\$4 million *iudgement*

A Rockcastle County jury awarded the family of a former Sowder Nursing Home patient 54 million last Thursday, after a five day trial in Rockcastle Circuit Court. In their vedrict, the juros indicated that the nursing home, which is now owned by the Rockcastle Hospital, was 70 percent responsible for the woman's death and that local physician Dr. Karen Saylor was 30 percent responsible. Antoneys for Roberta Powers, a woman in her mid-30s, told the court that she died from Lithium positioning in 1998 while under the care of the nursing home.

Both parties found at fault have said they will appeal the verdict.

Dr. Saylor said Tuesday that she is always mournful about the death of a patient, but that she had done nothing wrong and tried every waypossible to help her patient. No local attorneys were involved in the case. The judgement was not the largest ever in Rockcastle County, in a civil case.



The Cumberland Valley District Health Department will begin its annual mosquito control program this week. Information concerning the removal of mosquito breeding sites and habitat destruction will be made available at several locations around the county and the public is asked to help reduce the pest problem by taking the steps outlined in the informational pamphlets.

The department relies heavily on its mosquito-fogging program that will be in operation in all parts of the county on a routine basis. This was mide pos-sible through contributions by the Fiscal Court and City Governments which are concerned with preventing of the Endy comments. There were some suspected cases of West Nile Virus (transmitted by mosquitos) and some positive tests in birds in the district last season.
