It can ruin a weation. Travelers' diarrhea, which is caused
from bacteria, can be quite severe. But there are things you
prevent it or, if it occurs, to treat it quite quickly.

Areas of highrisk are Mexico and Central America,
Asia, Africa and the Middle East. Southern Europe
and the Caribbeain Islands have a lower risk.

One can decrease the chance of getting the infection by being careful not to eat raw fruits or vegetables.

The National Institute of Health recommends that
travelers not begin and antibotic unless an infection develops. Many travelers and doctors, holwever, feel that
it is better to be safe by taking a prophylactic and inclinations:

Several antibiotics can all be used. The newer antibiotic
effective. In fact, they are so effective that it is now usually recto wait until a ninfection occurs to take the medician erather
prophylactically.

A not-opposition, medicine that travelers of the services.

to-wait until the intercence seems.

A non-prescription medicine that is quite effective is bismuth substile/tale (Peiplo-Bismol). It needs to be taken frequently and in large amounts, which makes it less convenient than other treatments. For mild diarrhed, loperamide (Imodium) is very useful in slowing the gut and decreasing the symptoms. One should avoid dairy products, cafeine containing products and alcohol if diarrhed develops.

Do You Want to Live Longer?

I heartily recommend to you a new book, Emotional Lóngevity. What Really Determines How Long Tyo, Live by Norman B. Anderson: Especially if you are work in the filed freeth of the health early, his book is for you. Dr. Anderson was the associate director of the National Institutes of Health before accepting a teaching, position at Harvard University. The NIH, the medical research arm of the federal government, is made up or twenty-seven institutes that conduct research into all minner of diseases. In his book Dr. Anderson has gathered information from the latest medical research. Here are some of his conclusions.

medical research. Here are some or his conclusions.

1. Optimists live longer than pes-simists. As with all of his conclu-sions, Dr. Anderson cites relearch studies to support this claim. How you perceive both the past and the future affects longevity. If you tend to blame yourself for past mistakes or if you see the future as dark and bleak, your chances of living longer decrease.

2. People with multiple social ites live longer than loners. The fre-genery of contact that you have with family and friends affects how long you live. A study using mice found that when a certain hormone was de-pleted, the mice sought contact with others. That contact with other mice then increased the amount of that hormone that was present.

3. People who go to church live, longer. This may be for a multitude of reasons but one reason is that these people have a way to understand life is tragedies that helps them to cope. They may believe it was God's will that a certain event happened or they may explain it in some other way. The important fact, as far as longevity is concerned, is that they find an explanation: that satisfies them.

4. People with more education and or higher income live longer.
