

Boil water advisory issued for part of city

Water Superintendent Dennis McClure said that a sample taken from an outside faucet at one of the homes in the area, tested positive for the E, Coll virus.

The affected streets include Shirley, Ford, Liberty, Floyd, Joyce and Tee Street. All of the streets are in the general trace where much flood-ing has occurred in the past several months.

E. Coli is a bacteria normally found in human gastrointestinal tract and existed as munerous strains.
