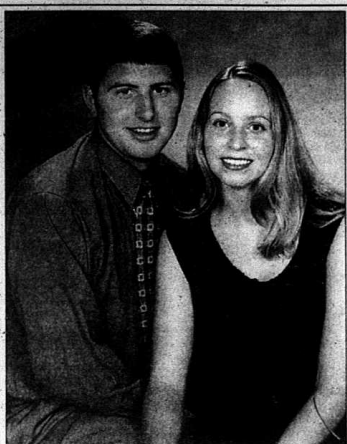

# Mission team from Tennessee works at Christ's Outreach

When 19 youth from Covington, Tennessee are asked what they did on their summer vacation, they will have some pretty interesting stories to share. This particular group spent June 9-14 doing work as part of a Mission team at Christ's Outreach for the Blind, a nonprofit, Christian-based camp that is being established for the blind and disabled in Mt. Vernon. Instead of lounging in the sun, these young volunteers, grades 7-12 and six adult leaders from the First Presbyterian Church spent a week weeding, mucking, raking dirt, moving rocks, digging a hole for a pond, moving a fence, staining a bridge and cleaning the Outreach Center.

Mike and Lori Gates, Directors of Christ Outreach, were as involved as the youth as they helped plan and coordinate the work on a building project that has been ongoing for two years. Mike admits that when he was blinded in a hunting accident in 1989, he had a death wish for a time. Then, he says, "God spoke to me and told me that I could help others like myself." Christ's Outreach now encompasses 800 acres of Rockcastle wilderness. Wood fences line the road leading to a metal building that houses two staff apartments, an indoor archery range, a hydrotherapy room, steam room, weight room and bathrooms. Another building, the Outreach Center or Lodge, is nearly completed. It has 10 bedrooms, 12 bathrooms, a cafeteria, a commercial kitchen, an office, a laundry room and a maintenance storage area. When the facility officially opens, it will accommodate 600 campers per year. Mike estimates that it will cost each participant only \$35 to attend. Camping activities will include horseback riding, hunting, fishing, swimming, mountain climbing, hiking, rappelling, gardening and inde-

pendent living skills. "Our activities are based on everything that everybody tells the blind or disabled that they can't do," Gates says. An outdoor classroom, constructed with a grant awarded by FRIDE will also be used to teach campers about their environment.

The mission team was impressed with Mike's decision and determination to see the building project go forward. Ricky Lyle, Youth Minister said, "Mike has been working with a chainsaw just like the others. It is hard for the students to refuse to do something." Mike and Lori also joined the group every morning and evening for devotions. Noting the effect on the young people whose work was being supervised by a visually impaired person, Ricky stated, "The change in the team happened with the first devotions. We were having problems with unity. There was shock for a lot of them, but when Mike shared his intention for the camp, it dawned on the group that they were part of something meaningful, getting this camp ready. The first night, Mike invited them back. They (the youth) can help children who come here and look at the pond and know that they helped to do that. This is something that lasts."

Cile Fullerton, the Pastor's wife, also expressed a positive impression of Mike and Lori and the Christ's Outreach for the Blind, saying, "The vision is impressive, the fact that Mike and Lori are so obedient to the Holy Spirit's prompting to provide a facility that is so nice for the visually impaired. It is a visual feast and I can only assume, for the visually impaired who rely on their senses, it will be an emotional feast to hear the birds and smell the fragrances... God reveals Himself in different ways and in nature in particular." That was the challenge that her husband had given

the mission team before they left, she said, "to see where or in what situation did they see Christ during the week." Despite the hard labor, Mike's invitation to come back to work at the camp when it is finished was well received by the youth. "Several of the youth want to come back next summer and particularly when the children or campers are here. It is encouraging and exciting that they want to come back. It has obviously had a positive impact."

The last night of devotions, the teenagers shared their written testimonies of how the week had changed their lives. Christy Barton said, "Working for others, serving God

through other people really showed me how we can be disciples and servants of Christ in our lives by helping other people that truly need our help." Another youth, Lain Peeler, shared, "It has helped me realize I can make a difference and without little people like me, the world can't ever be improved. It has changed my heart so that I want to do mission work. I want to help everyone I can and I want to serve God in everything I do." The unity problems that surfaced within the team the first day seemed nonexistent as Jay Freeland shared, "I saw that a small group of determined youth could accomplish a lot when trying their best together. I also felt a lot of unity within the people I

worked with and we all grew closer to each other and God."

The entire week was encapsulated in a statement by the Youth Minister, "Mission work always reminds me that a lot in the church might think physical work is not evangelizing. It will eventually speak to the community here and to the children who come here and also to us. This helps us to identify what Jesus meant by service, that He did not come to be served, but to serve. We are actually

living out the gospel, putting sweat and effort behind it."

Construction work will continue at Christ's Outreach for the Blind as Mission Teams from Stanton, Kentucky and Kalamazoo, Michigan visit in the month of June. Mike and his wife, Lori, are members of the First Baptist Church in Mt. Vernon. If you have any questions about this camp for the blind and disabled, please call Mike Gates at 1-888-254-6319.

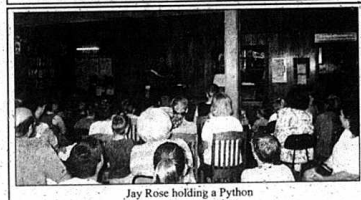

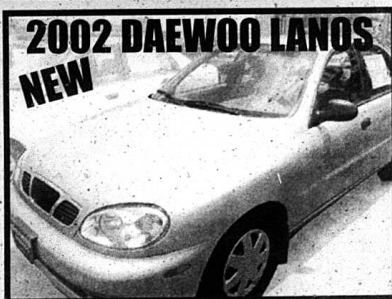

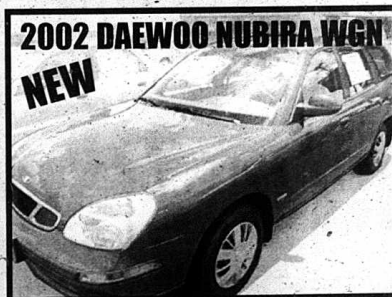

**Rudd wins at Nadeau's expense**  
 SONOMA, Calif. - The break turned around for Ricky Rudd, driver of the No. 28 Havoline Ford Sunday, but not for Jerry Nadeau of Richard Petty's No. 44.

In a strange finish to the Dodge Save Mart 350 road course race at Infineon Raceway, Rudd took the lead with less than three laps to go when leader Jerry Nadeau's Dodge had a rear-end gear break.

Rudd had been the victim of three bad breaks over the past two months, a crash at Richmond, a loose wheel at Dover and a flat tire at Pocono. But this time it was Nadeau that was bitten.

Rudd was five seconds behind the No. 44 Dodge as the final laps counted off.

"I hated to win it this way with bad luck for somebody else, but we'll take it. We may have been owed something, but not at Jerry Nadeau's expense, or the Petty's."

"We were not going to catch him."

Nadeau, who had a one-race fill-in for Steve Grissom was trying for his first victory since Atlanta in November 2000. Petty Enterprises haven't won since 1999.

"I tell you, it always happens to me," said a dejected Nadeau.

Polesitter, Tony Stewart finished second: Terry Labonte, Kurt Busch, and Jeff Green rounded out the top-five.

NASCAR will continue to fine teams.  
 Do you think NASCAR should disqualify a winning driver if his car is found to be in violation of the sanctioning body's rules?

"There are people that believe NASCAR should disqualify or take away a driver's win if he or his team is in serious violation of those rules. From my standpoint, I only see minor violations occurring because of the inspection process all cars go through before the race. A car can go through up to seven different inspections, plus occasional random car checks in their stalls.

I don't think we'll ever see another Winston Cup winner outright disqualified. I believe NASCAR will

continue to levy fines because of sponsor involvement."

The cost to a primary sponsorship on a major team is upwards of \$10 million. On six or seven of the top teams, it skyrockets to \$15 million. NASCAR might be the 275-pound gorilla that can sit anywhere it pleases, but they aren't going to mess around with a Fortune 500 company by disqualifying their winning car.

No sir, both NASCAR and the teams need the money too badly. The big boys at NASCAR know which side of their bread the jelly is on.

I don't think Mike Helton, their top dog, really wants to strip anyone of a win or points, because of the uproar it would cause. He knows there are only so many American companies right now that can shell out \$10-15 million to sponsor a race car.

The sport of stock car racing needs those big corporate dollars. Without the big bucks, NASCAR would wither faster than a watermelon on the vine on a hot scorching July day. It would be a lose-lose situation for both NASCAR and the sponsor. There's just too much money, prestige, and bragging rights for it to happen.

**How not to treat a friend**

Gene Tapia has been my racing hero and friend since 1967. But I sure didn't show any loyalty to him back in 1996.

I've always had a great deal of trouble with foot and mouth disease. When I was a boy growing up, I had a tendency to say and do things that were better left alone.

Until I was about 12 years old, my grandmother lived with us. Growing up in rural Lowndes County, Alabama in the late 1800s, before women were liberated, she hid her snuff-dipping habit from most outsiders. One day our local Baptist preacher came to visit, Grandma Jackson, who was sitting in her rocker in the living room, had a dash for the bathroom faster than any NFL tailback ever went into the end zone.

After the preacher shook hands with everyone, we all sat down. "Here is Miz Jackson," asked the reverend.

"Oh she is in the bathroom washing her teeth," replied my mother. "She'll be out shortly, she knows you're here."

That's her brushing them good to get all that Garrett snuff out," I added. Now you see what I'm talking about.

Racing fans that remember Richard Petty's racing days might recall Gene Tapia. He was one of the old time racers who helped get NASCAR

off the table and into corporate boardrooms, and then quit, because he didn't like the way Bill France Sr. handled the drivers.

Gene raced with Richard's dad, Lee Petty, the Flock brothers, Fireball Roberts, Curtis Turner, Jimmy Thompson, Jim Paschal, and Frank Mundy. His dad was Buck Baker, but Gene's "Sousher," "The Wild Indian," of Dawsonville, Georgia, was his favorite driver.

I met Gene in the pits at Mobile International Speedway. I was the proud owner of the No. 10-4, a supermodified, that ran about four seconds slower around the half-mile asphalt track than Gene's No. 327.

In racing language, my 10-4 was a pile of junk that the other drivers tried to avoid as much as possible when it was on the track. Red Farmer, whom we raced against occasionally, called it "hot pissant" because it had a way of wandering all over the track. Gene was "King of The Supermodifieds" at the time. He had won several national and world titles, and was at the top of the southeast-ern racing ladder.

It was one of those hot, muggy July nights with the heat index in the high 90's that are common along the Gulf coast. What made it even worse was the beer we had consumed on the way to the track. The combination of Budweiser, heat, a broken fuel line, and an ill-handling race car, made it a night hard to forget.

I guess the Lord knew I needed some relief.

"Son, what seems to be your problem?" the man asked, as I lay on my back in the grease and racing fuel under the car trying to tie a fire hammer bolt into the engine head.

I looked up and saw that the man standing next to my car was in his early 40s and very muscular. He wore a starched gray uniform, and had the look of someone with a larger-than-life type personality.

It was Gene Tapia.

Here we were a struggling team with a pile of junk, that had never finished higher than fourth in a race and the only number one driver was offering us help.

I was asked that he would even stop to talk, let alone assist us.

I don't remember what advice or racing parts Gene gave us that night, but what I do remember was his mannerism and personality. He treated a fourth class, race owner in a first class manner.

Gene went on to win back-to-back World 300s in 1967 and '68. I went on to become a manager and supervisor for T.G. & Y Stores. I quit and went to work for myself in 1978. Two years later, Gene hung up his racing helmet.

It wasn't until I moved back to Mobile, Alabama and began writing stock car racing columns for the Mobile Register that our paths crossed again. I saw him and his wife Genezine at several racing events where he was usually the featured speaker or host.

The telephone in my office rang one September day in 1997: It was Suzanne Harvey, wife of Sandy Harvick, who crew chief on the No. 62 Barnett Racing late model.

"Gerald, I need your help."

"O.K. Suzanne, what is it?" "I need you to make a press kit for Gene Tapia. We think he is eligible for induction into the Alabama Racing Pioneers Hall of Fame in Talladega."

"Well, sure Suzanne. Give me a few days. I'm pretty busy right now."

I never found the time to make that press kit. But Gene Tapia didn't need my help or a press kit.

The last week of November 1999, I received another call. This time it was from John Cameron, Sports Editor of the Mobile Register.

"Gerald, we want you to go to Talladega, December 9. One of our local drivers, Gene Tapia is being inducted into the Hall of Fame that night."

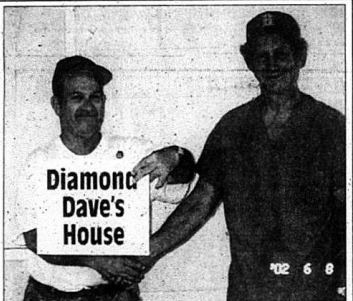

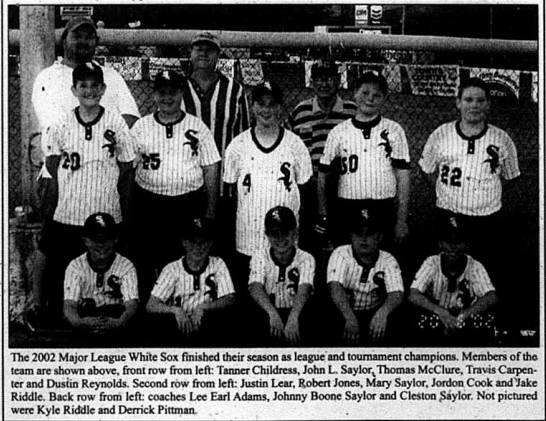

I think it would have been better if I could have had some time without the children. It seems as if we have always been parents, first and a couple, second."

Vera was right. A newly married couple needs time to get to know each other. This takes years, not months. Developing the closeness that will keep a marriage strong through the tough times does not happen quickly.

Sam and Diane had a similar problem. "We were already engaged when Diane got pregnant," Sam told me, "so we just moved up the wedding date. We had our first child after being married only five months. I wish we had waited."

Sam and Diane present a strong argument for sexual abstinence be-

fore marriage. Luckily they were already in love and engaged, but in any case "having to get married" because of pregnancy is not a good way to begin a married life together. This means that the baby will arrive shortly and the couple will have precious little time to build their own relationship. Cementing their bond as a couple takes a backseat to caring for a child.

Cliff and Myrtle illustrate a different scenario. "We talked about it before marriage and knew we didn't want to have children for a while," Myrtle explains. "We decided not to have sex before we got married, and, even afterward, we planned carefully to make sure that pregnancy would not happen."

"This gave us a chance to get to know each other," Cliff continued. "We were both in school but we still had time to do things together. Weekends were our time to do whatever we wanted. One summer we drove clear across the country, just because we knew we would like that. We had a life together before we ever had children. I would recommend that to any young couple starting out."

After graduation from college and working for a few years, Cliff and Myrtle decided it was time to start a family. That took awhile, but finally

their first child was born. "We had been married six years before we had children," Cliff said. "Those first six months of parenthood were hard on our relationship. The baby seemed to need constant attention, and both of us felt drained. I can't imagine going through that after having been married only six months."

Cliff reported that they had to endure some pressure from family when they produced no children after the first three years of marriage. Both sets of in-laws were anxious to be grandparents and made some not

so subtle hints about the matter. Friends would kid them about "not knowing what to do," and Myrtle's aunt even suggested they were being selfish. "It wasn't always fun," Cliff reported, "but we didn't let the pressure get to us. I am glad now we waited."

Children are an incredible blessing. They also create a considerable amount of stress in a relationship. Careful planning can give a couple time to build a strong marriage before the stress of child-rearing comes along.

She planted several perennials—black eyed susans, candy tuft,

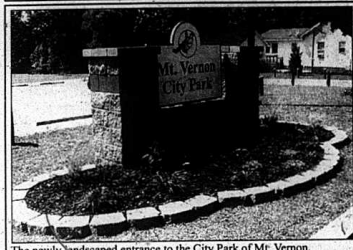

### What Saith the Scriptures?

The past few weeks we have been discussing the importance of taking things in context. Let's look at another example.

The idea and the word "pastor" is greatly misunderstood by many today. The general theory is that "the pastor" is the local preacher at a church, who can be a young man, a single man, a married man without children, or a married man with young children. But the way the word is used in the scriptures it refers to the office of a bishop or elder. In Acts 20:11-28 we read, "And from Miletus he sent to Ephesus, and called the elders of the church. . . . Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood." [see also I Pet. 5:1-3]

Notice Paul is talking to the elders. They are overseers or bishops. They "feed" or pastor the flock of God. Thus the pastors are the bishops who are the elders. Now there are qualifications for those who serve in this capacity, as we read in I Tim. 3:1-7 and in Tit. 1:5-9. A pastor or bishop or elder among other things is to be married, having children, having children old enough to be believers. And one more quick point, there are a plurality of elders or pastors, or bishops in a local church, not just ONE. So we can see how important context is in determining what is right.

The Mountain Association of FSA Districts

**Burley Tobacco Leasing**  
Coming to An End  
Producers may lease burley tobacco quota effectively immediately through July 1st. Producers may list quota for lease on the bulletin board space by way of contacting the county office either in person or by telephone.

Producers with leases on file in the county office are reminded all signatories must be obtained by July 1st for the lease to be approved.  
**Warehouse Designation**  
As a condition of price support

beginning with the 2001 crop year for tobacco, producers were required to inform FSA of the warehouse where they would market tobacco. This is acquired by completing the form FSA 808, Warehouse Designation, to indicate where the tobacco will be sold.

Initial designation will end August 1, 2003. Producers are encouraged to complete this form after all leases and transfers have been updated. After the initial designation period ends producers will be limited to designate for

the farm to any one day during the following regular redesignation periods:

- September 30-October 4, 2002, with card effective October 14, 2002.
  - October 28-November 1, 2002, with card effective November 11, 2002.
  - December 02-December 06, 2002, with card effective December 16, 2002.
  - December 27-January 3, 2003, with card effective January 13, 2003.
- The warehouse will be indicated with a number on the market card. Therefore, if you decide to market at a warehouse other than the one specified on the card, you must return that card to the FSA office in specific time periods to request another marketing card.

FSA has a listing for public notice of warehouses, receiving stations and dealers posted on the bulletin board in the county office available through March 31, 2003.

**Tobacco Spot Checks**  
Producers who have reported unmarketed tobacco stored on the farms are subject for random spot checks. Spot checks are performed by local FSA personnel to verify the amount of tobacco reported. These spot checks will be carried out in the next few months. If you have moved tobacco from where you first reported the storage, please contact FSA to report the new location.

**Crop Reports A Must!!**

Producers with crops such as tobacco, corn, soybeans, hay, pasture, etc. may report the planted acres to the FSA office now through July 15, 2002.

All farms with an effective quota greater than zero (0) must file a FSA 578, Report of Crop Acreage, no later than July 1st. Reports filed after the deadline will be subject to a late file fee. Marketing cards will NOT be issued without a crop report on file.

Farms with an effective quota will not plant or lease quota away from the farm MUST file a zero acreage report, or the farm will be subject to quota forfeiture for the applicable burley marketing quota not established for the farm, unless the State Committee and the County Committee determine that the reduction is not applicable.

**Presidential Declarations**  
President Bush has declared certain Kentucky counties as disaster areas due to damages and losses caused by severe storms and flooding that occurred from April 27 through May 16, 2002.  
Kentucky county family farmers may qualify for FSA Emergency Loan assistance pursuant to Section 321(a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act.

**USDA Provides Relief to Lamb Producers**

Signup has begun for U.S. Department of Agriculture incentive payments to help ewe lamb producers suffering financial losses due to current poor market conditions.  
The Lamb Meat Adjustment (LMAAP) is a four year program started to help stabilize the lamb market. The program will now provide \$26 million incentive payments to help producers increase the supply of domestic lamb meat.  
Applications for the first period (Year 3), which lasts from August 1, 2001 through July 31, 2001, are due by August 15, 2002. Producers included in this year incentive program are for ewe lambs, feeder and slaughter lambs.

Slaughter lambs must be marketed during August 1, 2001 through July 31, 2003 and be owned by an operation at least 30 days before marketing.  
Carriers must meet the requirements of USDA Quality Grade Choice Prime; meet the requirements of USDA Yield Grade 2; having a muscling conformation score of Average Choice or better; have a 55-75 pound hot carcasses weight and be certified by a USDA Agricultural Marketing Service agent or assigned representative.

Producers must purchase or retain a ewe lamb to expand the sheep herd from August 1, 2002 through July 31, 2003 and must certify that each ewe lamb:

- is not older than 18 months of age
- has not produced an offspring
- Does not possess characteristics of prout mouth, foot rot or scrapie and
- is identified according to state identification requirements that comply with a USDA Animal and Plant

Health Inspection Service approved scrapie program for interstate movement.  
Feeder lambs must be marketed during the period August 1, 2001 through July 31, 2003; be owned by the operation from birth until the time of marketing and be thick muscled and large framed as determined by the USDA Agricultural Marketing Service.

Payments subject to the availability of funds will be: \$18 per ewe lamb, \$3 per feeder lamb, \$5 per slaughter lamb and an additional \$3 for slaughter lambs are marketed between June 1 and July 31st and all eligibility requirements are met. If application amounts exceed the funding limit of \$26 million, USDA will prorate payments. Funds not utilized during the first application period will be carried forward to the next year.

Further information on program restrictions, eligibility requirements and other LMAAP payments is available from local USDA Service Center.

**These Five Insurance & Financial Mistakes Can Cost You Dear!**

Everyone wants financial security for themselves and their families. The dreams that we spend long hours working toward - whether it's a fine home, a college education for the children, or a retirement home some place warm - are all goals on the path to financial security. Unfortunately, it's all too easy to stumble on the way to your destination. I've compiled a list of what I've found to be the most common errors people make in achieving their insurance and financial goals. They're all potentially costly, but they could mean the difference between financial success and failure.

- 1. Failing to Plan.** An old saying goes, "Most people don't plan to fail, they fail to plan." This is particularly true when it comes to insurance and finances. If you planning is done it's a proven basis, but that's just not enough. To have a shot at accomplishing what we want, we must first set our goals, analyze what it will take to achieve those goals, and then implement a plan. The plan should include everything from savings and checking accounts, to longer term vehicles like annuities, CDs and IRAs and the protection provided by life, health and disability insurance.
- 2. Insufficient Diversification.** Another old adage will ring true: "Don't put all your eggs in one basket." Diversification is generally considered a key to reducing risk and enhancing potential return. Some people believe that because they have CDs in three different banks they're properly diversified. True diversification calls across product types, lengths of maturity, and asset categories. With a well-diversified portfolio, you're never too dependent on how well one product performs.
- 3. Inadequate Life Insurance.** We're quick to insure our cars and our homes, but too often we overlook our most important asset - ourselves. With mortgages, tuition and bills to be paid, it's important to have proper coverage on all income earners. Some people may have group term life insurance through their employers, but this alone may not be sufficient. Be careful not to be overly dependent on group term, for these plans can be inflexible, may not be portable and may not be available when you need it most - after age 65. Look into purchasing individual coverage to suit your particular needs. How much life insurance is enough? That depends on a number of personal factors including income and number of dependents. It's best to consult with an insurance professional to get your needs and look at the available options.
- 4. Inadequate Disability Income Insurance.** Your earning power is the greatest asset that keeps the wheels of your household running smoothly. What if that generator breaks down?
