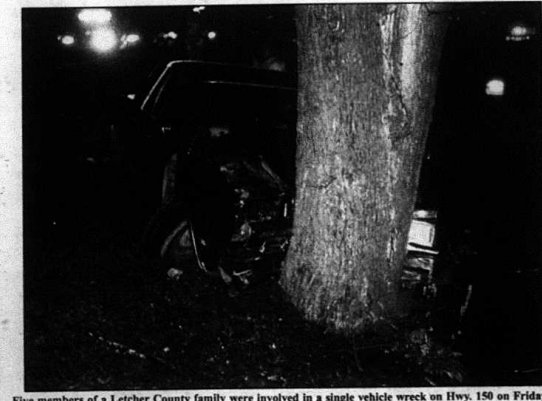

## Our Readers Write

Dear Editor,

Just a word to McKee Post Office and the community. My son will not receive his Christmas gift at Christmas because the McKee Post Office didn't do their job right. And now they're calling me and my husband liars saying they put the package on the back porch, but I found the package by the mailbox which was torn up and destroyed.

My mailbox is a long way from our back porch. We have an extra long driveway living in the country. I know a dog destroyed the package (I don't know who's dog), but the package would've not been damaged if the post office delivery man really put the package where he said he put it. I know my dog or any of my neighbors dogs aren't smart enough to go to the back porch around our home down the driveway, back to the road where the mailbox is and chew a package up about four to five feet from the mailbox. The man at the office said if I did that he would write a letter to the Bradford Editions Company to say that the package was destroyed by a dog. We already know that that's not the point the point is the mailman didn't do his job right and put the package where he said he put the package. McKee Post Office is calling me and my husband liars straight out. Excuse me I just remember he also tried blaming this one on the UPS and trying to get out of what they did wrong, just to pass the blame on someone else. the Mt. Vernon Signal has supported the JROTC program here in Rockcastle County 110% since we first started the program in 1995. Any disgruntled parent who says different, obviously hasn't been paying attention.

Our Army headquarters at Fort Knox constantly monitors our program. They do this by conducting visits from Ft. Knox and the Senior ROTC program out of Eastern Kentucky University. One of the first items we show them are our scrapbooks, mainly consisting of articles printed in the Signal. Every single time they visit, they express amazement at the sheer volume of the coverage given by our local paper. As Rick correctly stated in his article last week, the Signal has featured JROTC on the front page and taken up entire pages to cover several events he published. Many times he has reserved space, or waited till the last possible minute, for us to get articles to him. Frankly, my wife Jenny and I both consider him to be not only the best friend our program has, but also a personal friend.

The Rockcastle school system also would have a difficult time supporting JROTC or any other organization more than they already do.

Again the military personnel who monitor our program indicate during their visits that we are receiving much greater support from our community and school administration than any other program they visit. For instance, allocating \$13,000 to buy precision air rifles so our team members will be able to compete for college scholarships. By the way, Johnathan Noe is in fact our first Rifle Team member to receive a \$2,000 scholarship to shoot for

Morehead State University, thanks to the support of the Rockcastle County School Board. They also are impressed with the fact that our school system supported my wife and I taking 18 students out west on a 19-day educational field trip (come by and I'll show anyone the fantastic coverage we received from the Signal). In fact, they have encouraged and supported another similar trip we're taking this coming summer. Personally, I don't see how anyone could get more support than that.

Art Linkletter used to host a program on TV called "Kids say the Darndest Things." Most of the comments featured were honest, funny and sometimes embarrassing. As I

have found out in the last six and a half years, parents can also say the darndest things. The parent who complained to Mrs. Anderkin and my school principal did not and never will speak for myself, my wife or the JROTC program. We have always felt privileged by our position in this county and consider ourselves lucky to have found a home here in Rockcastle County.

### County Committee Election Results

Congratulations to Clarence Raymond Brown, the newly elected Rockcastle County Committee Member.

Of the 226 ballots returned to the county office to be counted on December 6, 2001; Clarence Raymond Brown received 153 votes, Lloyd Cain received 42 votes; Robert Crawford received 18 votes and Tina Hasty received 13 votes.

Clarence Raymond Brown will serve as the Rockcastle County FSA (COC) Member for three years beginning January 1, 2002.

### No P&CP Signup Ending For TLAP00

During October 2000, FSA provided payments through the Tobacco Loss Assistance Program 2000 (TLAP00) to quota holders and producers to help them defray income losses in the 2000 crop year because of quota reductions. One of the eligibility requirements for TLAP00 was that a farm must have received Planted and Considered (P&CP) credit for the 2000 crop year. This statute has been amended to provide that TLAP00 payments may now be made to person(s) who did not have

P&CP credit during the 2000 crop year.

Eligibility requirements include:

- Any person who owned, operated or produced eligible tobacco on a farm for which a quota reduction from the 1999 crop year to the 2000 crop year occurred.

Any farm which was not approved for a payment during the initial TLAP00 signup because there was no P&CP.

Eligible types of tobacco includes burley, type 31; flue-cured, types 11-14; dark fire-cured, type 21 and cigar binder type of 54-55.

Payments will be based on FY2000 information with rate the

same as those in the initial TLAP00 signup. All eligible persons or entities must agree on the division of payments before the application form, CCC-950, can be approved.

REMEMBER: The application signup period ENDS December 14, 2001. Late filed applications will not be approved.

### Marketing Cards

Rockcastle County producers who have received marketing cards are reminded to carefully check their card for complete and accurate information. Please compare the farm

number, warehouse number and pounds listed on the card to the information provided on the notification letter mailed with the card. If you find an error return the card immediately to the office for correction(s).

Remember: You are responsible for the information listed on the card. When you have finished your year sales of tobacco please return the marketing cards to the FSA office as soon as possible.

### Stolen Tobacco

Producers are reminded according to regulations stated in 107B paragraph 941 pertaining to stolen tobacco a police report must be filed within 15 days of the theft and be submitted to the County FSA Office. Filing the police report according to regulations will possibly avoid a penalty and/or a reduction of the next year's quota.

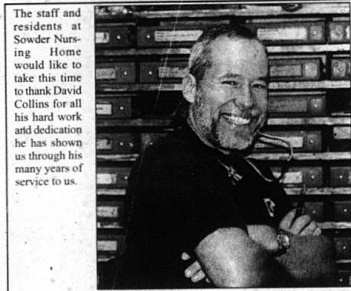
### Farm Changes

Producers who have purchased or sold land need to contact the FSA office for proper reconstitution of farms. Remember to bring your deed and/or to notify the new owner too. Also notify this office of any and/or all address changes.

## Holiday Entertaining

Among the many pleasures of the holidays are the foods and festivities of the season. From the traditional to the exotic, you can celebrate and serve healthier foods. Whether small groups or large, whether casual or more formal, the successful party is a harmonious blend of organization and flair with everyone thoroughly enjoying the occasion—including you. The party tips below will set you on your way to successful entertaining all through the year.

**Begin Planning Early:** Advance planning is the key to a successful party. Your guests are more likely to be available and there is more time for shopping, cooking ahead and freezing, readying your house and all the other aspects of entertaining.

**Be Specific:** Write or phone each guest with the important details, such as the date, time, place (including directions), type of party or occasion and sometimes, what to wear.

**Select the Menu Carefully:** Your time and budget, number of guests, type of party or occasion, guests' food and beverage preferences, ages of guests, season of the year, the oven, freezer and refrigerator space and supplies available are all considerations when planning the menu.

**Food, Recipes, and Garnishes Should Complement Each Other:** After you have selected the menu, picture it in your mind on a plate. Does it look attractive? Is it

appropriate for the holiday season? Does your menu offer some healthy alternatives?

**Pamper Your Budget:** You don't have to sacrifice quality, quantity and appearance when you cut costs. Serve punch instead of alcohol or colas; have brunch or lunch instead of a dinner party; serve hors d'oeuvres instead of a full course meal; incorporate grocery specials and seasonal foods into your menu; and borrow rather than rent extra glassware, flatware, serving pieces, tables and chairs.

**Use a Checklist:** Realistically make a list of how much time you need to prepare for your party. Note which foods can be made ahead and frozen or refrigerated. The week of the dinner party, make a day-by-day agenda. The day of the party, make an hour-by-hour schedule.

**Take Inventory:** Check your supply of table linens, serving pieces, flatware, glassware and other necessary items to be sure they are adequate and clean.

**Arrange for Help if Necessary:** Appraise the work to be done. If you cannot gracefully handle everything alone, hire an experienced person or line up a family member or friend to assist you. Passing canapés, pouring punch, clearing tables, serving coffee or cleaning up can be problem spots for the host trying to cope alone.

Relax and enjoy your own party. If you are having fun, your guests will, too!

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## Landscaping for seasonal decorations

As your neighbors flock to stores or sales yards for greenery and decorations, why not use items from your own landscape? There are so many plants that bear lovely berries or colorful foliage. You probably have some of them in your yard. Or you may want to plant at this time for future decorations.

Berry decorations could come from hollies and winterberries (leafless holly), beautyberry, nandina domestica, pyracantha, bayberry, wax myrtle, sea buckthorn, indian Hawthorn, sumac, or bitternut.

Evergreen boughs can be harvested from a few of the pines and junipers and so forth. Hemlock boughs with small cones attached are especially cute. The branches of Balsam and Fraser firs perhaps have the best aroma of all. Ivy, honeysuckle, photinia, laurel branches, and some of the euonymus species may not be traditional, but are attractively used as indoor decorations.

Berry decorations are wonderful for winter bouquets. Combined with a few bare branches, maybe a colored red dogwood or blueberry stem, perhaps a perennial seed head such as leasel or goldenrod. Fern fronds are also used indoors in some lovely arrangements.

Vines can be used in many ways indoors. The traditional grapevine

with greenery and green or seeds woven carefully into it is a perfect example of using landscape items indoors for seasonal decorations.

We often landscape to attract birds, bees, butterflies and so forth. Or to screen certain areas. Or plant lovely specimen trees in our yards. This year consider some plantings in your yard which would be attractive anytime—but especially useful for branches and berries to decorate the inside of your home.

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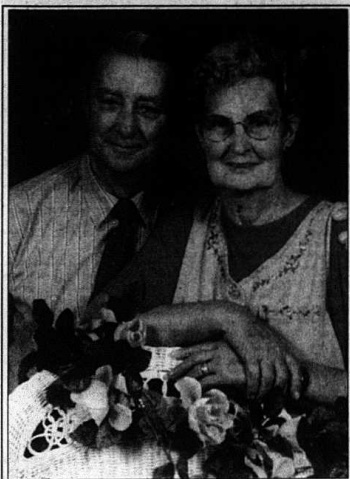

executive about his product's promotional campaigns and heard from two Kentuckians who described how OxyContin abuse has devastated their communities.

"I have never seen anything in my lifetime in law enforcement that has taken over a community so fast and has been so devastating," former Hazard police chief Rod Maggard told the committee.

Drug Enforcement Agency Director Asa Hutchinson told the committee that the pharmaceutical company aggressively courted doctors who were prescribing large amounts of pain medication and urged them to begin selling OxyContin.

The Stamford, Connecticut, company gave some doctors free trips and offered vouchers for free medicine to encourage them to prescribe the drug. Approved by the Food and Drug Administration in December 1995, OxyContin sales soared past \$1 billion during 2000.

"I don't believe we've ever seen as aggressive a marketing campaign for a Schedule II narcotic as we've

seen for OxyContin," Hutchinson said.

Schedule II drugs have legitimate medical uses, but have the highest potential for abuse and addiction.

The company said the drug was an "ideal choice" to treat moderate-to-severe chronic pain - everything from cancer to arthritis and lower-back pain.

Critics concede the drug has helped ease the pain of severely ill patients. But they say the drug has hooked thousands of Americans and created an epidemic from Appalachia to New England.

Donnie Coats, a Hazard minister whose son is a recovering OxyContin addict, told the committee about the pain the drug has inflicted on his family. He talked about funerals he's attended for OxyContin victims.

"OxyContin's killing folks and it's killing them right now," he said. "They're 'good people (but) they're trapped."

OxyContin is suspected of playing a role in 296 overdose deaths over a 19-month period, officials said.

Paul Goldenheim, a Purdue Pharma vice president, said his company is spending \$100 million to combat drug abuse and illegal diversions.

Purdue Pharma also has hundreds of scientists working to develop an abuse-resistant form of OxyContin.

"This is the highest priority of our company. We want this problem solved," he said.

But U.S. Rep. Hal Rogers, said that, in some cases, the company was aware its drug was being overprescribed, but failed to confront the doctors.

"People are dying and your company paid no nothing," Rogers said, his voice rising sharply. Goldenheim told Rogers it isn't Purdue Pharma's job to intervene, saying, "We can't stop them from prescribing our product."

"We can," Rogers shot back. Earlier, Rep. Jose Serrano, R-New York, warned that OxyContin could eventually be banned, if the company doesn't swiftly respond.

But U.S. Rep. Frank Wolf, R-Virginia, promised that the product will remain available for those who truly need it. Wolf said the FDA may have erred by allowing OxyContin to be prescribed for moderate pain.

The General Accounting Office will do the study for Congress. No completion date has been set. Meanwhile, federal drug agents are struggling to crack down on its misuse.

The Lady Rocket Jayvees have a perfect 3-0 record with wins over McCreary Central, Jackson County and Harlan.

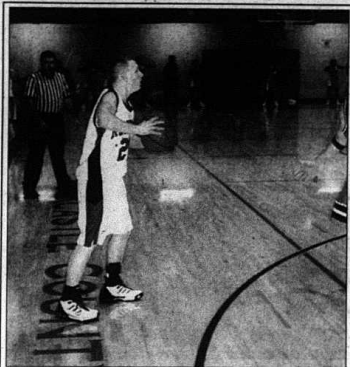

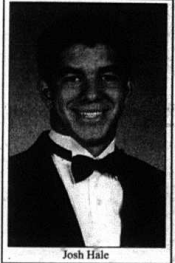
# Hale first to be selected as Heisman finalist
