

Mission team from Tennessee works at Christ's Outreach

When 19 youth from Covington,
Tennessee are saked what they did
on their summer vacation, they will
have some pretty interesting stories
to share. This particular group spent
June 9-14 doing work as part of a
Mission team at Christ's Outreach for
the Blind, a nonprofit, Christianbased camp that is being established
for the blind and disabled in Mt.
Vernon. Instead of lounging in the for the blind and disabled in Mt. Vernon. Instead of lounging in the sun, these young volunteers, grades 7-12 and six adult leaders from the First Presbyterian Church spent a week weeding, mulching, raking dirt, moving rocks, digging a hole for a pond, moving a fence, staining a bridge and cleaning the Outreach Center.

Mike and Lori Gates, Directors of Christ Gutreach, were as involved as the youth as they helped plan and coordinate the work on a building project that has been ongoing for two years. Mike admits that when he was blinded in a hunting accident in 1989, he had a death wish for a time. Then, he says, "God spoke to me and told me that I could help others like myst's Outreach now ence passes 800 acres of Rockcastle wil-derness. Wood fences line the roal leading to a metal building that looses set staff apartments, an invocate set and the set of the pendent living skills. "Our activities are based on everything that every-body tells the bind or disabled that they can't do," Gates says. An out-door classroom, constructed with a grant awarded by PRIDE will also be used to teach campers about their environment.

Ricky Lyle, Youth Minister said, "Mike has been working with a chainsaw just like the others. It is hard for the students to refuse to do something." Mike and Lori also joined the group every morning so joined the group every morning the

We were having problems with unity. There was shock for a lot of them, but when Mike shared his intention for the camp, it dawned on the group that they were part of something meaningful, getting-this camp ready. The first night, Mike invited them back. They (the youth) can help children, who come here and look at the pond and know that they helped do that. This is something that lasts."

That was the challenge that her husband had given

the mission team before they left, she said, "to see where or in what situa-tion did they see Christ during the week." Despite the hard labor, Mike's invitation to come back to work at the camp when it is finished was well received by the youth. "Several of the youth want to come back next sum-mer and particularly when the chil-aging and exciting that they want to come back. It has obviously had a positive impact."

The last night of devotions, the tenagers shared their written testi-

teenagers shared their written testi-monies of how the week had changed their lives. Christy-Barton said, "Working for others, serving God

through other people really showed me how we can be disciples and servants of Christ in our lives by helping other people that fruly need our help." Another youth, Lain Peeler, shared, "Itash sheped me realize I can make a difference and without little people like me, the world can't ever be improved. R has changed my heart so that I want to do mission work. I want to help everyone I can and I want to serve God in everything I do." The unity problems that surfaced within the team the first day seemed-nonexistent as Jay Freeland shared, "I saw that a small group of determined youth could accomplish a lot when trying their best together. I also felt a lot of unity within the people I

worked with and we all grew closer to each other and God."

The entire week was encapsulated in a statement by the Youth Minister, "Mission work always reminds me that a lot in the church might think physical work is not evangelizing, It will eventually speak to the community here and to the children who come here and also to us. This helpsus to identify what Jesus meant by service, that He did not come to be served, but to serve. We are actually

living out the gospel, putting sweat and effort behind it."



It would be a lose-lose situation for both NASCAR and the spensor. There's just too much money, prestige, and bragging rights for it to happen.





"What Saith the Scriptures"

The past few weeks we have been discussing the importance of taking ings in context. Let's look at another example.

things in context. Let's look at another example. The idea and the word "pastor" is greatly misunderstood by many today. The general theory is that "the pastor" is the local preacher at a church, who can be a young man, a single man, a married man without children, or a married man with young children. But the way the word is used in the scriptures it refers to the office of a bishop or elder. In Acts 20.116.28 we read, "And from Mielson be sent on to phense, and called the effects of the church. ... Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the thoty flows that made you <u>overseers, to feed the church of God, which the hath purchased with his own blood." [see also I Pet. 51-13]. Notice Paul is talking to the elders. They are overseers or bishops. They "feed" or pastor the flock of God. Thus the pastors are the bishops who are the elders. Now there are qualifications for those who serve in this capacity, as we read in ITim 3.1-7 and in Tit. 1.5-9. A pastor or bishop or elder among other things is to be married, having children, having children old enough to be believers. And one more quick point, there are to a plurality or elders or pastors, or bishops in a local church, not just ONE. So we can see how important context is in determining what is right.




