On Thursday, November 28, at happroximately 10.35 p.m. members of the London/Laurel County Major Crimes Task Force responded to the report of a shooting five miles north of London on Little Arthur Ridge Road in Laurel County.

According to the investigation Bobby Ray Grabb, 44, of Rockcastle and his wife, Brenda S. Cinable, 64 of East Bernstadt had been separated for exveral moints when he discovered she was visiting a family member of Thanks giving when Bobby Ray Grabb, suddenly showed up. While there a domestic dispute crupted between the two and a family member at the residence; shot Bobby Ray Grabb once. He was pronounced dead at the scone by Laurel County Deputy Coroner Doug Browling, "According to court records, Brenda Grubb had gotten an emergency protection order against her husband.
