What's in a name? **Fiscal Court will** have to decide soon

Mt. Verdon Mayor Clarice Kirby was at Tuesday's meeting of the Rockeastle County Fiscal Court to voice her displeasure with the cur-rent renaming process of city and county roads. Mayor Kirby feels that streets and roads are unnecessarity being re-

On October 22, 1986, the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA, Public Law 99-519) was signed into law. The law required EPA to develop regulations, which provide a comprehensive framework for addressing subestos problems in public and private elementary and secondary schools. On October 30, 1987, EPA published the Asbestos-Containing Materials in Schools Rule (40 CFR PAT 763 Subpart E). This Rule requires all public and private elementary and secondary schools to inspect for friable and non-friable asbestos, develop asbestos management plans that address asbestos hazards in school buildings, and implement response actions in a timely fashion.

To carry out the above activities involving inspections, management plans, and response actions to Rockadelle County Board of Education has utilized accredited personnel. On April 30, 1987, EPA publishe the Management plans (40 CFR Part 763 Appendits C to Subpart E) required by AHERA, which specifishing, examination, and other requirements for persons who inspect, develop management plans and design or conduct response actions in schools. The Model Plan became effective on June 4, 1987.

In 1988, the Rockcastle County Board of Education retained Barry W. Cooper, Inc., who complete an initial inspection to locate all asbestos-containing building materials (ACBM) and developed and submit to the State of Kentucky an asbestos Management Plan that includes the results of the inspections. In Docember of 1988, the Rockcastle County Board of Education began to implement this management plan The facilities were once again inspected in August of 2002.

Copies of the management plan are always available for review for those interested persons at the Administration Office at 245 Richmond Road, Mt. Vernon, KY and at the Principal's Office at each School any time during normal office hours.
