### Two from **Brodhead** among three sentenced

Three men who already entered gullty pleas were sentenced riday in Lincoln Circuit Court.

The heaviest sentence handed down by Circuit Judge William Cain Friday was to Kenneth Smith, 30, of Brodhead.

Smith pleaded guilty, to five counts of receiving stolen property and trafficking in methamphetamine. He was sentenced to a total of seven-years in prison. Actual sentences were five years on the receiving stolen property convictions and seven on the drug charge but the sentences will run at the same time for a total of seven years.

Smith was arrested in March slong with a woman, Sury Cromer, 36, of Brodhead, who allegedly sold methamphetamine to an undercover agent of the Kentucky State Police. Cromer entered a guilty plea Friday to reduced charges of possession of drugs. Commonwealth Attorney Eddy Montgomery recommended a sentence of three years for Cromer.

Also Friday, Richard Travis Mor-row, 23, of Tateville, was sentenced to 2.7 years on three counts of bur-glary, Morrow and a partner, Norman Decker, both pleaded guilty to bur-glarizing the Dollar General Store, McDopadi's Restaurant and Save-A-Lot on April 20, 2001. Decker previ-ously was sentenced to five years in Lot on April 20, 2001. Decker previ-ously was sentenced to five years in prison. Morrow will serve, a total of 12 years and seven months. He was already serving a 10-year sentence on a case in Pulaski County. The Lin-coln County sentence will start after that 10-year hitch in state prison is

prison on his guilty plea to criminal
possession of a forged instrument.
Tolman allegedly cashed a \$400

# Rogers obtains over \$2 million for Rockcastle

U.S. Representative Harold:"Hal' Rogers (KY-S) has secured \$480,000. for the City of Mt. Vernon to improve sewage service and \$200,000 to construct a new municipal conference center at Refire Valley. Funds were included in the FY 2004 VA/HUD Appropriations Bill, which was approved by the House Appropriations Committee this week.

"The federal investment to improve the wastewater infrastructure in Mt. Vernon is a vital part of the community's economic expansion."

Vernon the ability to provide service to a growing number of homes and businesses and meet the area's needs in the future. The funding announced Modelwidilb be used to install a gravity sewer line and pump station to service a number of older homes that have outdated and filmined septic systems. Concerning the Conference Center, Rogers said, "Renfro Valley has long, rich history of providing quality entertainment to Kentuckins and visitors from around the nation." 

### Notification of FERPA Rights

Distribute this notice annually to parents and students.

The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and "eligible students" (students over 18 years of age or students who are attending a postsecondary institution) certain rights with respect to the student's education records. They are:

1) The right to inspect and review the student's education records within forty-five (45) days of the day the District receives a request for access.

Parents or eligible students should submit to the school Principal/designee a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The Principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the record(s) may

The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent
or eligible student believes are inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of the student's

Parents or eligible students may ask the District to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of privacy or other rights. They should write the school Principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of their privacy or other rights.

If the District decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the District will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise himber of the right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure

One exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A "school official" is a person employed by the District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel;) a person serving on the school Board; a person or company with whom the District has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his/her tasks.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his/her professional responsibility. Upon request, the District shall disclose education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll or to other entities

4) The right to prohibit the discloture of personally identifiable information concerning the student to recruiting representatives of the U.S. Armed Forces and its service academies, the Kentucky Air National Guard, and the Kentucky Army National Guard. Unless the parent or eligible student requests in writing that the District not Yelease information, the student's name, address, and telephone number (if listed) shall be released to Armed Forces recruiters upon their request.

For students who have been determined eligible for Special Education, educational records will be destroyed at the request of the parents when they are no longer needed to provide educational programs or services. The <u>Rockessile County</u> School District may destroy the educational records of a child without parent request <u>event</u> years after they are no longer needed to provide educational programs or services. Parents are advised that data contained in the records may later be needed for Social Security benefits or other purposes. The <u>Rockessile County</u> School District may retain, for an indefinite period of time, a record of the students of an enabled to the time of the students of the stud

uldren eligible for Special-Education include those children with disabilities who have autism, deaf-ndness, developmental delay, emotional-behavior disability, hearing impairment, mental disability, stalliple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, doth relabilit, impairment, specific learning disability, spech or guage impairment, traumatic brain injury, or visual impairment and who because of such an impairment of Special-Education services.

Children eligible for 304 services include those children who have a turrent physical or mental, impairment that currently substantially limits some major-life activity which causes the student's ability fo access the shool environment or shool activities to be substantially limited.

Rockeastle County School District has an ongoing "Child Find" system, which is designed to identify and evaluate any child residing in a home, facility, or residence, within its geographical fasters, age three (3) to twenty-one (21) years, who may have a disability and be in need of Special totion or 504 services. This includes children who are not in school; those who are in public, private, or school; those who are highly mobile such as children who are migrant or homeless, and, thisse who are cing from grade to grade, who may need but are not receiving Special Education or 504 services.

The <u>Rockessile County</u> School District will make sure any child enrolled in its district who qualifies for Special Education or 504 services, regardless of how severe the disability, is provided appropriate Special Education or 504 services at no cost to the parents of the child.

### SCHOOL BUS RULES AND REGULATION

The privilege of any pupil to ride a school bus is conditioned upon their good behavior and observance of the following rules and regulations. Pupils violating these rules and regulations shall be reported to the principal of the school which the pupil attents for necessary corrective action. Safety is the primary concern in the transportation of pupils. In order to assure proper saffety, it is vital that pupils and perents understand the rules and regulations of shool bus riding. Following is a list of basic rules and regulations adopted by the Rockcastle County Board of Education and the Kentucky Department of Education.

- entucky Department of Education:

  1. Arrive at bus stop on time. The bus has many scheduled stops and cannot be delayed.
- 2. Never stand in the road while waiting for the bus. Parents should encourage safety
- measures for pupils as they wait for the bus and walk home from the bus.
- 3. Cross a safe distance (10 feet) in front of the bus so the driver can see you.

  A. Take a seat upon boarding the bus and do not change seats while the bus is in motion.
- 5. The driver is in charge of the bus and pupils and has the authority to assign seating
- 6. Keep noise to a minimum so that the driver's attention can be devoted to driving
- 7. Do not extend arms, legs or head out the bus windows.
- 8. Obey the rules posted on each bus.
- 9. Do not block aisles in any way.
- Knives/other sharp instruments are not permitted on the ous.
   Never run toward the bus. Always load and unload when the bus.
- 12. Apply the above rule (No. 11) when transferring buses.
- 13. Never use the rear exit unless an emergency exists.
- 14. Ride only your assigned bus unless you have a signed note from the Principal. Parents mu write or call the principal to obtain permission for pupil to ride another bus or to exit at a different stop.
- 15: Report any damages to the bus.
- 16. Do not occupy more space in a seat than required.
- Open and close windows in compliance with the driver's intructions.
   Figure and parents are to accept the menopsibility of listening for dismissal announced.
- 18. Pupils and parents are to accept the responsionity of installing for distincts and to not the radio on days when inclement weather disrupts the regular schedule.

  19. The following rules are of particular propern and the activities mentioned are prohibited.
  - a. Use of profane/foul language
    - b. Smoking or other use of tobacco on the bus
  - c. Fighting on the but
  - d. Destruction of bus property
  - f. Throwing objects on or from the bu
- 20. <u>Disciplinary Action</u>: Violations of the above stated rules and regulations shall be reported to the appropriate school principal. The principal shall record the incident and determine the appropriate disciplinary action. Should any pupil persist in violating any of these regulations, it shall be the duty of the driver to notify the principal and, after due warning has been given to the pupil and such violation persists, the principal and/or board of education shall then findful such disobedient pupil the privilege of nding the bus. Written notice of the action of the principal shall






