Prostate Cancer is common

African Americans. It is also more common in men who have deels high in fat.

Prostate cancer causes few symptoms and when it does, they are similar to the symptoms of other prostated disease. These may be difficulty starting or stopping a stream of urine, frequency of urination (especially during the night), bloody urine, pain with voiding and pains in the back or thighs.

These symptoms are the same as those caused by benign conditions of the prostate. The best way to find the cancer early is to see your doctor annually for an exam. Of course, a man should see his doctor sconer if there is any change in urination or other symptoms.

Every man over 40 should have a rectal exam when he has his annual physical.

physical ... When a lump is felt in the prostate, a biopsy should be done to determine if the sump contains cancer cells. If so, further studies may need to be done to determine the extent of the cancer. One test your doctor may order is an ultrasound of the prostate. A blood test, called the PSA, is also available and is gaining popularity in evaluating the prostate. If the cancer is in an early stage, surgery and radiation will cure it in many men. At other times hormone therapy is used. The outlook is generally quite good, especially when the cancer is found early with routine exams; deaths from prisstate cancer are declining.



Rockeastle County has been added to the countries as being approved for the Livestice Rassitance Program for the 2001 crop year.

To be eligible for LAP, the country must have suffered at least a 40 percent grazing loss for three or more consecutive months in a calendar year. A producer may receive a LAP, payment on a per head basis of eligible livestock when the producer bas control of adequate grazing land to support the eligible livestock Eligible Livestock include: beef and dairy cattle, buffalo, sheep, goots, swine and other certain equine animals.

animals.

To qualify, a livestock producer must have suffered a 46 percent or greater loss of grazing production for three or more consecutive months due to drought, not weather, disease, insect infestation, flood, fire, hurriane, earthquake, severe storm or other natural disaster, Lup payments will be reduced by the amount of assistance received by that producer under previous Livestock compensations. under previous Livestock compensa-tion program (LCP-1), (LCP-11) and the 2002 Cattle Feed Program. A pro-ducer must possess beneficial and financial interests in eligible livestock that have been owned or leased for at least three months. A \$40,000 payment limitation also applies to LAP assistance.

So Yuu Want a Watergarden?

Wilen. planning to build a watergarden, considerations must be addressed. First, what aspect of a water-feature is important to you. Then, where, how large, and the cost. And if not an avid do-it-yourselfer, how should you go about hiring someone to complete your project. When it conless to what you want in a waterfeature, be it large or small, with or without fish, simple or grandify fashioned, a gentle waterfall, at ponds edge or a roaring catecade of water over multiple waterfalls, at would encourage future pond owners to go ahead and build the watergarden of freit dreams. (So watergarden of their dreams. (So often, folks wish they had built a big-ger one and end up re-doing it after a

w years.) If it is mostly fish you are inter-

ested in, then you may need just a pond, a few plants, plus filtration and aeration. For koi, clean water and two feet or more depth is desirable. Gold-fish do well with less water and lesser water wall just less water and lesser

fish do well with less water and lesser water quality.

Maybe it is a waterfall you mainly want, if so, a small pondressovoir or even a pondress waterfall may work.

Desire a bubbling brook or a roating mountain waterfall. Visit some of patter's finess to rinspiration. Consider if they could be duplicated myodr on backyard.

Even of patter is the pattern of fall-invariant pattern indicots is a real special treat for those who have tried it.

I recently worked on such a project, and let me lell you, it was wild.

sand dollars may be required. Tens, of thousands for really large and contraining residential or commercial waterfiels, fountains, etc.

Who should build your watergarden? Maybe you would even-joy spending a vecation or seven well weekends doing it yourself? (If you would change the windows and doors to your home yourself, perhaps if you would change the windows and concrete driveway yourself, or buying a pre-cut gazebo and assembling it would tackle pouring your own con-crete driveway yourself, or buying a pre-cut gazebo and assembling at yourself, then a watergarden might be a piece of cake for you. If so, en-joy creating something very special You will be rightfully proud of your creation!).

But if spending 50 to 100 hours sweating with shovels and carrying heavy stones (about 5 or 6 tons for the average pond) and troubleshootthe average pond) and troubleshoot ing leaks are not exactly your forte it might be wise to hire a quertified contractor.

certified contractor.

Carefully select a company or qualified cardsman who will demonstrate his abilities with reference, fictures, and some considerable experience in the sort of project you have in mind. He should effry insurance in case damage it you property were to occur, and be willing to agree to a stated contract price in advance.

Best of everything to you if you are ready to join the growing number or homeowners who have added a pond and some fish or even a large waterfeature. Water is a big plus if one wants paradise at home in the backyard.






