Anyway, I was having so much fun with the bubble wrap that it took me a couple of weeks to get around to listening to the CD that was enclosed in the package. As best I recall there was a post-it note attached that said something like, "Enjoy," and it was signed J.R. or maybe Fred.

And I promptly played the first cut and put listening to the rest on my "to do list". My friend, when we are not brothers (He's far more Republican than I am Democrat) Frederick J. Besse, III, also known in hillbilly circles as FJ #3, lives in Wind Gap, Pennsylvania and he is a highly successful venture capitalist. However, to my knowledge, his only ventures (meaning he provided the cash to make them happen) into the music business has been to finance some live recordings of a Gathering of Writers who also play music we've had a couple of times at his place (near Allentown) and my-personal covers of a bunch of John Prine,

Merle Haggard, Tom T. Hall etc. songs, dutifully recorded on CD, that it would be illegal to sell even if anybody wanted a copy. Suffice to say that Fred has not made a lot of his money in the recording industry.

In the case of my own CD, not a penny has been generated in sales. But if Fred has a vested interest in the CD he sent me and that I finally got around to listening to at least a dozen times last week (it's playing in the background even as I write) his fortune in the music business is on the verge of greatness.

In short the best country band, recorded in Nashville, that I've heard in at least a decade is made up of young musicians, born, raised and trained in classical (can you say or spell Tchaikovsky?) music and they are from Russia. And I am absolutely gripped with the sound they generate and the feeling they capture. There's not a song on the CD that is

less than excellent, including one song in their native language.

The band is called Bering Strait but less forget about spelling and pronunciation Russian last names and simply talk about the music and the way they make it. The lead singers are two girls who have been speaking English all that long but sure know how to sing it and you'll be reminded of the Dixie Chicks and Martina McBride and Patsy Cline. And Loretta Lynn and Emmy Lou and Jerry Douglas and Alan Jackson and Ricky Skaggs and the list goes on and on. You'll hear a bluegrass lick here and a rock lick there with no apology that it was snatched from a loved one. Loved ones being the hero individual singers and bands that influenced Bering Strait into developing a sound that is both homogeneous and, at the same time, perfectly unique.

I promise you faithfully that if you purchase the album entitled "Bering Strait" and listen to these two cuts: "I Could be Persuaded" and "I'm Not Missing you," you will keep the CD on your player and you will set it to play those two songs over and over again. You will not only be listening to some of the best music recorded in Nashville in many years, but you will be fondly reminded of how honest and unpretentious country music

can be when it is issued from the heart and soul. Believe me, these Russian kids do it a lot better than anything else on the so-called Country Music scene these days.

The only way I know to get their music is online. The Bering Strait Album is available at amazon.com. The band also has a website with complete bio-sketches of the band and samples of the music. Go to beringstraitonline.com. And if that fails, just look them up with your favorite search engine. You will not be sorry you did and you will be saying to yourself that Bering should write about music more often than he does about beans. I already know that so you need not write a letter to the editor...

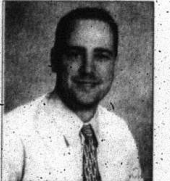

All-American Club trash clean-up report

Agricultural News

Pesticide Certification

As a condition of eligibility for receiving price support, all pesticide products (including plant regulators, defoliants and desiccants) used in connection with the production of Burley tobacco, must be approved by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for use on tobacco and each such pesticide products must be applied in accordance with label directions.

For purposes of the pesticide certification program, the term "pesticide" means "any substance or mixture of substances intended for preventing, destroying, repelling or mitigating any pest; and any substance or mixture of substances intended for use as a plant regulator, defoliant or desiccant."

Action to withhold price support on tobacco treated with nonapproved EPA pesticides or when pesticides are not used in accordance with Label directions was made necessary because their use threatens the domestic and export markets for tobacco. Samples of tobacco crops will be taken and chemically analyzed to determine whether nonapproved pesticides were used on the crop or pesticides were not applied in accordance with label directions. A "No Price Support" marketing card will be issued for the farm when the analysis indicates nonapproved pesticides were used or missed. In addition, all price support advances received during the current marketing year must be refunded.

The County Extension Office can furnish information about acceptable pesticides for use on tobacco. If you have questions concerning the pesticide certification program please contact this office.

Warehouse Designation

As a condition of price support of burley tobacco products are required to inform FSA of the warehouse where they will market tobacco. This is acquired by completing the form FSA-808, Warehouse Designation, to indicate where the tobacco will be sold. Initial designation will end August 1st.

After the initial designation pe-

riod ends producers will be limited, to designate for the term to any one day during the following regular re-designation periods:

• September 29-October 3, 2003 with the marketing card being effective October 13, 2003.

• November 3-November 7, 2003 with the marketing card being effective November 17, 2003.

• December 1-December 5, 2003 with the marketing card being effective December 15, 2003.

• December 26 - January 2, 2004 with the marketing card being effective January 12, 2004.

• February 2 - February 6, 2004 with the marketing card being effective February 16, 2004.

• March 1 - March 5, 2004 with the marketing card being effective March 15, 2004.

The warehouse number will be indicated with a number on the marketing card. Therefore, if a producer decides to market at a warehouse other than the one specified on the card, the producer must return the card to the FSA office in a specific time period to request another marketing card.

FSA has a listing for public notice of warehouses, receiving stations and dealers posted on the bulletin board in the county office available through March 31st.

Disaster Leasing

Farmers who suffer a burley tobacco disaster loss must file a report with FSA prior to harvest to retain eligibility to lease quota away under the disaster lease provisions. The disaster lease provision was implemented to provide relief to producers that suffer a disaster loss and are unable to produce and market the farm's effective quota. To be eligible to disaster lease and transfer, the transferring farm must file a crop acreage report, file the FSA-574 Disaster Credit Request, have planted sufficient acreage to produce the farm's effective quota, provide a measurement fee, suffered more than a 20% loss and meet all price support eligibility requirements. If determined eligible for disaster leasing,

the measurement fee will be refunded to the producer.

Remember, if you are a producer whose tobacco is suffering from poor weather conditions, black shank, blue mold, root disease, etc., come to the FSA office and file under the disaster provisions PRIOR TO HARVEST!

County Committee Election

The local FSA office is now accepting nominations for the upcoming election to be held December 1, 2003.

The COC members are critical to the day-to-day operations of FSA. They help run FSA farm programs at the local level by deciding the kind of programs their county will have and how they will operate. They make FSA agricultural programs fit the needs of local farmers.

Nomination forms must be received in the local FSA office by September 5, 2003. FSA committees operate within official regulations designed to carry out Federal laws and applying their judgement and knowledge to make decisions.

Nominations shall be eligible voters listed with FSA for LAA #2, the southeastern section of Rockcastle

County bound by Palaski and Laurel counties. Highway boundaries are Hwy. 70, Hwy. 150 and Hwy. 25

Notification of FERPA-Rights

Distribute this notice annually to parents and students.

The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and "eligible students" (students over 18 years of age or students who are attending a postsecondary institution) certain rights with respect to the student's education records. They are:

- 1) **The right to inspect and review the student's education records within forty-five (45) days of the day the District receives a request for access.**

Parents or eligible students should submit to the school Principal/designee a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The Principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the record(s) may be inspected.

- 2) **The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of the student's privacy or other rights.**

Parents or eligible students may ask the District to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of privacy or other rights. They should write the school Principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of their privacy or other rights.

If the District decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the District will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise him/her of the right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

- 3) **The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.**

One exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A "school official" is a person employed by the District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the school Board; a person or company with whom the District has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his/her tasks.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his/her professional responsibility.

Upon request, the District shall disclose education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll or to other entities authorized by law.

- 4) **The right to prohibit the disclosure of personally identifiable information concerning the student to recruiting representatives of the U.S. Armed Forces and its service academies, the Kentucky Air National Guard, and the Kentucky Army National Guard.**

Unless the parent or eligible student requests in writing that the District not release information, the student's name, address, and telephone number (if listed) shall be released to Armed Forces recruiters upon their request.

- 5) **The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the District to comply with the requirements of FERPA.** The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA is:

The Rockcastle County School District obtains written consent from a parent or eligible student (age 18 or who is attending a postsecondary institution), before disclosing personally identifiable information to an entity or individual not authorized to receive it under FERPA.

For students who have been determined eligible for Special Education, educational records will be destroyed at the request of the parents when they are no longer needed to provide educational programs or services. The Rockcastle County School District may destroy the educational records of a child without parent request seven years after they are no longer needed to provide educational programs or services. Parents are advised that data contained in the records may later be needed for Social Security benefits or other purposes. The Rockcastle County School District may retain, for an indefinite period of time, a record of the student's name, address, telephone number, grades, attendance records, classes attended, grade level completed, and year completed.

Children eligible for Special Education include those children with disabilities who have autism, deaf-blindness, developmental delay, emotional-behavior disability, hearing impairment, mental disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, specific learning disability, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, or visual impairment and who because of such an impairment need Special Education services.

Children eligible for 504 services include those children who have a current physical or mental impairment that currently substantially limits some major life activity which causes the student's ability to access the school environment or school activities to be substantially limited.

The Rockcastle County School District has an ongoing "Child Find" system, which is designed to locate, identify and evaluate any child residing in a home, facility, or residence within its geographical boundaries, age three (3) to twenty-one (21) years, who may have a disability and be in need of Special Education or 504 services. This includes children who are not in school; those who are in public, private, or home school; those who are highly mobile such as children who are migrant or homeless; and those who are advancing from grade to grade, who may need but are not receiving Special Education or 504 services.

The Rockcastle County School District will make sure any child enrolled in its district who qualifies for Special Education or 504 services, regardless of how severe the disability, is provided appropriate Special Education or 504 services at no cost to the parents of the child.

Parents, relatives, public and private agency employees, and concerned citizens are urged to help the Rockcastle County School District find any child who may have a disability and need Special Education or 504 services. The District needs to know the name and age, or date of birth of the child; the name, address, and phone number(s) of the parents or guardian; the possible disability; and other information to determine if Special Education or 504 services are needed.

Letters and phone calls are some of the ways the Rockcastle County School District collects the information needed. The information the school District collects will be used to contact the parents of the child and find out if the child needs to be evaluated or referred for Special Education or 504 services.

As part of these efforts the Rockcastle County School District will use screening information, student records, and basic assessment information it collects on all children in the District to help locate those children who have a disability and need Special Education or 504 services. Any information the District collects through "Child Find" is maintained confidentially.

Written Policies and Procedures have been developed which describe the District's requirements regarding the confidentiality of personally identifiable information and "Child Find" activities. Sports Medicine Physician joins Rockcastle Medical Arts

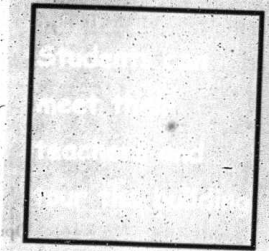
During the program, Gulfoil was introduced to academy life through a regimen of academics, physical training, intramural sports, sailing and seamanship, as well as leadership training and social activities.

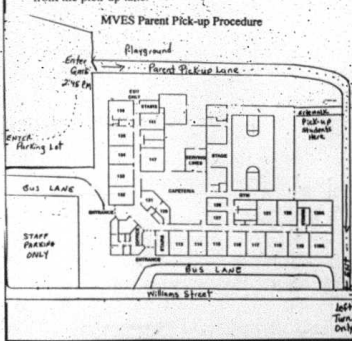

The procedure for dismissing parent pick-ups at Mt. Vernon Elementary School for 2003-2003 school year has been changed.

Parent pick-ups are those students whose parents/guardians drive to the school each day to pick them up in the afternoon. Parents will no longer be waiting in the cafeteria to receive their children. It may take a few days to get the routine established and will therefore require everyone's full cooperation. Please following the guidelines for dismissal:

1. Students will be assigned a number at the beginning of the school year. Parents/guardians will be given the same number to be displayed in the rearview mirror of the vehicle.
2. Parents/guardians will enter the parking lot from School St. and line up in the Parent Pick-up lane. **The gate to the pick-up lane will remain locked until 2:45 p.m.** Parents do not need to enter the campus prior to 2:45 p.m. unless picking up students for early appointments.
3. Cars will drive in a double lane until they reach the curve. Drivers will then be directed to proceed in single car order to the sidewalk where students will enter the vehicle.
4. **Drivers must remain in cars in pick-up lane. No parking in pick-up lane.** Staff members will identify parent/guardian by number and students will be sent directly to the vehicle from the gym. Walkers and pick-ups will be dismissed at 3:00 p.m.
5. Drivers will be making a left turn only onto Williams St. from the pick-up lane.

No means no

Anytime someone is made to have sex when they do not want to, it is rape. It is simply defined as "forced sex." The incidence of this huge problem is impossible to estimate because so many rapes go unreported. Sometimes victims do not even realize that their experience could be called rape because they were intimate with the person and somehow feel they "asked for it."

Teenwire's Ashley Rindini says, "Recognizing what it really means to 'give consent' can have a tremendous impact on the way you feel about your sexual experiences. Consent goes beyond whether or not someone said 'no,' or fought off a sexual advance. Consent means freely choosing to say 'yes.'"

Ashley goes on to make the following points:

- Giving consent is active, not passive. It means acting as an equal in a shared decision-making process. This means that someone who is sleeping or unconscious cannot give consent, because a person has to be awake to actively make decisions.

- Someone who has had sex because they were intimidated, threatened, or forced into it has not given consent, because he or she has not chosen to do so.

- Doing something because you are afraid that someone will hurt you if you don't do it is not the same thing as consenting. Consenting means saying yes freely, not saying yes because you were too scared to say no!

- It's never okay for someone to assume that you are willing to do something just because you don't kick and scream to avoid it.

- Consent means choosing to do something because you want to, not because you feel like you have to. Dating someone never means that they can decide what should be okay for you sexually.

- Your body and your comfort level are not bargaining chips! It's not okay for someone to assume that you "owe them," any sexual act, for any

reason.

- It's not okay for someone to assume that you will have sex with him or her just because you previously had sex with him or her or with someone else. You have the right to make different choices as you learn more about what you want and need in order to feel good about your sexual experiences. You can always choose not to do something again if you find that you didn't like how it made you feel.

- Hooking up with someone doesn't mean that they should expect some kind of "all-access pass" to your body; you have the power to decide what you want to do with your body every time.

- Consent is not about manipulation. Everyone should feel free to say yes or no without being disrespected for his or her choice!

- Consent is not binding. You have the right to change your mind at any time, for any reason.

- If both people are truly consenting to sex, it means that they continue to listen to each other every step of the way.

- You're the only person who has the right to set—or change—the boundaries around what feels comfortable and good to you. If you consent to something but then change your mind, you have the right to stop it immediately.

- If you or someone you know has been sexually harassed, you can call the Rape Abuse, Incest National Network (RAINN) at 1-800-656-HOPE or visit the RAINN Web site.

SCHOOL BUS RULES AND REGULATIONS

The privilege of any pupil to ride a school bus is conditioned upon their good behavior and observance of the following rules and regulations. Pupils violating these rules and regulations shall be reported to the principal of the school which the pupil attends for necessary corrective action. Safety is the primary concern in the transportation of pupils. In order to assure proper safety, it is vital that pupils and parents understand the rules and regulations of school bus riding. Following is a list of basic rules and regulations adopted by the Rockcastle County Board of Education and the Kentucky Department of Education:

1. Arrive at bus stop on time. The bus has many scheduled stops and cannot be delayed.
2. Never stand in the road while waiting for the bus. Parents should encourage safety measures for pupils as they wait for the bus and walk home from the bus.
3. Cross a safe distance (10 feet) in front of the bus so the driver can see you.
4. Take a seat upon boarding the bus and do not change seats while the bus is in motion.
5. The driver is in charge of the bus and pupils and has the authority to assign seating arrangements.
6. Keep noise to a minimum so that the driver's attention can be devoted to driving.
7. Do not extend arms, legs or head out the bus windows.
8. Obey the rules posted on each bus.
9. Do not block aisles in any way.
10. Knives/other sharp instruments are not permitted on the bus.
11. Never run toward the bus. Always load and unload when the bus has come to a complete stop.
12. Apply the above rule (No. 11) when transferring buses.
13. Never use the rear exit unless an emergency exists.
14. Ride only your assigned bus unless you have a signed note from the Principal. Parents must write or call the principal to obtain permission for pupil to ride another bus or to exit at a different stop.
15. Report any tamages to the bus.
16. Do not occupy more space in a seat than required.
17. Open and close windows in compliance with the driver's instructions.
18. Pupils and parents are to accept the responsibility of listening for dismissal announcements on the radio on days when inclement weather disrupts the regular schedule.
19. The following rules are of particular concern and the activities mentioned are prohibited at all times:
 - a. Use of profane/foul language
 - b. Smoking or other use of tobacco on the bus
 - c. Fighting on the bus
 - d. Destruction of bus property
 - e. Defiance of driver's authority
 - f. Throwing objects on or from the bus.
20. **Disciplinary Action:** Violations of the above stated rules and regulations shall be reported to the appropriate school principal. The principal shall record the incident and determine the appropriate disciplinary action. Should any pupil persist in violating any of these regulations, it shall be the duty of the principal to notify the principal and, after due warning has been given to the pupil and such violation persists, the principal and/or board of education shall then forbid such disobedient pupil the privilege of riding the bus. Written notice of the action of the principal shall be furnished to the parents and the superintendent.

Ride only your assigned bus unless you have a signed note from the Principal.

Parents must write or call the principal to obtain permission for pupil to ride another bus or to exit at a different stop.
