County sets tax rate same as last year

The county tax rate for 2003 was eat at 7.4" per 5100 assessed value for real property at a special called meeting of the flosal court on Friday. County Judget Executive Buzz Carfolhis told the court that the 7.4 would realize an estimated 3.2 or 7.4 commended that the county not take the 4% (of 7.4%) increase which, would only realize the county an estimated additional \$5.577.
