Police make more drug arrests

A second wave of arrests in what police are calling a major drug trafficking business operating between Texas and Kentucky took place Fri-day, with seven more arrested on co-canie charges.

The seven are linked with [1.arrested in an October roundup and indicated earlier this month in U.S. District Court in Lexington.

Richard Badaraceo of the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration. (DEA) said Friday's second wave of arrests likely, will be the last in this particular investigation, which has been going on 16 months and involved 18 federal, state and lecal law enforcement agencies.
