Gov. Patton orders \$250 million cut

The state Medicaid program will make more fina \$250 million in cuts to deal with increasing enrollment and growing costs. Gov. Paul Patton announced last Thursday.

The Medicaid program is facing a \$450 million deficit next year. Most offer states are facing a similar situation with their Medicaid programs. According to a recent Kaiser Family Foundation survey, 49 states are making plans or have already acted to reduce Medicaid spending growth. Kentucky's Medicaid programs has an annual budget of approximately \$45 hillion and provides health. caré coverage to more than 600,000 people. The number of people on Medicaid this year is expected to exceed projections by \$4,000 individuals.

This letter comes as an explana-tion to the citizens of Rockeastle County, regarding the transfer and ownership of vehicles controlled by the Sheriff's Department.

First of all, we need to understand that each county makes provision for Sheriff Department vehicles in sev-eral different ways.

that each county makes provision for Sheriff Department vehicles in several different ways:
Some county fiscal courts with large general funds (and much grants to the county fiscal courts with large general funds (and much grants webled to the county fiscal courts allow the county fiscal courts allow the sheriff to purchase the vehicles from the sheriff or purchase the vehicles from the sheriff department's recurs as a budget item. (This; of course, assumes the local sheriff's courts allow the county finds in the course of a year to make cash purchases. Likewise, when this occurs, the sheriff will surrender (ewent funds) to the county's, fiscal court each year, which is known as screen fees.)

Rockeastle County's fiscal court, during the terms held by Sheriff Shriley Smill; entered into an agreement whereby the sheriff purchased the vehicles with his permanal funds and then, in order to have insurance coverage by the county, and official plates, handed then over to the fiscal court. When a whicle was removed from service due to mechanize the plates of the county, and the county and the fiscal court. Basically, the result is the same with Sheriff Doan as it was with Sheriff Smith with the only difference being that now the county purchases the vehicles from Sheriff Doan, while the county returned the vehicles owned by Sheriff Smith. All grants generally flow through the fiscal court before being passed to an -individual government entity.

At no time, did Sheriff Smith ever purchase vehicles with grant funds or department funds. The vehicles his department used were purchased by

him personally.






