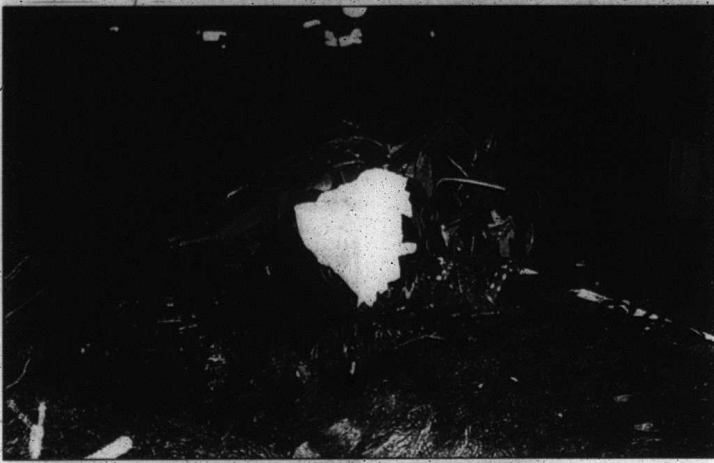

## Northside Baptist Church van involved Two killed in accident on Hwy. 150

A tragic accident on Hwy. 150, last Wednesday night, has left two Rockcastle countians dead.

The wreck gained state-wide attention because one of the victims involved was driving a church bus.

Jackie Dixon, 68, of Mt. Vernon and Stacy Nicely, 29, also of Mt. Vernon died in the accident.

Dixon was driving a Northside Baptist Church van heading toward Brodhead when Nicely, apparently, crossed the center line, causing a head-on collision.

Rockcastle County Coroner Bill Dowell pronounced Dixon and Nicely dead at the scene. Dixon's three passengers, David Brock, 55, Kenny Owens, 66 and Carl York, 13, all of Brodhead were treated for minor injuries at the Rockcastle Hospital.

The wreck occurred around 8:30 p.m. on Hawes Hill next to the entrance to Houston Point Subdivision. Police said that neither driver was wearing a seatbelt at the time of the crash and that alcohol may have been a contributing factor. But test results on Nicely will not be released for at least thirty days. Although police said that Dixon was not wearing a seatbelt, church members and family members said that he always wore a seatbelt when driving.

One of the first people on the scene was Natalie Taylor of Mt. Vernon who was traveling toward Mt. Vernon after attending church in the Quail area. Mrs. Taylor said, "There ended up being several people there before the police or ambulance arrived. We were all willing to help any way we could but there just wasn't anything we could do except pray and die."

Mrs. Taylor, who is a physical therapist, said that Nicely had no pulse at the scene but that Dixon was still conscious for a short time after the accident. Dowell said that both men died from blunt force trauma due to the impact.

"Jackie was like a second father to me," said Northside Baptist pastor Chad Burdette. "Jackie always put people first in his life and he loved Northside. He was a true, devout Christian man," Burdette said.

Northside is one of the fastest-growing churches in Rockcastle County with average attendance on Sunday morning of approximately 225. They have grown to the point where they run two church buses for each service. Dixon usually took the 150 Brodhead route on Wednesday night and had already dropped off about 10 passengers when the acci-

dent occurred. Jackie's wife, Nell, said the support from the church and the community, after the accident, has been overwhelming. "We really appreciate everything everyone has done for us. This has been a trying time but, with God's help, we have made it through," she said.

Mrs. Dixon's family is certainly no stranger to tragedy. In 1978, her niece, 4-year-old Jennifer, was killed in an accident on the family farm while riding a pony. In May of 1983, Mrs. Dixon's sister, Pam and her two small children, Cindy and David, were killed in an accident on I-75 when the car they were riding in was hit head-on by a state police cruiser which had been stolen by a Laurel County man in an attempt to escape arrest. In 1999, Mrs. Dixon's brother was killed in an accident involving an all-terrain vehicle, also on the family farm. In the same year, Mrs. Dixon's brother-in-law died unexpectedly of a heart attack. Her brother and brother-in-law were both 46 years old.

### In Medicaid

## Gov. Patton orders \$250 million cut

The state Medicaid program will make more than \$250 million in cuts to deal with increasing enrollment and growing costs. Gov. Paul Patton announced last Thursday.

The Medicaid program is facing a \$450 million deficit next year. Most other states are facing a similar situation with their Medicaid programs. According to a recent Kaiser Family Foundation survey, 49 states are making plans or have already acted to reduce Medicaid spending growth.

Kentucky's Medicaid program has an annual budget of approximately \$4 billion and provides health care coverage to more than 600,000 people. The number of people on Medicaid this year is expected to exceed projections by 41,000 individuals.

Gov. Patton noted that the state has been addressing problems with the Medicaid budget for nearly two years. He appointed a Medicaid Steering Committee in 2001 to start dealing with this problem, thus helping to avoid making painful cuts until now.

"To date, this effort has achieved great success," Gov. Patton said. "Despite increasing pressures on the program, we have been able to balance the Medicaid budget for fiscal years 2001 and 2002, produce annualized savings of \$201 million, and access additional federal revenues

without making across the board cuts to providers and without reducing eligibility."

However, increasing health care costs and a growing number of Medicaid recipients is forcing the state to make cuts in the program. Some of the specifics include:

- Eliminating the low intensity level of care for people seeking to qualify for nursing home care or the Home and Community Based Waiver services. This means Kentucky, like most other states, will have no level of care. Estimated savings of \$45 million.

- Equalizing Medicaid payments for people who are dually eligible for both Medicare and Medicaid. Medicaid currently pays any deductible or co-pay for these recipients for outpatient services. With the change, Medicaid will not pay deductibles or co-pays if it exceeds the Medicaid rate. This will not affect services to the approximately 86,000 people dually eligible for both programs. All other states in the in the southeast have implemented this change. Estimated savings of \$53 - \$57 million.

- Requiring \$3 co-payments for optional services, including adult users of dental, chiropractic, optometry, podiatry and audiology services. Children, pregnant women and those living in institutional settings are exempt from co-pays.

Next week, we will have a story as to the effect these cuts will have on care providers locally.

This letter comes as an explanation to the citizens of Rockcastle County, regarding the transfer and ownership of vehicles controlled by the Sheriff's Department.

First of all, we need to understand that each county makes provision for Sheriff Department vehicles in several different ways.

Some county fiscal courts with large general funds (and much greater tax revenues) purchase vehicles with public funds for their sheriff's departments and allow the deputies and sheriff to use them.

Some county fiscal courts allow the sheriff to purchase the vehicles from the sheriff department's revenues as a budget item. (This, of course, assumes the local sheriff's department will generate enough funds in the course of a year to make such purchases. Likewise, when this occurs, the sheriff will surrender fewer funds to the county's fiscal court each year, which is known as "cash flow.")

Some county fiscal courts permit the sheriff to purchase department vehicles with his personal funds and the fiscal court, in turn, does nothing. (When this happens, the sheriff is responsible for all insurance on the vehicles, and the vehicles are not

permitted to carry official license plates.)

Rockcastle County's fiscal court, during the terms held by Sheriff Shirley Smith, entered into an agreement whereby the sheriff purchased the vehicles with his personal funds and then, in order to have insurance coverage by the county, and official plates, handed them over to the fiscal court. When a vehicle was removed from service due to mechanical problems or wrecks, the county returned the vehicles to him, and the sheriff then replaced the vehicle.

In order to better formalize this agreement, this new fiscal court has decided that it would be better to actually purchase the vehicles from Sheriff Darrell Doan at the price he paid for them, from his personal funds, then allow the sheriff's department the free use of them. The sheriff's department, however, will be responsible for all maintenance and fuel costs, which are items in the sheriff's budget approved by the fiscal court. Basically, the result is the same with Sheriff Doan as it was with Sheriff Smith with the only difference being that now the county purchases the vehicles from Sheriff Doan, while the county returned the vehicles owned by Sheriff Smith.

All grants generally flow through the fiscal court before being passed to an individual government entity. At no time, did Sheriff Smith ever purchase vehicles with grant funds or department funds. The vehicles his department used were purchased by him personally.

### Some Birthmarks are Treatable

Over the years doctors have told parents not to treat the common red birthmarks that some children have at birth. There was good reason for this advice; the treatments often did more harm than good, and many of the birthmarks would eventually go away on their own.

Numerous treatments have been tried and most have resulted in excessive scarring, especially in young children whose thinner skin is more susceptible to thermal injury. But recently, newer methods of laser treatment have been shown to have better results.

"Yellow light" lasers have very low scar rates and they appear to be safer than other laser treatments for children whose thinner skin is more susceptible to thermal injury.

The yellow light laser is most effective for "port wine stains," which are large flat patches of red skin caused by dilated blood vessels. These are common on the forehead and face. The laser is not useful for strawberry birthmarks, which develop from a protruding cluster of abnormal blood vessels. The laser penetrates the skin only 1/16th of an inch, and feels like a snap of a rubber band. An average treatment may require up to 1000 "snaps," so young children may need anesthesia for the procedure.

Port wine stains are treated primarily for cosmetic reasons. Other reasons to treat the birthmarks are that they can become infected more easily than normal skin, and by middle age, the blood vessels may develop small blebs which can bleed easily with trauma.

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# Obituaries



**Jackie N. Dixon**

Jackie N. Dixon, 68, of Rt. 1, Mt. Vernon, died Wednesday, January 15, 2003, near Broadhead as the result of an automobile accident.

Mr. Dixon was born in Nicholas Co. on December 14, 1934, the son of "Marty" Patton Dixon and the late Jack Dixon. He was a retired federal employee, was an Army veteran of the Korean War and was a member and trustee of the Northside Baptist Church. He was also a Kentucky Colonel and Kentucky Admiral.

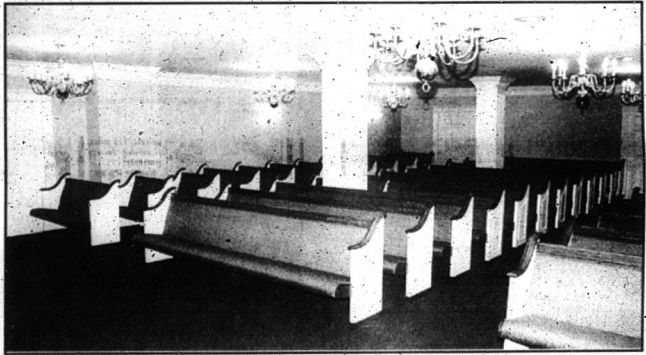

## Earn scholarships for good grades

The Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES) is a great way for high school students to earn scholarships for college or technical training.

Kepublic students who attend certified Kentucky high schools can earn a KEES award based on their grade point average (GPA) for each year of high school and a bonus award based on the highest ACT composite score (or equivalent SAT score) they earn before graduation.

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or higher GPA. Bonus awards range from \$36 for an ACT score of 15 to \$500 for a 28 or above. The scholarship can be used for up to four years for most programs of study at participating postsecondary schools, as long as the student keeps up his or her grades. Students must begin using the awards within five years of high school graduation.

Students do not apply for the scholarships. The Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA) will send them letters each year, telling them how much they have earned, based on data submitted by their school district to the Kentucky Department of Education.

KHEAA is the state agency that administers scholarships, grants, work-study, savings, and Federal Family Education Loans and provides free financial aid information to students and parents. For complete details about KEES, visit

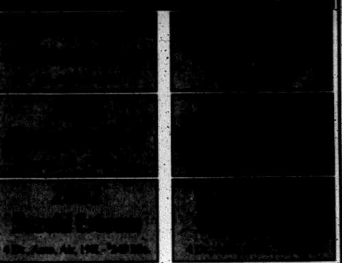

## Are you in an abusive relationship?

If you are in an abusive relationship, you probably already know there is nothing you can do to stop an abusive person from hurting you. The person who uses violence has to realize that the behavior is wrong in order to change. The tendency toward violence did not begin with you, nor is it caused by something you did or did not do. You are simply someone's target, or catch all, for pent-up anger that really has nothing to do with you.

Basically, the abuser is locked into a fit of rage; he isn't thinking of you as a person that he is hurting. If he did, he would stop. It isn't until the rage is released that he realizes the power it has over him. It is for this reason that it is imperative the victim becomes familiar with the cycle of domestic violence in order to seek safety before the violence escalates to a dangerous level.

People who have studied domestic violence have found three common stages in an abusive relationship. **Advocates** use the progression of storm stages to describe the abuse cycle.

### POWER & CONTROL

**Stage 1 "The Period Before the Storm"** Tension builds, name-calling, put-downs, nit-picking, arguing, cursing, blaming you for everything. You feel as if you're walking on eggshells, feel overwhelming dread, do

everything you know to keep him calm, but nothing works. --This is the time to get out--

**Stage 2 "The Storm"** He blows up-- goes off-- loses control, makes threats, punches, kicks, hurts you with weapons, destroys property, accuses you of cheating, calls you vulgar names.

**Stage 3 "Rainbow Period"** He promises never to do it again, wants to fix things, lots of apologies and ears, sends flowers, promises to go to counseling or church (or whatever he thinks you might want him to do), in time, usually a very short time, you find yourself gradually walking on eggshells again, which begins the cycle all over. At this point, the only option you have is to protect yourself, because the responsibility to stop the abuse lies with him. You deserve to be loved in a way that you want.

Keep in mind that when you leave an abusive relationship, it can be the most dangerous time. It is very important to put a safety plan in place for you and your children. A domestic violence victim advocate is available to provide emotional support, resources, information and safety planning.

# Agricultural News

## Slow Pace of Sign-up for Major Farm Bill Programs

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is concerned about the slow pace at which farmers are signing up for major farm programs under the 2002 Farm Bill and urges farmers to bring the process to quickly sign up in order to receive intended benefits in a timely and efficient manner.

The USDA team has developed extensive new software, trained personnel and prepared directives for the many new and existing programs. In addition, the department developed a new website and conducted hundreds of outreach meetings to farmers nationwide to provide information on how to comply with the new law and the required changes in program participation.

USDA is committed to working at every level to assist producers, but it is critical farmers contact their local FSA office to bring processing individual program information and updates needed to participate.

Accordingly, reports to date from the states indicate that producer sign-up for the direct and counter-cyclical programs is proceeding quite slowly. Several reasons explain the slow pace, including the late harvest in many parts of the country that kept farmers in the field longer than usual.

Additionally, the complexity of the programs require more time for producers to understand, assemble the necessary information and make their decision, often involving several different commodities and unknown future market conditions.

Producers are reminded that they can sign-up for major programs now and still make changes to their decisions any time until the April 1 closing date for base acreage and yield updating.

### Direct and Counter-Cyclical Program (DCP)

Direct and Counter-cyclical payments for 2002 through 2007 will be based on each producer's individual production history. Signup for the program began October 1, 2002 and will end July 2, 2003. Program participation is voluntary, and producers are responsible for meeting deadlines and complying with rules and regulations.

Producers have been mailed additional information concerning this program. Those who have questions should contact their local USDA/Service Center or county FSA office.

### Power of Attorney Farms

If you currently have a Power of Attorney on file with FSA, it is not valid for the new programs or transactions authorized by the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002 (Farm Bill). If you wish to retain an agent to act on your behalf for the new Direct and Counter-Cyclical programs, a new Power of Attorney is required.

The FSA Power of Attorney, form FSA-211, has been revised to cover programs in the Act (referred to as the Farm Bill). Non-FSA power of attorney forms currently on file are not valid for any new program authorized by the Act. Farmers are cautioned that the authorizing signature on the FSA-211, must be witnessed by either an FSA employee or a Notary Public.

### Designation by Landowner Method

The designation by landowner method of dividing a farm is the division of contract acres, allotments, or quotas in the manner AGREED to by all parent farm owner(s) and farm purchasers or transferees. Sellers must have owned the farm for three years prior to the date of designation by landowner method. The County Committee may waive the 3-year ownership requirement if either of the following apply:

- CCC determines the sale was not primarily to keep or sell allotments, quotas or contract acres.
- Land sold will be devoted to non-agricultural, recreational, residential or industrial use.

The designation by landowner method may be used when any of the following apply:

- Part of a farm or tract is sold or ownership is transferred.
- An entire farm or tract is sold to 2 or more persons.
- Farm or tract ownership is transferred to 2 or more persons.
- With the designation by landowner method, the 1,000 pound/acre also applies when there is a change in ownership. Thus, if a resulting farm has less than 1,000 pounds of tobacco quota, the owner shall either:
  - Purchase additional quota to make 1,000 pounds
  - Sell the quota
- Combine the quota with another farm to make 1,000 pounds

An FSA-155, Request for Farm Reconstitution shall be signed by ALL sellers, buyers and, if applicable, the holder or the deed of trust, lien holder or mortgage holder, state or county.

Producers who have purchased or sold land should inform the FSA office of the change. A copy of the deed or land contract sales is required to update FSA records with correct ownership. Producers are also reminded to inform the FSA office of any change of address.


### Important Program Dates

April 1, 2003 - Ending date for owners to select base and yield options.  
June 2, 2003 - Signup for the 2002 and 2003 DCP ends.
