Mt. Vernon City Council tables budget

Approximately 22 Mt. Vernon City employees showed up at the city council meeting on Monday night to see if the council was going to approve a second reading of the budget that would cut out their family health care plan.

The council took no action, which means for now, the city will continue to provide a family health insurance plan and operate without a budget due July 1st.

The city's premium for the health plan is \$19,000 a month.

Mt. Vernon Mayor Karen King has been a very strong advocate of the family health insurance plan, because she says the city should not expect their employees to work for relatively low wages and less benefits.

The council and mayor have been

at odds over the latest budget because the mayor says the city needs more money.

Council member Joe Mullins told the rest of the council and Mayor King that it would be very hard for the council to make a decision on a new budget because it was an election year, referring to the fact that two council members are running for mayor and King is also up for reelection.

Jody Adams, a patient at Rockcastle Hospital and Doug Bullock, are also candidates.

Mullins said in his opinion that he did not think the current council would approve any tax before the fall election.

After the meeting Mullins said that he understands the importance

Wayne Stewart Memorial dedicated

Family members and community leaders gathered recently at Rockcastle Hospital and Respiratory Care Center, Inc., to dedicate a special memorial honoring former hospital administrator William Wayne Stewart for his many years of service to the hospital. A large, color photograph of Mr. Stewart was hung above a bronze plaque in the hospital's front

hall as a way of reminding patients, visitors and employees of the many contributions he made.

"Wayne Stewart was one of the founders and principal architect of the modern Rockcastle Hospital. For more than a quarter century, he gave tirelessly of his time and effort toward building the outstanding hospital facility we have today," said

Chairman of the Board, Joseph E. Lambert. "We are pleased to establish this visible reminder of his work on behalf of the people of this community."

Mr. Stewart served as Rockcastle Hospital's Administrator from 1983-1989. He served on the Board of Directors from 1972 until his death on March 7, 2001.

In addition, Mr. Stewart also served on the Kentucky Highlands Investment Corporation Board, where he worked for economic improvement for the county and surrounding areas. He was an educator, farmer, businessman and unparaleled community leader. Posthumously, he was elected to the Rockcastle County Agriculture Hall of Fame.

Ruby Stewart said she was pleased that the hospital would recognize her late husband in such a fashion.

"Wayne loved Rockcastle Hospital and the people who worked there. He would have been very pleased—I know I was," she said. "It was a good picture and what they said about him on the plaque was nice. It was sweet of them to do that."

Rockcastle Hospital and Respiratory Care Center, Inc., is a not-for-profit community hospital, which is accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO). It operates inpatient and outpatient acute care

Dr. G.W. Griffith, who is the cur-

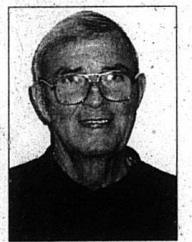

at Central Baptist Hospital in Lexington after undergoing heart surgery. Kirby, 71, was well-known and well respected in Rockcastle County, where he had served in public office for 20 years.

Kirby was Deputy Sheriff from 1966-70 and was elected Sheriff in 1970.

He served one term in that office and in 1978 he was elected jailer, an office he served three terms in.

He retired in 1993.

He is survived by his wife, Gladys; daughters, Mary Nina Thompson and Margaret Kirby and sons, Jody and Billy, all of Rockcastle County.

The past several weeks have been a time of living a dream or nightmare, according to the frame of mind the circumstances brought. The day of our reunion changed the course of living for me and my family temporarily and I am just now getting back to normal. The joy of having so many of these people close by overwhelmed me. I reckon and I ended up in Central Baptist Hospital for several days. Now it wasn't the result of the get-together. It was the result of many years buildup of health practices. I have been guilty of Mom used to say, "If you dance to the music you must pay the fiddler." Well believe me that fiddler has been paid. But know something else? The debt is being paid in installments. I decided to pay back by seeing how good my deeds I could do for someone in need of compassion and love. I have always been apt at doing

for others as I want to be done by so it was quite natural to shake the pillow and straighten the covers.

My admittance to Central Baptist Hospital didn't come as a shock but like a tidal wave of experiences I was not used to. Let's begin at the front door. I was not acquainted with my method of admission and dismissal, but I am usually a quick learner. So I, with an overnight bag tucked under my arm, approached the window where a woman sat with a scroll of paper around, or around before her ready to ask questions which I was not ready to answer. But, the necessity of admittance so I could receive treatment brought forth the answer that I might as well be prepared ahead to remove the artificial cover of privacy and expose all. For it is there in any part of your body that needs attention here is where it will be examined. This was the hardest part for me, when I had to strip to the skin before God and whoever else was in the room. But, to see beneath and probe, one had to look at the problem.

After shedding my modesty, I thought I'd do something to take its place so I began to look for the spare parts department, then realized God doesn't make spare parts. His are right to begin with. So I sought the source of help for the ailing and everywhere I looked I saw an Angel of Mercy stepping out from behind a door or cubbyhole where one had been waiting to help straighten the sheets or cuddle a confused patient. And I mean actually cuddle in her open arms the one not knowing where she was when the antibiotic began weeping off and the room became a wallless blank where strange

arras awaited to pull you back into oblivion. I was frightened beyond control and thought they had knives ready to begin caving my head off.

Occasionally I realized these strong arms were those of a gentle woman whispering kind words while carefully guiding me into the waiting arms of my family. This part of my hallucination was what I believed to be the torture chamber, or hall of horrors, frankly, I was scared, that is why Ann, Chad, Birch (and others) sat close by constantly assuring me it's well. What a blessing these grandchildren are. Here they are, full-grown young people, soothing their grandpas fears, just like she soothed them when they showed fears of the dark. My problem was I didn't know what I was afraid of all I saw was semi-dark, and a shadowy form, the form asking, can I help you? If another light came on so did another voice, that's ok I'll help you. How? Who was speaking? I was a soft human voice offering help to the one in distress. OK, I will gladly accept an arm drew me close and a dry garment was slipped around my body as well as a dry sheet. After two or three times of changing my bed I was finally settled in and breakfast was announced. The tumbled condition of the covers were evidence of my night with "GRUBS" in the dark and the smiling faces of the nurses stepping from their place beside a patient was a signal of "all is well" a new day has begun.

This was then I noticed the pleasant smiling faces around the beds and from every nook and corner of the room. Were they there last night? They must have been for it is not time for a change of shifts, or are they working overtime again. Over time for a nurse seems to be a continuation of whatever task they are performing when a new shift arrives. Since each person on the fifth floor has a private room I have no idea what went on behind those closed

doors, nor did I need to know. The shared knowledge between nurse and physician was sufficient evidence to me that all was well. These smiles came from the heart of those who genuinely cared for others. I was feeling lost, alone, these good folks offering help to one lost in the crowd, and cloud of a strange identity were lucky for they at least knew where they were.

A smile can melt the heart of demons when it is given in sincerity. The smiles that began to appear from each and every employee in the women's corridor caught on quickly and served as a remedy before a complete burst of hearty laughter could be heard when exuberance over a new way to fasten a diaper on an adult. I think what I am trying to convey is the wonderful atmosphere around Central Baptist Hospital. My impression was it is being protected by angels. One can almost see delicate wings slipping out from beneath starched folds of a rumpled uniform. What a gentle voice says, "that's ok I'll take care of it." Everyone, including your surgeon and staff are for your service. I am not advertising or doing a commercial for Central Baptist Hospital (in fact, I received excellent caring treatment here in our Rockcastle County Hospital emergency room). I am only telling you about the spirit of angels hovering close to the care center. Even the fountain and flower garden that is located in front of the hospital are a part of the scene. The comfort of sitting quietly beside a fountain while birds fit among the flowers in medicine to ones soul. Try sitting there some time, and feel peace flood over you.

"What Saith the Scriptures"

I was reading a sermon outline by a denominational preacher on the text in Matt 28:18-20. It said, "The Church has 3 duties to perform: 1) to make disciples; 2) to baptize those who are saved; 3) to watch points (Mt 18:3), but would have to disagree with point #2. One is not saved first and then afterwards the person is baptized. Look at what Jesus said in Mark 16:16. *He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned.*" Notice Jesus said there are 2 conditions in this text, before one is saved. A person must believe the gospel and then must be baptized. Jesus did not say, "He that believeth is saved and then is baptized." God grants salvation based on conditions he sets in his word. We must believe in Jesus. In 8:24, we must repent at the command of the Lord. Ac 17:31, we must confess the name of Jesus, Rm 10:9-10, and then we must be baptized. Ac 2:38. This will make us a saved person if we obey this form of doctrine from the heart. Rm 6:17-18. Then we must be faithful unto death. Rev 2:10c. *he that is faithful unto death, and will give his crown of life.* No wonder we have so many denominations today, when errors such as this, are taught and promoted.

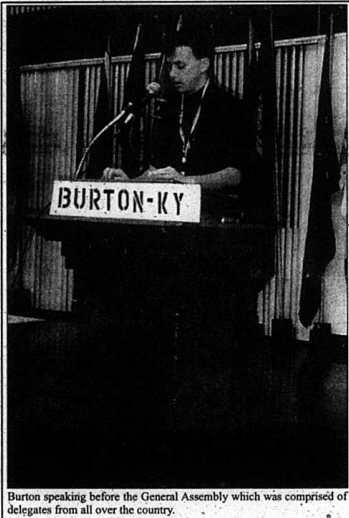

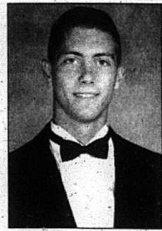

During fiscal year 2001, county attorneys collected more than \$63 million from the delinquent child support payers.

"County attorneys who collect delinquent child support payments have increased collections over the last several years," Burdette said.

"Contracting official and county attorneys receive only about \$9 million in funding from the state budget for child support collections efforts, according to Burdette.

"The fact that we return more than \$63 million is a testament to those who work so hard for the children. That means we returned nearly seven times what the government invested in the program," Burdette said. "There aren't many businesses that can earn seven dollars for every one dollar they are given."

"These figures are clear indicators that county attorneys are making a difference in children's lives across the state," said Steve O'Connor, president of the Kentucky County Attorneys Association. "Burdette is part of the leadership in the Kentucky County Attorneys Association," he added.

Burdette said his office becomes involved in child support collection after a parent falls behind in payments or when there needs to be an order establishing a child support obligation. County attorneys do not ordinarily involve themselves in visitation disputes, but instead devote

their efforts entirely to child support issues.

"The legislature sets the guidelines, we enforce them and the Judges interpret the applications we make," Burdette said.

"It takes a lot of research and preparation to get children the support they deserve," Assistant County Attorney Bill Reynolds said. "In a perfect world, we would not need this service because provisions would be made for all children. But until that day arrives, we are willing to do our part and even more to help the children of Rockcastle County and Kentucky."

The child support programs are graded monthly on their performances, and since taking office in 1994, the Rockcastle Program has consistently scored in the top ten percent statewide. County Attorney Burdette and assistant Reynolds do tribute the success of the program to their staff. "Patty Hayes, Julie Adams and Kathy Robinson make our job easier by truly caring about the work, and the needs of these children. Always there are those that still need help so the job is ongoing," Burdette said.

Patty Hayes, senior child support caseworker is slated to leave the Child Support Office near the end of the month to pursue other interests, and spend more time with her family. She has been with the County Attorney's Child Support Program for nearly seven years. "Both Billy and I are thankful for Patty's contribution to our community's children, and as we do, she has viewed this job as a mission field. She will be missed," Burdette said.

Training for FSA

Rockcastle County FSA office employees will be out of the office this Thursday, July 18th to attend training in Somerset. Natural Resource Conservation will be open for FSA customer concerns.

Graze-Out Payment Program for Crop Years 2001 through 2007

The Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002 provides for GRAZE-OUT payments instead of loan deficiency payments (LDP's) for 2002 through 2007 crop years to eligible producers who:

- Elect to use acreage planted to wheat, barley, oats, or triticale, for the grazing by livestock.
- Agree to forgo any other harvesting of the commodity on this acreage during the applicable crop year.

The application period for Graze-Out:

- Begins on the first day of mechanical harvest as determined by the local FSA County Committee.
- Ends on March 31 of the calendar year following the year the crop is normal harvested.

Producers may file an application for GRAZE-OUT anytime during this application period. Producers may not cancel or withdraw an application once requested.

Loan Deficiency Payment (LDP) Eligibility

In accordance with the provisions of the new farm bill, FSA has recently issued LDP provisions to extend eligibility to commodities grown in 2001 on non-Production Flexibility Contract (PFC) farms. In addition a special beneficial interest waiver will be available to producers who marketed 2001 crop year eligibility commodities before applying for their LDP payment.

Because the Act provided authority to accept LDP requests on commodities produced on non-PFC farms beyond the final loan availability date, the provision was extended to include PFC farms to ensure program equity among all producers of eligible contract commodities.

The ending date for application will be announced by FSA as soon as regulations are published. Producers who previously requested LDP's, but were disapproved based on lost beneficial interest, will be able to apply for their LDP on that 2001 production.

FY 2002 PFC Reminder

Producers with Production Flexibility contracts (PFCs) authorized under AMTA in the 1996 farm bill must continue to follow contract requirements for the 2002 crop year. The deadline to sign or revise a PFC for FY2002 is August 1, 2002. PFC payments for the 2002 crop year will continue to be issued, as requested, until September 30, 2002, provided all eligibility requirements have been met.

Producers who wish to receive their 2002 PFC (Production Flexibility Contract) payments early must sign a form for what month you wish to receive your 2002 payment.

Producers are encouraged not to request a payment for the farm if they are considering selling a portion of the entire farm as payment received must be refunded. Changes in your farming operation must be reported timely in order to reflect PFC payments to the current crop year production. All changes reflected on the CCC-478, Application for PFC Payment, must be signed by August 1st.

Disaster Lending

Farmers who suffer a barley to tobacco disaster loss must file a report with FSA prior to harvest to retain eligibility to lease quota away under the disaster lease provisions. The disaster lease provision was implemented to provide relief to producers that suffer a disaster loss and are unable to produce and market the farm's effective quota. To be eligible to disaster lease and transfer must file a crop report with FSA, file the FSA 574, Disaster Credit Request, have planned sufficient acreage to produce the farm's effective quota, provide a workman like manner for the crop production, a measurement fee and a 20% crop loss, pay a surferment fee and meet all price support eligibility.

Remember: If you are a farmer whose tobacco is suffering from poor weather conditions, black shank, blue mold, root disease, etc., please come to the FSA office and file under the disaster provisions PRIOR TO HARVEST!!

Warehouse Designation

As a condition of price support beginning with the 2001 crop year for tobacco, producers were required to inform FSA of the warehouse where they would market tobacco. This is required by completing the form FSA 808, Warehouse Designation, to indicate where the tobacco will be sold. Initial designation will end August 1, 2003. Producers are encouraged to complete this form after all lease and transfers have been updated. After the initial designation period ends producers will be limited to designate for the farm to any one day during the following regular redesignation periods:

- September 30-October 4, 2002, with card effective October 14, 2002.
- October 28-November 11, 2002, with card effective November 11, 2002.
- December 02-December 06, 2002, with card effective December 16, 2002.
- December 27-January 3, 2003, with card effective January 13, 2003.

The warehouse will be indicated with a number on the market card. Therefore, if you decide to market at a warehouse other than the one specified on the card, you must return that card to the FSA office in specific time periods to request another marketing card.

FSA has a listing for public notice of warehouses, receiving stations and dealers posted on the bulletin board in the county office available through March 31, 2003.

Continuous CRP Sign-Up

Eligible acreage devoted to certain special conservation practices such as riparian buffers, filter strips, grassed waterways, shelter belts, living snow fences, contour grass strips, salt-tolerant vegetation, and shallow water areas for wildlife may be enrolled at any time under CCC's continuous CRP sign-up. These practices are not subject to competitive bidding. For more information, contact your local FSA office.

Welcome Our New Neighbors

Have you noticed the new neighbors who are moving into our area of the country? Many of them are slightly darker skin and not all of them speak English well. They are from Mexico and other Latin American countries, and I am glad they are here.

One reason I am glad they are here is the food they bring with them. Most towns in southeastern Kentucky now have at least one good Mexican restaurant. The food is authentic because it is prepared by folks who came from Mexico! Ah, those burritos and enchiladas.

The transition must be difficult for them. Imagine moving several thousand miles to a new country where you do not speak the language well. It is easy for us to think that someone who does not speak the language well is not very smart. Their halting speech reminds us of someone who is intellectually slow.

How well would you do if you moved to Mexico tomorrow and had to begin speaking Spanish immediately? I have had the pleasure of visiting Mexico twice. On my first visit, I ran short of cash and went to a bank to get a cash advance on my credit card. No one in the bank spoke English and my Spanish consisted of

"hello" and "where is the bathroom?" Mostly through sign language, I managed to communicate to a very helpful teller what I wanted. Several people stood and listened as we "talked." I bet if you had taken a poll among those present as to my brain power they would have ranked me pretty low.

Learning to speak a second language as an adult is not easy. A lack of ability in English does not indicate a lack of intelligence.

On my second visit to Mexico one of my sons accompanied me. Thanks to the foresight of the school system in requiring a foreign language, he knew some Spanish and was able to act as an interpreter. I have tried to learn a little Spanish but find it very hard to do so. I wish I knew more so that I could communicate better with my new neighbors.

Some have wished aloud that our new neighbors would stay in their home countries. They claim not to understand why Hispanics move here. If you had the opportunity to earn in one day in another country what you could make in one week at home, might you consider moving? That is the case for many of the workers who come here. Wages are much higher in the U.S., and they can support themselves and a family back

home. Yes, many of our new neighbors are supporting folks back home. That is why they work so hard. Sometimes a father will move to the U.S. to find work and will send money home to his wife and children. He may be away from them for a year or more, but he is supporting them in the best way he knows.

Please be careful of closing the doors to immigrants. If Native Americans had closed the doors to those Europeans who came to America, I would have been writing this in England.

I am also glad that our new neighbors are here because it gives us a

chance to learn about another culture. During my visits to Mexico I had the opportunity to experience some of the native Indian culture. I visited with a shaman, a lady who is a healer. I participated in a native Indian sweat lodge and also took part in a fire walk. (I can assure you that I moved very quickly over that hot coals!) This was real treat for a small town Kentucky boy. Now we do not have to go to Mexico to learn more about the people there. They have come to us! All of us benefit from learning more about another way of life.

Join me in saying "ola" (hello) to our new neighbors.

Drug court program receives funding

The Administrative Office of the Courts, Drug Courts Department has been awarded Edward Byrne Memorial grant monies totaling \$867,958 from the Kentucky Justice Cabinet through the continuation of drug courts.

A letter from Governor Paul E. Patton stated, "Protecting the life and property of the Commonwealth of Kentucky's citizens is the foremost responsibility of government. Because of this obligation, my administration is particularly sensitive to the needs of the criminal justice system."

"It is, therefore, appropriate for me as Governor to do what I can to enhance any of the aspects of this multifaceted system, and I am pleased to be in a position to allocate federal funds for these purposes. I sincerely hope this grant will make your community and the Commonwealth an even safer place for all of us," he added.

Chief Justice Joseph E. Lambert oversees Kentucky's drug courts. "The citizens of Kentucky will be well served by this continuing commitment to the justice system. With additional funds available for Kentucky's drug courts, we can continue working to break the cycle of drug addiction that is at the root of many of society's problems," said Lambert.

The funding will be divided among existing drug court programs located in Jefferson County, Fayette County, Northern Kentucky, Warren County, Pike County, Christian County and the combined location of

Lincoln, Rockcastle and Pulaski Counties.

The drug court in Rockcastle, Lincoln and Pulaski counties is conducted by Judge Debra Lambert.

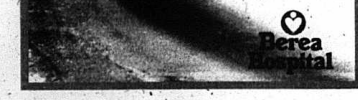
