Besides the new roofs, the county has also replaced the win-dows in the classroom building, painted the interior there and are in the process of putting up new doors in that facility. Daniel Boone was never able to secure the proper funding to renovate the property in a com-munity center and last year the

"In a perfect world we would go in there and spend whatever it took to fix the structure back to its original state, but we don't have those funds at the current time." Carlofits said. Once the gymnasium is fin-ished it will also be turned over to

The city will be able to use the gym for whatever need arises, such as fund raisers for the fire department and community

events," he said.

The actual school structure will be kept in a state of preservation until some other funding comes along, or until someone with money takes an interest in it, according to Carloftis.

# Local man killed in Friday wreck

Last Friday Ronald K. Rash, 50, of Mt. Vernon died in a single car, wreck on U.S. 25, four miles south of Mt. Vernon.

According to Kentucky State
Police, Rash was driving a 1994
Toyota pick-up north on U.S. 25
when his vehicle dropped off the
right shoulder of the roadway.
State Trooper Coby Smith said

State Trooper Coby Smith said hata Rash apparently overcor-rected, causing him to lose con-trol of his vehicle which crossed both lanes of travel, striking the earth embankment on the southbound shoulder and then overtured onto lis top. Rockcastle Gounty EMS trans-

ported Ronald K. Rash to the Rockcastle County Hospital where he later died from the inju-Smith reported that seath

accident.

Rash was the seventh person to lose his life on Rockasste County roadways in 2002.

Of the seven people to die, Rash and 15-year-old Aaron debynter are the only local people to lose their lives.



Then they used two different sizes of diamond polishing paste to create a mirrored aufface. These mirrors are sent back to Starshine headquaters, where they are placed on the surface of a satellite.

The satellite is scheduled for launch in January 2003. After launch, observers all over the world will be able to track the satellite based on the reflection of sunlight off its mirrors. This reflection will enable discription to determine the benefit of



The Supreme Court has strengthened the hard line against drugs by recently affirming rules that allow excetions of families, from public housing when family members of their guests are involved in illegal drug activity. Congress had already enacted procedures to allow these types of evictions, however the laws had been phalletigged, which ultimately led the case to the Supreme Court. The Court found that these aggressive eviction policies were reasonable, and upheld the laws.

# Place of entertainment must have permit

mits, according to County Automote Heff Burdette. KRS 231,008 state that, "No place of entertainment shall be operated outside the corporate limits of a city unless its owney or manager has a permit, issued to them by the Cotary Dadge/Executive in the county, in which the place of entertainment is located, granting to him the privilege to operate the place of entertainment in that county.

This includes, but is not limited to, pool/billiards, music, dancing, pinball or even exercise and weightlifting, according to the Country Attorney's office. It appears this is beginning to occur and busi-ness owners should now make sure their permits are up to date. Burdette said.

The permitting process is relatively simple and requires the completion of an application at the County Clerk's office, an investiga-County Clerk's office, an investiga-tion of the applicant's background, and a hearing before the County Judge who ultimately decides to grant or deny the permit. Anyone who desires to oppose the granting of a permit must do so in writing to the County Judge, and then must ap-pear at the hearing to oppose it in

pear at the hearing to oppose it in person.

The County Judge must exercise his reasonable discretion, taking into consideration all relevant facts and evidence which reasonably relate to the issuing of the permit, bearing in mind that the public interiest must be carefully heeighed in the process, According to opinions of the Attorney General, state law plainly states that no permit shall be issued to a person who is not of a good morial character, or who will not, in the judgement of the court, obey the law of the state in carrying on the bisiness. Finally, the County Judge shall fix reasonable house of operation for places of entertainment throughout the county here.




