# Rogers obtains \$9 million for Rockcastle Co.

U.S. Congressman Harold "Hal" Riggers amounced last week that he obstaned \$526 million in targeted federal funding for a wide range of projects in southern and eastern Kentucky, including Rockeastle County. The funding is included in the scal year 2003 Omnibus Appropriations bill, which is comprised of idifferent spending bills. Prysident George W. Bush is expected to sign the bill as early as this week.

\$ 9 million of the funding will be ent on projects in Rockcastle

They include \$6 million to coninue the six-lane expansion project on 1-75 in the county and \$3 million for forest preservation and to fight marijutana cultivation and lawless-ness in the Daniel Boone National

PRIDE provides money for dump site clean-ups and money for low income families to replace or build septic systems on their property.

To date the Congressman has obtained \$140 million for the project. Rockeastle County is in the area served by ERIDE.

#### **Babies Get Plugged Tear Ducts**

en the tear duch do not drain, the infant will have tearn welling up in his eyes and running down his checks all the time. After naps the eye may be a little mattery locking.

The obstruction is often at the far end of the tear duct. Usually it will open ajontaneously, but you can help this by massaging the area between the in-side comer of the eye and the note several times a day with your manfil finger or a cotton-tipped swah. The increased pressure from this milking action against the obstructing membrane will usually open against the obstructing membrane will usually open

it by six months of age.

If massage does not work, the ophthalmologist may try irrigating the duct. A saline solution is injected into the duct and this usually wastless out the debris and perforates the remaining membranes. This can often be done in the office.

be done in the office.

Conservative treatment is preferable unless the obstruction is disgovered at a later age, when it may be wise to probe the duct fairly
quickly unless there is a good response to massage. Probing the
duct should be considered if it is still plugged at six months of age.

Probing the duct is usually done in the operating room using anesthesia. It is quite successful in younger children, so if massaging regularly
does not solve the problem after a few months, it is appropriate to see an
ophthalmologist for an expert opinion on whether this minor surgery
should be doesn.



## Yards to Paradise

#### Winter Interest in the Landscape

Cold days arrived early last fall and I heard several say they enjoyed the white Christmas.

For ost, at least a day or two off from-e regular grind can mean a few uss free to do whatever strikes your nicy for wintertime outdoor enjoy-

Examples are frostbitten grasses waving in the cold wind, flower seed heads crowned with a lod of spow, a goldfine, betwicting seeds, from a dried pinecone or dried teasel. Such are most glorious in winter.

Some perennials that I like save throughout the winter and nemove the dead stalks or seed hearom include coneflowers, sedu

Some trees and shrubs exhibit nice characteristics we may not notice at other times of the year. Do you notice red twigs on blueberries, some wilewas and degwoods in summe? Probably not! Without their foliage, such plants can look striking against the white of snow.

Corkscere willows, contorted filberts, winterberry hollies, are all piemes striking minus their leaves. Wisteria, grapevines, passionflower types, offer nice form covering a post, trellis, or arch during the wintertime. Some folias may think dead vines and seed heads are signs of laziness. 
